TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners go for a 4-game series sweep today against the Houston Astros (3-0)... following the current series, the Mariners will travel to San Diego for a 3-game set against the Padres before returning to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/17-4/19) and Athletics (3 G, 4/20-4/22)...today's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call, with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Astros yesterday by a 6-1 score and have won each of the first 3 games of the current series and extended their win streak against Houston to 6 games, dating back to last year...Seattle will look to complete a 4-game series sweep against their division rival for the 2nd time (also: Aug. 9-12, 2018).

- **Division Foes** - Since 2023, the Mariners are 28-14 (.667) against the Houston Astros, going 14-8 (.636) at T-Mobile Park during that stretch.
- **Long Division** - The Mariners wrap up their run of 10 consecutive divisional games today...from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.
- **The J-Rod Show** - Center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** collected 2 hits in yesterday's game after he hit his first home run of 2026 in Saturday's comeback win...he has hit safely in each of his last 3 games (4/10-c).
- **Donnie Leadoff** - In 8 games in the leadoff spot, **Brendan Donovan** is 3-for-4 with 1 double, 2 home runs, 2 walks and 2 hit-by-pitch in the 1st inning of those games.
- **Vedder Cup On Deck** - Last year the Mariners dominated the inaugural Vedder Cup against the Padres, winning the season series 5-1...**Cal Raleigh** was named the "Better Man" MVP winner for his performance...the first of 2 series between the two clubs is set to begin on Tuesday at Petco Park.

RANDYLAND...**Randy Arozarena** went 3-for-4 with 1 stolen base, 1 walk and 1 RBI in yesterday's win... in 16 games this season, Randy is batting .291 (16x55) with 12 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 10 walks and 3 stolen bases with a .426 OBP, slugging .400 for an .826 OPS, reaching base safely in 14-of-16 games...over 10 games in April, he is batting .314 (11x35) with 1 double, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 5 walks, 2 stolen bases and an .858 OPS.

KIRB BRINGS THE ENTHUSIASM...**George Kirby** has been one of the best starting pitchers in the American League since he made his Major League debut on May 8, 2022, ranking among the leaders in ERA (11th, 3.59), fWAR (4th, 13.8), WHIP (7th, 1.11), strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 6.50), fewest walks-per-9-innings (1st, 1.34) and fewest home runs-per-9-innings (7th, 1.03)...Kirby has been historically good at limiting walks and collecting strikeouts, with a 6.50 SO/BB ratio which ranks 1st in MLB history, ahead of Cy Young Award winners Jacob deGrom (5.37), Chris Sale (5.28), Tarik Skubal (5.18) and Shane Bieber (5.10) among pitchers with at least 500.0 innings pitched in their careers...George's Mariners teammate **Logan Gilbert** (4.91) ranks 7th on the all-time SO/BB list.

LIGHTS OUT IN THE 'PEN...the Seattle bullpen owns a 2.10 ERA (12 ER, 51.1 IP) that ranks 2nd-best in the Majors this season...their 1.09 WHIP leads the American League and ranks T-2nd in MLB...they also rank 3rd among Major League bullpens in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.40), 4th-lowest in walk rate (7.3%), and 9th in strikeout rate (24.9%)...**Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 5.2 IP) and 0.71 WHIP...**Casey Legumina** has yet to allow in a run through 5 appearances (7.1 innings pitched).

OFF THE RALES...infielder/outfielder **Luke Raley** collected a career-high tying 3 hits yesterday, going 3-for-5 with 2 doubles and 2 RBI...in 14 games this season, Raley is batting .255 (12x47) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 9 RBI, a .314 OBP, slugging .532 for an .846 OPS...Raley set a career-high with 22 homers in his first year in Seattle in 2024 but was limited to 73 games in 2025 due to injury.

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...since 2023, Seattle owns a 151-102 record (.597) at T-Mobile Park, the best home record in the American League and 4th-best in MLB during that span...Seattle has drawn 356,337 fans so far this season, the 2nd-highest attendance total in the AL and 6th across MLB in 2026.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have drawn 26 walks through the first 3 games of the current 4-game set, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that 26 walks are already tied for the 5th-most in a single series in franchise history?...the single-series Mariners record is 39 walks (9/16-19/02 vs. TEX), followed by 32 walks (6/20-23/96 at CWS), 29 walks (7/27-30/00 vs. TOR) and 28 walks (5/7-9/02 vs. TOR).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 13

- **1985** - Mariners left fielder Phil Bradley belts a two-out, 9th-inning grand slam to give the Mariners their fifth-straight win to start the '85 season.
- **1998** - Ken Griffey Jr. belts two home runs, including his 300th career round-tripper. He becomes the second youngest in Major League history to accomplish the feat.
- **2001** - Ichiro singles off Anaheim's Shigetoshi Hasegawa in the first time in MLB history that a Japanese hitter had faced a Japanese pitcher.
- **2012** - Former Mariner Mike Cameron officially retired as a Mariner after signing a one-day contract.
- **2016** - Dae-Ho Lee hit a pinch-hit, walk-off home run with two outs in the 10th inning against Texas

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 4th start of the season and 1st against the Astros...this will be the 116th start of his career and his 10th career start against Houston.
Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...L#2 on April 7 at Texas, matching a career-high 8.0 innings pitched and allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 6 hits (1 HR) and 4 strikeouts with no walks issued...he tossed 90 pitches (68 strikes) in his first road start of the season and has tossed a quality start in 2 of his 3 starts this year.

COMPLETE DOMINANCE...is the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 8/12/23 vs. BAL) and is 1 of 7 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, joining fellow teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

MESSING WITH TEXAS...across 20 career starts against both Texas teams (Astros and Rangers), he is 12-2 with a combined 1.66 ERA (22 ER, 119 IP) and 103 strikeouts to just 12 walks allowed...he has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in all but 1 of 20 combined starts vs. Houston and Texas (5 ER on 9/20/25 at HOU), and has held opponents scoreless in 8 of those 20 starts.

HEATED RIVALRY...is 24-6 with a 2.59 ERA (68 ER, 236.1 IP) with 239 strikeouts to just 32 walks allowed across 40 career starts against AL West teams...his 24 wins vs. AL West teams are 9th-most among all MLB pitchers, 1 shy of tying Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (24 W)...leads all pitchers (min. 40 GS vs. AL West teams) in ERA (2.59), fewest walks allowed (32) and winning percentage (.800).

MORE VS. THE WEST...across 17 career home starts vs. AL West teams, he is 9-2 and owns a 1.59 all-time ERA (18 ER, 101.2 IP) with 111 strikeouts to 13 walks allowed...he has allowed 2-or-fewer ER in 15 of those home starts vs. AL West teams, throwing a quality start in all 14 games that he has tossed 6.0+ IP...the team is 12-5 when Kirby starts at home vs. AL West teams.

DAYTIME DEALING...is making his second day start at home this season (also: 4/1 vs. NYY)...across 15 career day starts at T-Mobile Park, he is 8-3 with a 2.45 ERA (25 ER, 92.0 IP) and 108 strikeouts to 10 walks allowed...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 13 of those 15 career day starts at home with the team going 10-3 when he does so...last season, tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk across 6.1 IP in a home day start on Sept. 14, 2025 vs. the Angels.

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at Los Angeles-AL then on Sept. 14 vs. Los Angeles-AL at home...was the only pitcher in the MLB last season to record multiple games of 14+ strikeouts without a walk and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom tallied 3 such games in 2021...the feat has also been accomplished only 5 times in franchise history by 3 different pitchers: Kirby (done 2x), Randy Johnson (done 2x) and Mark Langston (done 1x).

NO FREE PASSES...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 115 career games, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher, behind only Carlos Silva's 150 game streak from 8/2/2003-8/15/2008...Kirby's 38 career games of 6.0+ IP without a walk are the most such games among a pitcher's first 115 career games, ahead of Hall of Famer Cy Young (36 G).

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 107 of 115 career regular season starts, which are the most such games in MLB through a starting pitcher's first 115 career starts, ranking ahead of Chris Paddack (102 G, 2019-25) and Masahiro Tanaka (102 G, 2014-18)...are also the 3rd-most such games by any starting pitcher since 2022, trailing Miles Mikolas-STL (122) and Logan Webb-SF (112)...his 107 career games of 2-or-fewer walks are tied for 9th-most such games by a starting pitcher in Mariners history, behind Randy Johnson (109 G).

GOING THE DISTANCE...since 2025, the Mariners are 10-6 (.625) when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 4-6 (.400) when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...across his career, they are 47-25 (.653) when he tosses 6.0+ innings and are 16-27 (.372) when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 500 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (98), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.50), walks-per-nine innings (1.34), and walk rate (3.7%).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in walks-per-nine innings (1.3), ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (1.9) and Logan Gilbert (1.9)...also leads franchise in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.50), trailed by Logan Gilbert (4.90)...ranks 6th in franchise history in ERA (3.59), trailing Luis Castillo (3.45), and just ahead of Logan Gilbert (3.61).

2025 TOTALS...went 10-8 with a 4.21 ERA (59 ER, 126.0 IP) with 29 walks and 137 strikeouts over 23 starts last season...wrapped the 2025 season with a career-best 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine innings, surpassing his previous career-high 9.2 SO/9 in 2022, and a career-best K% of 26.1...tossed a combined 31 strikeouts across his last 3 starts of the 2025 regular season (9/14-9/26) which is the most by a Mariners pitcher across a 3-game span since James Paxton tossed 33 strikeouts from April 26-May 8, 2018.

ANOTHER STELLAR SEASON...finished the 2025 regular season with a 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine-innings and a walk percentage of 5.5, joins Logan Gilbert (2021, '24, '25) and Felix Hernandez (2013, '14) as one-of-three Mariners starting pitchers to record multiple seasons with a strikeouts-per-nine innings over 9 and a sub-6% walk percentage.

- **Scoreless Streak** - Has begun his season with 5.2 scoreless innings over 6 appearances...last season set Mariners record after not allowing a run in his first 19 appearances of the season.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 1-3 with 4 saves, a 2.47 ERA (13 ER, 47.1 IP), 18 walks, 58 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP in 53 relief appearances...held opponents to a .236 average while recording 21 holds.
- **Postseason Stalwart** - Made 8 appearances during Mariners run to the American League Championship Series, going 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER, 9.0 IP), 5 walks and 10 strikeouts.
- **Splendid Start** - Last season did not allow a run in his first 19 appearances (5/3-6/30, 2025), setting a franchise mark for most consecutive scoreless appearances to begin a season, surpassing the 16-game mark set earlier in the season by teammate **Andrés Muñoz**.
