IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME: Fresh off a series win in Baltimore, the Detroit Tigers tonight return to Comerica Park to start a six-game N.L. Central homestand with the first of three against the Cincinnati Reds ... the stay concludes next week with three games vs. the Pittsburgh Pirates ... the Tigers this week have reached 20 games above .500 for the first time since the end of the 2013 season when they won the A.L. Central with a 93-69 mark.

- Detroit's 23-9 record in its first 32 home games is the club's best start in 54 years since going 24-8 in 1971 ... in fact, only three times in franchise history have the Tigers started off better at home than in 2025: 1909, 1911 and 1971, which were all 24-8 starts ... thanks to Elias.
- Additionally, the Tigers are 8-2 in their first 10 home series this season ... the Tigers have won eight of their first 10 home series for only the third time in the 125-year history of the franchise, joining 1971 (8-1-1) and 1909 (8-0-2) ... thanks to Elias.
- Overall, the Tigers boast the best home record in the A.L. (23-9, .719) and the second-best home mark in all of baseball behind only the New York Mets (27-7, .794) ... only the Angels (31) have played fewer home games than Detroit among A.L. clubs this year.
- This series against Cincinnati continues a stretch of nine out of 12 games at home, a span that ultimately extends to 15 of 21 games at home to conclude the month of June.

HAVE WE GOTTEN THE TRISKAIDEKAPHOBIA OUT OF OUR SYSTEM?: The Tigers enter tonight's game on a mini two-game winning streak when it comes to games played on Friday the 13th ... the Tigers had lost six-straight Friday the 13th contests before winning their last two attempts, including a 1-0 win at Baltimore last September 13 ... fortunately, or unfortunately, today marks the only Friday the 13th on the entire 2025 calendar and none fall within the 2026 baseball season either ... we'll be sure to circle back on this on August 13, 2027.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Tigers are unbeaten in their last five series, have gone 9-2-1 in their last 12 series beginning May 1 and are 16-5-1 in their 22 series overall this season ... the Tigers are a major league best 18-4 in series openers this year, including wins in their last five such games.

THIS IS ON THE RECORD: At 45-25, the Tigers have the best record in the A.L. and are half a game behind the Mets for the best mark in the majors ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 70 games in 19 years when they began 46-24 in 2006 ... the Tigers are now 27-13 in their last 40 games starting April 30.

- The Tigers have posted a 45-22 record, a .672 winning percentage, in their last 67 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 45-22 record, which is a 109-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 4.5-games up on the Yankees, the next closest A.L. team.

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson has 16 homers, 31 extra-base hits and 47 RBI this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals ... in total, there are nine players overall in the majors to have reached those numbers.

- Torkelson ranks fourth in the A.L. in homers and RBI and is tied for sixth in extra-base hits ... Torkelson's .338 on-base percentage is currently 43 points higher than last year's .295 mark and his .598 slugging is 124 points higher than last year's .374 mark.
- Torkelson has now hit 10 home runs with two strikes this year, the most in the majors ... Torkelson also leads the A.L. and is tied for second in the majors with 19 RBI with runners in scoring position and two outs ... his seven extra-base hits with RISP/two outs lead the A.L. and tie for most in the majors.

VESTED INTERESTS: Will Vest (5-0, 12 saves, 1.83 ERA) and Tommy Kahnle (eight saves, 1.50 ERA) are two of the 10 pitchers in baseball with at least eight saves and a sub-2.00 ERA this season and the only set of teammates to each do so ... regardless of ERA, Vest and Kahnle are one of only three sets of teammates to each have eight saves this year, joining San Francisco's Camilo Doval and Ryan Walker as well as New York's Luke Weaver and Devin Williams.

- Vest is the only pitcher in all of baseball with at least five wins, 12 saves and a sub-2.00 ERA.

THE DEPARTMENT OF GLEYBER: Gleyber Torres has turned in a .756 OPS this season, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. and second to only St. Louis' Brendan Donovan (.819) in the majors ... Torres leads all A.L. second basemen with a .379 on-base percentage, and a .267 batting average, is second in the A.L. with 30 RBI and third in the A.L. with a .383 slugging.

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +88 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+107) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +72 edge on the second-place Twins (+16), are +102 on the third-place Guardians (-14) and are +107 on the fourth-place Royals (-21).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers last night improved to 32-6, an .842 winning percentage, when scoring the first run of the game, the best record in all of baseball.

- Montero will come out of relief today and be the "bulk guy", a role he is familiar with...the right-hander did this in back-to-back outings on May 13 and 19 as well as his last game on June 7 against the Cubs.
- Began the 2025 season with Triple-A Toledo, going 1-1 with a 2.79 ERA in his two starts...allowed three runs on six hits and one walk while striking out 11 over 9.2 innings.
- Named International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 7-13, 2025, after picking up the win with 5.2 perfect innings and six strikeouts on April 10.
- Saw his first Major League action last year, appearing in 19 games (16 starts) with Detroit, going 6-6 with a 4.76 ERA (52ER/98.1IP) and 77 strikeouts. He made his Major League debut on May 29 against Pittsburgh.

- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster after a standout spring camp, during which he didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief...went 1-0, surrendering seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.
