BRUCE BECK

Bruce Beck is in his 14th year with News 4 New York. He is the station's lead Sports Anchor. Beck is also the host of Mike'd Up, WNBC's popular Sunday Night Sports Show. He received a 2011 New York Sports Emmy for his interview with former Rutgers football player, Eric LeGrand. Beck is the host and sideline reporter for New York Giants pre-season football.

Beck received the 2006 New York Emmy for Outstanding Sports Anchor and was the recipient of a 1999 New York Emmy Award for outstanding On-Camera Achievement in Sports Reporting. Overall, he has received nine New York Sports Emmys, one Mid-Atlantic Sports Emmy, and three national Cable Ace Awards. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association elected him New York State Sportscaster of the Year five straight times - from 2007 through 2011.

The versatile sportscaster, has covered a multitude of events for News 4 New York including Super Bowl XLII and XLIII, the World Series, the NBA Finals, the Stanley Cup Finals, the U.S. Open Tennis Championship, the U.S. Open Golf Championship, the NCAA Final Four, the Kentucky Derby and the 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008 Olympic Games.

Beck was the host of WNBC-TV's coverage of the ING New York City Marathon. He also hosted the Toyota Giants Report with Coach Tom Coughlin, and The Rutgers Report with Coach Greg Schiano. He has hosted and contributed to a number of WNBC-TV specials including the Belmont Stakes, the U.S. Open Golf Championship, and "Glory Days," which preceded New York Yankees postseason games. In addition, Beck has hosted the Sun America Sports Desk and the All-State Sports Update for NBC Sports, and served as a sideline reporter for the network's coverage of the NBA and WNBA on NBC.

Beck is a regular contributor to WOR radio's morning show with John Gambling. In addition, he is the host of the weekly Rutgers University basketball and football shows which air on Sportsnet New York. He currently is the blow-by-blow man for Professional Boxing on Epix.

Beck, who was a studio anchor for NBA-TV from 2000 to 2008, also hosted "Sportstalk" and "Sports Images" on CN8, the Comcast Network from 1994 to 1997. He also was the playby-play voice of Atlantic 10 Conference Basketball and Hofstra



University Football while calling college basketball games for CBS Sports. He was the host of CBS' coverage of the Hambletonian and the American Championship Harness Series on ESPN. Beck was a play-by-play voice and host for Showtime's Championship Boxing and one of the first to call the blow-by-blow on the Ultimate Fighting Championship.

From 1982 to 1994, Beck was a staff broadcaster with the MSG Network. Among his many duties, he hosted the station's coverage of the Knicks, Rangers, and Yankees. He was the playby-play announcer for college football and basketball, professional and Golden Gloves boxing, and professional tennis. He hosted the Millrose Games, the Virginia Slims Championship, the National Horse Show and the Lou Carnesecca Show.

For the past 11 summers, Beck, along with Sportscaster Ian Eagle, has run a Sports Broadcasting Camp at the Yogi Berra Museum and Learning Center in Montclair, New Jersey. The camp teaches the fundamentals of broadcasting and features lectures by some of the top broadcasters in the New York area. In May of 2009, Beck was chosen by St. John's University to deliver the Commencement speech to its Staten Island Campus. He also received an Honorary Doctor of Letters Degree.

Each Thanksgiving Beck and his family serve those in need at the St. John's Bread and Life Program, the largest soup kitchen in Brooklyn. Among his other charitable endeavors are UJA Federation, the Tom Coughlin Jay Fund Foundation, Derek Jeter's Turn 2 Foundation, the Crohn's & Colitis Foundation of America, the Alan T. Brown Foundation to Cure Paralysis, the March of Dimes Greater New York Chapter, Page Morton Black's Parkinson's Disease Foundation, the Exchange Club Child Abuse Prevention Center of New York, the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation and the Make-A-Wish Foundation of the Hudson Valley.



imona Vareikaite is a proud graduate of Northeastern University. But it has been a long and arduous trip from her hometown of Panevezys, Lithuania to the housing projects of the Bronx to commencement day at Northeastern in Boston. Arriving in the United States at age nine, Simona found herself confronted by harsh economic realities. Soon after her arrival, she went to work cleaning offices to help her family afford food and rent. Her neighborhood, she says, "was empty of opportunities, hopes, and dreams." By middle school she was part of a crowd more likely to drop out than to head to college and more likely to find incarceration than a promising career. When her middle school bad habits lead to a high school placement decision that read "None," she stood at a perilous crossroads.

During her freshman year at the Bronx School for Law, Government and Justice, she was recommended for Jeter's Leaders and like a two out rally, the combination of a caring school and the opportunities afforded by Turn 2, turned the game around for Simona. As a part of the Jeter's Leaders, she learned responsibility, accountability, time management and



In 2009, Simona co-founded DRYVE (Distributing Resources to Youth through Volunteer Efforts), a non-profit organization with the mission to enrich, educate, and empower underprivileged communities by providing youth with sustainable resources of knowledge, tools, and skills. Over the years, Simona has reached out to the Turn 2 Foundation to support her volunteer efforts by applying for the Jeter's Leaders Alumni Grant to raise funds for service trips to the Dominican Republic and other local projects. Since she first applied for the grant, Simona has received a total of \$10,000 for her organization, which has proven to greatly improve the lives of many youth.

the importance of giving back to the community. In particular, Simona discovered the satisfaction of being a role model for younger peers. Transferred from her troubled world to a supportive team that believed in her potential and prepared her for college, Simona earned a Torch Scholarship to Northeastern as a first generation low-income student. There she excelled, achieving the Dean's List while balancing her studies with part-time jobs and volunteering. Simona coordinated Northeastern's LEAD (Linking Education and Diversity Program) for Boston high school seniors and served on the Advisory Board of Summer Search, Inc. She spent six months studying at Bond University in Australia. With the goal of someday working for the federal government, Simona has worked with the Criminal History Systems Board in Chelsea, MA. Her efforts to bring her own experience to the cause of social change can also be found in her slam poetry. Whether it is through work, her many volunteer efforts or her art, Simona has come to embody the success one can achieve through perseverance and hard work. It has truly been an amazing trip from Lithuania to Turn 2 Foundation MVP.

Dennis M. Walcott was integral in starting the Jeter's Leaders Program with the Jeter family during his time as President of the New York Urban League.


the Executive Director of the Harlem Dowling Westside Center where he expanded services to children and families.

Chancellor Walcott graduated from New York City public schools in Queens, including P.S. 36, I.S. 192, and Francis Lewis High School. A lifelong Southeast Queens resident, Chancellor Walcott graduated from the University of Bridgeport in Connecticut with a Bachelor's degree and a Master of Education in 1973 and 1974, respectively, and in 1980, received his Master of Social Work from Fordham University. He has served on numerous boards including Carver Bank Corporation, Primary Care Development Corporation, and the former New York City Board of Education. He has also served as an adjunct professor of social work at York College and as a talk show radio host. Chancellor Walcott and his wife Denise have four children: Dejeanne, Dana, Shatisha and Timmy; and two grandsons, Justin and Gavin. ■

ennis M. Walcott is Chancellor of the New York City Department of Education. As Chancellor, Walcott oversees a system of almost 1,700 schools with 1.1 million students, 136,000 employees, and a \$23 billion budget. Building on Mayor Bloomberg's *Children First* reforms, Chancellor Walcott is committed to cultivating teacher talent; expanding school choices for families so that students attend schools that best meet their individual needs; creating strong partnerships with parents; and preparing students to graduate from high school and succeed in college and careers.

Prior to his appointment as Chancellor, Walcott served as Mayor Bloomberg's Deputy Mayor for Education and Community Development for more than eight years. In that capacity, he oversaw and coordinated the operations of the Department of Education, the New York City Housing Authority, the Department of Youth and Community Development and the Mayor's Office of Adult Education. He also reviewed the activities of the New York City School Construction Authority, City University of New York, and the City University Construction Fund. Mr. Walcott was responsible for collaborating with community-based organizations citywide and coordinating policies concerning youth programs and adult education. He currently serves on the board of the Governors Island Preservation and Education Corporation, and previously served as Co-Chair of the Mayor's Commission for Construction Opportunity.

As a kindergarten teacher in the childcare center where he began his career, Chancellor Walcott recognized the need for a male role model in many of the children's lives, and in 1975, he founded the Frederick Douglass Brother-to-Brother program, a mentoring program for young boys. Before joining the Bloomberg Administration in 2002, he was the President and Chief Executive Officer of the New York Urban League where for more than 12 years he expanded educational and youth service programs including Jeter's Leaders and Bridge to Brotherhood programs, Healthy Start, Northern Manhattan Perinatal Partnership, and the 140th Street Building Block Program. TRACY GARCIA



Turn 2 Foundation Continues to Partner with Summer Discovery

he Turn 2 Foundation and Summer Discovery formed an exciting partnership in 2009 to award scholarships to Jeter's Leaders juniors to participate in collegiate level classes at leading colleges and universities throughout the country. For two to four weeks, the program allows the students to enroll in classes in their anticipated major, while participating in a wide variety of activities on campus and in the surrounding city. 


Jeter Meter Program

This year the Jackie Robinson and St. John's After School Programs both participated in the event, held at the New Balance Track & Field Center at the Armory in upper Manhattan.



Portage Public School's Student Assistance Program

The Turn 2 Foundation continues to partner with Portage Public Schools to support the Student Assistance Program. The mission of the program is to respond to problems that impact or interfere with a student's ability to achieve maximum potential in their daily lives and within the school setting. The goal is to provide an environment for the students that is alcohol, tobacco, and substance free by encompassing an elementary, middle, and high school level component. The program also has a parent education element that ensures that they not only reach the students, but also their parents. This year Portage Community High School provided an after school mentoring program four days a week. Participants are able to go to the center and work on homework, play basketball, have a snack, and attend weekly field trips as an incentive for routine attendance and good behavior.



SMART *Moves*

The Boys & Girls Club of Greater Kalamazoo offers what young people need and want most – a safe environment supervised by caring adults who respect each child and celebrate diversity. SMART Moves, a key program within the Boys & Girls Club, is a substance abuse prevention program designed for youth ages 6-18, and was developed to help young people strengthen skills to resist alcohol and other drug use. The program year was very successful, serving over 290 youth through a number of activities, which greatly benefited the participants. Highlights included a special visit from the Red Cross and a Healthy Habits lesson on making positive and healthy eating decisions. The youth also put together a nutritious fruit tray.



Proud 2 Be Me

Washington Writers Academy

Proud 2 Be Me – Washington worked on several projects and activities throughout the year. With each activity, they discovered which of Derek's *10 Life Lessons* related. Park and neighborhood cleanups, Tae Kwon Do, and an anti-bullying campaign were all prominent activities this year. 
