CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (10-9) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (8-13)  
April 19, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - Game #22/Home #12  
RHP Ben Lively (0-2, 4.87 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (2-1, 2.96 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** are in the sixth game of a seven-game homestand where they've gone 3-2 so far (3-1 vs. Washington, 0-1 vs. Cleveland)...Are in a stretch of 13 out of 16 games being played at PNC Park (the only road series in that span came from April 11-13 at Cincinnati, where they were swept)...Will embark on a six-game road trip to Anaheim (Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles (April 25-27) following tomorrow afternoon's series finale against the Guardians at PNC Park.

**CRUZ IN CONTROL:** Oneil Cruz followed up Wednesday's grand slam (first of his career) and Thursday's leadoff home run (first of his career) with another leadoff home run on Friday vs. Cleveland, off former teammate Luis Ortiz...Cruz has homered in three straight games for the first time in his career, and he's the first Pirate to do that since Connor Joe did so in three straight from May 11-14, 2024...The last Pittsburgh player to homer in four consecutive games was Corey Dickerson, who went deep in four straight contests from July 15-22, 2018...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cruz became the second Major League player since at least 1900 to hit a grand slam and two leadoff home runs in a three-game span...The only other player to achieve that was Colorado's Charlie Blackmon in 2016 against Cincinnati (he hit a leadoff homer on May 30, then a leadoff homer and a grand slam on May 31).

**ONEIL, OH MY:** Oneil Cruz has five home runs, 11 RBI and 12 walks through 18 games played this year...Since 1901, he's one of only seven Pirates (eight occurrences) to post those stats through his first 18 games of a season, joining Jack Suwinski (2023), Gregory Polanco (2018), Brian Giles (1999), Willie Stargell (1973), Ralph Kiner (1950 and 1948) and Arky Vaughan (1935)...Cruz also has a Major League-best nine stolen bases entering today, giving him the chance to join Ely De La Cruz (2024 Cincinnati Reds) and Ken Williams (1922 St. Louis Browns) as the only Major League players since 1901 to record five-plus homers and 10-plus steals through his first 20 games played in a single season.

**TAKE ME OUT TO THE PAUL GAME:** Paul Skenes, who will pitch on his bobblehead day today, is four strikeouts shy of reaching 200 strikeouts for his career...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the three-fastest Pirates pitchers by innings to reach the 200-strikeout mark were Jason Grilli (137.2), David Bednar (155.0) and Felipe Vazquez (159.2)...Skenes has currently pitched 157.1 innings in his career...If he were to reach the mark today, he'd match Oliver Pérez as the fastest Pirates pitcher to reach the mark by games (28)...Skenes' 196 strikeouts since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024, are the sixth-most in all of Major League Baseball...Skenes trails only Cole Ragans (211), Zack Wheeler (202), Tarik Skubal (200), Logan Gilbert (198) and Chris Sale (197)

**BUCS ON THE BASES:** Pittsburgh has 27 steals through its first 21 games, third-most in Major League Baseball behind Seattle (32) and Chicago-NL (29)...The Pirates have five players with three-plus steals (Oneil Cruz 9, Isiah Kiner-Falefa 5, Ke'Bryan Hayes 3, Tommy Pham 3, Jack Suwinski 3), tied with Seattle for most in all of Major League Baseball...On Friday, Adam Frazier stole his first base since September 26, 2024 (with Kansas City), and his first with Pittsburgh since July 7, 2021, vs. Atlanta...Andrew McCutchen also swiped his first base of 2025, and his first since July 19, 2024, vs. Philadelphia...Nine different Pittsburgh players have at least one steal, tied with Arizona and Chicago (NL) for fourth-most in Major League Baseball, trailing only Seattle (12), Milwaukee (10) and Washington (10).

**HOORAY, B-REY:** Bryan Reynolds went deep for the third time this season with his solo shot off Cleveland's Tim Herrin on Friday...Since making his Major League debut on April 20, 2019, Reynolds' 29 homers off left-handed pitchers are 10th-most among Major League switch hitters in that span (Cleveland's José Ramírez leads the group with 58-such homers in that stretch)...His 121 RBI off southpaws in that span are the sixth-most among MLB switch hitters (Ramírez tops the list with 164, while Carlos Santana ranks second with 145).

**EV'S ELECTRICITY:** Enmanuel Valdez hit his first homer of 2025 with his two-run blast off Jakob Junis on Friday night...His five extra-base hits (three doubles, one triple, one homer) are third-most on the team, trailing Oneil Cruz and Bryan Reynolds, who each have seven extra-base hits...Valdez is 7-for-15 (.467) with three doubles, one homer and nine RBI with runners on this year.

## ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 19, 2023: The Pirates scored nine runs in the game's first two innings en route to a 14-3 win over the Rockies at Coors Field, which also gave Pittsburgh its second sweep of the season. Andrew McCutchen doubled and hit his third home run in four games. Johan Oviedo earned his second win of the season, striking out six and allowing just one run across his 6.0 innings of work.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 22-year-old righthander will make his fifth start of the season today and third at PNC Park in 2025...Took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors last season after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. the Cubs...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Skenes earned his second win of the season in his last start on Monday vs. Washington, striking out six and allowing two runs (one earned) over 6.0 innings...He's allowed one earned run or fewer in 16 of his 27 Major League starts...Skenes also extended his streak of innings without allowing a home run to 61.1 (streak began on August 16, 2024), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball, per the Elias Sports Bureau...He trails only Tampa Bay's Drew Rasmussen, who has gone 62.0 straight innings without allowing a home run.

**VS. CLEVELAND:** Today will be Skenes' first career appearance against the Guardians...Skenes is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (34.0ip/6er) and 38 strikeouts in six career starts during interleague play, including 1-0 this year...He allowed an unearned run over 7.0 innings on April 2 at Tampa Bay.

**WHERE HE RANKS:** Entering today, Skenes' 26 strikeouts are tied with New York (NL)'s David Peterson for the 12th-most in the National League...His 8.67 strikeout-to-walk ratio is second in MLB among those with at least 24.0 innings (Texas' Nathan Eovaldi has a 12.00 K/BB ratio).

**SUPERB SKENES:** With four more strikeouts, Paul Skenes will reach 200 in his Major League career...His first Major League strikeout was Chicago (NL)'s Mike Tauchman on May 11, 2024... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, if Skenes were to reach the 200-strikeout mark today, he would tie Oliver Pérez as the fastest Pirates pitcher by games (28) to reach 200 strikeouts with Pittsburgh.

**OUR ACE:** Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career, Skenes had a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts....According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in the N.L/1913 in the A.L.) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and have 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League appearances.

**OPENING DAY HONORS:** Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings but had a no-decision on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old....Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).

**ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS:** Last year, Skenes became the second player in Pirates history to take home BBWAA Rookie of the Year honors, along with Jason Bay in 2004...He became the first rookie pitcher to make at least 23 starts and post a sub-2.00 ERA in a single season since Scott Perry with the Philadelphia Athletics in 1918...He also became the 24th pitcher to win the N.L. Rookie of the Year Award and the first to do so since Devin Williams with Milwaukee in 2020.

**IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN:** Skenes recorded a 1.96 earned run average in 23 starts during his rookie season in 2024...His 1.96 ERA from the time of his big-league debut on May 11 through the end of the season was the lowest in all of MLB...His .198 batting average against was also the lowest by a Pirates starting pitcher in team history (minimum 16 starts)...His 1.96 ERA was the lowest by a Major League rookie pitcher (minimum 18 starts) in the Live-Ball era (since 1920).

**ALL-STAR HONORS:** Skenes entered the 2024 All-Star break with a 6-0 record, 1.90 ERA, 0.92 WHIP, 89 strikeouts and 13 walks in 11 starts...The strikeout total was the fifth-most in Major League history (since 1901) through 11 starts...When he started for the National League on July 16 in Arlington, he became one of five rookie pitchers to start the All-Star Game, joining Hideo Nomo (1995), Fernando Valenzuela (1981), Mark Fidrych (1976) and Dave Stenhouse (1962).
