TIMES A CHANGING: The New York Mets announced that today's game against the Los Angeles Dodgers has been moved to 5:10 p.m. due to weather...Gates will open at 3:10 p.m. and parking lots will open at 2:10 p.m....All tickets for the originally scheduled 1:40 p.m. start will be good for the 5:10 p.m. game this evening.

METSCELLEANOUS: The Mets fell to the Dodgers, 5-1, last night...The Mets have dropped four straight including two in San Diego prior to the All-Star Break...New York begins the second-half with a seven-day, six-game homestand (0-2) against the Los Angeles Dodgers (0-2) and the Chicago White Sox (three games).

GET WELL SOON: RHP Sam Coonrod is slated to begin a rehab assignment with the St. Lucie Mets...He has appeared in 105 major league games and has posted a 7-5 record with a 5.27 ERA (57 ER/97.1 IP) with 44 walks and 95 strikeouts...He was claimed off waivers by the Mets on February 6, 2023.

HOW SWEEP IT ISN'T: The Mets are looking to avoid their fifth sweep of the season...The Mets were last swept by the Dodgers from August 13-15, 2021 at Citi Field.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 270-238 (including last night) in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .532 winning percentage during that span is the fourth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.627), St. Louis (.596) and Chicago (.576).

SIGN OF THE TIMES: Yesterday, the Mets announced that the club has signed third round selection (91st overall pick) RHP/OF Nolan McLean (Oklahoma State), third round selection (101st overall pick), RHP Kade Morris (University of Nevada) and fourth round compensation selection (134th overall pick) SS A.J. Ewing (Springboro HS, OH)...The Mets have signed 11 of 23 draft picks.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have played 41 games at Citi Field this season, tied for the fewest home games in the majors...The Phillies have also played 41 games at home this year...New York is 20-21 at Citi Field this season, posting a 3.96 ERA.

POWER UP: Brandon Nimmo hit his 14th home run of the season last night...He is three away from matching his career-high of 17, which he accomplished in 2018...Nimmo has hit six home runs in his last 14 games... All 14 of his home runs have come against right-handed pitchers.

SEEING DODGER BLUE: In 35 career games against the Dodgers, Brandon Nimmo owns a .340/.417/.538 slashline...During the Mets three-game series against the Dodgers in April, Nimmo batted .571 (8-14) and went 5-5 with a home run and two RBI in the series finale on April 19... In 26 career games against the Dodgers, Pete Alonso has seven home runs and a .530 SLG.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 27-5 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 11-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 4-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: Last season, the Mets won the season series over the Dodgers, 4-3... It was the first time the Mets won the season series over Los Angeles since 2015 (Also: 4-3).

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.86 ERA (2 ER/21.0 IP) over 25 games...That is the fifth-lowest mark during that span (Min. 15 relief appearances)...Raley has 17 holds, tied for the fourth-most in the NL and tied for the seventh-most in the majors.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Over his last 22 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .313 (25-80) with 18 runs, three doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 16 RBI, 13 walks and seven steals with a 1.069 OPS...Lindor ranks among NL leaders in fWAR (3.1, eighth), RBI (60, eighth), extra-base hits (41, tied for ninth), home runs (19, tied for 10th) and doubles (20, tied for 16th)...From July 6 - 7, Lindor became the only player in the Modern Era two eight or more hits, multiple home runs, multiple triples and multiple stolen bases over a two-game span...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 10 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 71 steals in 78 attempts...Their 71 steals are tied for ninth in the majors and tied for fifth in the NL...The team's 91.0 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 45 of their last 46 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 23 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 337 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor are one of four pairs of teammates to have 60 or more RBI this season, joining Los Angeles-NL's Mookie Betts, Freddie Freeman and J.D. Martinez, Atlanta's Matt Olson and Ozzie Albies and Adolis Garcias and Jonah Heim on the Texas Rangers...The duo also recorded 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break last season...Prior to 2022, only three other times have the Mets had pairs of teammates drive in 60 or more runs before the All-Star Break... David Wright and Carlos Beltrán both drove in 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break in 2006 and 2008...Bernard Gilkey and Todd Hundley both drove in 60+ RBI before the All-Star Break in 1996.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez has 17 homers this season, tied with Sean Murphy for the most by a catcher in the majors and the third-most among rookies...Alvarez has eclipsed Travis d'Arnaud's previous franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Alvarez's 17 home runs are the second-most in a season by a catcher in his age-behind Johnny Bench (26, age 21, 1969)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...Alvarez has five long balls in his last eight appearances and has scored at least one run seven out of eight games during the month of July...On July 7, Alvarez had his first career four-hit game...He is the youngest Met to collect four or more hits in a game since José Reyes recorded four hits on July 25, 2004 vs. Atlanta at 21 years and 44 days.

DR. ROBERTSON: On July 4-5, David Robertson recorded a save on back-to-back days for the third time this season (also, April 15-16 and May 30-31)...The veteran right-hander has posted a 3-2 record with 12 saves and a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) in 36 appearances this season...He has walked 11, while striking out 46...He ranks eighth in ERA among NL relievers...He is tied for 19th in the NL with 46 punchouts as a reliever... He is holding left-handed hitters to a .187 (14-75) average this year.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 5.0 innings against San Diego at Petco Park on July 9...Allowed five runs on six hits...Struck out seven and walked three while suffering the loss in the Mets' 6-2 defeat.

I LOVE LA: Today, Scherzer will make his second start against the Dodgers this season...In the first start against Los Angeles-NL this season, April 19, Scherzer pitched 3.0 scoreless innings before being ejected prior to the fourth inning after a foreign substance check...Scherzer has made 17 regular season appearances (15 starts) against the Dodgers in his career...In those appearances, he is 5-5 with a 2.51 ERA (27 ER/96.2 IP) and has 108 strikeouts...When facing the Dodgers at home, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (9 ER/36.0 IP) in seven appearances (five starts), with a 1-2 record...Scherzer also played part of the 2021 season in Los Angeles...He made 11 starts with the Dodgers, pitching to a 7-0 record and a 1.98 ERA (15 ER/68.1 IP).

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season on June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met... Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.

TERRIFIC TEN: Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 33 punchouts separating the two...With 77 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (3-3, 5.16)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 8.0 shutout innings against the Diamondbacks at Chase Field on July 6...Allowed three hits and one walk while striking out four batters in a 9-0 Mets victory.

COOKIE CRISP: In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 80th percentile in curve spin.

- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .400 (10-25) hitter in extra innings with a 1.389 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 172 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 441 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

- Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta...Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
