FROM 100 TO POSTSEASON

The Reds fell short in their bid to become the **third team** ever to make the playoffs following a **100-loss season** (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the **fourth Postseason team** with a **losing home record** during the regular season (**1981 Royals**, 19-28; **2001 Braves**, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ELIMINATED, AGAIN

Last night the Reds were eliminated from Wild Card contention...on 9/22 were eliminated from **NL Central Division** title contention...fell short in their bid to become the **first team** ever to **win a division** after **losing at least 100 games** the season before (62-100)...last season, the Reds were eliminated from the **Central** on **9/10** and from the **Wild Card** on **9/13**.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds finished **62-100** (.383) in **2022** and are **82-79** (.509) **this season**...among all **Major League** teams from **2022 to 2023**, the Reds will rank second to the **Rangers** (90-71, .559) for the largest increase in **wins** (+20, Tex +22) and largest increase in **winning percentage** (+.126, Tex +.139)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ROLLER COASTER

From **4/24-7/31** the Reds went **52-34** (.605), the second-best record in the **Major Leagues** behind the **Braves** (53-29, .646)...through games of **July 31**, the Reds led the **NL Central** by 1.5 games over the **Brewers** and by 5.0 games over the third-place **Cubs**...since then are **23-30**, including **10-17 in August** and **13-13 in September**.

KOMEBACK KIDS

The **Reds** and **Orioles** lead the Major Leagues with **48 come-from-behind wins**...the Reds won **24 games** in their **final plate appearance**, including **10 walkoff wins**.

- Selected from Louisville the contract of **RHP Alan Busenitz** (#78, BOOZ-nits) and optioned to the Reds' spring training complex **RHP Carson Spiers**.

TODAY'S GAME

- Is **Game 162** of the 2023 championship season, **Game 2** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Adam Wainwright's Cardinals** and **Game 5** (2-2) of a **5-game road trip** (1-1 at Cle).

SERIES NOTES

- The 19 runs in Fri's win were the most ever scored by the Reds vs the Cardinals in a 9-inning game...the Reds also scored 19 runs in a 10-inning win on 7/1/1956...the 17-run margin of victory was Cin's second-largest vs StL (19-1 win on 8/12/1882...courtesy @SlangsOnSports).
- The Reds have lost **11** of the **last 16 games** at **Busch Stadium** but **won 3** of the **first 5 meetings** here this season.

BIG ROAD MACHINE

- The Reds fell short in their bid to become **fourth Postseason team** to post a **losing home record** during the regular season (**1981 Royals**, 19-28; **2001 Braves**, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports
- Beginning **5/26** the Reds are **37-21** (.638) over their **last 9 road trips** covering **18 road series**...is the **best road record** in the Major Leagues during that span (Hou, 35-20, .636 & Tor, 33-19, .635).
- The Reds won **12 of their previous 18 completed road series**, including a streak of **7 straight road series wins** snapped by the Brewers in the last series before the All-Star Game break.
- From **5/26-7/6**, the Reds won at least **7 straight road series** for only the third time in their history (**1923, 1976**).

ROTATION

- Rookie pitchers** have made **61 starts** for the Reds, including **19** of the Reds' **26 games** so far in **September**.
  - LHP Brandon Williamson** (23gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, went 1-1, 5.89 in 4 starts in September.
  - LHP Andrew Abbott** (21gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-2, 6.10 in 5 starts in September.
  - RHP Connor Phillips** (5gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 1-1, 6.97 in 5 starts in September.
  - RHP Lyon Richardson** (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
  - RHP Carson Spiers** (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
  - RHP Fernando Cruz** (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started the 7-0 loss on 9/19 vs Min.
- Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson** and **Phillips** made their **Major League debuts** this season.

ROSTER NOTES

- 65 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, second-most of any team in the Major Leagues this season (LAA, 66) and **1 player** shy of the single-season club record established in **2022**.
- 40 pitchers**, including position players **C Luke Maile** (4 times) and **IF Jason Vosler** (twice), have appeared in **at least 1 game** for the Reds, a new **single-season club record** (38 pitchers, 2022).
- 17 pitchers** have **started at least 1 game** for the Reds, tying the **single-season club record** (2003, 2022)...**17 starters** tie the Dodgers and Rockies for most in the National League...the Athletics lead the Major Leagues with **24 starters**.
- The Reds have **8 rookies** on today's roster.
  - RHP Fernando Cruz, IF Elly De La Cruz, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand, IF Noelvi Marte, IF/OF Spencer Steer, LHP Andrew Abbott, RHP Connor Phillips** and **LHP Brandon Williamson**.
- Had a season-high **12 rookies** on the 27-player roster for the **8/23** day/night doubleheader at LAA.
- 16 Reds players** made their **Major League debuts** this season, the most of any team in the majors...listed below in the order in which they debuted:
  - RHP Casey Legumina, RHP Levi Stoudt, IF Matt McLain, LHP Brandon Williamson, RHP Eduardo Salazar, OF TJ Hopkins, LHP Andrew Abbott, IF Elly De La Cruz, RHP Ricky Karcher, RHP Randy Wynne, RHP Jake Wong, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand, RHP Lyon Richardson, IF Noelvi Marte, RHP Carson Spiers, RHP Connor Phillips**.
- 23 rookies** played in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues and tied for **fourth-most in club history** (**26** in 1909, **25** in 2016, **24** in 1914 & 2017, **23** in 2022)...courtesy @EliasSports.

LET THE KIDS PLAY

- Reds rookies have produced **68 HR, 237 RBI, 50 go-ahead RBI** and **75 stolen bases**...are the most **HR, RBI** and **go-ahead RBI** totals by any Major League team's rookies and second-most **stolen bases** total by any team's rookies (Oak, 87sb)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Have established single-season club records for **HR** (68) and **stolen bases** (75) **by rookies**...have produced the Reds' second-most **RBI** (260 in 1935) in a season **by rookies**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- With **68 HR** the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (**Spencer Steer** 23, **Matt McLain** 16, **Elly De La Cruz** 13, **Christian Encarnacion-Strand** 13, **Noelvi Marte** 3)...the **2008 team** recorded **54 home runs** by rookies (**Joey Votto** 24, **Jay Bruce** 21, **Chris Dickerson** 6, **Ryan Hanigan** 2, **Paul Janish** 1).
- The Reds are the first team in Major League history with **3 rookies**, in a single season, with at least **10 HR & 10 stolen bases** each (**Elly De La Cruz, Matt McLain, Spencer Steer**).
  - For the first time since **1890**, when Cincinnati joined the **National League**, **4 Reds rookies** have produced at **least 10 HR**...prior to this season, never had more than 2 rookies in the same season with 10 HR...courtesy @EliasSports.
  - The Reds have 3 rookies with at least 89 apps (**Spencer Steer** 156, **Elly De La Cruz** 97, **Matt McLain** 89)...most recently produced in the same season 3 rookies with at least 89 apps in 2009 (**Chris Dickerson** 97g, **Paul Janish** 90g, **Ryan Hanigan** 90g).
- Elly De La Cruz** is the only Major League player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to produce in his first 95 career apps at least 88 hits, 13 HR, 40 RBI and 35 stolen bases...Gary Redus (1983), Barry Bonds (1986) and Chris Sabo (1988) are the only other players with least 80 hits, 10 HR, 40 RBI and 30 steals in their first 95 career games...courtesy @EliasSports.

Today's Pitcher - #21 Hunter Greene, RHP

RED HOTS

- Was the Reds' Opening Day pitcher.
- Today will make his fifth start since a 9-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/1-9/9)...will be his seventh career appearance and start vs the Cardinals.
- Was confirmed with COVID-19 following his start on 8/30...remained isolated in San Francisco for 5 days before returning to Cincinnati on 9/5...came off the COVID-19 injured list just prior to his start on 9/10 vs StL.
  - In his 7-1 win on 9/10 vs StL recorded his seventh career start of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer...4 Reds pitchers held the Cardinals to 1 hit, an RBI-single off Greene by Andrew Knizner in the fourth inning.
    - His 7 starts of at least 6.0 innings and no more than 2 hits allowed are the most by a Reds pitcher in his first 42 career starts.
  - In the 5-3 win on 9/15 at NYM took a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing a 3-run HR to Pete Alonso that tied the game at 3-3.
  - In the 5-3 loss vs 9/20 recorded a career-high 14 strikeouts, the most by a Reds pitcher since LHP Ron Villone had 16 strikeouts on 9/29/2000 at StL and the most by a Reds righthander since Mario Soto had 14 strikeouts on 9/30/1985 at SF...was his seventh 10-strikeout game in 44 career starts.
- Has made 7 starts since a 62-day stint on the injured list because of right hip pain (6/19-8/19).
  - In those 7 starts went 2-2, 6.42 (33.2ip, 34h, 27r, 24er, 16bb, 46k, 10hr, .252baa).
  - Missed a start on 6/6 vs LAD because of stiffness in his right hip...after he skipped that start went 1-0, 3.97 in 2 more apps before he went on the IL on 6/19.
  - In his last 5 starts before the injury went 2-1, 2.97 (30.1ip, 17h, 10er, 14bb, 41k, .163baa).
  - From 8/1-8/15 made 4 rehabilitation starts for the ACL Reds (1gs, 2ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 3k) and Louisville (3gs, 12ip, 6h, 5r, 4er, 7bb, 12k, 2hr).
- Has been charged with a team-high 4 pitch timer violations, most recently on 5/10 vs NYM (Pete Alonso walked).
- In the third inning on 6/1 at Bos recorded his 250th career strikeout (Connor Wong)...became the fourth-fastest pitcher to reach that milestone by innings pitched (184.0; Spencer Strider 158.1, Corbin Burnes 176.0, Kerry Wood 183.0).
- In the bottom of the fourth inning of that 8-2 loss on 6/1 at Fenway Park, Rafael Devers led off with a double that snapped Greene's hitless innings streak at 9.0 (18 strikeouts) covering 2 starts.
- Finished that start vs the Red Sox just 2 strikeouts shy of his third consecutive game with at least 10 strikeouts...no Reds pitcher, since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, ever has recorded at least 10 strikeouts in 3 consecutive apps...courtesy @EliasSports.
- In his first 42 career apps produced 7 starts of at least 6.0 innings with 2 hits or fewer, the most ever by a Reds pitcher in that few starts.
- In the 9-0 win on 5/26 at Wrigley Field, for the second time in his career threw at least 6.0 innings without allowing a hit (1-0 loss on 5/15/22 at Pit, 7.1ip).
- Produced a career-high 29.0-inning homerless streak between home runs by Oneil Cruz on 3/30 vs Pit and Elvis Andrus on 5/5 vs WSox.
- At age 23 years, 236 days became the first pitcher age 25 or under to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 1980, when at age 22 years, 232 days RHP Frank Pastore beat Phil Niekro and the Braves, 9-0...became the first second-year pitcher to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 26-year-old RHP Raisel Iglesias started the 6-2 win vs the Phillies in the 2016 season opener...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft.
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery.

# REDS PITCHERS

## REDS PITCHERS

Road Trip: 2-2, 7.41 (34ip, 28er), .295baa

- In last night's 15-6 loss, Reds pitchers issued a season-high 10 walks.
- 40 pitchers, including position players C Luke Maile (4 times) and IF Jason Vosler (twice), have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, a new single-season club record (38 pitchers, 2022).
- Rank 25th in the Major Leagues in ERA (4.83).

## REDS STARTERS

Road Trip: 1-2, 11.91 (11.1ip, 15er), .412baa

- In last night's 15-6 loss, rookie RHP Connor Phillies became the first Major League pitcher to throw in a start at least 12 pitches without a strike since SD's LaMarr Hoyt did it on 9/13/1986 vs Hou (13 pitches, 0k, 3bb, 1hbp)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- 17 pitchers have started at least 1 game for the Reds, tying the single-season club record (2003, 2022)...17 starters tie the Dodgers and Rockies for most of any team in the National League...the Athletics lead the Major Leagues with 24 starters.
- Rank 28th in the Major Leagues in ERA (5.42).
- The rotation's 782.0 innings pitched are eighth-fewest in the Major Leagues.

## REDS RELIEVERS

Road Trip: 1-0-1, 5.16 (22.2ip, 13er), .222baa

- In last night's 15-6 loss, the Reds used a season-high 8 relief pitchers.
- Prior to last night's game (8ip, 12er), in the previous 4 games posted a 0.47 ERA (19.1ip, 8h, 1er, 8bb, 16k), including 4.2 scoreless innings (3h) in Sun's 4-2 win vs Pit, 6.0 scoreless innings (1h) in Tue's 11-7 win at Cle and 3.0 scoreless innings by rookie Carson Spiers in Fri's 19-2 win at StL...in the previous 4 games, opposing batters went 8-for-62 (.129)...last night, Cardinals batters went 13-for-35 (.371).
- Lead the Major Leagues with 53 saves, their highest total since they led the National League with 56 saves in 2012, and rank second in the majors with 48 wins (SF, 50).
- Rank eighth in the National League in ERA (4.13).
- Their 649.1 innings in relief are sixth-most in the Major Leagues.

## 78 ALAN BUSENITZ, rhp

2023 Reds: 5g, 0-0, 3.60, 5ip, 8h, 1bb, 3k

- Last name is pronounced BOOZ-nits.
- Was promoted earlier today, when RHP Carson Spiers was optioned to Louisville.
- On 9/1 was designated for assignment as 1 of 8 transactions between games of that day's doubleheader vs Cubs...were 13 player transactions overall that day.
- On 9/4 cleared waivers and was outrighted to Louisville.
- In 47 relief apps overall for the Bats went 3-4, 4.94 with 9 saves in 1 chances (51ip, 51h, 31r, 28er, 25bb, 50k, 7hr, 2hbp, 1.49whip, .254baa).
- After his last stint with the Reds (8/16-8/19), finished the minor league season with a 13.91 ERA in his last 11 apps for the Bats (11ip, 21h, 17er, 6bb, 13k, 3hr).
- Is in his fifth stint with the Reds this season (1g from 5/14-5/15, 3g from 5/19-5/25, 0g from 6/21-6/23, 1g from 8/16-8/19).
- Was promoted the first time on 5/14...in that afternoon's 3-1 loss at Mia made his Reds debut in his first Major League appearance since 9/27/18 (9-3 win for Min vs Det).
- Spent the previous 4 seasons pitching for the Rakuten Golden Eagles in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball Pacific League (165g, 9-8, 2.83, 18sv, 155.2ip, 146h, 57bb, 125k, 5hr).
- Prior to 2023, made all 51 of his Major League apps for the Twins in 2017 and 2018.
- Earned the most recent of his 5 Major League wins on 8/23/18 for Min vs Oak (6-4 win).
- Does not have a Major League save.
- On 12/27 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract and invited to 2023 Major League spring training camp.

- Retired the first batter in 41 of his 56 relief apps...inherited 33 base runners, 10 scored...from 4/14-6/24 stranded 13 consecutive inherited runners, including the bases loaded in the 10th inning on 6/2 vs Mil...inherited the bases loaded a second time, on 9/30 at StL, and allowed back-to-back 2-run doubles.
- Made his 2 spot starts on 8/26 at Ari (1.1ip, 4k) and 9/19 vs Min (1.2ip, 4k).

- Is 1 of 3 Reds (Ian Gibaut 74, Buck Farmer 71) and 1 of only 15 pitchers in the Major Leagues with at least 71 apps.
- 3 pitchers have made at least 70 apps for the Reds for the first time since 2008 (LHP Jeremy Affeldt 74, RHP Francisco Cordero 72, RHP David Weathers 72).
- Posted a 2.10 ERA and 37 saves in his first 66 apps of the season through 9/15.
- In his last 5 apps of the season posted a 24.00 ERA (3ip, 8h, 9er, 6bb, 2k, .500baa).
- Is tied with Ari's Kevin Ginkel and Mia's Tanner Scott for the National League lead in wins by a reliever (9), 3 behind the Major League leader (TB's Colin Poche, 12).
- With 37 saves ranks third in the National League behind Camilo Doval of the Giants (39sv) and David Bednar of the Pirates (38sv).
- Will fall short in his bid to become the seventh Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves, the first since Jeff Shaw in 1997 (42).
- Edwin (205) and Alexis (47) Díaz have combined for 252 Major League saves, the second-highest total by brothers since saves became an official statistic in 1969 (Todd & Tim Worrell, 327 saves).

- Lead the Major Leagues with 189 stolen bases (AZ 2nd, 166sb), the Reds' highest total since 1997 (190sb)...haven't recorded more than 190 steals in a season since 1988 (207sb)...in 2022, the Reds recorded 58 steals...recorded at least 3 stolen bases in 27 games, the most such games by any team in the Major Leagues, with a season high of 9 steals on 6/3 vs Mil...are on pace to lead the National League in steals for the first time since 2015 (134sb).
- 11 Reds batters have produced at least 10 home runs, a single-season franchise record (10 batters twice, 1999 & 2000).
- Reds outfielders have 28 assists (TJ Friedl 9, Will Benson 6, Stuart Fairchild 5, Jake Fraley 3, Jose Barrero, Wil Myers, Henry Ramos, Nick Senzel, Spencer Steer).

## 30 WILL BENSON, of

Road Trip: 3gs in RF, 4-12, 1 3b, 1rbi, 3sb, 1 RF assist

- With 8 triples is tied with TJ Friedl for the team lead, tied for fifth-most in the Major Leagues.
- Went 1-for-25 in his first 10 apps covering 2 stints with the Reds...in 97 apps since he rejoined the team on 5/26 is hitting .291 (75-258, 15 2b, 8 3b, 11hr, 31rbi, 18sb, .385obp, .539slg).
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (4-9, .444, 1 3b, 1rbi, 1sb).
- Beginning 9/18 started in RF in 8 of the Reds' last 10 games (7-25, .280, 2 3b, 1hr, 4rbi, 3sb).
- Made 44 starts in RF (last, Fri at StL), 37 starts in LF (last, 9/16 at NYM), 1 start in CF (6/4 vs Mil) and 3 starts at DH (7/7 at Mil, 7/15 vs Mil, 7/28 at LAD).
- Will lead the team in starts in RF (44) and in LF (37gs).
- In the eighth inning of Fri's 19-2 win at StL was ejected by HP umpire Phil Cuzzi following a strikeout looking...was Benson's first career ejection.
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF.
- Was selected by Cle in the first round (14th overall) of the 2016 first-year player draft.
- On 2/8 was acquired from the Guardians for minor league OF Justin Boyd and cash or a player to be named (3/25, LHP Steve Hajjar).

## 44 ELLY DE LA CRUZ, inf

Road Trip: 4gs at SS, 6-17, 1 3b, 2hr, 7rbi, 2sb, 5r

- Is the only Major League player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to produce in his first 95 career apps at least 88 hits, 13 HR, 40 RBI and 35 stolen bases...Gary Redus (1983), Barry Bonds (1986) and Chris Sabo (1988) are the only other players with least 80 hits, 10 HR, 40 RBI and 30 steals in their first 95 career games...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Leads the team with 35 stolen bases, sixth-most in the National League.
- His 35 stolen bases are the most by a Reds rookie in a season since Billy Hamilton established the franchise record for rookies with 56 steals in 2014.
- Has a 4-game hitting streak (6-17, .353, 1 3b, 2hr, 7rbi, 2sb, 5r, .421obp, .824slg).
- The Reds were 27-33 (.450) when he was promoted on 6/6 to make his Major League debut...since then are 55-46 (.545)...started 95 of Cin's 101 games since his debut.
- In the 4-3 win on 8/22 at LAA, in his 64th career game, recorded his 20th stolen base to become the fastest player since 1900 to accumulate at least 10 HR and at least 20 steals...Barry Bonds did it in his 65th career appearance, just ahead of Reds rookies Chris Sabo (66g) and Gary Redus (67g)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- In Tue's 11-7 win at Cle produced his first career 2-homer game (4rbi) to snap his longest homerless drought of the season (28g, last HR on 8/23/g1 at LAA)...his second HR (2-run off Xzavion Curry) was the hardest hit ball by a Reds player in the Statcast era (119.2mph, 467 feet).
- Was National League Player of the Week for 6/19-6/25.

## 33 CHRISTIAN ENCARNACION-STRAND, inf

Trip: 4gs, 3-17, 2hr, 5rbi

- The name on the back of his jersey is shortened to Encarnacion...please reference Encarnacion-Strand everywhere else.
- Homered in 4 of his last 6 apps (10rbi) and in 7 of his last 11 apps (15rbi).
- In his last 21 apps beginning 9/1/g2 is hitting .320 (24-75, 2 2b, 8hr, 18rbi, 1sb, .370obp, .667slg), raising his season batting average from .245.
- Since his 7/17 promotion leads the team with 32 starts at 1B.
- Also made 22 starts at DH (last, Sat at StL) and since 9/16 his first 4 career starts at 3B (last, Sun vs Pit).
- In the seventh inning of the 9-4 loss on 9/8 vs StL played RF in his third professional appearance and only Major League appearance in the outfield.
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/17, when IF Kevin Newman went on the 10-day injured list, and that night vs SF started at DH in his Major League debut.
- In 67g for the Bats hit .331 (21 2b, 2 3b, 20hr, 62rbi, 2sb, .405obp, .637slg, 1.042ops).
- In August 2022 was acquired from the Twins, along with IF/OF Spencer Steer and LHP Steve Hajjar (rhymes with badger), for RHP Tyler Mahle.

## 17 STUART FAIRCHILD, of

Road Trip: 3g, 1gs in RF, 1-4, 1r

- Has made 8 apps since he was reinstated from the COVID-19 injured list on 9/18, including 2 starts in RF.
- From 9/9-9/17 missed 8 games while on the COVID-19 injured list...was 1 of 5 Reds players this month to be placed on that injured list.
- From 8/22-8/27 missed 7 games while on the 7-day concussion list.
- Suffered the head injury in the 10-3 loss on 8/20 vs Tor after running into the outfield wall...after the second inning left the game to begin concussion protocol.
- Has made 30 starts in LF (last, 9/1/g1 vs Cubs), 16 starts in CF (last, 8/15 vs Cle) and 18 starts in RF (last, Sat at StL).
- On Opening Day was promoted to the 26-player roster.
- Is his third stint with the Reds this season.
- In 24 apps overall for Louisville hit .277 (2 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 13rbi, 3sb, .831ops).

## 27 JAKE FRALEY, of

Road Trip: 1gs at DH, 0-4

- On 9/1, after 2 rehab apps for Louisville, was reinstated from the 10-day injured list.

- 3 pitchers have made at least 70 apps for the Reds for the first time since 2008 (LHP Jeremy Affeldt 74, RHP Francisco Cordero 72, RHP David Weathers 72).
- With 3 saves is tied with Buck Farmer and Lucas Sims for second on the staff to Edwin Díaz...entered this season with 1 career save, for the Reds in 2022.
- Earned his 3 saves on in the 6-4 win on 4/9/23 at Phi, 6-3 win on 9/4 vs Sea and 4-2 win on 9/24 vs Pit.
- 16 times threw more than 1.0 inning, including a season-high 2.0 innings 4 times (5/6 vs WSox, 6/8 vs LAD, 9/1/g2 vs Chc, 9/9 vs StL).

- Leads the Major Leagues with 17 bunt singles, ranks fourth with 8 sacrifice bunts and ranks 15th with 8 triples, tied with Will Benson for the team lead.
- Is hitting .354 vs LHP, the fourth-highest batting average of any player in the Major Leagues and the highest BA by any lefthanded hitter vs lefthanded pitchers (Freddie Freeman 2nd, .338).
