#### Goin' with Drohan

**Shane Drohan**, who was acquired by the Brewers from the Red Sox as part of a six-player trade on February 9, is making his Major League debut today.

#### They're Out of Our League

The Brewers are 110-61 (.643) since 2022 during Interleague Play, which marks the best record in the majors.

#### Going National

Following an off day tomorrow, the Brewers return home to finally take on a National League opponent for the first time this season as they play Washington in a 3-game series.... the team will not play a divisional opponent until it hosts Pittsburgh on April 24 in the 25th game of 2026.

#### Line 'Em Up

Through 11 games, the Brewers have used 11 different lineups.

#### Stealing the Show

The Brewers have 22 stolen bases on the season, seven more than the next highest Major League team (Marlins-15)....Milwaukee has at least one steal in all but one game this season (4/4 at KC-G1).

**David Hamilton** has posted a .500 on-base percentage through his first 8 games of the season....Hamilton is tied with **Brice Turang** for the team lead in walks (9) and stolen bases (4).

**THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME:** Is the sixth game (3-2) of a 6-game trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Boston (1-1)....following this trip and an off day tomorrow, the team returns to American Family Field for 6 games in 7 days against Washington (3g) and Toronto (3g).

**MANAGER:** **Pat Murphy** (335g, 198-137, .591) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

**COACHES:** Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

**LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE:** The Brewers have made five replay challenges this season, going 4-1....their last challenge (won) came on 4/7 at Boston as an out call at second base involving Gáry Sanchez was overturned.

**2025 IN REVIEW:** The Brewers went 97-65 to finish in first place in the NL Central, 5.0 games ahead of the Cubs....Milwaukee had the best record in baseball for only the second time in franchise history (1982) and set a franchise record for regular-season wins....the team beat the Cubs, 3 games to 2, in the National League Division Series before getting swept by the Dodgers in the National League Championship Series.

**BREWING SUCCESS:** The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

**BREWING CONSISTENCY:** The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 771 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (862), Astros (812) and Yankees (796).

**DROHAN AT A GLANCE:** Shane Drohan, 27, will be making his Major League debut....Drohan was acquired from Boston with LHP Kyle Harrison and INF David Hamilton on February 9 in exchange for INF Caleb Durbin, INF Andruw Monasterio, INF/C Anthony Seigler and a 2026 Competitive Balance Round B selection....he was recalled on Monday from Triple-A Nashville, where he made his only appearance in a start on 3/31 vs. Charlotte (ND, 3.1ip, 3h, 2r, 2er, 4bb, 6k, 2hbp, 81 pitches)....he went 1-2 with a 4.26 ERA in 4 games (1 start) for the Brewers in Spring Training (12.2ip, 12h, 7r, 6er, 4bb, 15k, 1hr)....name is pronounced "DROH-ehn."

**LAST SEASON:** Drohan went 5-1 with a 2.27 ERA in 12 games/11 starts at Triple-A Worcester....he held International League opponents to a .185 AVG with 67 strikeouts in 47.2 innings while posting a 1.01 WHIP....he was on Worcester's injured list from 5/13-8/25 with left forearm inflammation.

**MINOR LEAGUE CAREER:** Is 31-21 with a 4.29 ERA in 105 games/90 starts (415ip, 376h, 222r, 198er, 209bb, 478k, 49hr) while pitching in the Boston (2021-25), Chicago-AL (2024) and Milwaukee (2026) organizations....he was originally selected by Philadelphia in the 23rd round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign....he was then selected by Boston in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft....Drohan went from Boston to Chicago-AL in the 2023 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Red Sox in June 2024....he underwent left shoulder surgery 2/22/24, performed by Dr. Nikhil Verma, and missed most of the 2024 season.

**CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD:** Drohan has not pitched in Milwaukee.

**CAREER ON THE ROAD:** Drohan has not pitched on the road.

**CAREER vs. RED SOX:** Drohan has not faced the Boston, Massachusetts Red Sox (or any other team for that matter).

**ODDS & ENDS:** Drohan graduated from Cardinal Newman (FL) High School, where he played three years of football (quarterback) in addition to baseball....he went on to attend Florida State University....his father, Bill, pitched in the Royals organization from 1987-90 at the Rookie and Class-A levels....Drohan enjoys watching football and basketball and playing video games....he is a fan of the Miami Dolphins and Miami Heat.
