METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell Giants, 5-2, last night in San Francisco...The Mets have dropped two straight after winning six straight...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 12-5...The Mets are in the midst of their second trip of the season, a six-game trip (2-2) to Los Angeles-NL (2-1) and San Francisco (0-1)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning home for a seven-game home stand against the Cardinals (three games) and Cubs (four games).

RANK AND FILE: Pete Alonso is now one home run away from 200 for his career...He is rising the leader-board in several categories in franchise history:

KING LUIS: Luis Severino is set to make his fifth start of the year today in San Francisco...He is 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP) with nine walks and 21 strikeouts...He has tossed at least 5.0 innings in every start...After allowed three earned runs in his first start, Severino has gone 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA (2 ER/16.0 IP) with nine walks and 15 strikeouts.

REEDING RAINBOW: On Saturday, Reed Garrett earned his first career save yesterday...He has made six appearances this year and has yet to allow a run in 10.2 innings...He is 3-0 and has allowed two unearned runs, five hits and three walks...He has struck out 21 of the 41 batters he faced...His 21 strikeouts are the most in the major leagues.

THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS: Jeff McNeil is a .333 (23-69) hitter with 15 runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI with a .403 OBP and a .522 SLG in 18 games at Oracle Park...Harrison Bader is 14-56 with six extra-base hits in 17 games at the ballpark...Pete Alonso has homered seven times in 15 games at the ballpark.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is in the midst of their second road trip of the year...The team is 6-4 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .270/.343/.416 on the road this year...Their .270 batting average is the third-best in the majors as is their .343 OBP...The Mets have outscored their opponents 58-52 on the road this season...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 15 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .278/.349/.428 with 88 runs, 25 doubles, one triple, 17 home runs, 51 walks with an .777 OPS...Their .278 average and .349 OBP are the best in the majors, while their .777 OPS is fourth-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 88-68 in that span...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

ADAM'S SONG: After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made six scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit or a walk in those 6.1 innings, striking out 11 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (2 ER/8.1 IP) this season.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have taken the season series from the Giants in each of the last two years...The Mets have won the season series against the Giants in five of the last seven seasons they've matched up against each

HERE'S THE PITCH: New York owns the third-lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.56 (78 ER/197.0 IP) mark...Their 211 strikeouts are fourth in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.85 ERA (28 ER/88.1 IP) with 40 walks and 109 strikeouts...Their 2.85 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit...Their 109 strikeouts from the bullpen lead the major leagues.

SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR: Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in 14 straight games...He has posted a .333 OBP in that span...He has safely hit in six of his last eight games, hitting .333 (10-30) with five runs, two doubles, one home run, three walks, one steal, four RBI with a .394 OBP and a .500 SLG...He is batting .286 (6-21) against lefthanded pitchers in 2024...This includes a .524 SLG.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is batting .323 (21-65) with 13 runs, two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, six steals with an .855 OPS in 15 games since April 6...He has safely hit in 12 of those 15 games...The Mets are 12-5 in that span...He is 9-20 with three-extra base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...Overall, Marte is batting .286/.330/.451 with seven extra-base hits in 22 contests in

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: As a team, the Mets are batting .270/.336/.435 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .270 average is sixth in the major leagues, and fourth in the National League...Their .442 SLG ranks fifth in MLB...This compares to a .235/.322/.358 slashline against righties.

SWING AND NO MISS: Mets batters have struck out 159 times this year...That is the third-fewest in the major leagues...Overall, the team has posted an 19.6 strikeout percentage, which is the fifth-lowest in the majors and third in the National League...Jeff McNeil ranks eighth in the majors, striking out only 11.1% of the time.

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Luis Severino earned his second win as a Met on April 17 vs. Pittsburgh...He allowed one run on five hits, issuing three walks with four strikeouts to lower his ERA to 2.14 on the season.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

NEW STARTER IN THE CITI: Severino made his Citi Field debut in his Mets debut, recording 5.0 IP with a 5.40 ERA (3 ER/5.0 IP)...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks while pitching at home.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 809 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1.192) has recorded more.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the Al, in strikeouts (fourth, 230). innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

STRONG START IN SPRING: In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.
