**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game set vs. the White Sox (1-0 thus far)...will also face the Reds in a three-game series this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 5-1 on their recent road trip after sweeping a three-game series at Cleveland and winning two of three games at Toronto.

- **Their 44-27 (.620) record is the best in the American League and the fourth-best record in the Majors.**
- **Have won seven of their last eight games (since 6/7) and eight of their last 10 games (since 6/4)**...are 14-5 in their last 19 games (since 5/24), 16-8 in their last 24 games (since 5/18) and 36-20 in their last 56 games (since 4/13).
- Are a season-high 17G over .500.
- The Yankees'+117 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the second-best in the Majors...have outscored their opponents, 118-66, over their last 19 games (since 5/24).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the White Sox, 12-2, in their series opener on Tuesday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (6.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR) started and earned his second win of the year...**CF Spencer Jones** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI, 2BB) reached base three times and drove in two runs, hitting his second career HR with a game-tying solo shot in the second inning and drawing a bases-loaded walk in the third inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (3-for-4, 2R, 2RBI) hit a go-ahead two-run single in the third inning...**RF José Caballero** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1SF) drove in a run in the third inning with a sac fly and hit his seventh HR of the year with a solo shot in the eighth inning...**1B Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI, 2BB) reached base three times and hit his 20th home run of the year with a two-run shot in the fourth inning...**DH Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his 10th home run of the year with a two-run shot in the fourth inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-5, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the fourth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (3-for-5, 1R) recorded a season-high-tying 3H...**LHP Ryan Yarbrough** (3.0IP, 1H, 3K) earned his second save of the season.

**RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice** reached base three times and hit his 20th home run of the year with a two-run shot in the fourth inning on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...has homered in back-to-back games for the fifth time in his career and the third time this year (also 4G from 4/16-19 and 2G from 4/1-3).

- Has reached the 20HR mark for the second time in his career (also 26HR in 2025).
- Has hit .292/.389/.617 (71-for-243) with 53R, 15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR, 49RBI, 38BB/31BB, 2HP, 2SF and 2SB in 66 games this season...has reached base safely in 51-of-62 starts.
- 37 of his 71H this year have been XBH (15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR).

**GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt** hit his 10th home run of the year with a two-run shot in the fourth inning on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...his 10HR in 46 games this year match his 2025 season total (10HR in 146 games).

- Has hit 2HR in his last three games (since 6/13) and 5HR in his last 15 games (since 5/29).
- **Owens an eight-game hitting streak (since 6/7)**...is hitting .412/.432/.676 (14-for-34) with 3R, 3HR, 10RBI, 2BB and 1SF over that stretch.
- **Has hit safely in 17 of his last 18 games (since 5/25), batting .351/.378/.584 (27-for-77) with 10R, 3 doubles, 5HR, 19RBI, 4BB, 1SF and 1SB over that span.**
- Has recorded 10RBI in his last eight games (since 6/7) and 19RBI in his last 16 games (since 5/27).
- Is batting .328/.384/.584 (45-for-137) with 20R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 9HR, 30RBI, 11BB, 2HP, 1SF and 1SB over his last 37 games (since 4/26).
- **Has hit .419/.514/.774 (26-for-62) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR, 9BB and 3HP vs. left-handed pitching this season**...ranks first in the Majors in OPS (1.288), SLG and OBP, second in BA (first in AL) and tied for seventh in XBH (11, tied for second in AL).
- As a Yankee (since 2025), has batted .360/.442/.630 (76-for-211) with 19 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 26BB/51BB and 5HP vs. left-handed pitchers...ranks second in the Majors in BA (second in AL) and OPS (1.072, second in AL), and fourth in OBP (third in AL) and SLG (fourth in AL) over that span.
- **Has hit .394/.512/.636 (13-for-33) with 2 doubles, 2HR, 21RBI, 7BB, 1SF and 2HP with RISP this season**...as a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .331/.420/.451 (47-for-142) with 8 doubles, 3HR, 55RBI, 21BB/51BB, 3HP and 3SF with RISP.

**RODOMINANT: LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his seventh start of the season tonight...has gone 2-2 with a 3.19 ERA (31.0IP, 11ER) and 34K in six starts this year, holding opponents to a .170 (18-for-106) BA...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of his six starts and 2ER-or-fewer in four starts.

- Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in three of his last four starts (since 5/21), posting a 2.35 ERA (23.0IP, 6ER) over that stretch.

**2026 HOPE WEEK:** This week, the Yankees are celebrating the 17th edition of **HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel)**, an ambitious, week-long, multifaceted community outreach program undertaken by players, coaches and employees within the organization...the initiative is rooted in the belief that acts of goodwill provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...over each of the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support, providing honorees with a day celebrating their accomplishments...this year's outreach will take place in the community and at Yankee Stadium.



- During today's HOPE Week event, the Yankees honored **First Tee Metropolitan New York...Yankees players Gerrit Cole, Max Fried, Clarke Schmidt, Trent Grisham, Ryan McMahon, Jake Bird, Paul Blackburn, Brent Headrick, Tim Hill and Ryan Weathers** along with **Assistant Hitting Coach Casey Dykes** and **Assistant Pitching Coach Desi Druschel**, toured the facility at Mosholu Golf Course and participated in putting exercises with First Tee students and coaches...founded in 2001 at Mosholu Golf Course in The Bronx, First Tee Metropolitan New York chapter's mission has always been to foster strength of character in young people, particularly in communities that have historically lacked access to golf or enrichment opportunities...by integrating the sport with a structured life skills curriculum, First Tee encourages participants to develop resilience, self-confidence and positive decision-making...after the event, First Tee staff and students will be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. the White Sox.
- Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 45-28 (.616) during the event...the Yankees have gone .500-or-better in 11 of their first 16 years of HOPE Week and have gone undefeated during HOPE Week four times (5-0 in 2009, 4-0 in 2014, 5-0 in 2016 and 5-0 in 2019)...are 32-20 in their last 52 HOPE Week games (since 7/10/13).

**NEW YORK OR NOWHERE:** Prior to tonight's game, 2026 NBA champions **Jalen Brunson** and **Josh Hart** of the New York Knicks will throw out the ceremonial first pitches.

**ON A ROLL: OF Spencer Jones** reached base three times and drove in two runs on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...hit his second career HR with a game-tying solo shot in the second inning and drew a bases-loaded walk in the third inning...has hit .348/.444/.652 (8-for-23) with 4R, 1 double, 2HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SB over his last seven starts (since 5/21).

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 12-2 in their last 14G vs. the White Sox (since 2024) and 14-4 in their last 18G (since 6/8/23-G2).

**TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT:** The Yankees are 17-6 when facing a left-handed starter this season...have won 15 of their last 17 games when facing a left-handed starter (since 4/18) and 16 of their last 20 games (since 4/13).

**WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers** have posted a 1.47 ERA (36.2IP, 6ER) and 38K over their last 10 games (since 6/4).

**SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger** recorded three hits on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL, including a go-ahead two-run single in the third inning...**his 14 go-ahead RBI are tied for the most in the Majors (tied for first in AL) and his eight game-winning RBI are tied for the third-most in the Majors (tied for second in AL).**

- Is hitting .293/.377/.522 (46-for-157) with 25R, 11 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR, 33RBI, 23BB, 5SB and 3SF over his last 42G (since 4/28).
- Is batting .306/.368/.435 (19-for-62) with 4 doubles, 2 triples, 30RBI, 9BB and 5SF with RISP this season.
- Has hit safely in 26-of-31 home games this year, batting .373/.451/.700 (41-for-110) with 22R, 11 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR, 29RBI, 19BB, 4SF and 3SB.
- Since 5/1, is hitting .320/.386/.580 (16-for-50) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR and 6BB vs. left-handed pitching...as a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .323/.387/.557 (76-for-235) with 16 doubles, 3 triples, 11HR, 28BB and 1HP against left-handed pitching.
- According to FanGraphs, his 16 DRS are the most in the Majors.

**HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero** drove in two runs on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL, hitting a sac fly in the third inning and his seventh HR of the year with a solo shot in the eighth inning...has homered in back-to-back games for the third time in his career and second time this season (also 2G from 4/24-25/26 and 5/21-22/23 with Seattle).

- Has hit 7HR in 60G this year after hitting 5HR in 126G in 2025.
- Has 5RBI over his last 2G and 7RBI over his last 5G (since 6/10)...has recorded multiple hits in three of his last 5G.
- Is hitting .293/.345/.487 (44-for-150) with 24R, 8 doubles, 7HR, 19RBI, 10BB, 3HP, 2SF and 10SB over his last 46G (since 4/13).
- Is batting .324/.400/.486 (12-for-37) with 3 doubles, 1HR, 16RBI, 6BB and 2SF with RISP this year.

**HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe** recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL...has hit .462/.500/.538 (6-for-13) with 3R, 1 double, 3RBI and 1BB over his last four games (since 6/10)...is batting .333/.462/.333 (7-for-21) with 9RBI and 5BB with RISP this year.

**MONDAY:** The Yankees kicked off 2026 HOPE Week on Monday by honoring **Jatee Kearsley** and her Bed-Stuy bakery, **Je T'aime Pâtisserie**, which brings affordable, finely crafted food within reach of families in challenging financial circumstances — like she had growing up. At the present, Kearsley is struggling to keep her bakery afloat, resisting suggestions such as moving to Manhattan, raising prices or eliminating her acceptance of EBT and SNAP. While these changes would ease her financial burden, she would forfeit everything she believes in.

*HOPE Week Event:* Yankees players **Carlos Rodón, Cam Schlittler, Will Warren, J.C. Escarra, Spencer Jones, and Ryan Yarbrough** along with **Pitching Coach Matt Blake** and **Legends Global Yankee Stadium Executive Chef Robert Flowers** joined Kearsley, a small group of her friends and family for a day of baking at Je T'aime Pâtisserie. Given that the Yankees did not have a game on Monday, Kearsley, her family and friends are guests of the team tonight at Yankee Stadium.

**TUESDAY:** The team honored **Dunia Sibomana-Rodriguez** and the organization **Smile Rescue Fund for Kids**, which brought Dunia to the United States and performed over a dozen surgeries on him to repair severe facial and limb trauma that was caused by a childhood chimpanzee attack in his original home in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Now a graduating high school senior and wrestling star, Dunia is heading off to the University of North Carolina on scholarship this fall.

*HOPE Week Event:* **Aaron Judge, Giancarlo Stanton, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Rice, Anthony Volpe, David Bednar** and **Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne** joined Dunia's family and friends — along with other children from the Smile Rescue Fund for Kids — for a surprise graduation / bon voyage party in Yankee Stadium's Delta Sky360 Suite.

**WEDNESDAY:** The Yankees showcased Bronx-based organization **First Tee Metropolitan New York**, a youth development organization which uses the game of golf as a vehicle to teach life skills, shape character and prepare students for long-term success both on and off the course. While its roots are in sport, its branches extend into education, leadership and college readiness through its "Path to College" program, which is designed to equip middle and high school students with the practical tools and emotional readiness required to pursue higher education through the college application process and beyond. First Tee stands as a testament to the power of holistic youth development. Through their model, a generation of young people are learning that the skills they build on the golf course can help them unlock a lifetime of possibilities far away from the fairway.

**THURSDAY:** The Yankees will celebrate **Brian Schwartz** and his national 501(c)3 nonprofit "**I Want To Mow Your Lawn**," which provides older adults, veterans, and neighbors facing physical or financial hardship with free, temporary lawn care relief provided by generous volunteers. The acts of help originated during the isolation of the pandemic and became a national movement that continues to this day.

*HOPE Week Surprise:* Yankees players and coaches along with Yankee Stadium Head Groundskeeper Danny Cunningham will join Brian Schwartz in surprising a family at a residential home in Leonia, N.J. (near the GWB) with free lawn maintenance and gardening around their property. They will then be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. Chicago-AL.

**FRIDAY:** The Yankees will honor the **Bronx Legends Boxing Academy** and its founder **Jay Bulger**. The organization, which operates at a boxing gym just 1.5 miles north of Yankee Stadium, changes young people's lives through discipline and determination. It also fosters a culture of mentorship, integrating academic support, tutoring and SAT preparation into its holistic mission. The philosophy is simple — discipline learned in the ring must carry over into the classroom.

*HOPE Week Surprise:* Yankees players and coaches will surprise students from Bronx Legends Boxing Academy and tour the facility, participate in meditation, watch the students practice light sparring and eat lunch together. They will then be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. the Reds.
