METSCELLANEOUS: On Sunday, the Mets fell to the Blue Jays, 6-4, completing a three-game sweep at the hands of Toronto...New York is coming off a six-game homestand (3-3) against Philadelphia (3-0) and Toronto (0-3)...The team enjoyed an off day before the start of a sixgame road trip to Atlanta (three games) and Pittsburgh (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the Mets reinstated catcher Omar Narváez from the 60-Day IL ... Narváez has been on the IL since early April with a left calf strain...In order to make room, catcher Tomás Nido was designated for assignment... Narváezwas 4-19 (.211) with one double, four RBI and five walks in six rehab games between Brooklyn (A+) and Syracuse (AAA).

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is set to make his seventh start of the season tonight...Over his last two starts, Carrasco is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP) with three walks and eight strikeouts...In five career games (four starts) against Atalanta, Carrasco is 2-2 with a 4.30 ERA (11 ER/23.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts.

TURNED A CORNER: The Mets have received eight quality starts from their staff in the last 14 games...New York had eight quality starts through the first 46 games of the season...Over the last 14 games, Mets starters have posted a 3.06 ERA (27 ER/79.1 IP) with 28 walks and 76 strikeouts.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 25 games. Starling Marte is batting .298 (25-84) with 12 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a .344 OBP and a .405 SLG...He has safely reached base in seven of his last eight games, batting .346 (9-26) with six runs, one double, one triple, one home run, three RBI with a .414 OBP and a .577 SLG.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: The Mets are taking their first trip to Truist Park this season...New York is 22-30 all-time at the ballpark...Mark Canha has hit .303 (10-33) with three runs, four doubles, two home runs, four RBI, three walks with a .378 OBP and a .606 SLG...Tommy Pham has batted .275 (11-40) with nine runs, one double, four home runs, eight RBI, 10 walks with a .423 OBP and a .600 SLG...Starling Marte has hit seven home runs in 25 career games at the yard.

HOTLANTA: Jeff McNeil has hit .395 (34-86) with 12 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, four walks with a .429 OBP and a .570 SLG.. In seven games at the ballpark in 2022, McNeil recorded a hit in six of those games, batting .517 (15-29) with five runs, three doubles, one home run, two RBI with a 1.241 OPS.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham went 2-4 with two runs, two home runs and two RBI on Sunday...Over his last 10 games, Pham is batting .360 (9-25) with four runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, seven RBI, four walks with a .448 OBP, a 760 SLG and a 1.208 OPS.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has hit 21 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 47 RBI are fifth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 427 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)... Alonso has appeared in all 57 of the Mets games this year.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 12-8 against the division this year... The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

CANHA GET AN AMEN ?: Over the last 17 games, Mark Canha is 14-45 (.311) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, seven walks with a .426 OBP, .489 SLG and a .915 OPS...He has safely reached base in each of his last 12 games with a plate appearance, batting .313 (10-32) with five runs, two home runs, six RBI, seven walks with a .950 OPS in that span.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 20 errors in 60 games this year, the fewest errors in the majors...New York owns a .990 fielding percentage... Their .990 fielding percentage also leads the major leagues.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost four straight and six of their last seven at Truist Park...New York is 22-30 all-time at the ballpark.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 46-13 in the first inning this year.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 33 games on the road this year, tied for the third-most in the majors...New York is 15-18 with a 4.85 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 277 strikeouts on the road are the third-most in the majors.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting .354 (46-130) with 18 runs, eight doubles, three triples, two home runs, 17 RBI, 16 walks with a .424 OBP and .508 SLG in 34 games on the road this season...His .354 road average ranks second in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .399 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

BROOKS WAS HERE: Brooks Raley allowed four earned runs in one inning of work on April 4 in Milwaukee...Since then he has pitched to a 1.04 ERA (2 ER/17.1 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...Since returning from the IL, the southpaw has not allowed a run in any of his last 10 games, striking out 11 over those 8.1 innings.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 16-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 6-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 27-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 122 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the fifth-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for third in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets lead the major leagues with an 87.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 17 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 331 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals...Pete Alonso has stolen 12 bases in 13 tries in his career.

RISP: The Mets are hitting .237 (108-455) with runners in scoring position, ranking 11th in the NL and 23rd in the majors this year...Last season, New York batted .269 (371-1,378), good for third in the NL and fourth in the majors.

LATELY: The Mets lead the majors with a 2.00 ERA (12 ER/54.0 IP) since May 29 (span of six games).

BULLISH PEN: New York has six blown saves this season, tied for the fifth fewest in the majors, one behind the league leaders.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win after tossing 6.0 innings at Citi Field against the Phillies on May 31...Allowed one earned run on six hits and one walk while fanning four Philadelphia batters...Pitched to his second quality start in a row, the first time he has accomplished the feat since September 10-15, 2022.

AT THE HOME OF THE BRAVES: Carrasco will face Atlanta for the sixth time in his career...In his last start against the Braves on August 15, 2022, he suffered the loss after allowing three earned runs in 2.0 innings on four hits and one walk... Throughout his career against the Braves, Carrasco has pitched to a 4.30 ERA (11 ER/23.0 IP) and holds a 2-2 record, with both wins coming when pitching at Citi Field...His last win against the Braves was on August 4, 2022, during which he threw 6.0 innings, allowing three earned runs on four hits and one walk while striking out six batters in a 6-4 Mets victory...Has a 1.93 ERA (3 ER/14.0 IP) when facing Atlanta at home compared to an 8.00 ERA (8 ER/9.0 IP) against Atlanta on the road.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his last two starts, Carrasco has allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco has fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

WINNER, **WINNER**: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES & MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1479.1...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 289 and 242, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
