METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action on Tuesday night and fell to the Chicago Cubs, 7-2...The defeat snapped a five-game winning streak...The Mets have won six of their last nine games...New York continues a six-game road trip (0-1) to Chicago-NL (0-1) and Colorado (three games).

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high seven straight contests, hitting 14 home runs in that span...The Mets are 20-10 when hitting a home run this season and 9-5 when hitting multiple homers.

18, I JUST DON'T KNOW WHAT I WANT: Pete Alonso has homered in five of his last seven games...Overall, he has hit 18 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 43 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 423 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in 49 games this year...See the chart below for the fastest Met to reach 20 home runs in a season and the fastest to 50 RBI...*Courtesy of Elias.*

DROVE TO CHICAGO ALL THINGS KNOW: According to Sportsradar, Pete Alonso has homered in seven career games at Wrigley Field... It ties him with Mark McGwire and Prince Fielder for the second-most HR all-time in a player's first 12 games at the ballpark, trailing only Carlos Beltran's eight home runs...Beltran's eight homers are the most through a players first 13 games at the yard.

MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to LHP David Peterson who was named the International League's most recent Pitcher of the Week...In his first start since returning to Triple-A Syracuse, the lefty tossed 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits, three walks, while strikeout out nine.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar is 12-32 (.375) with a triple, three home runs, six RBI, five runs scored and a 1.147 OPS over his last 14 games...

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo collected three hits last night... He is now batting .355 (39-110) with 13 runs, eight doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks with a .413 OBP and .482 SLG in 28 games on the road this season...His .355 road average ranks fourth in the majors...He has safely hit in seven straight road games, batting .448 (13-29) with three runs, two doubles, four RBI, two walks with a .986 OPS in that span.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga struck out career-high 12 in his last start...It was the first double-digit-strikeout game by a Mets pitcher this season...It was the most strikeouts by a Japanese-born pitcher in Mets history and the first double-digit strikeout game by a Mets rookie since Tylor Megill struck out 10 vs. the Yankees on September 10, 2021...The right has 55 strikeouts through his first eight games of his career, the third-most by a Met...Only Nolan Ryan (64) and Dwight Gooden (59) have recorded more...Senga's 55 strikeouts ranks fourth among Japanese born pitchers, behind Masahiro Tanaka (66), Hideo Nomo (59) and Yu Darvish (58) through a players first eight games.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 28 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is 13-15 with a 4.73 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 238 strikeouts on the road is the most in the National League and tied with the Twins for the most in the majors.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Mets continue a three-game set at Wrigley Field tonight...New York took three of four in the Windy City in 2022...Francisco Lindor is a lifetime .333 (18-54) hitter with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and 12 walks with a .455 OBP and a .519 SLG in 14 games at the ballpark...Brandon Nimmo has hit .333/.378/.476 in 11 career games at the ballpark... In 67 career contests, Starling Marte has hit .269/.322/.454 with 44 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 34 RBI and 17 walks.

THREE NIGHTS IN CHICAGO: The Mets are set to play three consecutive night games in Chicago...The last did that from April 20-23, 2021...Prior to that, the team played three straight night games at Wrigley Field from September 12-14, 2017.

THE HATEFUL EIGHT: Jeff McNeil has hit safely in each of his last eight starts, batting .400 (12-30) in that span with five runs, two walks and three RBI...He has 178 multi-hit games in his career, which is 19th all-time in Mets history...Wally Backman is next with 179 multi-hit contests.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .271 (16-59) with four doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .338 OBP and a .593 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 16 games in May, Alvarez is batting .271 (13-48) with seven runs, four doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, six walks with a .968 OPS.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 22-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 117 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the tied for the longest streak in franchise history...From October 1, 1990- September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 17 errors in 49 games this year... That gives the team a .990 fielding percentage...Their .990 fielding percentage ranks fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 17 errors are the second-fewest committed in the Senior Circuit...Only the Padres (12) have committed fewer.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Set a career-high with 12 strikeouts on May 17 in the Mets 8-7 win against Tampa Bay...Threw 6.0 innings, allowing one run on three hits with three walks...His 12 strikeouts marked the most strikeouts by a Japanese-born pitcher in Mets history...Senga was the first Met this season to record double-digit strikeouts in an outing.

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Senga has 55 strikeouts through his first eight career major league games, the third-most in franchise history behind Nolan Ryan (64) and Dwight Gooden (59).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 30 of his 55 strikeouts through eight starts...The pitch has a 58.8 percent whiff rate and a 27.8 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just five hits in 44 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .114 batting average.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (0-2, 8.68)

LAST TIME OUT: Returned from the 15-Day IL, throwing 5.0 innings in the Mets 10-9 win against Cleveland on May 19...Allowed five runs on five hits, with two walks and three strikeouts...The appearance also marked his first start against his former team.

HE'S GOT THE MONTH OF MAY: In 39 appearances and 32 starts in the month of May, Carrasco has pitched to an 18-8 record with a 4.31 ERA (102 ER/213.0 IP)...His .692 winning percentage in May is the best split of any month during the season...In those appearances, Carrasco has thrown three complete games, including one shutout, and has tallied 201 strikeouts compared to 48 walks.

- Has drawn 13 walks in 22 games this month, two more than he had in 27 games during March/April.
- Belted an opposite-field, game-tying grand slam on May 19 vs. Cleveland...Was his third career grand slam and the third game-tying slam in Mets history.
- Tied a Mets record with his fourth career walk-off blast on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay, a three-run shot to ice an 8-7, extra-inning victory...Five other hitters have hit four walk-off home runs with the Mets: Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds, Cleon Jones, Mike Piazza and Wilmer Flores.
- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .417 (10-24) hitter in extra innings with a 1.442 OPS in his career.
- Has 71 career home runs at Citi Field, tied with Lucas Duda for the most in the ballpark's history.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 164 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
