TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

March 31, 2004: The Yankees notch the franchise's first-ever win on non-North American soil, defeating Tampa Bay, 12-1 in Tokyo, Japan, behind 2HR and 6RBI from Jorge Posada.

March 31, 2003: The Yankees' regular season begins in March for the first time ever, as the Yankees defeat Toronto, 8-4 at the SkyDome. Alfonso Soriano hits a sixth-inning grand slam and Roger Clemens allows only 3H in 6.0 shutout innings.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 1, 2003: Behind 7.0 scoreless IP from starter Andy Pettitte (6H, 1BB, 7K), the Yankees defeat Toronto, 10-1, to move to 2-0 on the season. It marks the first time in franchise history that the Yankees won on April Fools' Day.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the second game of their three-game set at Seattle tonight (0-1 thus far)...are 3-1 on their season-opening six-game road trip after sweeping San Francisco in a three-game series and dropping their series opener at Seattle...following this series, will return home for their first homestand of the season, featuring three-game sets vs. Miami (Fri.-Sun.) and the Athletics (4/7-9).

- ▶ Have won at least three of their first four games of a season for the fifth time in the last seven years (since 2020) but only the sixth time in the last 23 years since 2004 (4-0 in 2024 and 3-1 in 2011, '20, '23 and '25)...with a win tonight, would mark just the third time in the last 23 years the Yankees have won four of their first five games (5-0 in 2024 and 4-1 in 2020).
- ▶ Are opening the season on the road for just the third time in the last eight seasons (since 2019) and fifth time in the last 12 years (since 2015).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees suffered their first loss of the season in a 2-1 "walk-off" loss against the Mariners on Monday at T-Mobile Park...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (4.1IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 7K, OHR) made his Yankees debut and did not record a decision...**PH/3B Amed Rosario** (0-for-1, 1RBI, 1SF) drove in the Yankees' only run with a pinch-hit game-tying sac fly in the seventh inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1BB), **DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1 double) and **SS José Caballero** (1-for-2, 1BB) each reached base multiple times...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.2IP, 2K), **RHP Jake Bird** (1.0IP), **LHP Brent Headrick** (0.2IP, 2H, 2K) and **RHP Camilo Doval** (0.1IP) were scoreless in relief...**RHP Paul Blackburn** (1.1IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1BB) suffered the loss after allowing a "walk-off" single to Cal Raleigh in the ninth inning.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have allowed only 3R over their first four games, their fewest in their first four games of a season in franchise history (previous: 5R in 1909, '58 and '74)...are only the 11th team in Major League history to allow 3R-or-fewer over their first four games of a season, joining the 2018 Los Angeles Dodgers (2R in first 4G), 1915 Philadelphia Phillies (2R in first 4G), 2007 New York Mets (3R in first 4G), 2002 San Francisco Giants (3R in first 4G), 1991 Chicago White Sox (3R in first 4G), 1979 Houston Astros (3R in first 4G), 1970 Cincinnati Reds (3R in first 4G), 1943 St. Louis Cardinals (3R in first 4G), 1943 Cincinnati Reds (3R in first 4G) and 1914 Washington Senators (3R in first 4G).

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 15 of their last 17 completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 18 of their last 21 completed series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 38-17 in the last 55 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- ▶ The Yankees have won 13 of their last 14 completed series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11) and 14 of their last 16 completed series (since 7/8/10)...their 30-12 (.714) record at T-Mobile Park since 2012 is the third-best by any team (min. 30G) at any stadium in that span, trailing only Tampa Bay's 25-9 (.735) record at loanDepot park and Los Angeles-NL's 29-11 (.725) record at Citi Field.
- ▶ Are 9-3 in their last 12 games vs. Seattle (since 5/22/24).

TAKE FLIGHT: RHP Jake Bird tossed a scoreless inning of relief on Monday at Seattle...has retired 10-of-11BF this season (1H, 3K).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger has batted .329/.379/.532 (26-for-79) with 18R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI, 7BB and 1SF in 20 career games vs. Seattle...has hit .306/.370/.551 (15-for-49) with 8R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 5BB in 12 career games at T-Mobile Park.

PEN PAL: RHP Camilo Doval retired his only batter faced to strand two runners on Monday at Seattle...has retired each of his 8BF this season.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have allowed 1R-or-fewer in each of the Yankees' four games...marks the first time in franchise history the Yankees rotation allowed 1R-or-fewer in the club's first four games of the season.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base twice on Monday at Seattle...has hit .351/.470/.802 (46-for-131) with 32R, 14 doubles, 15HR, 34RBI, 31BB, 1HP, 3SB and 3SF over his last 36 games against the Mariners (since 8/27/17)...has hit 15HR in his last 33 games vs. the Mariners (since 6/21/18) and 17HR in his last 41 games against Seattle (since 7/21/17).

- ▶ Since 2017, has hit .361/.486/.843 (30-for-83) with 19R, 7 doubles, 11HR, 25RBI, 21BB, 1HP, 3SB and 2SF in 23 games at T-Mobile Park...has hit 11HR in his last 22 games at T-Mobile Park (since 7/21/17).
- ▶ Has hit .313/.476/.438 (5-for-16) with 2 doubles, 4BB and 1HP in his career against Seattle's RHP Logan Gilbert.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has recorded multiple hits in each of his first four games, batting .500/.500/.750 (8-for-16) with 2R, 1 double, 1HR and 2RBI...is only the ninth Yankee in franchise history (10th time) to record multiple hits in each of the Yankees' first four games of a season, joining Alfonso Soriano (first 6G in 2003), Bob Watson (first 4G in 1980), Bobby Murcer (first 4G in 1969), Elston Howard (first 4G in 1962), Bill Skowron (first 4G in 1955 and first 6G in '56), Joe DiMaggio (first 4G in 1941), Bob Meusel (first 6G in 1928) and Wally Schang (first 4G in 1922)...with multiple hits tonight, would be only the fourth Yankee in club history to record multiple hits in the team's first five games of a season.

- ▶ His four-game multi-hit streak marks his longest since a four-game streak from 5/14-18/24 and matches the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a five-game stretch from 8/3-7/21...marks the longest streak by a Yankee since Cody Bellinger's four-game streak from 8/25-28/25.
- ▶ His 8H mark his most hits through his first four games of a season in his career (previous: 6H in 2014).
- ▶ His next RBI will mark his 500th RBI as a Yankee.

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers had their season-opening 14.2 scoreless inning streak snapped on Monday at Seattle...was tied for their fourth-longest season-opening scoreless streak by the Yankees bullpen in franchise history, trailing their 20.1 scoreless inning streak in 1942, 16.2 scoreless inning streak in 2024 and 15.0 scoreless inning streak in 1970 (also had a 14.2 scoreless inning streak in 2017).

- ▶ Yankees relievers have allowed only 1R in 15.0 innings this year, posting a 0.60 ERA...have held opponents to a .185 BA (10-for-54).
- ▶ Have not allowed an inherited runner to score (7IR).

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his second start of the season tonight at Seattle...has won a career-high seven straight starts since 8/27/25, posting a 1.54 ERA (46.2IP, 8ER) and 45K over that span...also owns an eight-game winning streak (since 8/16/25), posting a 2.34 ERA (57.2IP, 15ER) and 58K during that stretch...his current eight-game winning streak is tied for the third-longest winning streak of his career, trailing only nine-game winning streaks from 9/21/24-5/24/25 and 4/19-7/6/22 (also had eight-game winning streaks from 8/4/23-4/23/24 and 9/21/19-9/18/20).

- ▶ In 44 career starts vs. the American League, has gone 28-6 with a 2.19 ERA (275.2IP, 67ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 34 of those 44 starts, including 20 of his last 26 starts (since 6/17/24), going 17-3 with a 2.08 ERA (164.2IP, 38ER) in that span.
- ▶ Made 16 starts after a Yankees loss in 2025 and went 11-1 with a 1.82 ERA (103.2IP, 21ER) in those starts...tossed at least 6.0IP in 14 of those starts and did not allow an ER in seven of them...the Yankees went 12-4 when Fried started after a loss.

STARTING OFF STRONG: Since 2017, the Yankees have gone a Major League-best 132-90 (.595) in March/April.

THE RIGHT CALL: The Yankees went 5-for-5 in ABS challenges on Monday at Seattle...are 10-for-11 in ABS challenges through their first four games...their 90.9% success rate is the best among Major League teams who have made at least five challenges...their 11 challenges are the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Minnesota (13) and Chicago-AL (12).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his second start of the season tonight at Seattle...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest...made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee on Wednesday at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...posted a 4.40 ERA (14.1IP, 12H, 7R/ER, 4BB, 12K, 2HR) without recording a decision in three official spring training starts...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 93-41 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.02 ERA (1,086.0IP, 949H, 405R/364ER, 298BB, 1,056K, 90HR) in 201 career games (184 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.80), wins (74), winning percentage (.712) and pickoffs (26), tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.66) and opponents' SLG (.330), third in opponents' OPS (.610), groundball percentage (54.0%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.19), sixth in opponents' OBP (.281), tied for sixth in complete games (five) and seventh in WHIP (1.09)...his 91 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

OPENING DAY NOD: Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on Wednesday at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...**was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996** (also OR in 7.0IP)...**was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so**, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (OR in 7.0IP in 1977).

- ✦ **Was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day**, joining David Cone (2H and OR in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemyre (2H in SHO in 1967).
- ✦ Retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 20BF.
- ✦ Was the 61st different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Yankees and the 19th left-handed pitcher...along with Nestor Cortes in 2024 and Carlos Rodón in 2025, it marked the first time the Yankees have had three different left-handed pitchers start three straight Opening Days.
- ✦ Is now 1-1 with a 3.54 ERA (20.1IP, 8ER) in four Opening Starts (also 2021-23 with Atlanta).
- ✦ Has made eight career Opening Day rosters (2019-24 with Atlanta and 2025-26 with the Yankees).

SPRING FLING: Made three official spring starts, posting a 4.40 ERA (14.1IP, 12H, 7R/ER, 4BB, 12K, 2HR) without recording a decision...also made his spring debut in the Yankees' exhibition against Team Panamá on 3/3 and earned the win (3.0IP, 1H, 0R, 3BB, 1K).

VS. SEATTLE: Has made three career starts vs. the Mariners, going 0-1 with a 1.59 ERA (17.0IP, 3ER)...all three of those starts have come at T-Mobile Park...faced Seattle once last season and allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0IP in a no-decision on 5/13/25 (4H, 2BB, 5K, 0HR).

- ✦ **In 44 career starts vs. the American League, has gone 28-6 with a 2.19 ERA (275.2IP, 67ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 34 of those 44 starts, including 20 of his last 26 starts (since 6/17/24), going 17-3 with a 2.08 ERA (164.2IP, 38ER) in that span.**

ON A ROLL: **Has won a career-high seven straight starts since 8/27/25, posting a 1.54 ERA (46.2IP, 8ER) and 45K over that span**...also owns an eight-game winning streak (since 8/16/25), posting a 2.34 ERA (57.2IP, 15ER) and 58K during that stretch...**his current eight-game winning streak is tied for the third-longest winning streak of his career**, trailing only nine-game winning streaks from 9/21/24-5/24/25 and 4/19-7/6/22 (also had eight-game winning streaks from 8/4/23-4/23/24 and 9/21/19-9/18/20).

2025: Went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees...set career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...was named to his third career All-Star team...opponents batted .223/.281/.334 (164-for-737, 14HR); LH .209/.282/.393 (34-for-163, 8HR); RH .226/.281/.317 (130-for-574, 6HR)...finished fourth in AL Cy Young Award voting.

- ✦ Led the Majors in wins (19), ranked second in winning percentage (.792, first in AL) and pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.65, second in AL), eighth in ERA (2.86, fourth in AL), ninth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.97, third in AL), groundball percentage (52.7%, third in AL) and opponents' SLG (.334, fourth in AL), and tied for ninth in starts (32, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranked sixth in the AL in opponents' OPS (.615) and ninth in opponents' OBP (.281) and WHIP (1.10).
- ✦ Won his fourth career Gold Glove Award (also 2020-22 with Atlanta), becoming the fourth pitcher in franchise history to win the award (13th time by a pitcher), joining Ron Guidry (5x: 1982-86), Bobby Shantz (4x: 1957-60) and Mike Mussina (3x: 2001, '03 and '08)...also won his second career Fielding Bible Award (also 2020 with Atlanta).
- ✦ Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of his 32 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 15 of those starts...his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were tied for the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors...his 15 starts of 1ER-or-fewer were tied for the sixth-most in the AL...was the first pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first 11 starts of a season (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...Chad Green did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- ✦ The Yankees went 22-10 in Fried's starts...his 22 team wins were the second-most in the AL and tied with San Francisco's Robbie Ray (22-10) for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Crochet (23-9) and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (23-9).
- ✦ His career-high 19 wins matched the most by a Yankee in a single season in the last 15 years since 2011 (also CC Sabathia in 2011 and Luis Severino in 2018)...his 19 wins were tied with CC Sabathia (19-8 in 2009) and Ed Figueroa (19-10 in 1976) for the third-most by a Yankee pitcher in his first season with the club in the Expansion Era (since 1961), trailing only Catfish Hunter (23-14 in 1975) and Tommy John (21-9 in 1979).
- ✦ His 2.86 ERA was the fourth-lowest by a Yankee in the last 44 years (since 1982), trailing only Gerrit Cole's 2.63 ERA in 2023 and 2.84 ERA in 2020, and David Cone's 2.82 ERA in 1997.
- ✦ Tossed at least 6.0 innings in 21 of his 32GS, tied for the sixth-most in the AL and tied for the eighth-most in the Majors...tossed at least 7.0 innings in 13 of his starts, tied with Detroit's Tarik Skubal (13) and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (13) for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Crochet (14)...were the most by a Yankee since 2017 when Luis Severino recorded 14GS and Masahiro Tanaka recorded 13GS.
- ✦ Allowed 2BB-or-fewer in 27 of his 32 starts and 3BB-or-fewer in each of his 32 starts.
- ✦ Made 16 starts after a Yankees loss and went 11-1 with a 1.82 ERA (103.2IP, 21ER) in those starts...tossed at least 6.0IP in 14 of those starts and did not allow an ER in seven of them...the Yankees went 12-4 when Fried started after a loss.
- ✦ Left only five of his 32 starts trailing.
- ✦ His eight pickoffs were the most by a Yankee in a single season since Andy Pettitte recorded 10 in 2008.
- ✦ Allowed only 14HR to 801BF, posting a 0.65 HR/9.0IP ratio.
- ✦ Was named the AL "Pitcher of the Month" twice: March/April and September.
- ✦ Made two postseason starts, going 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (9.1IP, 7ER)...made his Yankees postseason debut in ALWC Game 1 and tossed 6.1 scoreless innings in a no-decision (4H, 3BB, 6K)...became the seventh player in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in their first postseason appearance with the Yankees.

ROAD WARRIOR: Will make his second road start of the season...in 17 road starts in 2025, went 11-3 with a 3.28 ERA (104.1IP, 38ER)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of his 17 road starts and 1ER-or-fewer in eight of those starts.

LAND OF THE FRIED: Over his last seven seasons (2020-26), has gone 74-30 with five complete games (four shutouts) and a 2.80 ERA (860.2IP, 719H, 298R/268ER, 219BB, 817K, 63HR) in 145 starts...has posted an ERA of 3.25-or-lower in each of previous six seasons and his 2.80 ERA over that stretch is the lowest by any Major League pitcher that has tossed at least 700.0 innings in that span.

- ✦ Among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.80), wins (74), winning percentage (.712) and pickoffs (26), tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.66) and opponents' SLG (.330), third in opponents' OPS (.610), groundball percentage (54.0%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.19), sixth in opponents' OBP (.281), tied for sixth in complete games (five) and seventh in WHIP (1.09).
