METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Pirates, 9-1, in Queens...The Amazins' earned their fourth straight series victory of the season and their first sweep...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 10-3...The Mets hit the road for their second trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-NL (three games) and San Francisco (three games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a season-high four-game winning streak...Their longest winning streak in 2023 was six games, which they accomplished from July 1-7.

ROSTER MOVES: On Wednesday, RHP Michael Tonkin was claimed off waivers from the Minnesota Twins...He will be active for tonight's game and wear #51...LHP Tyler Jay was designated for assignment...Following Wednesday's game, RHP Grant Hartwig was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

I LOVE LA: Brandon Nimmo is a lifetime .404/.460/.614 hitter with 10 runs, three doubles, three homers, six RBI and four walks in 18 games at Dodger Stadium...Pete Alonso has hit seven home runs and hit .349 (22-63) in 15 career games at the ballpark.

TAYLOR MADE: Tyrone Taylor is batting .341 (14-41) with three runs, two doubles, one home run, 10 RBI, with three walks, a .378 OBP and a .463 SLG in 15 games this season...He has safely reached base in all but three games this year.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York begins their second road trip of the year...The team is 4-2 away from Citi Field...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte recorded his 150th career home run on Wednesday...He is one of three Dominican born players with 150 or more home runs and 300 or more steals, joining César Cedeño (199 HR/550 SB) and Juan Samuel (161 H/396 SB)...He is one RBI away from 600...Marte has stolen 341 bases in his career...That is the most among active players.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 11 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .292/.364/.451 with 71 runs, 20 doubles, one triple, 13 home runs, 39 walks with an .811 OPS...Their .365 OBP is the second-best in the majors, while their .291 average and .814 OPS is third-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 71-45 in that span...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

REEDING RAINBOW: In four games this year, Reed Garrett has struck out 17 of the 31 batters he has faced (55%)...His 17 strikeouts as reliever are tied for the major league lead...His 17 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first four appearances of a season... He has yet to allow a run in a career-high 8.2 innings this year.

IN A PINCH: Joey Wendle recorded a pinch-hit RBI double yesterday...Overall, Mets pinch-hitters are 5-12 this season...Their .417 average ranks fourth in the major leagues.

HERE'S THE PITCH: New York owns the lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.15 (57 ER/163.0 IP) mark...Their 176 strikeouts are fourth in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.97 ERA (24 ER/72.2 IP) with 28 walks and 90 strikeouts...Their 2.97 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit as are their 90 strikeouts.

FRANKLY SPEAKING: Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in 10 straight games...He has posted a .319 OBP in that span...He is batting .286 (6-21) against left-handed pitchers in 2024...This includes a .524 SLG.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 7-6 against the Dodgers since 2022...This includes a 4-3 record at Dodger Stadium.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: As a team, the Mets are batting .286/.348/.460 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .286 average is fourth in the major leagues, while their .460 SLG ranks third...This compares to a .227/.321/.346 slashline against righties.

HEY BABY: Harrison Bader has safely hit in nine of his last 11 games...Bader is batting 13-40 (.325) over that span with eight runs, one double, one home run, five RBI, two walks, three steals with a .372 OBP.

SWING AND NO MISS: Mets batters have struck out 132 times this year... That is the fewest in the major leagues...Overall, the team has posted an 19.0 strikeout percentage, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...Francisco Lindor ranks ninth in the majors, striking out only 10.6% of the time, while Jeff McNeil places 10th at 10.8%.

SAVE ME: Edwin Díaz has recorded 100 saves as a member of the Mets... He is the sixth player in franchise history to record at least 100 saves with the Club...His current save streak of 26 games is the longest active in the majors...It is his second-longest of his career...Diaz career-best is a 28 save streak from June 2-August 15, 2018.

BROOKS IS OFF AND RUNNING: Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run in seven games (6.1 IP) this season...He has surrendered one hit, walked three and struck out eight.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso, the reigning National League Player of the Week, is batting .407 (11-27) with 10 runs, two doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, seven walks with a .529 OBP and a .926 SLG over his last eight games.

MANAEA NEWS & NOTES

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.

SUCCESSFUL SEAN: In his first two starts as a Met, Manaea allowed one run over 11.0 innings...He joined Harry Parker, Masato Yoshii, Dillon Gee and Chris Bassitt as the only starters in franchise history to allow one or zero runs through their first two career starts with the Mets...Manaea allowed only four hits in his first two start with the club, tied with Rick Reed, Bruce Chen and Kazuhisa Ishii for the fewest hits allowed by a Met in their first two games with the club (Min. 10.0 IP)...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Bassitt, Steven Matz and Kodai Senga for the fifth-most in franchise history by a pitcher through in their first two games with the club...Only Pedro Martinez (21), Aaron Harang (18), Matt Harvey (18) and Pedro Astacio (16) had more strikeouts through their first two games as a Met.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 37 games (10 starts) with the San Francisco Giants...Made his first start of the season vs. Kansas City on April 8 and allowed one run over 6.0 innings while tallying eight strikeouts...Was a starter in six of his first eight games of the season before becoming a full-time reliever on May 16...Tied a season-high eight strikeouts in just 3.2 innings of relief on May 22 at Minnesota... Became the first MLB left-hander to throw at least 80 pitches and strike out eight+ batters in a scoreless relief outing since Randy Johnson struck out 16 in 7.0 innings on July 19, 2001...Courtesy of *OptaSTATS*... Did not allow a home run in a 53.2 inning stretch from May 22 through his first inning of work on August 21 at Philadelphia...Rejoined the rotation on September 12 and started his final four games of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP)...Pitched to a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (Min. 50.0 IP).

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal... Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first three starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are 1-5 with four strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch.

SUPERB SOUTHPAW: Since his debut season, 2016, Manaea ranks in the top-10 among left-handed pitchers in several categories including innings (1017.1, seventh), wins (66, ninth) and strikeouts (943, eighth)...In 2021, Manaea was tied for the AL lead with 32 games started and ranked eight in the AL with a career-high 194 strikeouts...In 2018, Manaea ranked sixth in the AL in WHIP with a 1.08 clip (Min. 150.0 IP).

NO HITS FOR YOU: On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to *Elias*, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JOSÉ BUTTÓ (0-0, 0.75)

LAST TIME OUT: Struck out a career-high nine batters on April 14 vs. Kansas City over 6.0 scoreless innings...Allowed two hits and issued only one walk...Has allowed only one run over his first two starts of the season.

QUALITY EATS: Dating back to September 6, 2023, Buttó has pitched to a 2.52 ERA (11 ER/39.1IP) over seven starts...Five of those starts have been quality starts and the right-hander has held opposing batters to a .186 (26-140) average during that span.

- Was named NL Player of the Week for the period ending April 14...Batted .429 (9-21) with four homers, seven RBI, eight runs and seven walks during the week...Was his fourth career NL player of the week selection (Also: 6/24/19, 9/26/22 and 7/31/23).
- Is batting .440/.533/1.000 with four home runs, two doubles, seven RBI, eight runs and five walks over his last seven games.
- Went 3-3 with a two homers and three RBI on April 13 vs. Kansas City...Was his 20th career multi-homer game, the third most such games in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21)...Are the second most such games since 2019 behind only Aaron Judge.
- Lined a solo homer in the eighth on April 12 vs. Kansas City...All four of his home runs this season have come in the eighth inning or later.
- Hit a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning in the second game of a doubleheader on April 4 vs. Detroit...Was his 500th career RBI...Became the 10th Met to reach the 500-career RBI mark...José Reyes and Cleon Jones are next (521)...Is the third player in major league history to record 194 or more home runs and 500 or more RBI within their first 690 games joining Ralph Kiner and Ryan Howard...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein...His 196 home runs and 505 RBI are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.
