SEATTLE MARINERS (41-40) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-40)

June 25, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #81/Home #42

RHP Bryce Miller (3-1, 1.58 ERA) vs. RHP Bubba Chandler (2-7, 4.62 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first two games of this six-game homestand vs. Seattle (Tuesday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (Friday-Sunday) after picking up an 11-1 win on Wednesday at PNC Park...Will embark on a seven-game road trip to Philadelphia (June 29-July 2) and Washington (July 3-5) after this homestand...Have scored the fourth-most runs (404) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (433), Los Angeles-NL (423) and Milwaukee (407)...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (733) in Major League Baseball, behind Milwaukee (769), Philadelphia (760) and Cleveland (739)...Have the third-best batting average (.257) in Major League Baseball, behind only Los Angeles-NL (.262) and San Francisco (.257).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh can win its fourth straight series against American League teams with a win today vs. Seattle (the team swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston and won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics)...The Pirates have won four straight interleague series (within a season) twice since interleague play began in 1997, coming from June 15-July 5, 2015 and April 25-July 25, 2018...Pittsburgh can also win its seventh straight interleague series at PNC Park with a win today (the team swept a three-game series last year from July 21-23 vs. Detroit, won two of three games from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, won two of three games from September 19-21 vs. the Athletics, swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay and swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota)...The Pirates have won seven straight interleague series at home once since interleague play began...They picked up series wins in seven straight home interleague series from June 18, 2010-June 24, 2012.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds went 2-for-4 with an RBI double, a walk and a run scored on Wednesday vs. Seattle and has now reached base safely in 29 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...That is a new career-high streak (within a single season), surpassing another 28-game streak from August 29-September 30, 2023...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the third-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25) and Chicago (NL)'s Ian Happ (30 games, April 5-May 9)...Reynolds is 39-for-105 (.371) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 17 walks, a 1.140 OPS and 23 runs scored during the streak...He has also hit safely in 14 straight games (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), going 22-for-54 (.407) with six doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, a 1.263 OPS and 11 runs scored during that streak...That is tied with another 14-game hitting streak from June 14-30, 2021 for the third-longest hitting streak of his career, trailing only a 25-game hitting streak from June 1-29, 2024 and a 17-game hitting streak from May 23-June 9, 2019.

O'YEAH: Ryan O'Hearn was 4-for-5 with a career-high three doubles, three RBI and two runs on Wednesday vs. Seattle...He was the ninth Pirate (since RBI became official in 1920) with four hits (including three doubles), three RBI and two runs in a game, joining Cotton Tierney (May 7, 1923 vs. St. Louis), Frank Thomas (May 2 [G2], 1954 at Chicago), Lee Walls (May 2, 1956 at St. Louis), Willie Stargell (August 1, 1970 at Atlanta), Bill Robinson (June 9, 1978 vs. Cincinnati), Kevin Young (August 4, 1998 vs. Colorado), Corey Dickerson (June 26, 2019 at Houston) and Starling Marte (July 24, 2019 vs. St. Louis)...O'Hearn is 37-for-123 (.301) with an .893 OPS at PNC Park this year.

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 2-for-5 with two runs on Wednesday vs. Seattle and now has multiple hits in three straight games (since Sunday at Colorado) for the second time in his career (also four straight, July 2-5, 2023)...His 29 multi-hit games are tied with San Francisco's Luis Arraez for the second-most in Major League Baseball, trailing Miami's Otto Lopez (33).

FROM THE ASHES: Braxton Ashcraft struck out 10 batters and did not issue a walk over 6.0 innings on Wednesday vs. Seattle, marking his second start with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks issued (also May 31 vs. Minnesota)...He became the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with two such starts in a season...It was Pittsburgh's third game with at least 13 strikeouts and zero walks (also April 5 vs. Baltimore and May 31).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 25, 2024: Bryan Reynolds extended his hitting streak to 22 straight games by going 2-for-5 with a two-run home run in Pittsburgh's 9-5 win over Cincinnati at Great American Ball Park. Jared Triolo also hit a two-run blast, while Nick Gonzales was 3-for-4 with an RBI in the victory. Starter Mitch Keller improved to 9-4 after allowing four runs (three earned) and striking out six Reds in 5.2 innings of work.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing two runs over a career-high-tying 6.0 innings (also last year on September 13 at Washington and this year on April 17 vs. Tampa Bay) in Pittsburgh's 4-3 loss on June 19 at Colorado...He was the third Pirate to have a quality start with 75 or fewer pitches so far this year, joining Mitch Keller on April 8 vs. San Diego and Carmen Mlodzinski on May 8 at San Francisco... Chandler has a 3.18 ERA (17.0ip/6er) and a .167 batting average against (10-for-60) over his last three outings (two starts), dating back to his outing on June 7 at Atlanta.

RIGHT ON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .201 batting average against (28-for-139) and a .605 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)'s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco's Heliot Ramos (May 10).

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodriguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

DYNAMITE DEBUT: Chandler secured a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut on August 22 vs. Colorado...He was the first Pirates pitcher to earn a save in his MLB debut (stat became official in 1969), and he was one of four Major Leaguers to earn a 4.0-inning save in his MLB debut, joining Boston's Bob Stanley (April 16, 1977 at Cleveland), St. Louis' Zack Thompson (June 3, 2022 at Chicago-NL) and San Francisco's Keaton Winn (June 13, 2023 at St. Louis)...He was the only one to not surrender a run.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Friday night's game against Cincinnati at PNC Park.

 Is 10-for-34 (.294) with seven RBI and seven runs scored over his last 13 contests (since 6/10 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...Has gone 4-for-13 (.308) with RISP.
 Is 9-for-24 (.375) out of the No. 7 spot of the lineup...Is 8-for-20 (.400) with a double, two triples, two homers and seven RBI over his 10 home games.
 Hit his first two Major League homers, including a go-ahead, three-run home homer in the eighth inning, in the 9-8 win on 6/10 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

 Has made three starts in center field, two starts in right field, one start at first base and one start in left field (last in center field on 6/19 at Colorado).

 His 29 multi-hit efforts (last, Wednesday vs. Seattle) are tied for the second-most in all of MLB...Is 13-for-44 (.295) out of the No. 4 spot of the lineup.
 His 31 RBI with RISP are tied with Brandon Lowe for the third-most on the Pirates...His .297 average (83-for-279) ranks ninth in the National League.

 His .857 OPS out of the leadoff spot is fourth in the National League (minimum 100 plate appearances)...Has an .804 OPS over 19 games this month.
 Ranks first among National League first basemen/second among Major League first basemen with a .392 OBP, behind only the A's Nick Kurtz (.429).

 Hit the game-winning home run in the ninth inning on 6/16 at the Athletics (it was his eighth career game-winning RBI in the ninth inning or later).
 His 18 home runs this year are already the most by any Pittsburgh second baseman in a single season since Neil Walker (23) during the 2014 season.

 Is 39-for-105 (.371) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 17 walks and a 1.140 OPS during his 29-game on-base streak (since 5/23 at Toronto).
 His .957 career OPS during the month of June ranks second in Bucs history among those w/at least 675 plate appearances, behind Ralph Kiner (.992).
 Is 22-for-54 (.407) with six doubles and five home runs on his 14-game hitting streak...Has six hits across his last eight at-bats with RISP (since 6/17).

#13 ENDY RODRÍGUEZ (C/1B)
