METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 5-4, in extra-innings yesterday...The Mets are 3-2 in their last five games and 8-2 in their last 10 games...New York is 13-2-2 in 17 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (2-2) at the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (three games) and Angels (three games).

EXTRA, EXTRA! The Mets are 5-0 in extra-inning games this season...They are one of three teams who have not lost in extras in 2022 (also, Cincinnati and Washington, who are both 1-0)...Their five extra-inning wins are tied for second-most in MLB, trailing only the Padres, who are 6-3 in extra-inning games...Last season, the Mets were 11-7 in extra-inning games...Their 11 wins were tied for seventh in MLB and their .611 win percentage ranked seventh in the majors.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Joey Lucchesi turns 29 years old today...Lucchesi is recovering from "Tommy John" surgery which was performed in June of 2021...In addition, Bud Harrelson turned 78 years young today...Harrelson spent 13 seasons with the Mets...He was a two-time All-Star with the club in 1970 and again in 1971.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 37 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .661 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 37-19 record through the team's first 56 games...Only the 1986 (40-16) and the 1988 (38-18) teams posted a better record through the first 56 games of the season...The Mets are 18 games above .500, which matches their season-high...The last time the team was more than 18 games above .500 was when they were 19 games over .500 on October 1, 2015 (89-70).

TOUGH COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is tied for second in the majors with six wins...He has won five straight decisions for the first time since doing so from July 6-August 1, 2018...He is 5-0 with a 3.09 ERA (12 earned runs/35.0 innings) in his last six starts.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte has safely hit in 15 of his last 18 games and is batting .313 (25-80) in that span with 18 runs, five doubles, two triples, four home runs, 13 RBI, three walks and a .912 OPS in that stretch...He is batting .277 (57-206) with 35 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 33 RBI with a .447 SLG in 48 games this year.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last eight games, Tomás Nido is batting .391 (9-23) with five runs, a double, four RBI, three walks with a .896 OPS...Over his last 17 games, he is batting .300 (15-50) with five runs, two doubles, six RBI, five walks with a .364 OBP...He is 9-23 (.391) with runners in scoring position this season.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 18-11 on the road this year...Their .621 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 18th win on the road until July 3 in 2021 in their 43rd road game (18-25)...New York is batting .258/.327/.401 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average ranks third in the majors, while their .327 OBP ranks fourth.

ROAD WARRIOR: Pete Alonso is batting .277/.320/.555 with nine home runs and 31 RBI on the road this year...He owns a lifetime .946 OPS on the road...His .946 OPS is the highest in franchise history (min. 900 PA)...His .585 SLG on the road is also the best in franchise history...In 2022, his nine road homers are tied for third in the majors and are tied for the most in the NL...His 31 RBI on the road are second-most in the majors and top the NL.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has 22 RBI in his last 12 games and has 45 RBI this season, nine more than he had in the entire first half last year (87 games)...He did not reach 45 RBI last year until September 7 in his 102nd game of the year...Lindor is fourth in the majors and third in the NL in RBI...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 39 runs scored...Over his last 21 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .309 (25-81) with 21 runs, three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 26 RBI, 11 walks, three steals with a .385 OBP, a .543 SLG and a .929 OPS.

New York has homered in 11 of their last 13 games, hitting 19 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 34 home runs in their previous 43 games...New York ranks 17th in the majors and 10th in the NL with 53 home runs this year...Pete Alonso ranks tied for second in the majors and is tied for the NL lead with 16 round-trippers.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 10 games, J.D. Davis is batting .371 (13-35) with six runs, four doubles, four RBI, two walks with a .421 OBP, a .486 SLG and a .907 OPS in that span...Over his last 20 games, Davis is batting .277/.342/.385...He owns a .320/.407/.500 slashline in 18 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a .291 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .361 OBP and ninth with .457 SLG in those situations...Several Mets are hitting .300 or better with RISP...Jeff McNeil leads the club with a .395 (17-43) mark in those scenarios...J.D. Davis is hitting .400 (8-20), Tomas Nido is batting .391 (9-23), Francisco Lindor has hit .321 (18-56), Mark Canha is batting .326 (14-43) and Pete Alonso is hitting .360 (18-50)...Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, four more than any other hitter in the majors.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 1.67 ERA (five earned run/27.0 innings) over their last seven games...They have allowed 20 hits, walked five and struck out 22 in that span...The team's 3.36 ERA from relievers is third in the National League.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the sixth-most in the majors...He is season in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 41 strikeouts...His 16.28 strikeouts per nine innings is second in the majors and in the NL...He has struck out 41 of the 91 batters he faced, good for 45.1%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.38 ERA (six earned runs/22.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 22-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.78 ERA (71 earned runs/169.0 innings) with 69 walks and 279 strikeouts...His 279 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (308) and Josh Hader (299) have struck out more...Additionally, his 279 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Luis Guillorme is one of nine players in the majors with more walks than strikeouts this year (min. 100 PA)...He has 16 walks and 13 strikeouts this season...He has reached base safely in nine straight games dating to May 25, posting a .487 OBP in that span...He is batting .340/.434/.423 with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 16 walks and a steal with this season...After batting .071 (1-14) in his first eight games, Guillorme is batting .386 (32-83) with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 13 walks, a steal with a .469 OBP, a .482 SLG and a .951 OPS over his last 29 games...Among players with 100 or more plate appearances, Guillorme's .340 batting average is sixth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...His .434 OBP is fourth in the majors and the second-best in the National League.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Pitched with his father in attendance for the first time in his major league career on June 1 vs. Washington...Earned the win after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with four hits, five walks and five strikeouts...Marked his third scoreless outing of at least 5.0 innings this year, tied with Taijuan Walker and Tylor Megill for the most on the club...Has won five consecutive decisions for the first time since also winning five contests from July 6-August 1, 2018.

WALK THIS WAY: Issued just eight walks through his first nine starts to begin the year before giving up five free passes in his last appearance on June 1...Issued a walk his first time through the batting order in that outing for the first time this season...Was the only starter in the majors (min. 4 GS) without a walk in such a situation entering the game...The five walks matched his career-high, last done on August 12, 2020 vs. Chicago-NL while with Cleveland...His 2.05 walks per 9.0 innings and 5.5 percent walk rate remain the sixth-best marks in the National League...Also owns a 3.92 strikeout-to-walk ratio, eighth-best in the NL.

NEW FOE, WHO DIS?: Will be facing the San Diego Padres for the first time in his career...After the Padres, his former club, Cleveland, is the only team he has yet to pitch against...Has made three starts against the National League West this season, going 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (three earned runs/18.0 innings)...His first five appearances (2011-2017) against the division were all on the road, while four of his last six since 2021 have come at his home ballpark...Has pitched to a 3.39 ERA (23 earned runs/61.0 innings) with a 3-4 record in 11 games (10 starts) against the NL West in his career.

THE FIRST 10: Carrasco's six wins are tied with 2015 for his most victories through his first 10 starts to begin a season while his .857 win percentage is his best mark in that span...The six wins lead the Mets and are tied for the second-most in the majors this year...His 51 strikeouts are his third-fewest through his first 10 starts of a season; he had 60+ punchouts through his first 10 starts from 2014-2020...Has given up three home runs this year, tied with the 2014 season for his fewest allowed through his first 10 starts.

TOUGH COOKIE: Carrasco is one of eight pitchers in the majors, and the only Mets starter, to throw more than 7.0 innings in multiple starts this year...He did not allow a run through 11.0 innings from May 3-10, his longest such streak since also doing so in 11.0 straight innings from September 15-25, 2020...Has multiple scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings (also, April 10-21) in a single season for the first time since 2019.

WHAT A PITCH: Has struck out 20 batters with his changeup this year after just 11 in all of 2021...Carrasco ranks 11th in the majors with a 30.3 strikeout percentage and a 23.3 putaway percentage with his changeup (min. 50 PA)...Last season, Carrasco struck out 19.0 percent of batters on his changeup and registered a 12.8 putaway percentage.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs five wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.

LAST TIME OUT: Snapped a three-game win-streak with his first loss of the season on June 2 at Los Angeles-NL...Gave up two runs on seven hits and a walk with two strikeouts through 5.2 innings of work.

NL WEST: His 1.97 ERA against San Diego is his only sub-2.00 ERA against any opponent (min. 5 GS)...Has pitched to a 3.12 ERA (59 earned runs/170.1 innings) in 30 starts against the NL West in his career, his best mark against any division in the majors...His 3.12 ERA is 11th-best in MLB among pitchers who have made at least 20 starts against the division since 2015.

- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (six) and tied for second in games with multiple RBI (13) this season...He is the first player since Carlos Lee in 2005 with at least six 4+ RBI games in his team's first 55 contests...The only players with more through 55 team games are Juan Gonzalez (eight in 1998), Jimmie Foxx (seven in 1938) and Lou Gehrig (seven in 1930)...All three of those players finished the season with at least 157 RBI.
- Hit two homers and drove in five on June 4 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his 13th career multi-homer game (tied for most since 2019).
- Has a 1.419 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 18-50 (.360/.479/.940) with two doubles, nine homers, 41 RBI and 14 walks.
- After putting up a .744 slashline in April, owns a 1.019 OPS since May 1 (eighth-best in MLB)...Set a Mets record with 30 RBI in May...Willie Montañez (1978) had the old mark with 28 RBI in May...He is the seventh Met with 30+ RBI in a calendar month.
