## ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (52-47) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (50-49) July 22, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#100/HOME \#50 RHP ANDRE PALLANTE (4-4, 4.21 ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELLER (10-5, 3.46 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...were shut out 6-0 in their series finale Sunday against the Phillies...Are tied with Arizona for the best record in the National League while also being tied for the second-best record in all of MLB this month (Detroit has a league-best 11-5 record in July)...Are over . 500 for the first time since being 13-12 on 4/24...Have won 11 games in their last at-bat (the most since winning 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 37-3 (.925 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 64 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the longest streak for the season is 75 straight games by the Phillies from $4 / 15$ to $7 / 9$ )...Have played in 32 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (35)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (46) in MLB behind the Mariners ( 60 ), Phillies (54) and Royals (51)...Have the fourth-best ERA (3.61) among all starting rotations in MLB behind the Phillies (3.22), Mariners (3.34) and Royals (3.44)...Rank fourth in all of MLB in stolen base percentage ( 82.5 percent) behind the Brewers ( 84.5 percent), Mets ( 82.8 percent) and Reds ( 82.7 percent)...Have gone $11-2$ on the 13 occasions the team has stolen multiple bases in a game this year.... Have won nine straight and 12 of their last 13 games when scoring at least four runs... Have gone 16-2 since the beginning of June when scoring first in a game.

SETTING UP THE SERIES: Tonight is the second time this month the Pirates will face the Cardinals here at PNC Park (also July 2-4)...Each of the last 11 games between the Cardinals and Pirates has been decided by three or fewer runs...According to StatsPerform, no other matchup in MLB has an active such streak of 10 or more consecutive games.

CUTCH AND THE CARDS: Andrew McCutchen's next hit will be the 200th of his career against the RedBirds (the only active player with more is Joey Votto with 231)...McCutchen's 199 hits against the Cardinals are his second-most vs. any team (he has 200 against the Cubs).


REYNOLDS ROLLING: Bryan Reynolds comes into today tied for the fourth-most hits (23) in MLB this month (Bobby Witt Jr. leads the way with 27)...Reynolds has accounted for 14.7 percent of Pittsburgh's total hits this season $(115 / 780)$...That's the second-highest percentage of any Major Leaguer in 2024 (Bobby Witt Jr. - 16.3\%).

A FAN-TASTIC WEEKEND: The Pirates drew a total of 116,935 fans this past weekend while taking two of three games against the Phillies...Pittsburgh is 3-0-1 in its last four series...The only team with a longer active streak of series won/tied is Arizona (six).

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen ranks 11th in Pirates history coming into today with 1636 hits...He is two shy of tying Hall of Famer Fred Clarke for the 10th-most in team history...McCutchen also ranks fourth among all active players with 2121 hits behind Freddie Freeman (2221), Jose Altuve (2168) and Joey Votto (2135).
CALL TO THE PEN: Pittsburgh's bullpen allowed one earned run in 4.1 innings in yesterday's game against the Phillies...Since June 25, Pittsburgh's bullpen ranks fourth in MLB with a 2.58 ERA...The only three teams with a lower bullpen ERA during that time are the Cubs (1.51), Braves (2.18) and Cardinals (2.51)...Since allowing six runs on June 15, Dennis Santana has an 0.75 ERA ( $12.0 \mathrm{ip} / 1 \mathrm{er}$ )...Colin Holderman ranks eighth among all National League relievers this season with a 1.72 ERA...David Bednar has the National League's longest active saves streak (16).

STARTING OFF: The 28 -year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season, all with the Pirates...Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, making him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First Year Player Draft.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Keller enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including tied for third in wins (10),second in run support (78), 10th in innings pitched (114.1) and 12th in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.94).

RARE AIR: Keller had 10 wins, 114.1 innings pitched and 105 strikeouts in the first half of the season, making him the fourth pitcher in club history to record 10+ wins, $100.0+$ IP and $100+$ strikeouts before the All-Star Break, joining Gerrit Cole in 2015 (13 wins, 117.1 IP, 116 strikeouts), Bob Veale in 1966 ( 10 wins, 142.0 IP, 134 strikeouts) and Bob Friend in 1960 ( 10 wins, 153.1 IP, 109 strikeouts).

Keller was one of eight Major League pitchers to have posted those numbers before the All-Star Break this season, joining Chris Sale, Seth Lugo, Aaron Nola, Tarik Skubal, Luis Gil, Ranger Suarez and Zack Wheeler...The only other pitchers on that list that were not selected to the 2024 All-Star Game were Aaron Nola and Luis Gil.
\#WINNING: The Pirates are 10-2 in Keller's last 12 starts since May 6 vs. LAA... The 10-2 mark is the best team record for any major league pitcher with at least 10 starts in that time and is the first time a Pirate pitcher has had 10 team wins in a 12 -start span since Jameson Taillon did so in 2018.

ALL HE DOES IS WIN: Keller earned his ninth win of the season on June 25...Keller has now earned nine wins before July 1 in back-to-back seasons, the first Pirates pitcher to accomplish this feat since Steve Blass did so in 1971 (9) and 1972 (9) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

He is the first Major League pitcher to post back-to-back seasons of 9+ wins before July 1 since Justin Verlander did so for the Astros from 2018-19...The last National League pitcher to do so was Max Scherzer with the Nationals for four straight seasons from 2015-18 (also did it from 2013-14 with the Tigers...six consecutive seasons in total).
Keller was also the first Pirate to have seven-plus wins through June 1 in consecutive years since Howie Camnitz from 1908 (7) to 1909 (8)...The only other Pirates to accomplish this feat were Frank Killen in 1896 (10) and 1897 (8) (courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau).

GETTING IT DONE: In 12 starts since the beginning of May, Keller is $8-2$ with a 2.54 ERA (21 ER in 74.1 IP) and 242 ( 69 -for-285) batting average against... His eight wins in that time are tied for the second-most in the NL (Chris Sale - 10)..His ERA since May 1 is third-best in the NL and fourth in the Majors behind only ATL Chris Sale (2.30), BAL Corbin Burnes (2.32) and SD Michael King (2.52).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision in his last outing on July 14 at Chicago-AL, allowing two runs on four hits with three strikeouts in 3.0 innings pitched...The outing snapped a streak of 49 consecutive starts of $5.0+$ innings pitched, which was the longest active streak in Major Leaque Baseball and the longest steak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett also made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Keller will be making his 13th career start and appearance against the Cardinals today, including his third of the season (also: July 2 and June 13)...He owns a lifetime 2-3 record with a 3.97 ERA ( 29 ER in 65.2 IP) in his 12 starts against St. Louis.
