**TODAY'S TILT...**the Mariners play the last of a 4-game series against the Cleveland Guardians (1-2) this afternoon...Seattle will also host the New York Yankees (3 G, 3/30-4/1) on the homestand starting tomorrow night...this afternoon's game is televised exclusively on **Peacock's MLB Sunday Night Baseball** with **Jason Benetti, Rick Manning** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners dropped last night's game to the Guardians by a 6-5 score in 10 innings...it marked Seattle's first extra-inning affair of the season...Seattle registered a season-high 9 hits.

- **200 For Dan** - Tonight marks **Dan Wilson's** 200th game as Mariners manager...Dan's .563 winning percentage (112-87) in the regular season ranks **best in franchise history**.
- **NBC/Peacock** - Tonight's Mariners game will be televised exclusively on **Peacock's MLB Sunday Night Baseball**.

**SUNDAY STEELHEADS...**the Mariners will debut their 2026 Seattle Steelheads uniforms today...every Sunday home game, beginning today, the team will honor the 1946 Seattle Negro League team by wearing the Steelheads uniforms...as part of Steelheads Sundays, the Mariners are committing \$500,000 to support local Black-led baseball and softball initiatives...for more information, visit Mariners.com/Steelheads.

**FIRST ROUND STUDS...**the Mariners have former consecutive first-round draft picks making starts for them in 3 of their first 4 games of the season...2018 first round pick (14th overall) **Logan Gilbert** made his second consecutive Opening Day start for Seattle on Thursday...2019 first round pick (20th overall) **George Kirby** tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball and got the victory on Friday night...2020 first round pick (6th overall) **Emerson Hancock** makes his season debut tonight...also, 2022 first round pick (21st overall), infielder **Cole Young** is on the roster and hit a 3-run homer in Friday's win.

**NEW FACES...**five players have made their Mariners debut this season: right-handed pitchers **Cooper Criswell** and **Cole Wilcox**, infielder **Brendan Donovan**, outfielder **Rob Refsnyder**, and left-handed pitcher **José A Ferrer**...on the Mariners Opening Day roster this year, 22 of 26 players had suited up for Seattle in 2025...Wilcox was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on March 27.

**HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...**the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

**HEAR IT FROM THE PLAYERS:**

**THREE IN THE TOP-18...**among the Mariners all-time wins above replacement leaders (*Baseball-Reference*) in franchise history, there are 3 active players in the team's top-18: center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** (22.8 WAR, 11th), shortstop **J.P. Crawford** (21.0 WAR, 13th), and catcher **Cal Raleigh** (18.7 WAR, 18th)...Rodríguez led the team in WAR in 2022 (6.2) and 2023 (5.5), while Raleigh led the team in WAR in 2024 (4.6) and 2025 (7.4)...debuting for Seattle in 2019, Crawford is the longest tenured player.

**MARINERS TV...**the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on [Mariners.com/Watch](https://Mariners.com/Watch) to find providers in their area.

**THE COACHING STAFF...**manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Major League Coach and Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**...**Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

**NAYL'D IT...**first baseman **Josh Naylor** signed a 5-year contract through the 2030 season on Nov. 17, 2025 to remain in Seattle...Naylor was originally acquired by the Mariners from the Diamondbacks prior to the trade deadline on July 24, 2025...in 54 regular season games after the trade, Naylor hit .299 (58x194) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 9 home runs, 33 RBI and went 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .341 clip and slugging .490 (.831 OPS)...in 11 Postseason games, he hit .340 with 3 home runs, 5 RBI and a .966 OPS.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW...****Luke Raley** belted a 2-run homer in the bottom of the 10th last night, his third home run in as many games...Raley has homered in 3 consecutive games to start the season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he tied Robinson Canó for the franchise record?...Canó also homered in the Mariners first 3 games of the 2016 campaign...**if Raley were to homer tonight**, he'd become the seventh player in MLB history to homer in each of his team's first 4 games of the season, and would join Willie Mays (1971 Giants), Mark McGwire (1998 Cardinals), Nelson Cruz (2011 Rangers), Chris Davis (2013 Orioles), Trevor Story (2016 Rockies) and Christian Yelich (2019 Brewers)...lastly, Cleveland's Chase DeLauter, who has also homered in 3 consecutive games, has a chance to join that list tonight.

**ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MARCH 29**

- **2018 - Félix Hernández** becomes the seventh pitcher in Major League history to make 10 consecutive Opening Day starts, the longest active streak in the Majors at the time. The Mariners defeat Cleveland 2-1, thanks to a 2-run home run by **Nelson Cruz**, his fourth career Opening Day home run.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his season debut tonight and the 31st start of his career... this will be his 37th career appearance including the 8 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

**2025 SEASON...**Went 4-5 with a 4.90 ERA (49 ER, 90.0 IP), 64 strikeouts and 31 walks across 22 appearances (16 starts).

**BACK IN PEDROIA...**Closed out camp with a 1-1 record over 5 appearances...allowed 9 runs on 16 hits, recording 21 strikeouts and only 1 walk over 15 innings pitched for a 12.6 SO/9 and a 21.00 SO/BB.

**FACING CLEVELAND...**Owens a 2-0 record in starts facing Cleveland, boasting a 2.19 ERA, 5 strikeouts, 4 walks, and only 1 home run over 12.1 innings pitched in those two starts.

**BACK FOR MORE...**Recorded his 1st career win on 4/1/24 vs. Cleveland at T-Mobile Park, tossing 5.1 innings, giving up 4 hits (1 home run) and 3 earned runs with 1 strikeout...in his last start against the Guardians on 7/15/25, tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, marking the first time he has tossed 7.0+ shutout innings in his career...he faced the minimum (15 hitters) across his last 5.0 innings pitched.

**LIGHTS OUT...**In his July 15 start against the Guardians, became one of 4 Mariners pitchers to toss 7.0+ shutout innings during the 2025 season, joining Luis Castillo (done 2x, 5/19 at CWS and 7/5 vs. PIT), Bryan Woo (6/17 vs. BOS) and George Kirby (8/12 at BAL).

**LENGTH ON THE MOUND...**Has tossed 6.0+ innings in 10 of his 31 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season (last: 7/1 vs. KC)...the Mariners are 7-3 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 14-12 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings...has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 22 of 30 career starts, doing so in 12 of his 16 starts in 2025.

**BRINGIN' THE HEAT...**Increased his average fastball velocity by 1.5 mph (94.9 mph) in 2025, up from an average of 93.4 mph in 2024...in his relief appearance on Sept. 14 vs. the Angels, he reached a career-high 98.8 mph with his four-seam fastball, throwing a career-high 5 pitches above 98 mph in that game...in 2025, he threw 158 pitches above 96.0 mph.

**EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...**Became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts with no walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).

**TRANSITION TO THE 'PEN...**Made his first career appearance out of the bullpen on 9/1/25 at Tampa Bay, collecting 2 strikeouts across 1 inning pitched...owned a 2.08 ERA (2 ER, 8.2 IP) with a 1.269 WHIP and 4 strikeouts to just 1 walk allowed across 6 relief appearances in 2025.

**2025 POSTSEASON...**Made two appearances in relief during the Championship Series against Toronto...came into the game in the 9th inning both times, recording 3 strikeouts, 5 walks, and 2 runs on 2 hits in a combined 4.0 innings pitched.

**QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...**was 1-2 with a 5.24 ERA (26 ER, 44.2 IP) with a 1.54 WHIP and 56 strikeouts across 11 games (9 starts) with Triple-A Tacoma during the 2025 season...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, he is 8-5 with a 4.01 ERA (62 ER, 139.0 IP), 1.37 WHIP and 122 strikeouts across 28 appearances (26 starts) with Tacoma...tossed a complete game shutout across 9.0 innings on July 21, 2024 with Tacoma.
