RAYS REPORT—The Rays open a brief three-game home swing vs. the Dodgers (3G) tonight before embarking on a 12-game, 14-day, West Coast trip against the Angels (3G), Mariners (3G), Athletics (3G) and Giants (3G) starting Monday...are coming off a seven-game road trip against the Reds (0-3) and Yankees (1-3), their ninth time going 1-6 (or worse) on a seven-game trip in franchise history and first since June 14-20, 2021 (1-6), according to Stats Perform...are multiple games below .500 for the first time since entering play on May 24 (24-26)...were last three games under entering play on May 23 (23-26)...have dropped three straight, seven of eight, nine of 11, 13 of 17, 17 of 23 and 21 of their last 29 games...started 21-26, went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20-June 26 and are an MLB-worst 8-21 since June 27...have lost eight of their last nine series and are 2-2-1 in their last five home sets...are fifth in the AL in run differential (+50)...are fourth in the AL East for the 21st consecutive day, a season-high-tying 10.0 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 4.0 GB behind the Mariners for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 51 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays dropped yesterday's series finale at Yankee Stadium, 7-4, after falling behind 7-0 in the 3rd inning...the defeat ensured a season series defeat, the Rays first time losing back-to-back season sets to the Yankees since 2015-18 (4).
- ✦ Tampa Bay scored all four of its runs in the 4th inning—its 35 innings with four runs or more this season lead the majors, ahead of Milwaukee and Chicago-NL (both 34).
- ✦ It marked the Rays sixth consecutive series loss on the road, their longest streak since June 15-July 26, 2007 (7) and tied for the sixth-longest streak in club history.
- ✦ Under **Kevin Cash** (2015-pres.), the Rays are 164-108 (.603) in August, second in the majors, trailing only the Dodgers (185-91/.670).
- ✦ Tampa Bay has split its six home games since the All-Star break (3-3) and is 20-10 (.667) at Steinbrenner Field since May 20, the AL's third-best home record in that span behind Toronto (24-5/.828) and Boston (21-10/.677).
- ✦ The Rays 19-14 (.576) mark in Interleague play ranks fifth in the AL/tied with the Dodgers (19-14) for eighth in the majors.
- ✦ Tampa Bay is looking to snap a six-game skid in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers...its last such win came on June 24 vs. KC (**Kris Bubic**).
- ✦ The Rays are 7-2 in their last nine series openers in Tampa, but have lost seven of their last nine openers overall.

I'VE BEEN TO THE YEAR 3000—Tonight's matchup with **Clayton Kershaw** marks the first time the Rays have been opposed by a current member of MLB's 3,000-strikeout club since May 16, 2023 at NYM, when they tagged **Justin Verlander** for six runs in an 8-5 win...since 2008, they have faced two pitchers who entered with 3,000 career strikeouts: Verlander and NYY **CC Sabathia** (6x, last: July 16, 2019 vs. NYY)...according to Stats Perform, it will mark the 38th time an opposing pitcher has appeared against the Rays who has already reached or surpassed 3,000 career strikeouts, including matchups with **Roger Clemens** (19G), **Randy Johnson** (8G), Sabathia (6G), **Curt Schilling** (2G), **Greg Maddux** (1G) and Verlander (1G).

TURN THE PAGE—The Rays went 7-18 (.280) in July, the lowest winning pct. in the majors and their lowest in a calendar month since **Kevin Cash** took the helm in 2015...it marked the fifth-worst winning pct. in a month in team history (min. 6G), ahead of only July 2007 (7-20/.259), July 2002 (7-20), May 2001 (7-20) and June 2003 (5-21/.192)...Rays hitters had the AL's lowest OPS (.677) while averaging the fewest runs per game (.392)...on the mound, their 4.43 ERA (215.1IP, 106ER) ranked 19th in the majors, but the bullpen led MLB with nine blown saves, tying the club record for a single month (5x, last: Sept. 2023)...the Rays led in 11 of their 18 defeats, their most blown lead losses in a month since May 2017 (11) and tied for second most in a month in franchise history (8x), trailing only August 2006 (14).

- ✦ According to FanGraphs, the Rays postseason probability dropped by 66.7 pct. entering play on July 1 through the month's end, going from 75.6 pct. to 8.9 pct.

HOME COOKING—**Junior Caminero** has reached base safely in a career-high 19 straight home games, batting .387/.439/.747 (29-for-75) with 6 2B, 7 HR, 17 RBI and a 1.186 OPS in that span...it marks the second-longest active streak in the majors behind **ATH Brent Rooker** (30G) and ties **Yandy Diaz** (June 3-July 21) for the longest streak by a Ray this season...the last longer streak belongs to **Isaac Paredes** (22G) from March 30-May 12, 2024.

GO, JONNY, GO—**Jonny DeLuca** has hit safely in a career-high eight straight starts, going 12-for-29 (.414) with 2 3B, 4 RBI, 4 R and 5 SB in those games...the streak began March 30 vs. COL before he was sidelined for 94 games with a right shoulder strain...despite registering a plate appearance in only 12 of the Rays 110 games, he is the only Tampa Bay hitter with multiple triples, and his six three-baggers since the start of last season lead the club.

- ✦ He is a combined 13-for-31 (.419) in at-bats ending with fastballs or breaking pitches.

MILESTONE WATCH—**Brandon Lowe** is one game shy of 700 for his career...**Yandy Diaz** is one hit away from 900 and five runs from tying **Kevin Kiermaier** (410R) for fifth on the Rays all-time list...his 64 three-hit games are one shy of **Aubrey Huff** (65G) for third...**Christopher Morel** is 4 RBI away from 200...**Junior Caminero** and **Nick Fortes** are both 4 RBI shy of 100...**Josh Lowe** needs 1 SB to surpass **Miguel Cairo** for sole possession of 10th in franchise history...**Pete Fairbanks** needs 3 SO to tie **Grant Balfour** (291SO) for third most by a reliever in club history and four saves to match **Fernando Rodney** (85SV) for third in Rays history.



BLUE CREW IN THE BAY—The Rays and Dodgers meet for their lone series of 2025 this weekend in Tampa...the Rays are 2-3-4 in series play vs. Los Angeles (2-1-2 at home) with the lone wins coming from May 26-28, 2023 and June 22-24, 2007, both at Tropicana Field...last season, they dropped two of three games at Dodger Stadium from Aug. 23-25, falling on a **Shohei Ohtani** walk-off grand slam in the opener before taking the second game in 10 innings, 9-8, thanks to a pair of clutch homers by **José Caballero** (go-ahead 2R HR in 10th inn.) and **Junior Caminero** (game-tying solo HR in 9th)...they dropped the rubber match, 3-1, after **Mookie Betts** hit a go-ahead two-run homer in 8th...in each of the last five meetings between the clubs dating back to May 27, 2023, the winning run was scored in the 7th inning or later.

- ✦ **Junior Caminero** went 6-for-13 (.462) with 2 2B, 2 HR and 3 RBI in the three-game series against the Dodgers last season...**Jonny DeLuca** was 5-for-11 (.455) with 1 HR, 3 RBI and 2 BB vs. his former club.

TONIGHT'S START—Shane Baz will toe the rubber for his 22nd start of the season and 12th at home...marks his 45th career start and 22nd at home...marks his first career start opposite the Dodgers...the Rays have won seven of his last 12 starts and are 12-9 in his outings overall (6-5 at home)...has taken the loss in a career-high four consecutive starts, pitching to a 5.91 ERA (21.1IP, 14ER)...was acquired from the Pirates as a player to be named later (Aug. 14, 2018) along with **RHP Tyler Glasnow** and **OF Austin Meadows** for **RHP Chris Archer** on July 31, 2018.

LAST TIME OUT—Suffered his career-high fourth consecutive loss after yielding 5.0 innings of two-run ball in a 2-1 loss to the Reds on July 27 at Great American Ball Park (5.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 2BB, 5SO)...all the damage came in the 1st inning, as he allowed singles to each of the first two batters before an **Austin Hays'** RBI-single two batters later opened the scoring...another scored on a ground out...the second run came around to score on a ground out in the next at-bat...from there, Baz was scoreless over his final 4.1 innings...he retired seven of his next nine batters faced (2BB) before surrendering back-to-back singles in the 3rd inning...finished the day putting away each of his final seven faced.

- ✦ He threw 100 pitches, his highest total on an outing of 5.0 innings or fewer in his career...his previous high was 91 pitches across 4.1 frames on Aug. 8, 2024 at STL.
- ✦ Has pitched to a 2.97 ERA (60.2IP, 20ER) in road starts this season, which includes a 2.51 mark (43.0IP, 12ER) with a .212 (33-for-156) opp. average in his last seven such starts...has not allowed more than 3 ER in that stretch.
- ✦ The Rays have lost each of his last five starts after winning his previous seven from May 24–July 12.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'—Baz has never faced the Dodgers in his career...has made just two appearances (2GS) against NL West clubs in his career, the fewest of any division he has faced...he won both contests, working 7.0 shutout innings in a 1-0 victory over the Padres at Petco Park on April 25 of this year (W, 7.0IP, 4H, BB, HBP, 6SO) and tossing 5.0 innings of two-run ball in an 11-4 win over the Padres on Aug. 31, 2024 at Tropicana Field (W, 5.0IP, 2H, 2ER, HR, 3BB, 5SO).

- ✦ Baz is 3-3 with a 3.44 ERA (34.0IP, 13ER) in six Interleague starts this season, three of which were quality...all three wins came in Rays shutout victories in which he tossed a combined 18.2 scoreless innings...he allowed 13 ER over 14.1 IP (8.16 ERA) in the three losses...when facing Interleague opponents at home in his career, he is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA (31.2IP, 11ER), 40 SO and a .214 (25-for-117) opp. average.

SHANE AT THE STEIN—Since posting a 1.42 ERA (19.0IP, 3ER) over his first three home starts, Baz is 3-3 with an 8.69 ERA (39.1IP, 38ER) across his last eight at Steinbrenner Field dating back to April 19...the Rays have gone 4-4 in this stretch, backing him with 5.49 runs of support per 9.0 IP...on the season, his 6.33 ERA (58.1IP, 41ER) at home is third highest among qualified pitchers, better than only COL **Antonio Senzatela** (6.39) and ATH **Luis Severino** (6.34)...meanwhile, his 2.97 ERA (60.2IP, 20ER) on the road ranks ninth in the AL.

WHERE DID THE PARTY GO?—Over the span of eight consecutive starts between May 24–July 1, Baz received three runs of support or more in each start, totaling 36 runs of support and a 6.66 run support average...he also posted a 5-0 record and a 3.33 ERA (48.2IP, 18ER) over that timeframe...in his four starts since, he has received three total runs of support, good for a 1.27 run support average, while pitching to a 5.91 ERA (21.1IP, 14ER).

- ✦ When Baz receives three runs of support or more in his career, he is 13-1 with a 3.11 ERA (124.1IP, 43ER), and the Rays are 19-4 (10-2 in 2025)...in 21 starts with two runs or fewer, he is 2-11 with a 4.96 ERA (114.1IP, 63ER), and Tampa Bay has gone 5-16 (2-7 in 2025).

CUT IT UP—Baz fully introduced a cutter to his arsenal on June 15 and opponents have since gone 14-for-51 (.275) with 8 SO against the offering...they were 2-for-17 (.118) in his first three starts after implementing the pitch, but are 12-for-33 (.364) in his last five...the cutter has been his second-most utilized pitch over his last eight starts, throwing it 27.7 pct. of the time (215 of 777 pitches), trailing only his four-seam fastball (39.6%/308 of 777... he has not thrown a silder since he began utilizing the cutter.

RUNNING OUT OF GAS—Over the first three innings, Baz has pitched to a 3.14 ERA (63.0IP, 22ER), 1.14 WHIP and .218 (51-for-234) opp. average... he has held opponents scoreless in the opening frame in 19 of his 21 starts this season and 37 of his 44 career starts...Baz had went 13 straight starts (April 25–July 1) without a run allowed in the first two frames prior to his outing on July 7 at DET...from the 4th inning on, he owns a 6.27 ERA (56.0IP, 39ER), 1.48 WHIP and .278 (60-for-216) opp. average...39 of his 61 runs allowed (63.9%) have come from the 4th inning on.

10 PAIR FOR 10—Baz struck out a career-high 11 batters on April 14 vs. BOS... paired with his start on April 1 vs. PIT, he became the fifth pitcher since 1901 to record 10 SO or more with no walks in two of his first three starts of a season, joining MIL **Corbin Burnes** and CWS **Lance Lynn** in 2021, WSH **Stephen Strasburg** in 2010 and AZ **Randy Johnson** in 2000 (Stats Perform).

GOING STREAKING—Baz threw 6.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer in six consecutive starts from Sept. 17, 2024–April 14, 2025, tying the longest streak in franchise history (6GS, 5x, last: **Shane McClanahan**, June 20–July 26, 2022)...he was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.0IP, 8ER) and 0.74 WHIP during the streak, holding opponents to a .160/.218/.252 (21-for-131) slash line with 46 SO and 7 BB.
