WASHINGTON NATIONALS (7-9) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (10-6) April 14, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #17/Home #8 LHP PJ Poulin (2-0, 4.00 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (1-0, 1.00 ERA)

THE PIRATES: opened this seven-game homestand with a 16-5 win on Monday vs. Washington (their most runs in any win since beating the Nationals, 16-1, on April 29 [G2], 2023 at Nationals Park)...Have won nine of their last 12 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati)...Have won five of their first seven home games for the fourth time in PNC Park history (since 2001), along with 2010, 2014 and 2019 (the only time they won six of their first eight home games here was in 2019)...Will host Washington for three more games (Tuesday-Thursday) before welcoming Tampa Bay to town for three games (Friday-Sunday)...Have not lost consecutive games since losing each of their first two games from March 26-28 at New York (NL).

NATIONAL OUTBREAK: Pittsburgh picked up a 16-5 win on Monday night vs. Washington...The Pirates' 16 runs scored were tied for their second-most in any game (also April 29 [G2], 2023 at Nationals Park; 16-1) against the Montréal/Washington franchise (since 1969), trailing only a game on May 15, 1999, when Pittsburgh bested the Expos, 17-6, at Three Rivers Stadium.

IN THE BEGINNING: The Pirates scored 10 runs in the sixth inning of Monday's 16-5 win vs. Washington...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it was Pittsburgh's sixth inning with at least 10 runs in the Expansion Era (since 1961), along with June 8, 1989 at Philadelphia (first inning, 10 runs), May 4, 1992 vs. Cincinnati (sixth inning, 11 runs), August 20, 2003 at St. Louis (fifth inning, 10 runs), May 17, 2009 vs. Colorado (seventh inning, 10 runs) and July 9, 2017 at Chicago-NL (first inning, 10 runs)...The Pirates' nine hits in the inning were tied with the seventh inning of the 11-4 victory on May 17, 2009 vs. Colorado for their most during any inning in stadium history (since 2001).

SWEET SIXTEEN: Pittsburgh scored 16 runs in Monday night's victory vs. Washington, marking only its third game in PNC Park history (since 2001) with at least 16 runs scored...The Pirates scored 18 runs in an 18-2 victory on June 11, 2005 vs. Tampa Bay, while also scoring 18 times in an 18-5 victory on July 1, 2019 vs. Chicago (NL).

RIGHT LOWE: Brandon Lowe went 3-for-5 with a home run, five RBI and two runs scored on Monday vs. Washington, his second straight game with five RBI after hitting a grand slam and a solo home run on Sunday at Chicago (NL)...He became the first Pittsburgh player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to record at least five RBI in back-to-back games, while also joining Ralph Kiner (September 11-13, 1949 and June 24-25, 1950) and Adam Hyzdu (July 19-20, 2002) as the only Pirates since 1920 with at least three home runs and 10 RBI over a two-game span...Lowe also became one of three Pirates since 1920 with at least six home runs and 14 RBI through his first 14 games with the club, joining Dino Restelli (June 14-29, 1949) and Daryle Ward (May 11-28 [G1], 2004)...He has homered in at least three straight games three times in his career, coming from Aug. 12-15, 2020 (four games), Sept. 29-Oct. 2, 2021 (three games) & April 8-11, 2023 (four games).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz extended his hitting streak to a career-high 12 straight games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) by going 2-for-3 with three RBI, two walks, a stolen base and three runs scored in Monday's 16-5 win vs. Washington...He is hitting .417 (20-for-48) with five home runs, 16 RBI, six walks, seven stolen bases and 12 runs scored during the streak...Cruz became the first Pittsburgh player since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 with at least 16 RBI and seven stolen bases through the team's first 16 games of a season (he is also one of only nine Major Leaguers [10 instances] since 1920 and the first since Texas' Ian Kinsler in 2009 to accomplish that)...He also joined Lefty Davis (May 6-9, 1902) and Andrew McCutchen (Sept. 30 [G2]-October 4, 2009) as the only Pirates players during the Modern Era (since 1901) to record at least one hit, one walk and one stolen base in four straight games.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 14, 1994: Dave Clark's pinch-hit, run-scoring triple that brought home Al Martin in the seventh inning proved to be the difference in Pittsburgh's 4-2 win over San Diego at Three Rivers Stadium. Paul Wagner started and earned the win after allowing one earned run over his 7.0 innings of work. Jeff Ballard secured his first of two Major League saves by striking out Tony Gwynn to conclude the game.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller had a no-decision after allowing just three hits and one walk (had four strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings in Pittsburgh's 8-2 loss on April 8 vs. San Diego...He left with the game scoreless before the Padres scored four runs in the seventh inning (off Justin Lawrence) & four runs in the ninth inning (off José Urquidy).

AGAINST THE NATIONALS: Keller is 1-3 with a 4.70 ERA (38.1ip/20er) and 35 strikeouts in seven career starts against Washington...He lost a 3-0 decision last season on April 15 at PNC Park after allowing three runs in 6.0 innings...Keller also had a no-decision in a 6-5 loss last year on September 12 at Nationals Park after allowing two runs in 5.1 innings...He has a 3.42 ERA (23.2ip/9er) and 22 strikeouts in four starts against the Nationals in Pittsburgh (his lone win vs. them was here on Sept. 14, 2023).

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller enters today with 848 career strikeouts...He is five strikeouts shy of passing Rick Rhoden (852) for 10th place on Pittsburgh's all-time strikeouts list.

SIX-PACK: Keller has pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove from April 5-16, 2019...The only Pirates in the 21st century to do that in each of their first four starts were Jeff Suppan (April 4-22, 2003, four), Paul Maholm (August 30-September 17, 2005, four) and Ian Snell (April 3-27, 2007, five).

CONSISTENT KELLER: Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his last start on April 8 vs. San Diego, his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by a Pittsburgh pitcher in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Bob Friend, who ranks first among those pitchers, made 37 such starts from 1951-65.

THE OPENING ACT: Keller started Pittsburgh's Home Opener for the second straight season, after also doing so last season on April 4 vs. New York (AL)...Keller, who earned the win after allowing two runs in 6.0 innings on April 3 vs. Baltimore, was the first Pirates pitcher to start back-to-back Home Openers since Zach Duke in 2009 and 2010.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half...Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.

HOME SWEET HOME: Keller is currently PNC Park's all-time strikeouts leader (417)...He surpassed Paul Maholm (383) in a start last season on July 2 vs. St. Louis...His 85 games started at PNC Park are second in stadium history, behind Maholm (100 starts).

LIMIT THE LONG BALL: Keller has not surrendered a home run in his first three starts of the season, marking his first streak of at least three straight starts without a home run since last season from May 19-30...Keller, who allowed at least one home run in each of his final seven starts of 2025, last made at least four straight starts (within a single season) without allowing a home run from May 13-June 7, 2024 (five straight).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: Keller had 17 quality starts in 2025, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (he had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it from 2012-13 and in 2015, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...Keller made his 30th start of 2025 on September 12 at Washington, marking his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts...He joined Ian Snell (2006-08) and Maholm (2008-10) as the only Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to accomplish that.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Wednesday night's game against Washington at PNC Park.
