**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the A's, 1-0, yesterday... The Mets are in a stretch of nine straight games (1-5)...New York concluded a six-game homestand (1-5) against Arizona (1-2) and the A's (0-3)...The Mets hit the road for their second trip of the season...The team will head out for a six-game seven-game trip against the Dodgers (three games) and the Cubs (three games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves...OF Tommy Pham (#39) has been selected from Triple-A Syracuse...INF Ronny Mauricio has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

**LET'S NOT GO STREAKING:** The Mets are on a season-long five-game losing streak...The Mets have posted a 6.00 ERA (30 ER/45.0 IP) in that span with 17 walks and 42 strikeouts...As a team, they are batting .205/.243/.289...They have been outscored 30-6 in the current streak.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets hit the road for the second time in 2026...They are 4-3 in 2026...The team's 2.30 ERA on the road is second in the NL and fourth in the Majors...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 2.35 ERA on the road this season, which is the fourth-best in the NL.

**STRIKE THAT:** Yesterday, the Mets recorded double-digit strikeouts for the seventh time this season...They are tied for the third-most such games in the NL this season (also: San Diego and Miami)...Overall the team has recorded 144 punchouts, which is the fourth-most in the National League.

**ATTABOY ALVAREZ:** On Saturday, Francisco Alvarez Launched a solo home run to center field in the sixth, his fourth home run of the season...He joined Gary Carter (6, 1988), Todd Hundley (1995, 7, 1996), Mike Piazza (2001, 5, 2002) and John Buck (6, 2013) as the only Mets catchers with four or more home runs through the team's first 15 games of a season...He is batting .300 (12-40) with seven runs, one double, four homers, five walks and four RBI in 14 games this season.

**MIGHT GOOD MANAEA:** Sean Manaea fired 3.0 scoreless innings in relief and recorded a season-high four strikeouts yesterday...It was his fifth career relief appearance of at least 3.0 scoreless innings...Has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/10.2 IP) through his first four relief appearances this season...His 12.0 innings in relief are the second-most among NL pitchers.

**DODGERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 6-4 over their last 10 regular season games in LA.

**WHAT ABOUT BOB:** Luis Robert Jr. has extended his on-base streak to 10 games...In the NL, ranks second among qualifiers in OBP (.458) and tied for fifth in walks...He recorded a career-high 40 walks in 110 games last season.

**THE HUASCAR GOES TO:** Huascar Brazobán has not allowed an earned run in 11 multi-inning appearances since 2025...Has yet to allow a run over 8.1 innings this season, the second-most innings without allowing a run in the majors by a relief pitcher (most: Antonio Senzatela 9.0 IP).

**D-FENSE:** The Mets are fifth in the National League with a total of nine Defensive Runs Saved according to The Fielding Bible.

**IN A PINCH:** The Mets have recorded an MLB leading eight RBI from their pinch-hitters this season...In 2025, the Mets recorded a total of nine RBI from their pinch-hitters...Overall this year, Mets pinch hitters are batting .364 (4-11) with two runs, one double, one home run and seven RBI...Their .364 average is the Major League lead.

**BROOKS AND DONE:** Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run through his first six appearances of the season (5.2 IP)...Since returning from "Tommy John" surgery on July 19, 2025, has pitched to a 2.01 ERA (7 ER/31.1 IP)...Has not allowed a home run over his last 52.2 innings pitched dating back to August 15, 2023, the third-longest active homerless streak in the Majors.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets fell to the Phillies, 4-2, at the Vet...Rick Aguilera took the loss, allowing all four runs in 6.0 innings of work...Keith Hernandez led the offense, going 3-3 with one run, one walk and a double, while Ray Knight hit his second homer of the season...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed six hits and five earned runs over 5.0 innings...Recorded a season-high six strikeouts...He has allowed six or more hits in three consecutive starts for the sixth time in his career.

**VS. DODGERS/NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Has recorded two runs or fewer in four of his six career appearances vs. the Dodgers...He has recorded a 4.45 ERA (15 ER/30.1 IP) and a 8.60 SO/9.0 IP...In his two appearances against Los Angeles-NL in 2025, he allowed five earned runs over 14.2 innings with 13 strikeouts against four walks...All three starts this season have come against National League opponents...Peterson made 25 appearances vs. the National League last season, posting a 4.53 ERA (70 ER/139.0 IP)...The Mets were 14-11 last year when Peterson started against a National League team.

**ON THE ROAD:** Dating back to last season, Peterson has recorded seven starts where he's completed at least 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs...Today's outing will mark his second road start this season.

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Peterson recorded a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with nine strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .235 (12-51) average...Last pitched on March 22 at Miami, tossing a spring-high 5.0 innings (1R, 5H, 1BB, 4K).

**2025 YEAR IN REVIEW:** Over a career-high 30 starts in 2025, he went 9-6 with a 4.22 ERA (79 ER/168.2 IP), 65 walks and a career-high 150 strikeouts...He allowed three earned runs or less in 22 of his 30 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...He picked up at least eight strikeouts in five of his 30 starts this season...Allowed four or more earned runs in eight of his last 16 starts after not allowing more than three earned runs through his first 14 starts of the season...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, finished third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59), tied for fourth in opponent GIDP (20) and sixth in groundball percentage (54.7).

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Completed at least 7.0+ innings in six of his 30 starts last season...Mets starters completed 7.0 innings 10 times in 2025, six of those starts came from Peterson...Him and Nolan McLean were the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings this season...His two 8.0+ innings pitched starts were the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He completed pitched 5.0 or more in 24 of his 30 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 24 such starts were the most on the team and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings were the most on the team...He became one of 13 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ innings pitched...He joined Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 24 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, his 16 starts of 6.0+ innings pitched, six starts of 7.0+ innings pitched and two 8.0+ innings pitched are all his most in a single season.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR:** On July 10, 2025, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first-half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He became the first Mets starting pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

**LEFTY LEADERBOARD:** His 614 strikeouts are the seventh-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Tug McGraw is next on the list with 618 K...His 115 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, he posted a .228/.275/.289 slash line (34-149) and allowed just one home run to 161 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he finished fifth in groundball percentage (63.7), tied for fifth in strikeouts (48), seventh in opponents' SLG (.289), 10th in OPS (.564) and 13th in opponents' OBP...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

**QUALITY CONTROL:** Recorded 15 quality starts in 30 total outings last season, including 12 of his last 23 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from July 3 - August 1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 46 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to the end of this season, he was one of 12 pitchers (one of five in the NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez, Max Fried and Cristopher Sánchez).

**APPLE PICKING:** Last season, Peterson recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which was tied for the second-best in the majors with six others, trailing Matthew Boyd and Max Fried...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 33 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Max Fried is next on the list at 23...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

**CAREER NOTES:** Set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts last season...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from June 5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of six Major League seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 37-30 with a 4.12 ERA (285 ER/622.2 IP), 262 walks and 614 strikeouts in 131 games (115 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his 10th scoreless appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the seventh-most such games among NL relievers during that span.

- Earned his first win of the season after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings on April 5 at San Francisco (1.1 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 17 relief appearances, which is tied for the seventh-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in each of his last 11 appearances (14.2 IP).
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
