HAVING A BLAST: Kevin McGonigle (leadoff homer) and Max Clark (first major league homer) became the first 21-year-old or younger Tigers teammates in franchise history to homer in the same game as the Detroit Tigers last night picked up an 8-6 win at the Athletics, securing the series win ... this series began Detroit's longest road trip of the season, a three-city, nine-game trek through Sacramento, Seattle (next Tuesday-Thursday) and San Francisco (next weekend).

- The Tigers are now 31-20 since the beginning of June, the second-best record in the A.L. behind the Red Sox (34-18) and tied for the third-best record in baseball ... the Tigers woke up on June 1 with a 22-38 record and the lowest winning percentage (.367) in the A.L.
- The Tigers woke up on June 1 in fourth place in the A.L. Central, 11.0 games behind the first-place Guardians, and 7.0 games behind for the third Wild Card spot with every team in the A.L. to leap frog ... since posting the second-best record in the A.L. starting June 1, the Tigers woke up today, August 2, in fourth place in the A.L. Central, 5.5 games behind the first-place White Sox, and 2.5 games behind the third Wild Card spot with five teams to leap frog.
- The Tigers are a perfect 5-0 against the Athletics this season ... Detroit today has a chance at its first perfect 6-0 (or better) single-season record against an opponent for the first time ever.
- The Tigers have now won five series in a row on the road for the first time since May 1-June 1, 2025 (also five series in a row away from home).

DYNAMIC DUO: In addition to being the first Tigers 21-year-old or younger teammates to homer in the same game, Kevin McGonigle and Max Clark last night became the first such teammates across the majors to homer in the same game since Atlanta's Vaughn Grissom and Michael Harris II on September 2, 2022 ... thanks to Elias for both nuggets.

THE SECOND TIME'S THE CHARM: Hao-Yu Lee batted .205 (17-for-83) with three doubles, two homers, nine RBI, a .241 on-base percentage and a .337 slugging, good for a .578 OPS, in his first 32 major league games through June 1 ... in his last 36 games starting June 13, Lee is batting .320 (33-for-103) with seven doubles, four homers, 17 RBI, a .345 on-base percentage and a .505 slugging, good for an .850 OPS ... Lee has two big league stints this year: April 17-June 1 and June 13-present.

THE FULL MONTY: Keider Montero makes his 18th start of the season this afternoon, joining Tampa Bay's Griffin Jax, who also makes a start today, as the only two pitchers in all of baseball with at least 18 starts and at least six relief appearances this season.

- Montero is only the second Tigers pitcher in the last 60 years to enter August having made at least 17 starts with at least six relief appearances in a season, joining Dan Petry in 1990 ... Peaches had 19 games started + six relief outings at the end of July.

CATCH THIS: Dillon Dingler on Friday hit his 20th home run of the season while in the game as a catcher, just the 10th such Tigers season by someone playing that position in the last 50 years ... the 10 seasons have been done by five catchers: Lance Parrish (5x), Mickey Tettleton (2x), Dillon Dingler (1x), Matt Nokes (1x) and Jake Rogers (1x) ... the only other Tiger in the last 50 years to reach 20 homers as a catcher by the end of July?: Lance Parrish with 21 homers at this point in 1986.

MEN O WAR: Kevin McGonigle leads the A.L. with a 5.6 bWAR, well ahead of Yordan Alvarez (5.1 bWAR), and Kevin ranks second among all position players in the majors behind only PCA (6.6).

- Dillon Dingler boasts a 4.9 fWAR this season, the third-best fWAR by a position player in baseball and fourth-best overall, as Dingler trails only Pete Crow-Armstrong (7.2), Shohei Ohtani (6.3 fWAR: 3.3 as position player, 3.0 as pitcher) and Yordan Alvarez (5.4).
- No other catcher in baseball remotely approaches Dingler's fWAR this season, as the recently-injury-listed Shea Langeliers is next closest with an 2.8 fWAR, tied for 52nd in the majors ... the next closest active catcher is Atlanta's Drake Baldwin (2.3), tied for 90th in the majors.

HORSE SHOES, HAND GRENADES, TIGERS GAMES: The Tigers have seen a plethora of games - 52 - decided by two runs or less with the club going 16-36, the worst record in baseball ... the 36 such losses are the most in baseball while the 16 wins are the second-fewest in baseball ... the Tigers are 37-22 in games decided by three runs or more.

- The Tigers are 12-17 in games decided by two runs or less at home ... the Tigers are 4-19 in games decided by two runs or less on the road, a .174 win percentage, the lowest in baseball.

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 85 games since, the Tigers have gone 39-46 to drop to 53-58 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 39-46 (.459) record starting April 24 is the eighth-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 31-20 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 31 of their last 66 games, 34 of their last 70 games and 41 of their last 76 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Max Clark went 3-for-4 with two doubles in his major league debut on Friday and 2-for-5 with a homer last night ... according to OptaStats, Clark is the first player in major league history age 21-or-younger with five or more total bases in each of his first two career games.

- Suffered the loss on July 19 against the Angels, allowing an earned run on a hit and three walks over 1.1 innings...has allowed at least one run in eight of his last 11 outings.
- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Threw two perfect frames in his first game back with Detroit, striking out a batter along the way.
- Pitched in seven games (10.1 innings) from July 1-25 with Toledo, allowing five earned runs on 17 hits and two walks while striking out 10...recalled on July 31.
- Allowed just three hits and two walks while striking out 13 batters over 13.0 innings (eight games) from May 21 to June 26 before getting optioned to Toledo on June 28.
- In his first game since May 22, tossed 4.0 perfect innings on June 2 against Tampa Bay to earn his first Major League save...struck out four of the 11 batters he faced.
- Earned the win on Sunday Night Baseball on May 10 against Kansas City, delivering a perfect 2.1 innings with a strikeout.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.

- Earned his second save of the season, needing just two pitches to induce a game-ending double play on July 23 against Kansas City.
- Struck out all four batters he faced in a perfect 1.1 innings on June 23 against the Yankees.
- Blew a save in the eighth inning against Kansas City on May 8 and ninth inning on May 29 against Chicago.
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.

- Made his third start of the year on July 31 against the Athletics, allowing one earned run on one hit and one walk while striking out a batter over 2.0 innings.
- Allowed his first earned run in the month on July 27 against Baltimore, surrendering a solo home run to Tyler O'Neill.
- Earned a save on July 20 against the Cubs, his first of the year and 10th of his career.
- Allowed just two earned runs in the month of June over 12 games (13.2 innings) despite allowing at least one hit in all 12 outings.
- Was the opener on May 3 against Texas, allowing one hit while striking out one over a scoreless 0.2 innings...also opened the next night against Boston, working around two hits with a strikeout to throw a scoreless inning...became only the second Tigers pitcher in the last 80 years to start on back-to-back days (Brieske, 2024).
- Allowed two or more earned runs in three of four outings from April 20-28, totaling seven earned runs on 12 hits and four walks in his last 3.2 frames.
- Spun 7.0 scoreless innings (seven games) to start the year for the Tigers before allowing a run on April 16 to Kansas City.
- Appeared in 70 games for the Tigers last season, starting six...went 6-5 with a 3.66 ERA (32ER/78.2IP) and 64 strikeouts.
- Tossed 3.1 scoreless innings in the Wild Card series against Cleveland...allowed two hits while striking out two batters.
- Allowed just three earned runs on six hits and one walk while striking out 12 over his last 11 games (12.2 innings) of the 2025 regular season.

- Earned his 12th save of the year and 488th of his career with a perfect ninth inning on July 24 against Kansas City...has not allowed an earned run in eight consecutive games dating back to July 2.
- Saved back-to-back games against the White Sox on June 19 and 20 for the first time since April 14-15 against Kansas City, his third and fourth saves of the season...his save on June 19 was the first since May 10.
- Placed on the 15-day injured list on May 28 with pelvic inflammation...made a rehab outing with Triple-A Toledo on June 10 and was activated by Detroit on June 12.
- Had back-to-back blown saves on two-run walk-off home runs against Cincinnati on April 24 and Atlanta on April 29...had recorded five consecutive saves prior to April 24.
- With a scoreless ninth inning on April 14 against Kansas City, he recorded his 479th career save to surpass Hall of Famer Lee Arthur Smith for third-most in major league history...only Hall of Famers Mariano Rivera (652 saves) and Trevor Hoffman (601 saves) have more.
- His 479 saves have come with five different clubs: the Los Angeles Dodgers (350), Boston Red Sox (56), Atlanta Braves (41), Los Angeles Angels (29) and Tigers (three).
- Earned his first Tigers save and 477th career save on March 27 against the Padres with a perfect ninth inning, striking out the side to complete Detroit's 5-2 comeback win.
- Signed by Detroit to a one-year contract on Dec. 17, 2025...went 5-4 with 29 saves, a 2.59 ERA (17 ER/59.0 IP) and a 165 ERA+ in 62 relief outings with the Los Angeles Angels last year, his second-best ERA+ in his last eight years.
- Is a four-time All-Star (2016-18, 2023) and has recorded 25 or more saves in each of the last 13 seasons (minus 2020) while eclipsing 40 saves four times, including as recently as 2022 when he led the N.L. with 41 saves with Atlanta.

- Earned the win on July 31 against the Athletics, tossing 3.0 scoreless frames...allowed two hits and two walks while striking out two batters, throwing 39 of his 56 pitches for strikes.
- Threw two perfect innings of relief on July 28 against the Orioles, striking out two batters along the way.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on May 17 (retro May 16) with a right forearm contusion after taking a comebacker off his arm...activated June 1 and optioned to Toledo June 13...recalled on July 21, pitching 3.1 relief innings, allowing just one run.
- Tallied 11.0 innings covering two relief appearances to start his 2026 big league campaign, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to total at least 11.0 innings in his first two relief outings of a season in 40 years when Eric King tossed 11.1 relief innings on May 15 and 21, 1986.
