TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs 2020 Robert O. Fishel Award-winner Dustin Morse's Twins and the first game of a 6-game road trip that includes an upcoming stop vs the Rays at the reopened Tropicana Field.

- The Reds are coming off a 3-3 homestand vs LAA (1-2) and SF (2-1) in which they batted .180 (32-for-178), their lowest in any homestand since they went 0-6 and batted .172 from 5/3-5/9, 2024 vs Bal & AZ.
- Following Wed's game at TB, the Redlegs will return to Cincinnati for a 6-game homestand vs Det (4/24-4/26) and Col (4/28-4/30).

WINS/RUNS: The Reds have won 11 of their first 19 games despite ranking 28th in the majors with 64 runs scored (SF 58, CWS 60).

- 8 of Cin's 11 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, tying them with StL for the most such wins in the majors.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.
- Cin has been held to 2 runs or fewer 9 times already this season, including twice in the 2-1 series win vs SF...are 5-4 in such games.
- Cin is 4-0 in 1-run games...went 22-22 in 1-run games last year.
- Reds batters have been blanked twice this season, including yesterday vs SF...conversely, Reds pitchers have combined for 3 shutouts (T1st).
- Reds games produce a combined total of 7.42 runs per game...second-lowest in the majors (SF, 7.36).

RUNS VIA HOMER: Of Cin's 64 runs this season, 33 have scored via HR...that 51.6% ranks second in the majors (LAD 55.2%).

3-4-5: Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .275/.366/.545 in the first 19 games of the 2026 season (58-for-211, 16 HR, 39 RBI, 89 times on base).

- The 16 combined HRs from the 3-4-5 spots are the most in the majors.
- The rest of the batting order has combined for a .161/.264/.223 slash (65-for-404, 5 HR, 17 RBI, 122 times on base).

HE'S GRRRRRRREAT!: RHP Tony Santillan has yet to allow a run in 8 apps this season (1-0, 8.0ip, 2h, 6bb, 10k)..on Wed celebrated his 29th birthday.

SWITCH BLADE: SS Elly De La Cruz has homered 4 times in 26 at-bats this season vs left-handed pitchers (.269/.296/.769)...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs LHP (.236/.276/.342)..

- His 6 HR this season lead all switch hitters...is 1 HR away from tying Dmitri Young for second-most by a switch hitter in Reds history.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Twins are meeting for the only time this season...Cin is 21-19 all-time vs Min, including 7-4 here at Target Field and 7-7 at Great American Ball Park.

- Last season, the Redlegs took 2 of 3 at Great American Ball Park (6/17-6/19)...the second game of that series (6/18) was completed early due to rain, with the Reds winning 4-2 in 6 innings (the game was stopped in the bottom of the 6th inning with 2 outs).
- With a 7-2 win in Minneapolis on 9/25/20, the Reds clinched a Postseason berth, their first since 2013.
- A 2-1 series win in April 2018 snapped a streak in which the Reds had lost 9 consecutive Interleague road series of at least 3 games.
- Eugenio Suárez has the most hits (18) by a Red vs Min in the all-time series...his 3 HR rank T1st with Dante Bichette and Willie Greene.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: SS Elly De La Cruz has appeared in each of Cin's last 237 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

MORE ELLY: SS Elly De La Cruz is 6 steals away from ranking among the fastest players in the Live Ball Era (since 1920) to produce 400 hits, 200 RBI, and 150 steals...he's currently at 437 hits, 217 RBI, and 144 steals through 439 career games...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis, who also wore uniform No. 44 for Cin, ranks fourth on that list (401h, 272rbi, 179sb, 458g).

OUR PAL SAL: 1b Sal Stewart has hit safely in 14 of his 19 games this season and reached base in 17 of 19 (20-for-66, .302/.412/.682).

- Stewart ranks among Major League leaders in HR (7, T3rd), RBI (17, T8th), SLG (6th), OPS (1.095, 5th), extra-base hits (11, T4th), and total bases (45, 5th).
- In Wed's 8-3 win vs SF, produced his first multi-HR game, hitting a pair of 3-run shots off RHP Tyler Mahle (1st & 2nd innings)...the 6 RBI marked a new career high.
- Has 12 HR through his first 37 career games, second-most by any Red through his first 36g since 1900 (Aristides Aquino 15hr, 2018-2019).

MINNESOTA NATIVE: The Fairmont, MN native will make his first career start vs the Twins.

• Graduated from Martin County West HS in Sherburn, about 140 miles from Target Field.

LAST TIME OUT: Didn't factor in the decision in the 7-3 win vs LAA on 4/11 (4.0ip, 3h, 3r/3er, 6bb, 3k, 93 TP).

- The 6 walks were a career high...the Reds and Angels combined for 18 walks in the game.
- Allowed 10 baserunners for the first time since 8/19/23 vs the Blue Jays (10).
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 11 of his 21 batters.
- Turned it over to Connor Phillips after the 4th inning with a 5-3 lead.

APRIL 6 at MIA: Earned the 2-0 win on 4/6 at Mia (6.2ip, 3h, 0r, 1bb, 4k, 93TP).

- Was his first Major League victory and first quality start since 9/29/23 at StL, a span of 920 days.
- Tied his career high with 6.2 innings pitched (3x)...marked the first time in his Major League career that he ever pitched 6.2 shutout innings.
- Allowed 4 of his 24 batters to reach.
- Turned it over to Brock Burke in the 7th inning with 2 outs and a runner on first...Burke fanned Xavier Edwards.

MARCH 31 vs PIT: Suffered the 8-3 loss on 3/31 vs Pit (4.2ip, 6h, 6r/6er, 2bb, 3k, 3hr, 94 TP).

- The 3 home runs allowed were a career high...5 of the 6 runs allowed came via HR.
- 4 of the 6 runs allowed came with 2 outs, including back-to-back homers in Pit's 5-run 2nd inning (O'Hearn 3-run HR, Reynolds solo HR).
- Was his first Major League appearance since 9/17/24 at Atl, a span of 560 days...missed all of last season as he recovered from left elbow reconstruction surgery (10/9/24).
