TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Mike Vassallo's Brewers and Game 4 (1-2) of a 6-game final homestand that included a 2-1 series loss to the Mets...beginning Friday night at PNC Park, the Reds will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games vs the Pirates.

FINAL GOODBYES: As part of the month-long series of special events celebrating the 46-season career of Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman, tonight's pre-game show on 700 WLW Radio will be broadcast among the fans behind Section 119...tomorrow night's radio game broadcast, by Marty and son Thom, also will emanate from that location... Marty will broadcast his final game Thursday afternoon from the radio booth alongside his partner of 13 seasons, Jeff Brantley.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds went 2-1-2 in the first 5 series vs Mil and won each of the last 2 series (0-3, 1-1, 2-2, 3-1, 2-1)...haven't won 3 series in a season vs the Brewers since 2016 (4-1-1)...the 5-4 loss on 7/24 at Miller Park snapped the Reds' 5-game winning streak vs the Brewers, their longest since 9/27/12 - 6/14/13 and their longest in a single season since they won 7 straight from 7/27-9/21, 2010...the Reds' 3-1 series win at Great American Ball Park from 7/1-7/4 was their first series win vs Mil since 9/4-9/6, 2017 (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since 4/30-4/23, 2015 (3-1 at Miller Park).

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds have lost 10 straight games at PNC Park dating back to an 8-6 win on 6/17/18, including this season's 7-game losing streak, and are 2-15 there over the last 2 seasons...the current losing streaks are the Reds' longest overall and single-season losing streaks at PNC Park...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field...from 3/31-4/5 the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (126), HR (44, Major League record), RBI (123) and slugging percentage (.567)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 126-84, and are 36-13 (.735) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 14 HR in the first inning, a franchise record.

GENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez ranks second in the Major Leagues with a career-high 48 HR, a record for a player from Venezuela, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and tied for the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position...he shares the NL record for homers by third basemen with Phi's Mike Schmidt (1980) & LAD's Adrián Beltré (2004)...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 28 HR, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, Ted Kluszewski, 1954), and leads the National League in slugging percentage (.696)...Suárez is trying to become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since Foster hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, Foster is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 100 of the Reds' 156 games (70g at P, 15g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 5g as a pinch hitter)...in 4 of the last 8 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a career .236 hitter (29-123) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a .730 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is 1-5 with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5-for-25 (.200, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 406.2 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...he joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully (67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) & Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrin (47, 1973-2019).

Tonight's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...his **first strikeout** in tonight's start will be his **200th of the season**, extending his career high...lead the National League in **opponents' BA** (.198) and **fewest hits per 9 innings** (6.3) and ranks among the NL leaders in **ERA** (4th) and **strikeouts** (11th)...beginning 8/25/18 has made 32 consecutive starts allowing **6 hits or fewer**, a **Major League record** and excluding "openers"...the record was held by **Nolan Ryan** (31gs, 5/1/91-6/1/92)...**Gray** is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.80 or lower since **Johnny Cueto** in **2014** (34gs, 2.25)...in his **last 15 starts** beginning **6/28** is **8-2, 1.81** (94.1ip, 19er) with **13 quality starts**, **5 times** was the victim of **blown saves** and since then ranks third among all Major League starting pitchers in **ERA** (**Jack Flaherty** 1.39, **Jacob deGrom** 1.80)...in his **last 9 starts** beginning **8/4** is **5-1, 1.46** (55.2ip, 9er)...in his **last 8 starts** at **Great American Ball Park** is **7-0, 2.08**, including wins in **7 straight starts** from **6/16-8/20**...is only the second pitcher ever to **win 7 consecutive starts** at **GABP**...**Johnny Cueto** won **7 straight starts** here from **6/6-8/18, 2012**...in his 3-2 win on **8/20 vs SD**, **Josh Naylor's** solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at **23 innings**...the longest scoreless streak of **Gray's** career had been **14.2 innings** (4/28-5/8, 2015)...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw **8.0 shutout innings** and tied his career high with **12 strikeouts**...the **8.0 innings** tie **Trevor Bauer** for the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his **12 strikeouts** were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until **Luis Castillo** had a career-high **13 strikeouts** on **8/5 vs LAA**...has 11 wins and 6 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.
