RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue their six-game road trip through Kansas City (2-0) and Cincinnati (1-1), playing the third game of a four-game series at the division-rival Cincinnati Reds tonight and wrapping up their play in the Queen City for the 2019 season ... the Cardinals enter play today in 1st place in the NL Central, 1.0 game ahead of Chicago ... the Cardinals are 20-12 since the All-Star Break, 4th-best winning percentage (.625) in the National League.

NO FREE PASSES: Miles Mikolas has walked two or fewer batters in 39 straight starts (dating back to 4 walks on July 4, 2018 at Arizona), representing Major League Baseball's longest active streak and tying Curt Davis for longest in Cardinals history (July 3, 1938-Sept. 3, 1939). Mikolas' streak is the longest streak in Major League Baseball since 2017 when Clayton Kershaw (47) and Andy Sonnanstine (45) each ran streaks of 40+ dating back to 2015. Carlos Silva holds MLB's all-time mark of 99 from 2003-07.

GREEN LIGHT: Dexter Fowler hit his second homer in a row on a 3-0 count last night (3rd career), tying Texas' Hunter Pence for most in MLB this season and Albert Pujols (2009) for most in a season by a Cardinal ... Fowler's 11 hits (11-20, .550) on 3-0 counts are T9th-most among active Major Leaguers (teammate Matt Wieters (15-25, .600) ranks 5th ... Among all players in MLB history with 120 career plate appearances on 3-0 counts, teammate Matt Carpenter (2-for-2), Melky Cabrera (1-for-1), Mike Piazza (2-for-2) and former Cardinal Jhonny Peralta (2-for-2) are tied for 1st in batting average (1.000), while Carpenter and Piazza co-lead in slugging (2.500) and OPS (3.500).

"VICTORY" BLUES: The Cardinals are 1-8 when wearing their road alternate "victory" blue uniforms on Saturdays, patterned off their threads from the 1980s (won May 18 at Texas) ... Overall, St. Louis is 8-12 (.400) on Saturday this season (7-3 in home cream alternates & 0-1 in road gray vs. Cincinnati on April 13 in Mexico), with only Colorado (4-16, .200) sporting a worse Saturday record.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Cardinals bullpen has shut out the opposition over the last 10.1 innings in four games on the current road trip, while five Cardinal relievers are sporting active scoreless innings streaks: Giovanni Gallegos (17.1 since July 5), John Brebbia (8.2 since July 26), Ryan Helsley (7.0 since July 20), Tyler Webb (5.2 since August 3) and Carlos Martinez (2.2 since August 9) ... Overall this season, St. Louis relievers lead the NL in ERA (3.72), opp. BA (.211), opp. OBP (.297), opp. SLG (.359), opp. OPS (.655), WHIP (1.16), Hits/9 IP (6.91), baserunners/9 IP (10.93), HR/9 IP (1.08), and rank 2nd in saves (37).

MAHALO: Since July 5, Koltan Wong leads Major League Baseball in on-base percentage (.470) and ranks 2nd in batting average (.396, 40-101). Last night, the Hawaiian matched his single-game career high with 4 hits (fourth time) while hitting the 50th home run of his career.

BIRD BYTES: Since August 5, 2017, the Cardinals are 16-5 in their last 21 games at the Great American Ball Park ... For the first time since April 14 (3.90), St. Louis' team ERA dropped below 4.00 at 3.99, which currently ranks 2nd to the Dodgers (3.33)...The Cardinals are 30-21 (.588) in divisional play, and have won 15 of 19 over divisional opponents since the All-Star Break.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (August 17, 2006): The Cardinals walk-off over the Cincinnati Reds, 2-1, at Busch Stadium as Scott Rolen hits an RBI single off of future Cardinal Ryan Franklin (2007-11) in the bottom of the 9th inning. Rolen also provided St. Louis' other run with a game-tying solo homer off of future Cardinal Kyle Lohse (2008-12) in the 7th inning.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Michael Wacha's uncle, Dusty Rogers, was a Reds 1st round draft pick in 1984...played in the Reds minor league organization from 1984-88.

After the 2015 season, Paul Goldschmidt gifted his NL Silver Slugger Award to then current Reds hitting coach Turner Ward, who previously served as a Diamondbacks hitting coach (2013-15) and Mobile (AA) manager of Goldschmidt in 2011.

Pitching coach Mike Maddux was born in Dayton, Ohio...originally selected by the Reds in the 36th round of the 1979 MLB draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Texas at El Paso.

Cardinals Hall of Famer Vince Coleman played in 33 games for the Reds in 1996.

Cardinals 2019 Hall of Fame inductee Scott Rolen played his final four seasons in a Reds uniform (2009-12), where he was a 2010 Gold Glove Award winner and two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Cardinals Translator Carlos Villorria is related to Reds Hall of Fame infielder Dave Concepcion.

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer Jim Edmonds played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season in 2010.

Reds Bullpen Coach Lee Tunnell pitched in 32 games for St. Louis in 1987.

Reds first base coach Delino DeShields played two seasons with St. Louis (1997-98).

Reds manager David Bell previously served as a Cardinals assistant hitting (2014) and bench coach (2015-17)...played parts of four seasons with St. Louis (1995-98)...traded by Cleveland with catcher Pepe McNeal and pitcher Rick Heiserman to the Cardinals for pitcher Ken Hill (July 27, 1995).

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO Walt Jocketty served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)... named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds pro scout Bruce Manno worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds broadcaster George Grande previously worked as a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Reds Special Asst. to the GM Marty Maier spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds Player Performance Special Asst. Eric Davis played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds broadcaster Jeff Brantley pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM John Morris played five seasons for St. Louis from 1986-90.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM, Player Personnel Cam Bonifay worked for the Cardinals as a special assistant, evaluating the American League East from October of 2007-08.

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office William DeWitt Jr. was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals... his father, William O. DeWitt, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO Robert Castellini, Chairman W. Joseph Williams Jr. and Vice Chairman Thomas Williams were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his team-leading 25th start of the season (67th career start) and 94th career appearance tonight. Needs one win for 30 career.
- Has walked two or fewer batters in 39 straight starts dating back to July 4, 2018 (4 BB at Arizona). It's Major League Baseball's longest active streak and the tied for the longest in Cardinals history with Curt Davis (39, 7/3/1938-9/3/1939).
- The consecutive starts with two walks or less is the longest streak in MLB since 2017 when Clayton Kershaw (47) and Andy Sonnanstine (45) each ran streaks of 40+ dating back to the 2015 season. Carlos Silva holds the MLB all-time mark at 99 (2003-07).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last three starts and only one since the All-Star Break after allowing 16 HR prior to the All-Star Break.
- Has induced six ground into double plays post All-Star Break, most in the N.L.; and currently 2nd in the N.L. behind Sandy Alcantara (MIA, 18) with 17 this season.
- Has lowered his ERA from 4.88 to 3.94 over his last 14 starts dating back to May 17 at TEX, the last time he entered a game with an ERA below 4.00 (3.83).
- Is 1-3 with a 1.87 ERA in his five home starts against N.L. Central opponents holding his opposition to two runs or less in his last four starts of that kind.
- Has walked one or fewer in 17 of his 23 starts, including no walks in seven outings.
- The Cardinals sport a 35-20 record (.636 win pct.) in his games pitched since 2018. Since July 4, 2018, St. Louis is 25-14 (.641) in his games started.

LAST TIME OUT

- Received a no decision despite surrendering two home runs to Josh Bell and allowed six runs (5 ER) on seven hits over 5.0 innings. The Cardinals rallied to win 11-9 with a five-run 7th inning on a Lane Thomas grand slam. Tied the Cardinals franchise record by holding his opponent to two walks or less for the 39th straight start.
