**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Giants, 7-4, yesterday... Tonight, the Mets finish their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (7-2) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (2-1) and Giants (2-1)...The Mets are off on Monday before they return home for a seven-game homestand against the Nationals (three games) and Braves (four games).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Happy Birthday to Bryce Montes de Oca who turns 27 today.

**#WINNING:** New York has won eight of its last 10 contests...The Mets have secured a winning road trip (7-2)...With a victory today, the Mets would claim their fifth straight series and their seventh series overall...New York's 14 wins are tied for the third-most in the National League.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York will play its 17th road game tonight, the most in the majors...The next closest NL team is Milwaukee and Philadelphia, who have played 13 road contests this season...The Mets are batting .273/.365/.445 with 57 runs, 16 doubles, 13 home runs, 54 RBI, 40 walks, seven steals and an .810 OPS during the road trip...The team has posted a 4.05 ERA (36 ER/80.0 IP) with 35 walks and 78 strikeouts in that span...The Mets are outscoring their opponents 57-36 in this stretch...Overall, the Mets are 10-6 on the road this season...Their 10 road wins are tied with the Braves for the most in the majors.

**TYLOR THE CREATOR:** Tylor Megill is set to make his fifth start of the season...The Long Beach, CA native is 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 ER/21.0 IP) with 11 walks and 17 strikeouts...This will mark his fourth career start against the Giants and his second in San Francisco...Megill made the start at Oracle Park on August 18, 2021 and allowed one run in 6.0 innings with two walks and six strikeouts.

**CALIFORNIA DREAMING:** The Mets are 7-2 with one game remaining on their West Coast California trip...The most wins the Mets have ever had on one road trip facing teams in California is eight...New York went 8-1 from August 18-27, 1986 vs. Los Angeles-NL, San Francisco and San Diego...Research courtesy of Elias.

**1010 WINS:** The Mets have recorded 10 or more hits in a season-high four straight games...The team has raised its batting average from .222 to .242 in that span...The last time the team recorded 10 or more hits in four straight games was from September 13-17, 2020...The last time the Mets recorded 10 or more hits in five straight games was from April 12-16, 2019.

**APRIL, SHE WILL COME:** Pete Alonso has become the first player in Mets history with 10 home runs before May 1...The last time a player hit 10+ home runs in his team's first 21 games of a season was in 2019, when Christian Yelich (11), Cody Bellinger, Kris Davis and Eddie Rosario all accomplished the feat.

**CAN'T STOP:** Pete Alonso is tied for the major league lead with 10 home runs and is in third in the majors with 23 RBI...He is tied for fifth with 18 runs scored and his .640 SLG and is seventh in the majors...Alonso's 1.000 OPS ranks 13th in The Show...Alonso has nine homers in his last 16 games...He's hitting .328/.394/.750 over that period with 21 RBI and 14 runs.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Mets have homered in nine of their last 10 games...The team has hit 15 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 10 home runs in the previous 12 games.

**WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Brandon Nimmo leads the major leagues with a 1.6 fWAR...Pete Alonso is 15th in The Show and ninth in the NL with a 1.1 fWAR, while Francisco Lindor is 17th in the majors and 10th in the Senior Circuit with a 1.1 fWAR.

**ROAD TRIPPIN':** Over the nine game road trip, Brandon Nimmo is batting .487 (19-39) with eight runs, four doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, three walks with a .535 OBP and a .744 SLG...He is batting .364 (20-55) in his last 14 games vs. the Giants...Nimmo is hitting .400 (24-60) on the road...Has a .324 (119-367) road average since the start of last year, fifth-highest in the majors...The Wyoming native ranks second in the majors with a .479 OBP, third in batting average (.368) and is tied for sixth in the majors with 15 walks this season.

**THE FRANCISCO LINDOR WAY:** Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 14 of his last 16 games...He is batting .250 (16-64) with 16 runs, seven doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI, six walks, two steals with a .342 OBP, a .547 SLG and an .889 OPS in that span...This comes after Lindor batted .111 (2-18) in his first six games...Lindor is tied for third in the NL with 12 extra-base hits.

**GOING BACK TO CALI:** Over the last seven games, Jeff McNeil has batted .440 (11-25) with five runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, three walks, a .533 OBP and a .640 SLG...McNeil has raised his season batting average from .212 to .286 during this span.

**THIS IS THE PLACE:** Eduardo Escobar has an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games against the Giants...Only six players have ever had a longer streak against the club...Overall, Escobar has hit safely in 10 straight games against San Francisco, going 18-40 (.450) with a 1.275 OPS.

**WALK, DON'T STRIKE:** The Mets are second in the majors with 99 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out only 157 times this season, the third-fewest time in the Majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 15 walks and struck out just nine times this season...Jeff McNeil has 13 walks and has also struck out only eight times.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed just five errors in 22 games this season, the fewest in the majors...The team's .993 fielding percentage is the best in the majors...Francisco Lindor has recorded six DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the most in the majors.

**BROTHERS IN ARMS:** Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 1.58 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 19 strikeouts...They have converted seven of eight save opportunities...They are one of three pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels).

**MEGILL NEWS & NOTES**

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered his first loss of the season on April 18 against the Dodgers at Dodger Stadium...Allowed three runs on seven hits, a career-high-tying four walks and four strikeouts over 5.0 innings.

**BIG DRIP BY THE BAY:** Megill will make his fourth career start against the Giants, the most against a club outside of the NL East...Megill is 0-1 with a 6.89 ERA (12 ER/15.2 IP) through his first three career start against the Giants...In his lone start at Oracle Park, August 18, 2021, Megill allowed one run on five hits, two walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings.

**AMAZIN APRIL:** In nine April starts since 2022, Megill is 7-1 with a 2.39 ERA (13 ER/49.0 IP) and 44 strikeouts...Megill's seven wins in April since last season are tied with Minnesota's Joe Ryan for the most during that span...Among qualifiers in April dating back to 2022, Megill is 11th in ERA...Megill has allowed three runs or fewer in eight of his nine career April starts.

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**DOIN' THE SPLITS:** This season, righties are hitting just .163 (7-43) against Megill, while left-handers have batted .324 (12-37)...For his career, Megill owns a .196 (60-306) opponent's average against right-handed batters, the ninth-best mark among right-handed pitchers since his major league debut on June 23, 2021 (min. 300 RHB faced)...Left-handed batters have a .309 (93-301) average against Megill, the third-highest mark among right-handed pitchers (min. 300 LHB faced).

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodriguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).
