RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude a brief three-game road trip in Cleveland (2-0) today at Progressive Field...following an off day tomorrow, will host the Giants and Blue Jays for a six-game homestand from May 1-6, which commences a stretch of 13 games in as many days...have won a season-high-tying six consecutive games (also: April 10-16), the longest active streak in the majors, to improve to a season-high seven games above .500 for the first time since July 19, 2025 (50-43)...were last eight games over on July 6, 2025 (49-41)...are an AL-best 16-6 (.727) in their last 22 games since April 4, second in the majors behind the Padres (17-5/.773), on the heels of a 2-5 start...have won eight of their last 10 road games since losing five of their first seven...have gone 10-4 on a stretch of 27 games in 29 days from April 14-May 13, with off days coming on April 23 and 30...own the majors' sixth-best record, 1.5 GB behind the division-leading Yankees for first in the AL...have spent six days occupying first in the AL East, 15 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 15 straight days in first or second...will enter May with a top-two record in the AL for the fifth time, joining 2023 (1st), 2019 (1st), 2012 (2nd), and 2010 (1st).

* The Rays recorded their first shutout Sept. 18, 2025 vs. TOR (4-0) and first on the road since Aug. 25, 2025 at CLE (9-0) with a 1-0 victory last night, with **Jonathan Aranda** plating the game's lone run on a two-out RBI-single in the 5th inning...it was their second shutout win at Progressive Field over the last 21 seasons (2006-26), joining the aforementioned 9-0 victory.

* **Cole Sulser**, who resides in nearby Brunswick, Ohio during offseasons, worked a scoreless 9th for his first save since May 28, 2022 at ATL as a member of the Marlins...he became the fifth Ray to record a save this season, tied for the most in MLB (also: ATL, CIN, COL, MIN).

* It marked the Rays first 1-0 win since April 25, 2025 at SD and was their eighth over the last four seasons (2023-26), tied for second most in the majors to the Mariners (9).

* With the win, the Rays secured their first series victory over the Guardians since July 12-14, 2024 at Tropicana Field and first at Progressive Field since July 22-25, 2021 (0-3-1 in prev. 4)...they have won each of their first five sets vs. AL opponents to for the first time in team history.

* The Rays have recorded multiple winning streaks of six games or more before the calendar flips to May for the second time, joining 2023 (13, 6)...no other club has multiple such streaks, and the Rays have tallied two of the majors' seven streaks this season...only three teams have recorded a winning streak of seven games or more in 2026: the Cubs (10G, April 14-24), Padres (8G, April 8-16), and Yankees (8G, April 17-25).

* This marks the seventh time the Rays have won 15 games or more by the end of April, including the first since 2023 (23-6)...each of the previous six Tampa Bay squads went on to win 90 games or more, and five of those six made the postseason.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

With a win today, the Rays would:
* Tally their season-high seventh straight win, tying their longest streak from 2025 (Aug. 29-Sept. 4).
* Record their major league-leading fourth sweep...the Yankees could also log their fourth sweep with a win over the Rangers today.

* Sweep Cleveland for the seventh time, first since July 5-7, 2021 at Tropicana Field...it would mark their second sweep at Progressive Field along with Aug. 12-14, 2005.

* Record four sweeps before the end of April for the first time in franchise history...last year, they didn't record their fourth sweep until June 13-15 at NYM.

* Finish April with 19 wins, tying 2019 (19-9) for second in club history behind 2023 (23).

* Win their 14th straight game vs. AL opponents, tying MLB's sixth-longest streak in the expansion era (since 1961)...improve to 14-1 against AL clubs, tying the best intraleague start in the modern era (since 1900 - see "All-American" note below for more information).

HOT IN CLEVELAND—The Rays have outscored opponents, 26-8 (+18), during their six-game winning streak, yielding two runs or fewer in each contest, tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history (3x, last: June 3 [G2]-8, 2023) behind a seven-game stretch from March 29-April 5, 2019...they have held opponents to 2-for-31 (.065) with RISP during the streak, including 0-for-9 this series, and have scored first in five of six games while trailing only once (2-0 on April 27 at CLE)...the staff's eight runs allowed during the streak are their fewest over any six-game span since May 23-28, 2025 (8)...since the streak began on April 22, the Rays have pitched to a 1.33 ERA (54.0IP, 8ER) while holding opponents to a .176/.238/.275 (34-for-193) line—all marks lead the majors in that timeframe.

* Rays starters have turned in a 1.02 ERA (35.1IP, 4ER) during the streak to lower their season-long mark from 4.22 to 3.44, fourth in the majors to the Yankees (2.70), Dodgers (2.82), and Braves (3.02)...between **Steven Matz** and **Nick Martinez**, the rotation has worked 7.0 IP (or more) in back-to-back outings for the first time since **Zack Littell** (9.0) and **Taj Bradley** (7.0) from May 31-June 1, 2025...they have done so while yielding four hits or fewer in both starts for the first time since April 8-9, 2023 (**Jeffrey Springs/Drew Rasmussen**)...Rays starters last worked three consecutive outings of 7.0 IP or more from July 24-26, 2017.

* The Rays have out-homered opponents, 8-4, during the streak, with **Jonathan Aranda** (3) and **Yandy Diaz** (3) combining for six of the eight homers...on the season, they are undefeated (8-0) when hitting more homers than the opposition.

* **Ryan Vilade** is 5-for-6 (.833) with 3 RBI since the winning streak began on April 22 while Diaz is batting .333 (7-for-21)...Aranda leads the club with 6 RBI in that span, and nine different Rays have driven in a run, including seven players with multiple RBI.

* The Rays have won six straight one-run games since a 6-5 loss on March 28 at STL, their longest streak since May 15-June 2, 2024 (6G)...they have not had a longer stretch since Aug. 10-Sept. 2, 2019 (7G), and the single-season franchise record of eight games has been achieved twice: May 19-June 18, 2008 and July 12-Aug. 13, 2003.

ALL-AMERICAN—The Rays 13-1 start vs. AL opponents is tied for the best in the modern era (since 1900) by any team against its own league...among AL clubs, they matched Milwaukee in 1987, Detroit in 1984, Oakland in 1981, and Cleveland in 1966...in the NL, San Francisco in 2003, Atlanta in 1994 and 1982, and the New York Giants in 1918 all started 13-1 against Senior Circuit competition...with a win today, the Rays would tie Milwaukee in 1987, Detroit in 1984, Oakland in 1981, Cleveland in 1966, and the New York Giants in 1918 (all 14-1) for the best intraleague start in the modern era.

* The Rays have won a franchise-record 13 straight games vs. AL competition since a 10-4 loss on April 3 at MIN, surpassing a 10-game run from March 30-April 13, 2023...it marks the longest streak in the majors since Cleveland's MLB-record 22-game run from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017 and ties the 1987 Brewers (April 6-20) for the majors' longest such streak before the end of April...it ties the Tigers (May 10-27, 2006) for the second-longest streak by an AL team since 2003.

* The 13-game winning streak is the longest by any team against its own league since the Brewers 14-game run over NL clubs from Aug. 1-16, 2025.

* The streak includes a franchise-record 10 straight wins over AL Central opponents.

* **Yandy Diaz** has an active 14-game on-base streak vs. AL teams, the longest season-opening run by a Ray since himself in 2020 (19G).

ALL ARANDA BASES—**Jonathan Aranda** has an RBI in three straight games and has driven in nine over his last seven games to bring his season total to 25 RBI, second in the AL to HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (26) and tied with **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for second most by a Ray in March/April, trailing **Randy Arozarena** in 2023 (28)...an AL-most 22 of those 25 RBI have come against right-handed pitching, third in the majors to CIN **Sal Stewart** (27) and MIA **Liam Hicks** (24)...his team-leading three game-winning RBI are tied for seventh in the AL and match his career high set in 2025...Aranda is on pace for 139 RBI, which would best **Carlos Peña's** franchise record (121) established in 2007.

THE GREAT YANDINO—**Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely 54 times, surpassing **Tommy Pham** (52, 2019) for the most TOB during March/April in Rays history...he needs to reach twice today to tie **Jonny Gomes** (56, 2006) for the most TOB by any Tampa Bay batter through the club's first 30 games of a season...Diaz's 36 hits are tied for third in the AL and are tied with **Randy Arozarena** (2023) for fourth most by a Ray before the calendar flips to May, trailing **Rocco Baldelli** (40) in 2003, **Quinton McCracken** (39) and **Fred McGriff** (37) in 1998.

* Diaz is one extra-base hit shy of 300 for his career and 283 with the Rays, which would tie **Carlos Peña** for seventh most in franchise history...he needs 1 HR to tie **Carl Crawford** (104HR) for seventh on the Rays all-time list.

* He has 993 hits in his career, eight shy of becoming the 20th Cuban-born player in major league history to tally 1,000 hits.

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound against the Guardians for his sixth start of the 2026 season...marks his 136th career appearance (87th start) and seventh opposite Cleveland (fifth start)...has a career-best six-decision winning streak dating back to June 25, 2025...allowed three runs or fewer in 28 of 31 starts last season and was named an All-Star for the first time in his career... established career highs in starts (31), innings pitched (150.0), strikeouts (127), and bWAR (4.5).

✦ Min. 25.0 IP, Rasmussen ranks highly among major league pitchers in baserunners allowed per 9.0 IP (2nd, 6.66), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 6.50), WHIP (3rd, 0.74), walks per 9.0 IP (3rd, 1.40), and walk rate (3rd, 4.1%).

✦ In 2025, he became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011 and Price (2.72) in 2010.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen earned his second win of the season on April 24 vs. MIN in a quality start (W, 6.0IP, 5H, R, BB, 6SO, HR)...allowed one baserunner via a walk his first time through the order...worked out of a second and third situation with one out by recording back-to-back strikeouts...was tagged for a **Brooks Lee** solo home run in the 5th inning before setting down five of his last seven he faced to get through the 6th inning...marked his second quality start of the season and his third start with one or zero runs allowed.

✦ Rasmussen has gone 43 straight regular-season starts (April 30, 2023–pres.) with four runs or fewer allowed, the longest active streak in the major leagues... it is one game shy of tying the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter behind **Shane McClellan** (44G, April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022)...his 31 starts with four runs or fewer last season tied for the most in the majors with **MIL Freddy Peralta**, **PHI Christopher Sánchez**, and **PIT Paul Skenes**.

GENERAL ADMISSION—Across six career outings (four starts) against the Guardians, Rasmussen is 0-0 with a 3.57 ERA (17.2IP, 7ER), 14 strikeouts, a .238 (15-for-63) opp. average, and a 1.19 WHIP...opposing hitters have reached base at a .314 clip against him...carries a 1.69 ERA (16.0IP, 3ER) in his four starts against the club, with two runs or fewer allowed in each start.

✦ Three of his four career starts against Cleveland have come at Progressive Field...he holds a 2.45 ERA (11.0IP, 3ER) at the ballpark with a .162 (6-for-37) opp. average and a 0.64 WHIP.

LACED UP—Rasmussen is making his fourth start of the season away from Tropicana Field...he has posted a 3.95 ERA (13.2IP, 6ER) in the three previous outings despite a 0.88 WHIP and a .173 (9-for-52) opp. average...since Rasmussen was acquired from the Brewers on May 21, 2021, his 1.08 WHIP away from Tropicana Field ranks as the eighth best in the majors among all pitchers (min. 200.0IP).

✦ Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his last 12 starts (June 25, 2025–pres.) with a .195 (38-for-195) opp. average against...over those starts, he has posted a 0.98 WHIP with 48 strikeouts to 14 walks.

STAY IN THE YARD—In his four outings this season, Rasmussen has allowed eight runs (7ER) to a 2.45 ERA in 25.2 innings...each of the eight runs he has allowed have come on the five home runs he has conceded...four of the five home runs have come from left-handed hitters, producing six of the eight runs he has allowed.

✦ He allowed 18 home runs that accounted for 22 of the 47 runs he allowed last season...in 2025, 32 of the 116 hits (27.6%) he allowed were extra-base hits (14 2B, 18HR) with a .340 opp. slugging pct.

POOL RULES: NO BASERUNNING—Through his first five starts of the campaign, he has held hitters to a .160 (15-for-94) opp. average and a 0.74 WHIP...his 0.74 WHIP ranks third in the majors among pitchers with at least 20.0IP or more and his .160 opp. average ranks fourth under the same criteria...opposing hitters are reaching base at a .194 clip against him.

✦ Right-handers have slashed .086/.086/.200 (12-for-59) against him this season, with his .086 opp. average ranking best in the majors (min. 35AB)... eight of his 26 strikeouts this season have come against right-handers with one double and one home run.

MADE A DECISION—Since May 17, 2025, Rasmussen has turned in an 11-1 record, with a career-best six-game winning streak (June 25–pres.)...he and **MIL Quinn Priester** are the only pitchers in the majors over that span to win double-digit games and lose one or zero contests...Rasmussen is the only AL pitcher over that time with double-digit wins and three losses or fewer.

✦ To go with his 11-1 record in that span, he has a 2.52 ERA (135.2IP, 38ER), 118 strikeouts to 31 walks, and a 0.96 WHIP.

FEELING SUPPORTED—Rasmussen has received three runs of support or more in 43 of his 86 career appearances...in those 43 outings, he holds a 28-0 record, 1.90 ERA (217.1IP, 46ER), a .190/.232/.279 (148-for-781) slash line, 0.86 WHIP, and 208 strikeouts to 39 walks...in starts where he receives three runs of support or more, his teams are 37-6.

LEADING THE WAY—Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER) last season, trailing only **DET Tarik Skubal** (2.21), **HOU Hunter Brown** (2.43), and **BOS Garrett Crochet** (2.59)... under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

GOOSE EGGS—Rasmussen made 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more in 2025, the most in a single season in franchise history and tied with **LAD Yoshinobu Yamamoto** for third most in the majors behind **DET Tarik Skubal** (12) and **PIT Paul Skenes** (12)...his 22 such career starts are the second most in Rays history, behind only **Chris Archer** (24).

RIGHT ON TIME—Right-handed batters hit .198 (49-for-247) against him in 2025, sixth lowest in the AL and the sixth lowest mark in franchise history (min. 200AB)...under the same qualifier, his .551 opp. OPS vs. right-handed hitters was third in the AL, trailing only **TEX Nathan Eovaldi** (.512) and **BAL Trevor Rogers** (.519), and ranked second in club history to **Tyler Glasnow** (.492) in 2023.
