PITTSBURGH PIRATES (28-42) vs. CHICAGO CUBS (42-27)
June 13, 2025 - Wrigley Field - Chicago, IL - 1:20 CDT - Game #71/Road #33
RHP Paul Skenes (4-6, 1.88 ERA) vs. RHP Cade Horton (3-1, 4.11 ERA)

THE PIRATES: dropped the first game of their seven-game trip to Chicago (Thursday-Sunday) and Detroit (June 17-19) with last night's 3-2 loss at Wrigley Field...Went 6-3 on their recent homestand against Houston (1-2), Philadelphia (3-0) and Miami (2-1) from June 3-11...Are 16-16 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8...Have played in 16 one-run games since Kelly managed his first game on May 9 (8-8 record in those games)...Are 7-13 vs. the NL Central in 2025.

SKENES DAY: Paul Skenes will start for Pittsburgh in this afternoon's contest at Wrigley Field...Skenes allowed just one unearned run on two hits and one walk (seven strikeouts) over 7.2 innings in his last start on Sunday vs. Philadelphia...It was his third start of 7.2-plus innings, one or zero runs allowed and seven-plus strikeouts this season (also May 18 at Philadelphia and June 3 vs. Houston)...He became the first Pirates pitcher to do that in back-to-back starts since Francisco Cordova from August 1-7, 1999...The only Pittsburgh pitcher since at least 1901 to do it in three straight starts was Bob Veale from May 23-June 1, 1965 (the last Major Leaguer to do that in three consecutive starts was Miami's Sandy Alcantara from September 18-30, 2022)...Skenes' three-such starts so far this season are the most by a Pirates pitcher in a single season since Gerrit Cole also had three-such starts in 2015.

FOR STARTERS: Pittsburgh has gotten at least 10 outs from its starting pitcher in each of its 70 games this season, joining Tampa Bay (68) as the only Major League teams to have done that this year...According to OptaStats, the Pirates' 70 consecutive games with their starter recording at least 10 outs is their longest-such streak to begin a season since at least 1901.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE: The Pirates were outscored by 57 runs (175-118) in their first 38 games, but have outscored opponents 109-105 since Don Kelly's first game (May 9 vs. Atlanta).

UP GOES FRAZIER: Adam Frazier went 1-for-4 with a single, an RBI, and a run scored on Thursday night at Wrigley Field...In his last 18 games, dating back to May 20 vs. Cincinnati, Frazier is batting .344 (22-for-64) with five doubles, a home run, eight RBI, four walks and seven runs scored...His .344 average in that span ranks second among National League batters with at least 60-at bats, trailing only Atlanta's Ronald Acuña Jr., who's hitting .353 (24-for-68).

STILL GOT IT: Andrew McCutchen singled off former teammate Jameson Taillon in the first inning of Thursday's game at Wrigley Field, extending his hitting streak to a season-high-tying six consecutive games (since June 7 vs. Philadelphia)...He also hit safely in six straight contests from April 18-25 and from May 20-26...His last hitting streak of at least seven games came last season from July 28-September 2 (14 straight)...During his current streak, McCutchen is batting .375 (9-for-24) with two doubles, a home run, six RBI and three runs scored.

DON'T WALK HERE: Entering today's game, Pittsburgh's 3.01 walks issued per 9.0 innings this season are the ninth-fewest in Major League Baseball (Chicago-NL, 2.83, ranks fourth)...The Pirates have had 14 games this season where they've allowed one/zero walks, including Thursday in Chicago (one)...Dennis Santana's streak of 20 consecutive games without walking a batter (April 5-May 27) was the longest by any Major League pitcher so far in 2025.

VERY FRIENDLY CONFINES: Despite dropping last night's series opener in Chicago, Pittsburgh has won each of its last three series at Wrigley Field (September 19-21, 2023; May 16-19, 2024; September 2-4, 2024)...Per OptaStats, the Pirates have won four consecutive series at Wrigley Field just twice in the Divisional Era (since 1969)...They also did that in four straight from April 2011-July 2012, as well as from September 2013-September 2014.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 13, 1988: The Pirates shut out the Cubs, 8-0, at Wrigley Field. Bob Walk tossed a complete game, striking out five Chicago batters while allowing eight hits. Bobby Bonilla led the charge offensively, finishing a triple shy of the cycle while driving in three runs. Barry Bonds hit a solo home run as part of a two-hit game, while also scoring three runs and stealing a base in the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: Skenes will make his 15th start of 2025 and the third of his career at Wrigley Field...Took home BBWAA NL Rookie of the Year honors in 2024 after making his MLB debut on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...Was the first-overall pick by Pittsburgh in the 2023 Draft (out of LSU).

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed an unearned run over 7.2 innings (seven strikeouts) on Sunday vs. Philadelphia, having a no-decision in the team's 2-1 win...He's made six straight starts of 6.0-plus innings, one/zero runs allowed and six-plus strikeouts (since May 12 at New York-NL), the longest-such streak by any Pirates pitcher since at least 1901...He's the first Major Leaguer to do it in six straight starts since Arizona's Zac Gallen from August 8-September 4, 2022 (last to do it in seven straight was Minnesota's Johan Santana from August 23-September 24, 2004).

AGAINST THE CUBS: Skenes will make his sixth career start (second this season) against Chicago (NL) today at Wrigley Field...In his first start against the Cubs this season, which came on May 1 at PNC Park, he allowed a career-high three home runs and a career-high-tying four walks while striking out a career-low two batters over 5.0 innings, losing an 8-3 decision...Skenes has not allowed a run over two starts (11.Oip) here at Wrigley Field...He pitched 6.0 no-hit innings (11 strikeouts) here in his second Major League start last season on May 17 (won a 9-3 decision), while also tossing 5.0 scoreless innings (six strikeouts) on September 3 (won a 5-0 decision).

A MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Skenes recorded a 1.91 ERA (37.2ip/8er) in six starts last month, ninth-best in the entire National League (teammate Bailey Falter, 0.76, was second in the NL).

ALL-AMERICAN: Skenes appeared on MLB Network on May 13, where he was named as a member of Team USA for next year's World Baseball Classic by manager Mark DeRosa...It will mark the fourth time he's represented the United States, having also played for the 12U National Team in 2014, as well as the Collegiate National Team in the summers of both 2021 and 2022.

LIMITING THE HITS: Skenes has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his first 37 starts to begin his career...That's the longest-such streak (excluding openers) to start a career...In his start on May 12 at New York (NL), he broke a tie with Shohei Ohtani, who did it in 31 straight from 2018-21.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO: Skenes' 1.93 career ERA (224.0ip/48er) is the lowest of any Major League starting pitcher (minimum 30 starts) in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...His 1.93 ERA since May 11, 2024 (the day he made his MLB debut) is also the lowest in MLB (minimum 30 starts).

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes recently partnered with New Era Cap, launching a charitable initiative to support America's veterans...For every strikeout that Skenes records throughout the rest of this season, New Era will donate \$250 to a veterans-focused charity of his choosing.

OUR ACE: Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career (May 11, 2024 to April 2, 2025), Skenes pitched to a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs were officially tracked in both leagues in 1913 to post a sub-2.00 ERA with 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League games.

OPENING DAY HONORS: Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings, but had a no-decision, on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old...Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).
