## ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (15-13) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (16-13)

April 28, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #30/Home #15

RHP Kyle Leahy (2-3, 5.63 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (1-1, 2.43 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** dropped the first game of this seven-game homestand with Monday night's 4-2 loss vs. St. Louis...Will host the Cardinals for three more games (Tuesday-Thursday) before welcoming Cincinnati for a three-game series (May 1-3)...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game road trip to Texas (1-2, April 21-23) and Milwaukee (2-1, Friday-Sunday)...Are in the fifth game of a stretch of 10 consecutive games against the National League Central (are 6-4 against the division this season)...Are 15-10 in their last 25 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) following a 1-3 start...Have lost back-to-back games (also Sunday at Milwaukee) for only the second time (also March 26-28 at New York-NL)...Have not lost three straight games since dropping five straight games last season from September 14-19 against Washington, Chicago (NL) and the Athletics.

**PITCH (NEAR) PERFECT:** Mason Montgomery (1.0ip), Justin Lawrence (1.0ip), Wilber Dotel (4.0ip) and Evan Sisk (0.2ip) combined to toss 6.2 perfect innings to begin Monday's game vs. St. Louis before Sisk allowed an infield single to Alec Burleson...It marked Pittsburgh's second bid for a perfect game of 6.2 innings in the last four games (also Paul Skenes, Friday at Milwaukee)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Pittsburgh became only the second Major League team in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have multiple bids for a perfect game of at least 6.2 innings within a four-game span, along with New York (AL), which did it on June 2, 2022 vs. Los Angeles-AL (7.0 innings) and June 3, 2022 vs. Los Angeles-AL (6.2 innings)...The Pirates also became the first Major League team to have a bid for a perfect game of at least 6.2 innings while using multiple pitchers since Detroit on September 13, 2024 vs. Baltimore, when Beau Brieske (1.1ip) and Brant Hurter (5.2ip) combined to pitch 7.0 perfect innings.

**PICK SIX:** Pirates pitchers have at least six strikeouts in 66 straight games (since last year on August 18 vs. Toronto)...That is tied with New York-AL (August 22, 2017-April 29, 2018) for the fourth-longest streak by any Major League team during the Modern Era (since 1901), behind New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019), Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023) and Cincinnati (71 games, August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021)...Pittsburgh's 268 strikeouts in 2026 are the most in the National League and the third-most in all of Major League Baseball (Cleveland, 278/Toronto, 273).

**COUNT ON ISAAC:** Isaac Mattson struck out the only batter he faced (Jordan Walker) on Monday vs. St. Louis...He has tossed a career-high 15.1 straight scoreless innings (since March 29 at New York-NL)...Mattson's 1.13 ERA (16.0ip/2er) ranks third among Major League relievers (minimum 16.0 innings pitched), behind Colorado's Antonio Senzatela (0.50 ERA, 18.0ip/1er).

**GOOD GONZO:** Nick Gonzales went 3-for-4 with a double and a run scored on Monday vs. St. Louis, extending his hitting streak to eight straight games (since April 19 vs. Tampa Bay)...He is hitting 15-for-31 (.484) with two doubles, three RBI, a walk, a hit by pitch, a stolen base and five runs scored during the streak...Gonzales' current streak is tied for the second-longest streak of his career (also July 14-26, 2024), trailing two nine-game streaks last season from August 16-25 and August 28-September 6...He is looking to double in three straight games for the second time in his career (also August 27-31, 2024)...Gonzales' .409 average (18-for-44) over his last 12 games (since April 15 vs. Washington) ranks fifth in all of Major League Baseball (18 hits in that time are the third-most in all of MLB).

**WALK THIS WAY:** Bryan Reynolds has drawn 22 walks through his first 29 games...His 22 walks are the second-most in the National League, trailing only Washington's James Wood (28), and are also tied with Chicago (AL)'s Munetaka Murakami for the fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (30), Los Angeles (AL)'s Mike Trout (30) and Wood...Reynolds' 22 walks are the second-most by a Pirate during March/April of a single season in the Modern Era (since 1901), behind Jason Bay in 2006 (24)...His 48 times on base safely are the fifth-most by a Pirate during March/April of a single season in the Modern Era, behind Nate McLouth in 2008 (54), himself in 2024 (50), Bay in 2006 (49) and Andrew McCutchen in 2014 (49).

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 28, 1971: Steve Blass improved to 3-0 on the season after starting and pitching 7.0 innings in the Pirates' 7-5 win over the Dodgers at Three Rivers Stadium. Willie Stargell led the way offensively for Pittsburgh after going 3-for-4 with a double, three RBI and a run, while Vic Davalillo also went 2-for-3 with a double, a stolen base and two runs. Dave Giusti earned the save with his 2.0 scoreless innings.

## TONIGHT'S STARTER

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Ashcraft was in line for the win, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 8-4, last at-bat win on April 22 at Texas...Ashcraft, who pitched in front of 150-plus friends and family from his hometown of Robinson, Texas (approximately 110 miles from Globe Life Field), allowed two runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...He departed with a 4-2 lead before the Rangers tied it in the eighth inning...The Pirates scored four runs in the ninth inning to capture a win...Ashcraft's 94 pitches were his most in any professional appearance, while his 7.0 innings matched his most in any professional appearance (also May 14, 2024 and June 6, 2024 with Double-A Altoona)...He was reinstated from the Major League Bereavement/Family Medical Emergency List today.

**FROM THE ASHES:** Ashcraft allowed two runs and had five strikeouts in a career-high 7.0 innings on April 22 at Texas...He has pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in each of his first five starts, joining Ian Snell (2007, five), Erik Bedard (2012, six), A.J. Burnett (2015, nine) and Trevor Williams (2018, six) as the only Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to do that in each of their first five starts of a season.

**IN THE BALLPARK:** Ashcraft has allowed four home runs over his first 31 career games (99.1ip)...He is only the 14th Major League pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow four or fewer home runs over his first 31 games (minimum 99.1 innings)...Ashcraft is the first Major League pitcher to do that since Detroit's Kevin Ritz (1989-92).

**HISTORIC STRETCH:** Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

**CASHING IN AT PNC:** Ashcraft is 4-2 with a 2.82 ERA (44.2ip/14er) and 53 strikeouts in 16 career appearances (six starts) at PNC Park...He has allowed more than two earned runs once (he allowed three earned runs last season on September 15 vs. Chicago-NL).

**HOW LOW CAN YOU GO:** Ashcraft has a 2.29 ERA (63.0ip/16er) in the first 13 starts of his Major League career (since last year on June 23 at Milwaukee)...That trails Zach Duke (1.85 ERA, 2005), Paul Skenes (1.90 ERA, 2024), Cy Blanton (2.03 ERA, 1934-35), Bob Moose (2.06 ERA, 1967-68), Tim Wakefield (2.15 ERA, 1992) and Red Witt (2.21 ERA, 1957-58) for the lowest by a Pirate thru 13 starts in the Live Ball Era (since 1920).

**HOMER HIATUS:** Ashcraft allowed three home runs in 69.2 innings pitched last season, coming on July 4 at Seattle (Dylan Moore, two-run), September 9 at Baltimore (Jeremiah Jackson, solo) and September 15 vs. Chicago-NL (Michael Busch, solo)...He was one of only two Major League pitchers from May 26 (debut date) through the end of the regular season to pitch at least 65.0 innings and allow three or fewer home runs, along with Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (he allowed three home runs over 65.2 innings).

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Ashcraft pitched at least 3.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in each of his first six Major League starts, joining Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (seven starts) as the only pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that...The streak was snapped last year on Sept. 15 vs. Chicago-NL (gave up three runs).

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** Ashcraft struck out six batters over 3.0 perfect innings of relief during his penultimate appearance last season, which came on September 20 vs. the Athletics...He became the third Pirates reliever during the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that feat, joining Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia) and Chan Ho Park (October 1, 2010 at Florida)...Ashcraft also joined starter Bubba Chandler, who had six strikeouts and zero walks, as the only pair of Pirates pitchers in the Modern Era to each have at least six strikeouts while also giving up zero walks in the same game.
