METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Padres, 2-1, last night...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day homestand (0-2) against the Padres (0-2) and the Yankees (two games)...The Mets are 46-11 when scoring first this season...New York is now 21-6-3 in 30 series this year.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures for the Subway Series, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays...Gates will open at 5:10 p.m., while parking lots open will open at 4:10 p.m...The Mets will offer \$5 Nathan's Hot Dogs at concession stands between 5:10 - 6:10 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday.

BREAK THE STREAK: The Mets have dropped three straight games...The last time the Mets lost four or more games in a row was a five-game skid from September 21-26, 2021...It is tied for their longest losing streak of the season (also, June 26-29)...The Mets will look to avoid their third sweep of the season...If the team loses, it would be their first sweep at the hands of the Padres since August 13-15, 2002.

MAY 1?: Trevor May will begin a rehab assignment with Double-A Binghamton today...May was placed on the injured list on May 3 with right triceps inflammation...He has appeared in eight games this year allowing eight runs in 8.1 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Overall, he has appeared in 76 games with the Mets, posting an 8-3 record with five saves and a 4.18 ERA (33 earned runs/71.0 innings) with 27 walks and 88 strikeouts.

GIL GETS THE CALL: Today, Gil Hodges will be honored in Cooperstown, NY as he is inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame...Hodges was elected by the Golden Days Era Committee, which considered a 10-person ballot comprised of candidates whose primary contribution to the game came from 1950-69...Hodges played 18 seasons with the Dodgers and the Mets from 1943-63, earning eight All-Star Game selections and three Gold Glove Awards at first base...He topped the 20-homer mark in 11 straight seasons from 1949-59, drove in 100-or-more runs each year from 1949-55 and played on seven pennant winners and two World Series champions, ending his career with 370 home runs - the third-most by a right-handed hitter at the time of his retirement...He would go on to manage the Senators and Mets for nine seasons, leading New York to a memorable World Series title in 1969...Hodges is one of 17 players, coaches or managers who are in the Hall of Fame who have been a member of the Mets organization.

FOR STARTERS: Mets starters have posted a 1.67 ERA (15 earned runs/80.2 innings) in the team's last 13 games with 95 strikeouts and 17 walks...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.06 to 3.69 in that span that began on July 7...According to Elias, New York's 13 straight games with two or fewer runs allowed by the starting pitcher is a team record, surpassing a 12-game streak from May 3-16, 1998...It is tied for the longest streak in the majors this season (Minnesota has done it twice)...The last team with a longer streak was Milwaukee, who had 15 straight games with two runs or fewer from their starters from September 14-29, 2019.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York's 2.37 (46 earned runs/174.1 innings) team ERA this month is the best mark in the majors...The club's 214 strikeouts in July also top the majors...Mets starters have gone 7-5 with 2.42 ERA (30 earned runs/111.2 innings) with 25 walks and 143 strikeouts in 19 games in July...Their 2.42 ERA is the second-best in The Show, while their 143 strikeouts from starters in July is the most in the majors.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank second in the majors with 915 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 729 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game seven times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 50 times this year, the most in the majors.

ROAD TO 100: Carlos Carrasco is one win away from 100 for his career...He is seeking to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone...If he earns the win today, it would be in his 273rd career game, making him the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to reach the mark...His 10 wins on the season are tied for fourth in the majors...Carrasco has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018)...He has gotten to 10 wins before the All-Star break three times before (2015, 2017, 2018).

TO THE RIGHT: The Mets are batting .257/.325/.404 against right-handed pitchers this season...Their .257 average is the best in the National League and is third in the majors...Their .325 OBP is second in the NL and fourth in The Show.

BACH IN THE NEW YORK GROOVE: On Friday, the Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh in exchange for RHP Colin Holderman...He will wear #32...Vogelbach, 29, had 10 doubles, a triple, 12 home runs, 34 RBI and 29 runs scored in 75 games for the Pirates this season...He has posted a .338 on-base percentage and a .430 slugging percentage...His 11 home runs as a designated hitter are tied for the second-most in the NL behind Bryce Harper...His 149 wRC+ is tied for 15th in the majors (min. 200 PA)...He has an .817 career OPS vs. righties and 55 of his 61 career home runs have come against right-handed pitchers.

SWIPE RIGHT: Francisco Lindor stole his 10th base of the season in the first half finale at Chicago-NL on July 17...Stole 10 bases all of last season...He is one of five players in the majors with 10+ home runs and 10+ steals in at least seven of the last eight seasons, joining José Ramirez, Trea Turner, Mookie Betts and Marcus Semien.

PADRES-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 6-5 against the Padres at Citi Field since the start of the 2018 season.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 58 games this season, tied for the second-most in the National League...Their .611 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 58-37 record through the team's first 95 games...Only the 1986 (65-30) team posted a better record through the first 95 games of the season...The 1988 and 1984 teams also went 58-37 through the team's first 95 games.

HERE COMES TREVOR: Trevor Williams has posted a 1.57 ERA (four earned runs/23.0 innings) with nine walks and 28 strikeouts in 10 appearances as a reliever this year...Overall, he is 2-5 with a save and a 3.43 ERA (22 earned runs/57.2 innings) with 15 walks and 54 strikeouts in 18 games (eight starts) in 2022.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 64 times this year...The Mets have been hit 298 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 65 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 49 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 39 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has tied a franchise record with 50 HBP in his career...Michael Conforto was also plunked 50 times...Pete Alonso is one away from tying the record as well.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded a hit in six of his last seven games...He is batting .284/.348/.538 with 18 home runs and 62 RBI against right-handed pitchers this year...This compares to a .230/.337/.471 slashline with six home runs and 16 RBI against southpaws...He owns a .302/.391/.553 slashline in night games this year...His .302 average under the lights ranks sixth in the National League.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 45 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the fourth-fewest in the majors and tied for the second-fewest in the Senior Circuit...By comparison, the Braves have played 53 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 28-17 at home this year...They are sixth in the majors and third in the National League with a .622 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.27 ERA with 134 walks and 440 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the NL.

ADAM EXPLAINS EVERYTHING: Adam Ottavino is ninth in the majors in lowest average exit velocity at 84.5 MPH...He has allowed three earned runs over his last 27 appearances, posting a 3-1 record with a 1.00 ERA (three earned runs/27.0 innings) with five walks and 27 strikeouts...Overall, he is 4-2 with a 2.45 ERA (10 earned runs/36.2 innings) with 10 walks and 44 strikeouts in 38 appearances this season...Right-handed batters are hitting .146 (13-898) against him this season.

LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE: Lindor has recorded 66 RBI in 94 games this year...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic...He's broken his own record for most RBI before the break (62) when playing with Cleveland in 2018...He has posted a 3.3 fWAR this year which places him 10th in the National League.

PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Edwin Díaz has converted 84 saves as a member of the Mets...That ties him with Roger McDowell (1985-89) for seventh place on the team's all-time list...Tug McGraw is next...He converted 86 saves with the Mets from 1965-74...Díaz has struck out 313 batters as a member of the Mets...That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 10 saves, a 0.46 ERA (one earned run/19.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 42 strikeouts over his last 20 appearances since May 27...He has recorded 20 saves this season, tied for the fifth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 76 strikeouts...His 17.84 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 76 of the 148 batters he faced, good for 51.4%...He is 2-1 with 20 saves, a 1.64 ERA (seven earned runs/38.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 34-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 49-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 49 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .908 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 17 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 27-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte is batting .364 (20-55) with four runs, two doubles, two homers, five RBI, four walks with a .417 OBP and a .509 SLG in 14 games this month...He has recorded a hit 12 of those 14 games...Dating back to June 28, he has hit in 15 of his last 18 games, batting .366/.416/.521 with five doubles, two homers, five RBI and four walks.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: On July 14 at Chicago-NL, Carrasco did not allow a run for the fourth time this season and the first since June 1 vs. Washington...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings with five hits, two walks and six strikeouts.

ROAD TO 100: Carrasco is one win away from 100 for his career...He is seeking to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone...The earliest he could accomplish the feat would be in his 273rd career game, making him the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to reach the mark...His 10 wins on the season are tied for fifth in the majors...Carrasco has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and has now earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 & 2018).

COOKIE'S KIDS: On Friday, Carrasco visited patients at the Cohen Children's Medical Center and gifted them with Mets swag, Cookie's Kids T-shirts and signed photos as part of the Cookie's Kids Program...Throughout this season, Carrasco is partnering with Northwell Health to meet with pediatric cancer patients and their families to share his inspiring story and show his support.

THAT'S QUALITY STUFF: Registered his sixth quality start of the season in his last start on July 14...Notched just two such starts last season...Earned back-to-back quality starts on May 3 (G2) and May 10, his first time since finishing the 2020 season with six in a row.

VS. SAN DIEGO: Faced the Padres for the first time in his career earlier this season on June 6 at San Diego...Earned the win through 7.0 innings of two-run ball with five hits and a season-high 10 strikeouts...Has made four starts against the National League West this season, going 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (five earned runs/25.0 innings)...Has pitched to a 3.31 ERA (25 earned runs/68.0 innings) with a 4-4 record in 12 games (11 starts) against the NL West in his career

HOMER HAPPY: Has not allowed a home run in consecutive starts after giving up eight homers across his five previous starts from June 6-July 3...Allowed just three home runs through his first 11 starts of the season...The eight longballs are tied for his second-most in any five-game span of his career.

SWING AND A MISS: Among MLB qualifiers, Carrasco ranks second with a 36.0% chase rate...Only Kevin Gausman of the Blue Jays has a better rate (41.6%)... Carrasco has generated a 44.8% chase rate with his changeup, his highest of any pitch...He ranks tied for 13th in the majors with a 32.8 strikeout percentage with the pitch (min. 50 PA)...His 39 strikeouts on his changeup are tied for the ninth-most in the majors.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.
