The Red Sox took 2 out of 3 from the Mariners at T-Mobile Park from June 19-21 this year...last season at Fenway Park (April 22-24, 2025), the Mariners took 2 out of 3 as part of a 6-3 road trip.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners finish the road trip today with the finale of a 3-game series against the Boston Red Sox (1-1)...Seattle also took on the Toronto Blue Jays (0-3) on the trip...following today's road trip finale, the Mariners welcome the Athletics (4 G, 9/3-9/6) and Texas Rangers (3 G, 9/8-9/10)...today's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's game against the Red Sox by a 9-6 score...Seattle is 48-19 (.716) when they score at least 4 runs, 41-11(.789) when they score at least 5 runs and 56-35 (.615) when they hit a home run.

- **20 Home Run Quartet** - **Randy Arozarena** (22 HR), **Dominic Canzone** (21 HR), **Cal Raleigh** (20 HR) and **Julio Rodríguez** (20 HR) are 1 of 5 teammate quartets with 20+ homers apiece this season, along with the Cubs, Reds, Braves and Nationals.
- **September to Remember** - Last season, the Mariners went 17-8 (.680) in September...over the last 5 seasons (2022-c), the Mariners are 64-49 (.566), 3rd-best September/October record in the AL, trailing the Yankees (71-40/.640) and the Guardians (72-43/.626).
- **September Rosters** - Yesterday MLB rosters expanded to 28 players, with the Mariners selecting OF **Lazaro Montes** and LHP **Hoby Milner** from Triple-A Tacoma to bring their active roster total to 28.
- **Offensive Explosion** - Over the last two games, the Mariners offense has scored 17 runs, batting .321 (25x78) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 8 walks, a .393 OBP and slugging .628 for an 1.021 OPS...the Mariners yesterday had all 9 players in their starting lineup hit safely for the 2nd time in 2026 (also: 6/12/26 at WSH).
- **Youth Movement** - Of the 14 players to appear in an MLB game this season before turning 22-years-old, 2 have played for the Mariners: OF **Lazaro Montes** and INF **Colt Emerson**...the Mariners, Brewers and Tigers are the only teams to have had multiple players appear in a game this season before turning 22-years-old.

THE LAZER SHOW HAS ARRIVED...yesterday, **Lazaro Montes** made his MLB debut, going 2-for-4 with 1 walks, 1 home run and 2 RBI...he became the youngest Mariners player and 6th overall to hit a home run in his debut, and the first since Kyle Lewis (9/10/19 vs. CIN), and the first Mariners player since Hall of Famer Ichiro Suzuki to record multiple hits in his debut...the No. 56 overall prospect per *MLB Pipeline*, is batting .292 (28x96) with 21 runs, 5 doubles, 10 home runs, 22 RBI and a 1.054 OPS over 25 games with Triple-A Tacoma since being promoted from Double-A Arkansas on July 7...over 123 games between Triple-A and Double-A this season, **Montes' 38 home runs are the 2nd-most among MiLB batters**.

YOU'RE CRUSHING IT, CAL...**Cal Raleigh**, went 1-for-5 with 1 double and 1 RBI in last night's game...Raleigh, who is the reigning American League Player of the Week, hit his 20th home run of the season in Monday's game at Boston for his fifth consecutive 20+ homer season (2022-c), becoming the 8th Mariners player with at least 5 20+ homer seasons.

- **The Latest Stretch** - Cal has reached base safely in 14 of his last 15 games (8/16-c), batting .283 (13x46) with 8 home runs, 2 doubles, 12 RBI, 11 walks, and a .421 on-base percentage while slugging .848 for an 1.269 OPS in 57 plate appearances.
- **Did You 'Catch' This?** - Raleigh became the 18th catcher (min. 50% of games at catcher in a season) in MLB history to record five or more seasons with 20+ homers, and the ninth to do it before turning 30 years old.

RANDY'S MONSTER SERIES...over the first 2 games of the 3-game set with Boston, **Randy Arozarena** is 5-for-10 with 1 double, 2 home runs and 7 RBI, homering in each game...over his last 20 games since Aug. 11, Randy is batting .256 (20x78) with 16 runs, 3 doubles, 8 home runs, 16 RBI, 11 walks, a .370 OBP and slugging .603 for an .972 OPS...Arozarena has 4.5 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season, ranking T-7th in the American League.

FORCE OF NAYLOR...in 39 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), **Josh Naylor** is batting .307 (46x150) with 16 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 11 walks, 7 stolen bases, a .356 OBP while slugging .393 for a .749 OPS, reaching base in 34 of those games...his .307 batting average in the 2nd half ranks 9th in the American League and 14th in MLB among qualified hitters...he also ranks T-9th in the AL in stolen bases during that span along with José Ramírez-CLE.

IN THE CANZONE...**Dominic Canzone** went 1-for-5 with a solo home run in last night's game...over his last 20 games, he is batting .280 (23x82) with 7 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 1 stolen base, getting on base at a .337 clip and slugging .476 for an .813 OPS...in 123 games this season, Canzone is batting .255 (98x385) with 48 runs, 22 doubles, 2 triples, 21 home runs, 62 RBI and an .812 OPS.

MUNY MAKES MORE HISTORY...Yesterday, **Andrés Muñoz** recorded his 102nd save in a Mariners uniform, moving into sole possession of 3rd most saves in club history, trailing only Kazuhiko Sasaki (129 SV) and Edwin Díaz (109 SV)...Muñoz's 2.64 ERA (84 ER, 286.2 IP) with Seattle is the lowest in Mariners history among pitchers with at least 250.0 innings, ahead of Tom Wilhelmssen (3.01 ERA) and Arthur Rhodes (3.05 ERA).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Lazaro Montes** yesterday was electric in his Major League debut, going 2-for-4 with 1 walk, 1 home run and 2 RBI, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that he is the 3rd player in Mariners history, and the youngest, to record at least 2 hits and 2 RBI in his debut?...he joins Al Chambers (7/23/83 vs. BOS) and Shane Monahan (7/9/98 vs. ANA)...Laz is the only one of that trio to homer, and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...at 21 years, 314 days, Laz is the youngest player to record multiple hits, multiple RBI and a home run in his MLB debut since Vaughn Grissom-ATL (8/10/22 at BOS)?

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 2

- **1987** - Mark Langston is named AL Pitcher of the Month for August. Langston was 4-1 with a 2.14 ERA in six starts. In 46.1 IP he fanned 41.
- **1996** - Alex Rodriguez becomes the third youngest player to hit 35 HR in a season.
- **2014** - James Paxton allowed 4 hits and 2 runs in 7.2 innings to improve to 5-1, 1.91 ERA in a 6-5 win over the Athletics. Paxton ran his career mark to 8-1 with a 1.77 ERA in his first 12 MLB starts, 2nd-lowest in MLB history behind Steve Rogers (1.16 with Montreal in 1973). Fernando Rodney recorded his 40th save of the season, becoming the 3rd Mariners closer with 40 saves in a season (Putz & Sasaki).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 18th appearance (17th start) of the season and the 92nd appearance (91st start) of his career...it marks his 5th career start against the Red Sox and 2nd of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 on 8/23 vs. CHC...tossed 4.1 innings, allowing 6 runs (6 ER) on 2 hits (2 HR) and a career-high 7 walks with 5 strikeouts...threw 104 pitches and 60 strikes...marked his 2nd straight start throwing fewer than 5.0 innings.

LUCKY NUMBER 500.0...has recorded 496.0 innings of work over his first 91 career games...with 4.0 innings from Miller in today's game, he will become the Mariners 33rd pitcher to record 500.0 innings with the franchise and the 15th to do so in the first 92 games of their career, joining **George Kirby**, **Logan Gilbert**, and **Bryan Woo**...will be the 7th pitcher in MLB that made their debut in 2023-or-later to record their 500th inning pitched, joining Woo...with Miller's 500th inning pitched, the Mariners will be 1-of-2 rotations in MLB to have 4+ pitchers with 500.0 IP with their current team (also: ARI).

BRYCE BACK IN BOSTON...will face the Boston Red Sox for the 2nd time this season in today's game...last faced them on June 6 at T-Mobile Park, tossing 5.0 innings of 1-run ball with 3 hits (1 HR), no walks and 7 strikeouts...today will mark his 2nd career start at Boston...his last outing at Fenway Park was April 22, 2025.

LIKE PLAYING CATCH...has allowed 3-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ innings of work in 6 starts this season (last: 7/31 vs. MIN), tied for the 9th most in MLB since he made his season debut on May 13...Miller has allowed 2-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings this season, T-8th most since he made his season debut, and has recorded 5.0+ IP with a single hit allowed in 3 appearances, 1-of-2 players to record 3+ such games since May 13...this season marks the first in which he has recorded multiple games of 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed...his league-leading 3 such outings are also tied for the 2nd most recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season, joining Luis Castillo (2023) and Roy Thomas (1985) and just trailing **Bryan Woo**'s 4 outings in 2025.

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...owns a career 10.32 baserunners-per-nine, which ranks 14th in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 9.86 BR/9 this season is 15th-lowest in MLB in 2026 (min. 90.0 IP)...his 23 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 7/2 vs. LAA) rank T-4th in MLB since 2023, trailing **Logan Gilbert** (25), **Bryan Woo** (26) and **Tarik Skubal**-DET/LAD (26)...he is 1-of-10 pitchers with 6+ such games this season...his 23 such outings, with his most recent being recorded in his 83rd career game, are the 3rd most through a players first 83 outings in MLB history.

CRACKING THE WHIP...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400.0 IP) with a 1.119 WHIP...has recorded 3 outings of 2-or-fewer hits and 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP this season (last: 7/2 vs. LAA)...he is 1-of-13 pitchers in MLB to have 3+ such games, along with **Logan Gilbert** (3 G)...is 1-of-15 pitchers to own a sub-1.119 WHIP and a K/9 greater than 8.3 since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP).

THE GOLDEN RATIO...is 1-of-8 pitchers in MLB this season to own 90+ strikeouts and 25-or-fewer walks...owns a 4.09 K/BB on the road, ranking 5th best among AL pitchers (min. 50.0 IP)...his career 3.51 K/BB ranks 13th-best in the AL since 2023 and ranks 7th among Mariners pitching leaders...has recorded 8 games with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks since making his season debut on May 13...his 8 such games are T-14th most in MLB over that span...is 1-of-10 pitchers to make 4 appearances with 7+ strikeouts and no walks since May 13...on June 25 at PIT tossed 11 strikeouts to 0 walks for his 2nd such career outing (also: 9/11/25 vs. LAA), becoming 1-of-6 Mariners pitchers to record multiple such outings in their career.

QUICK AND SNAPPY...owns a 15.6 pitches per inning, tied for 15th-lowest in the AL in 2026 (min. 90.0 IP)...records a first pitch strike 65.1% of the time while he earns a first pitch swing 40.0% of the time, 3rd-highest in MLB this season (min. 90.0 IP)...owns 39 strikeouts to 4 walks with a 0.832 WHIP, while holding batters to a .201 (29x144) batting average when they swing at the first pitch.

BEWARE THE SPLITTER...Miller's splitter ranks as the T-9th best qualified splitter across the League this season by run value (3)...has thrown his secondary pitch 366 times, for a 25.0% usage rate...is holding batters to a .178 (18x101) batting average against the offspeed pitch while owning a 34.1 whiff rate, 11th-highest among qualified splitters in MLB, a 38.2 strikeout rate, 3rd-highest, and a 22.9 put away rate, 6th highest in MLB.
