**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Marlins (1-1, one to play) and the Orioles (three to play) today at Tropicana Field...have won 11 of 14, 17 of 21, and 24 of their last 32 games...since April 4, have the majors' best record (27-10) and ERA (3.19)...own MLB's second-best record overall behind the Braves (31-15)...are off to the third-best start in club history (see table on the right) in spite of having the fourth-toughest strength of schedule thus far (.506)...have led the AL East for eight straight days...have spent 14 days atop the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays fell, 10-5, in 10 innings yesterday to the Marlins...the loss snapped an 11-game winning streak at home (April 22-May 15), tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history (also: April 22-May 13, 2008)...it marked the first time the Rays had given double-digit runs since April 21 vs. CIN - 12R).
- ★ The Rays allowed eight runs in the extra frame, the most in an extra inning in franchise history and tying the most in a single frame this season (also: March 26 at STL - 6th).
- ★ **Nick Martinez** spun 6.0 scoreless innings yesterday, his ninth straight start to begin the season with two runs or fewer allowed...he joins **PIT A.J. Burnett** (9G, April 9-May 23, 2015) as the only pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) age 35 or older to allow two runs or fewer in each of their first nine starts to open a season...his 1.51 ERA (53.2IP, 9ER) is the lowest by a traditional starter through the first starts of a season in team history...he is one of 11 pitchers age 35 or older in the live ball era (since 1920) to hold a 1.51 ERA or better through their first nine starts (see list on the right).
- ★ Rays starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 21 straight starts (April 22-pres.), the second-longest streak in franchise history, trailing only a 23-game streak from Sept. 11, 2024-April 2, 2025.
- ★ Since April 21, the Rays have boosted their postseason odds from 28.5 pct. to 84.1 pct. entering play today, a 55.7 pct. increase (FanGraphs)...the Phillies (+20.0%) have the second-largest odds increase over that timeframe.

### WHAT'S AT STAKE

- ★ Earn their seventh straight series win and the ninth in their last 11 sets...it would mark their third-longest single-season streak in franchise history behind a pair of 10-set streaks from June 24-July 29, 2013 and July 28-Aug. 31, 2008.
- ★ Improve to 18-4 in their last 22 games (April 22-pres.), tied for their eighth-best record over any 22-game span in team history and one game shy of the franchise record (19-3, 7x, last: April 1-24, 2023).
- ★ Return to their high-water mark of 15-games above .500 for the third time this season (also: May 12; 28-13 & May 15; 29-14).
- ★ Become the second team in the majors with 30 wins (ATL), marking the second-earliest date in franchise history to reach the total (2023 Rays, May 11).
- ★ Avoid back-to-back losses for the first time since April 19-21 (2G)...they are the only club since April 21 to not lose back-to-back games and one of three (ATL & ATH) to not drop three consecutive contests.
- ★ Secure their first rubber game at home in 2026.

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—The Rays placed **OF Jake Fraley** (hernia) on the 10-day IL (retro: May 16) and recalled **INF Carson Williams** from Triple-A Durham...this marks Williams' second stint on the active roster this season (also: Opening Day-April 6).

★ In 32 games with the Bulls, Williams slashed .238/.333/.418 (29-for-122) with 5 2B, 1 3B, 5 HR, 21 RBI, 17 BB, and 6 SB.

**TIP TROP SHAPE**—The Rays are 15-5 at Tropicana Field this season, including an 11-game home winning streak (April 22-May 15)...they are tied for the second-best home start to a season in team history (also: April 6-27, 2010), trailing only a 17-3 start in 2023 (March 30-April 21)...the club's 3.34 ERA (183.OIP, 68ER) is tied for the fifth-best through its first 20 home games of a season (also: 2010)...they have held opponents to four runs or fewer in 15 of those contests and two or fewer in 10 of 20...their home record is the second best in the majors behind the Cubs (18-5).

**MAY FLOWERS**—In May, **Jonathan Aranda** ranks highly in the majors in on-base pct. (1st, .500), average (2nd, .413/19-for-46), hits (7th), and OPS (13th, 1.022)...he has reached base 29 times this month, third most in the majors behind **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (31) and **CHC Michael Busch** (30)...he has reached base safely in seven straight, his longest streak since a career-best 20-game streak between July 19, 2025-April 1, 2026.

★ His 34 RBI lead the AL, marking the fourth-latest in a season a Rays hitter has led the Junior Circuit in RBI, earlier than only **Evan Longoria** in 2010 (May 22) and 2009 (June 9) and **Austin Meadows** in 2021 (June 10), per Stats Perform...it is the seventh-most RBI by a Ray through the club's first 44 games and marks the most since **Randy Arozarena** (36) in 2023.

★ In his last 25 games (April 18-pres.), he is batting .329 (28-for-85) with 2 2B, 5 HR, 19 RBI, a .433 OBP, and a .962 OPS...his .329 average is the sixth best in the AL and 12th best in the majors during that timeframe.

**THE RAY WAY**—The Rays staff ranks highly in the majors in saves (1st, 19), opp. average (4th, .222), opp. OPS (5th, .656), WHIP (4th, 1.19), and ERA (5th, 3.60)...they have posted a top-six WHIP in the majors in each of the last nine seasons (2017-25), MLB's longest active streak...the Rays have permitted three runs or fewer 22 times (T5th in AL), going 20-2 in those games compared to a 9-12 mark when allowing four runs or more...they have held opponents to two runs or fewer 17 times (T4th) and one or zero runs 11 times (T1st).

★ The rotation paces the majors in WHIP (1.07) and opp. on-base pct. (.271) while ranking second in ERA (2.93) behind the Braves (2.95)...this includes an MLB-best 2.84 ERA (184.OIP, 58ER) in their last 37 starts dating back to April 4.

★ From April 22-May 11, the Rays bullpen produced a major-league best 1.20 ERA (60.OIP, 8ER)...in the five games since they have a 8.41 ERA (20.OIP, 19ER)...they had five blown lead losses in their first seven games compared to three in their last 37 games.

**FISH ARE FRIENDS NOT FOOD**—Today, the Rays and Marlins continue the Citrus Series as part of MLB's second annual Rivalry Weekend...the Rays lead the all-time series, 85-64, after the clubs split the 2025 season series, 3-3...the Rays have won nine of 14, 17 of 23, and 29 of their last 37 against the Marlins...Tampa Bay has won 11 of its last 14 series against Miami, including eight straight from May 14, 2019-Aug. 31, 2022...since 2019, the Rays 28-8 (.778) record is the second best by any team against a single opponent (min. 20G) behind the Yankees 33-9 (.786) against the Royals.

★ Five active players today (**Nick Fortes**, **Cole Sulser**, **MIA Pete Fairbanks**, **MIA Calvin Faucher**, and **MIA Christopher Morel**) have played for both clubs in their careers.

★ The Rays held an all-time record of 46-47 against Miami prior to **Kevin Cash** becoming manager in 2015...under Cash, the club is 39-17 and won a franchise-best nine straight games against the Marlins between July 22, 2018-Sept. 4, 2020.

★ Since the start of 2025, **Yandy Diaz** has gone 9-for-29 (.310) with 1 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, a .552 slugging pct., and a .907 OPS in seven games against the Marlins.

**OLD BAY COMES TO TAMPA BAY**—Tomorrow, the Rays begin a three-game set with the Orioles, their first of four series this season...last year, the team went 6-7 against Baltimore and 4-3 at Steinbrenner Field...the Rays tied their largest come-from-behind victory (3x) on June 18, 2025 vs. BAL (12-8) after going down 8-0 in the 2nd inning...the Rays are 246-232 all-time against the club and 98-84 since **Kevin Cash** became manager in 2015.

★ In 12 games against the Orioles last season, **Yandy Diaz** slashed .419/.510/.605 (18-for-43) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 7 BB, and a 1.114 OPS...since 2023, he has hit safely in 32 of 37 games and batted .319 (46-for-144) against Baltimore.

★ Tomorrow's probable starter, **Shane McClanahan**, has not allowed a run over his last four starts (April 25-pres.)...it ties with **Drew Rasmussen** (May 17-June 3, 2025) for the longest scoreless start streak by a traditional starter in franchise history...he is 6-0 with a 2.86 ERA (50.OIP, 16ER), five quality starts, and 57 strikeouts in nine career starts opposite the Orioles.

**TURNING BACK THE CALENDAR**—On May 17, 2010, **Jason Bartlett** executed the first walk-off bunt in franchise history when he squeezed in **John Jaso** from third base to defeat Cleveland, 4-3, in 11 innings.

**TODAY'S START**—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber this afternoon for his ninth start of the campaign and 139th career appearance (90th start)...min. 40.0 IP, ranks second in the AL in opp. on-base pct. (.229), is third in WHIP (0.91) and walk rate (4.1%), fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.14), fifth in opp. average (.198), sixth in opp. OPS (.575), and seventh in ground-ball rate (48.7%)...is 29 strikeouts shy of 500 for his career.

★ Min. 150.0 IP, his 2.19 ERA (185.0IP, 45ER) in day games ranks fourth among active pitchers, trailing TEX Jacob deGrom (2.02), SF Tyler Rogers (2.14), and PIT Paul Skenes (2.18).

**LAST TIME OUT**—Rasmussen turned in his fourth quality start and second in as many outings on May 11 at TOR, earning the win in an 8-5 victory (W, 6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, BB, 6SO, HR)...worked a 1-2-3 opening frame before yielding two singles in the 2nd ahead of **Andrés Giménez's** two-out, three-run homer, which accounted for all of the damage against him in the start...allowed only one hit following the long ball, retiring 13 of his final 15 BF from that point on, including each of his final 8 BF...tossed a career-high 100 pitches in the outing, becoming the second Ray to reach the century mark this season along with **Joe Boyle** (104) on April 3 at MIN...at 30 years, 288 days, became the oldest Rays pitcher to toss 100 pitches or more in a road outing since **Charlie Morton** (100) on Aug. 10, 2019 at SEA (35.271).

★ He surpassed the 500.0-inning mark for his career during the 3rd frame.  
★ Of the 17 runs Rasmussen has permitted this season, 12 (70.6%) have come on the 7 HR against him.

**FISH AREN'T FRIENDS**—Across six career appearances (4 starts) opposite the Marlins, Rasmussen is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (26.0IP, 6ER) and 0.96 WHIP...this includes a 2.35 ERA (23.0IP, 6ER) across the four starts, three of which were quality and all of which have come since being acquired by the Rays in June 2021...the Rays are undefeated (4-0) when he starts against Miami, and he has a 1.50 ERA (18.0IP, 3ER) in his last three starts opposite the club, striking out 12 against one walk and 1 HR in those games.

★ He is 4-2 with a 2.64 ERA (61.1IP, 18ER) over 17 career appearances (10 starts) vs. NL East competition, including 4-1 with a 2.86 ERA (50.1IP, 16ER) in the 10 starts...marks his second-lowest career ERA against any division, higher than only the AL East (2.51).

★ He has a 3.95 ERA (13.2IP, 6ER) in three Interleague starts this season despite posting a 0.88 WHIP and holding NL opponents to a .173 (9-for-52) clip... Rasmussen is 6-3 with a 2.93 ERA (86.0IP, 28ER) in his last 20 appearances (16 starts) vs. NL teams since the start of 2023.

**TROP TALK**—The Rays are 3-0 in Rasmussen's home starts, with the righty going 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA (18.0IP, 4ER), 18 SO, 2 BB, a 0.83 WHIP, and a .197 (13-for-66) opp. average in those outings...each of his first three starts at Tropicana Field have been quality, matching **Shane Baz** (2025) and **Aaron Civale** (2024) for the longest season-opening streak at home by a Rays starter since 2018...the last longer streak belongs to **Jake Faria** (5 starts) to open the 2017 campaign...a fourth straight quality start at home today would tie four other pitchers (5x) for the eighth-longest season-opening streak in club history (last: **Scott Kazmir** in 2008).

**MR. RELIABLE**—Rasmussen has allowed four runs or fewer in 46 straight regular-season starts (April 30-pres.), the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter, ahead of **Shane McClellan**'s 44-start run from April 29, 2021-July 26, 2022, and the longest active streak in the majors...he is 10 starts behind opener **Ryne Stanek** (56GS from May 26, 2018-July 16, 2019) for the longest streak by any starter in franchise history.

**RIGHT ON**—Right-handed hitters are batting .121 (7-for-50) with 15 SO and 0 BB against Rasmussen, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 50AB)...three of those seven hits came on May 5 vs. TOR—in his other six starts, righties have gone a combined 4-for-46 (.087) against him...right-handed batters are hitless (0-for-15) against his cutter, 1-for-10 (.100) off his four-seamer, and 4-for-29 (.138) against his sinker.

★ Min. 300 AB, his .184 (56-for-305) opp. average vs. right-handed batters since the start of 2025 ranks third in the majors behind PIT **Paul Skenes** (.178) and NYM **Freddy Peralta** (.183).

**MAY MOMENTUM**—Rasmussen is 9-3 with a 2.45 ERA (88.1IP, 24ER) and 0.98 WHIP over 21 career appearances (15 starts) during the month of May, his most wins during any month in his career and his second-lowest ERA and WHIP to August (2.03 ERA, 0.93 WHIP)...each of his last five May starts have been quality, a streak that began on May 17, 2025 at MIA...three of the five starts were scoreless.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST**—Rasmussen earned the starting nod for the Rays on Opening Day for the first time in his career, firing 5.0 innings of one-run ball on March 26 at STL...he became the 18th Opening Day starter in franchise history (12th right-hander), third in the last three seasons, and eighth in the last nine years on the heels of **Chris Archer's** four consecutive starts from 2015-18...at 30 years, 260 days old, he was the third-oldest pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day, trailing **Charlie Morton** (36.255) in 2020 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31.172) in 2002.

**BEST OF THE BEST**—Among active pitchers with 75 starts or more in their careers, Rasmussen's 2.91 ERA ranks third behind TEX **Jacob DeGrom** (2.59) and LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.83)...he also ranks third in opp. OPS (.603) and opp. slugging pct. (.334), fourth in opp. on-base pct. (.279), sixth in WHIP (1.06), and 10th in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.86).

**LEADING THE WAY**—Last season, Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER), trailing only DET **Tarik Skubal** (2.21), HOU **Hunter Brown** (2.43), and BOS **Garrett Crochet** (2.59)...under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43) en route to his first career All-Star selection...led the majors with 10 starts of 5.0 IP or more with 0 XBH allowed, most by an AL pitcher since CAL **Nolan Ryan** (13) in 1977...made a club-record 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, tied for third most in the majors behind DET **Tarik Skubal** (12) and PIT **Paul Skenes** (12).  
★ In 2025, he also became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011, and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.
