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THE TWINS: Completed their nine-game, 10-day roadtrip with a record of 3-6, going 1-2 at Seattle, 1-2 at Kansas City and 1-2 at Milwaukee...tonight, the Twins will begin a nine-game, 10-day homestand with the first of three against the Orioles through Wednesday...after this series, the Twins will travel to Dyersville, Iowa to play the Phillies at the Field of Dreams on Thursday night...they will enjoy an off-day on Friday, then complete the series with Philadelphia at Target Field on Saturday and Sunday...they will finish the homestand next week with three against the Braves, from August 17-19.

TWINS WALKED-OFF IN WISCONSIN: The Twins lost to the Brewers yesterday afternoon at American Family Field by a score of 4-3 in 10 innings, suffering their fourth walk-off defeat of the season...Connor Prielipp was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs (2 on solo homers) on five hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with two walks and seven strikeouts...the offense recorded just five hits, two apiece from Brooks Lee and Victor Caratini...Lee hit his 17th home run of the season and Kody Clemens hit his 20th, both setting single-season career-highs in homers.

BIRD BALL: The Twins and Orioles are playing each other today for the fourth of six games in 2026...Twins opened the season in Baltimore from March 26-28, winning just the middle game of the three-game series.

- Twins last hosted the O's for three games from May 6-8, 2025, sweeping in three games.
- Twins are 7-2 vs. Baltimore in their last nine (since the start of 2025) after going 0-10 head-to-head prior to this stretch (from July 2, 2023-September 29, 2024).
- Since 2018, the Twins have hit 74 home runs in 47 games against the Orioles, their third-most vs. any opponent outside of the AL Central (88 vs. SEA & 81 vs. TOR).
- Josh Bell is hitting .333 (30-for-90) with seven home runs, 18 RBI, a .611 slugging percentage and a .991 OPS in 25 career games vs. the Orioles...he has hit safely in 13 of his last 16 vs. the O's...he has homered in five of his last 12 vs. the O's.
- Victor Caratini is hitting .341 (14-for-41) with six walks, eight RBI, a .420 on-base percentage and an .859 OPS in 15 career games vs. Baltimore.

MAKING A TARGET RUN: Twins return home where they have gone 30-27...they have gone 6-1-0 in series play at home since June 12.

- Since June 28, they have gone 9-4 at home, posting a .692 winning percentage...marks the fourth-highest winning percentage in baseball since that date, trailing Atlanta (.714, 15-6), Milwaukee (.714, 15-6) and Boston (.700, 14-6).
- Over their last 13 home games, Twins starters have combined to go 3-3, 3.09 ERA (75.2 IP, 26 ER) with 19 walks, 74 strikeouts and a .214 opponent batting average.
- Ryan Jeffers has hit safely in nine-straight home games...over his last 17 games at Target Field, he is hitting .328 (20-for-61) with a .933 OPS.

THE LEFTORIUM: Twins are facing a left-handed starter for the third time in their last four games and fifth time in their last 11 games...tonight marks the 39th lefty starter the Twins will be facing this season; going 17-21 in previous games.

- Ryan Jeffers is hitting .319 (22-for-69) with a .932 OPS vs. lefties this season...his batting average ranks eighth in the AL (min. 70 PA) and his OPS ranks 11th.
- Since July 31, Royce Lewis is hitting .538 (7-for-13) vs. lefties, with one double and two home runs.
- Josh Bell has five hits in his last eight at-bats vs. left-handed pitching, including one home run off Shane Drohan on Friday.
- Luke Keaschall has four hits in his last seven at-bats vs. lefties.

SAINT LEWIS: Royce Lewis went 0-for-5 yesterday, snapping his hitting streak at 13 games...over his last 14 games, he is hitting .345 (19-for-55) with five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI, a .636 slugging percentage and a 1.005 OPS.

- Lewis' OPS by month: March/April - .666 // May - .318 // June - .841 // July - .722 // August - 1.109
- Among all AL players with a minimum of 30 plate appearances this month, Lewis ranks third in batting average (.394), OPS (1.109) and slugging percentage (.697).
- He also ranks fifth in baseball this month in average exit velocity (95.5 mph).

LUUUUUUUUUUUUUUUKE!: Since July 1, Luke Keaschall is hitting .315 (29-for-92) with four doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, 15 runs scored, 12 walks, a .421 on-base percentage and a .910 OPS...in that span, he ranks third in the AL in both OPS and on-base percentage, and fourth in batting average.

EXCELLENT 'PENMANSHIP: Over their last 16 games, the Twins bullpen has posted a 2.86 ERA (55.0 IP, 17 ER) with 31 walks, 59 strikeouts (9.7 K/9.0 IP) and a .220 opponent batting average.

- Since the trade deadline on August 3, Twins relievers have struck out 24 of 83 batters faced (28.9%)...in that same span, they have held opponents to a .206 batting average with one home run (Massey off Minter on Wednesday).
- Pen ERA by month: March/April - 5.15 // May - 4.40 // June - 6.94 // July - 2.86 // August - 3.51

THE INKREDIBLE KODY CLEMENS: Kody Clemens hit his 20th home run yesterday afternoon, setting a single-season career-high (19 in 2025)...since being acquired by the Twins in late April of 2025 (from Philly for cash), he has 39 home runs in 799 plate appearances...prior to joining Minnesota, he had 14 home runs in 402 plate appearances for Detroit (2022) and Philadelphia (2023-25).

- Since June 1, he's homered 14 times, tied for sixth-most in the AL.
- Among AL players with at least 400 plate appearances this season, he ranks 12th in slugging percentage (.465).

SO FRESH, SO C-LEE-N: Brooks Lee hit his 17th home run of the season yesterday, setting a new single-season career-high, passing his previous total of 16 last season...14 of his home runs have been hit from the left side of the plate and three have been hit from the right side of the plate.

- Lee has 61 RBI, needing three to match his 2025 total of 64.

RED HOT CULPEPPERS: In his last 27 games between Triple-A St. Paul and Minnesota, Kaelen Culppepper has combined to hit .320 (32-for-100) with six doubles, two triples, three home runs, 10 RBI, 23 runs scored, 12 walks, a .419 on-base percentage, a .510 slugging percentage and a .929 OPS.

PRESTO! IT'S PRESTON: Double-A Wichita right-handed pitcher Preston Johnson has been named Texas League Pitcher of the Week...the 26-year-old made two appearances (1 start) for the Wind Surge, pitching 8.0 scoreless innings, with one hit allowed, three walks and nine strikeouts...the Jackson, Mississippi native was signed by the Twins on May 18 after spending three seasons in Baltimore's organization.

HBD BANDA: Left-handed reliever Anthony Banda is celebrating his 33rd birthday today...Banda has been on the Injured List since June 29, recovering from a left lat strain.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1971, Harmon Killebrew hit his 500th and 501st career home runs against Baltimore at Met Stadium...in 2024, former general manager Terry Ryan and former coach Rick Stelmazek were inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame.
