METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 7-0, last night...The Mets continue a 10-day, 10-game homestand (2-2) against the Cubs (2-1), Braves (0-1) and Pirates (three games).

PROGRAMMING NOTE: As a reminder, tomorrow's contest against the Braves has been moved to a 7:10 p.m. start and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

HERE COMES YOUR 27TH MAN: RHP Reed Garrett will serve as the 27th man for both games of the doubleheader...The 30-year-old has appeared in three games with the Mets this season...In 25 games at Triple-A between the Mets and Orioles, Garrett has posted a 5-1 record with a 2.45 ERA (8 ER/29.1 IP) with 14 walks and 33 strikeouts.

REYES ON SUNSHINE: RHP Denyi Reyes is expected to start game one of today's doubleheader...The 26 year-old has appeared in six games with the Mets this year, making one start...He has struck out eight in 7.1 innings...In 15 games (13 starts) at Triple-A this season, Reyes is 1-2 with a 6.05 ERA (41 ER/64.0 IP) with 24 walks and 50 strikeouts.

JUST PEACHY: The Mets and Braves will play their second doubleheader against each other this season...The two teams split a twinbill on May 1, with the Mets losing game one, 9-8, and won, 5-3 in the nightcap...The two teams played two doubleheaders last year, on May 3 in New York and again on August 6 in New York...The Mets swept both twinbills...Prior to that, the Mets and Braves had split each of their previous three doubleheaders...The Mets have not been swept by the Braves in a doubleheader since they dropped both games on September 8, 2011 in New York.

DOUBLE DARE: The Mets are set to play their fourth doubleheader of the season today...The team split a twinbill on May 1 vs. Atlanta, were swept by the Tigers in Detroit on May 3 and swept a twinbill against the Guardians in New York on May 21...The Mets have played 27 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 26 of those 27 twinbills over the last two years...New York has swept eight of their last 14 doubleheaders, including one this year and five DH sweeps last season.

PUT ME IN COACH, I CAN PLAY..: Yesterday, Jeff McNeil played center field for the first time in his major league career...McNeil appeared at the position only once in professional baseball...On August 25, 2013, the left-handed hitter entered the game as a defense replacement, playing the final 2.0 innings in center for the Kingsport Mets in a 15-0 loss...According to Baseball Reference, McNeil played 21 games in center field in college at Long Beach State.

JEFF McHITS: In 19 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .288 (21-73) with 12 runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .366 and a .425 SLG...In 25 games (106 plate appearances) following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out seven times...He is batting .345 (121-351) in 97 games against NL East foes since the start of 2022...He is hitting .356 (31-87) against the Braves in that span.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 16-15 against the NL East this season...The team has posted a 4.05 ERA against their division, while hitting .242/.328/.393.

AW SNAP: Francisco Lindor's consecutive game streak was snapped at 223 games last night...It was the longest streak in franchise history...José Reyes previously held the Mets' record with 200 consecutive games played from 2005-06.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Francisco Lindor owns a seven-game hitting streak, batting .440 (11-25) with six runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, three walks with a .500 OBP and a .640 SLG in that span...He has safely hit in 11 of his last 12 games, batting .409 (18-44) with 11 runs, three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, six walks, with a .490 OBP, a .682 SLG and a 1.172 OPS.

LINSANITY: Over his last 44 games, Lindor is batting .304 (40-161) with 34 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 25 walks, 12 steals with a .400 OBP, a .565 SLG and a .965 OPS...Lindor has stolen 18 bases in 112 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso became the first Met to record four seasons with 35 or more home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 35 home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the NL with 87 RBI.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost four straight to Atlanta... New York went 6-3 against the Braves at Citi Field last year.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in a stretch where 19 of 25 games are at home...New York is 2-2 in that span...The Mets are 28-25 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.77 ERA in Citi Field...That is the fifth-lowest mark in the National League...This compares to a 4.93 mark on the road...The team's 53 games at home are the fewest in the majors.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season...He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is second behind Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 34-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 83 steals in 92 attempts...The team's 90.2 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 56 of their last 60 stolen base attempts

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2015, Yoenis Céspedes hit his first home run as a member of the Mets...The Cuban hit a solo homer to right-center field to put the Mets up 3-0 against the Rockies at Citi Field...New York would earn a shutout victory against Colorado, improving to 62-52 on the season...The Mets struck out 12 in the game...Jeurys Familia closed out the victory, converting his 32nd save of the season.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Ronny Mauricio socked two home runs for the Syracuse Mets last night...He finished the game going 2-4 with two runs, four RBI, a walk and two homers...In nine games this month, he has recorded five extra-base hits, putting up an .855 OPS...Overall, Mauricio is batting .290/.341/.497 with 64 runs, 27 doubles, two triples, 19 home runs, 63 RBI, with 19 steals and 27 walks in 101 games at Triple-A...He ranks as the fourth-best prospect in the organization according to the revised MLB Pipeline rankings.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Over six appearances this season with the Mets, Reyes is 0-1 with a 6.14 ERA (5 ER/7.1 IP)...Reyes began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run over five appearances (6.1 IP)...Reyes' lone start of the season came on May 1 vs. Atlanta at Citi Field in game one of a doubleheader...The right-hander allowed five runs over 1.0 inning in a 9-8 Mets loss.

SLINGIN' IT IN SYRACUSE: In 15 appearances (13 starts) with Triple-A Syracuse, Reyes is 1-2 with a 5.77 ERA (41 ER/64.0 IP)...In his last two starts with Syracuse, Reyes has tossed back-to-back quality starts and threw a season-high 7.0 innings on August 5 vs. Worcester...In that start, Reyes allowed one run on seven hits, two walks and five strikeouts.

2022: Reyes made his major league debut on May 13 with Baltimore and tossed 2.0 perfect innings in relief at Detroit...In his first career major league start, May 28 at Boston, Reyes allowed one earned run over 3.2 innings in the second game of a doubleheader at Fenway Park...Reyes finished the 2022 season with a 2.35 ERA (2 ER/7.1 IP) over three appearances with Baltimore.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox....Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his fourth start of the season on August 6 in Baltimore...He threw 6.0 innings and allowed two earned runs on six hits and two walks while striking out a season-high six batters.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

OH MY 'LANTA: Today, Quintana will make his seventh career start against the Braves...Quintana last faced Atlanta on August 26, 2022 at Busch Stadium with the Cardinals and allowed two runs over 5.0 innings.

YOU GOTTA EARN 'EM: Quintana has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 18 starts dating back to July 23, 2022...lt is the longest such streak of his career and the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his last start against Kansas City on August 1.

HOT STREAK: Quintana has not allowed a home run over his last 85.1 innings dating back to August 4, 2022...Is the longest such active streak in MLB...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,535) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,912), Chris Sale (2,135), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,551).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).
