METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets fell to the Phillies, 7-6, in Game 2 of the NLDS at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild Card Series...The Mets will host Game 4 of the NLDS on Wednesday. October 9....A potential Game 5 would take place on Friday. October 11 at Citizens Bank Park.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: With capacity crowds expected, the Mets encourage fans to take mass transit or rideshare services and arrive early to enter the ballpark...Parking will be limited and available parking spaces will run out quickly. Citi Field is just a short subway ride from Midtown Manhattan and most NYC points on the 7-train, including extra trains back to Manhattan after the game...Mass transit is the fastest way to Citi Field.

TO THE POST: The Mets are 55-42 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .567 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (245-179, .578) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the fourth-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.25 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80), Athletics (3.14) and Reds (3.23) have a lower ERA.

IN THE CITI: The Mets will play their first Postseason game at Citi Field this year...The Mets are 5-6 during the Postseason at Citi Field..Overall, the Mets are 31-19 at home in the Postseason...Their .620 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors.

DIVISION BELL: The Mets are playing in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...Overall, it's their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 13-5 all-time in the series...Their .722 winning percentage in the series is the best in the National League...Only the Blue Jays (.750) have a better mark

THREE'S COMPANY: The Mets are 14-5 in Game 3 of a Postseason series... This includes going 10-4 in New York and 4-1 on the road.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Mark Vientos is the third-youngest player (24 years, 300 days) with 10+ total bases in a playoff game...He was only older than Carlos Correa (21y, 20d) in Game 4 of the 2015 ALDS and Manny Ramírez (23y, 134d) in Game 2 of the 1995 ALCS...Vientos is now the third Mets player with three extra-base hits in a playoff game, joining Lucas Duda in Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS and Gary Carter in Game 4 of the 1986 World Series.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are facing the Phillies in the Postseason for the first time in franchise history...The Mets are 3-5 against the NL East in the Postseason...The last time the Mets faced off against a divisional opponent was in 1999, when they faced the Atlanta Braves in the NLCS.

SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD: There have been 12 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each.

AINT IT GRAND: The Mets have had one grand slam in Postseason history.... Edgardo Alfonzo cleared the bases in the top of the ninth in Game 1 of the 1999 NLDS in Arizona...Alfonzo gave the Mets an 8-4 lead with one swing of the bat with two outs in the top of the inning.

BACK-TO-BACK: The Mets have hit back-to-back home runs twice in the Postseason...On October 21, 2015 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Lucas Duda and Travis d'Arnaudhit back-to-back home runs in the first inning...On October 9, 1988 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds went back-to-back in the fourth inning.

HAPPY TRAILS: According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason... After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins).

BACK-TO-BACK: The Mets won Game 3 of the NLWCS and Game 1 of the NLDS after trailing entering the eighht inning...According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets have scored five or more runs in an inning twice this Postseason (In Game 1 of the NLDS and in Game 1 of the Wild Card Series)... It's the first time they've done so multiple times in a single Postseason in franchise history...Courtesy of Brent Maguire at MLB.com

NOTHING EXTRA: The Mets scored six runs without recording an extrabase hit in their Game 1 win against the Phillies...It marks the second time in franchise history that the team scored six runs without an extra-base hit in a Postseason game...The only other coinsurance was Game 6 of the 1986 World Series Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

SAVE ME: In Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series, David Peterson became the first pitcher in franchise history to record his first career save in the Postseason...He became the 19th pitcher to have earned their first career save in the playoffs...Courtesy of Elias.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are the first team in MLB history to clinch a postseason spot in a win and win a playoff series BOTH via games in which they faced a deficit in the ninth inning or later...Courtesy of Sarah Langs and Elias.

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 37 Postseason games, batting .295 (38-129) with 15 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 19 walks, a .384 OBP and a .566 SLG.

**TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE:** Ryne Stanek has appeared in 26 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.74 ERA (7 ER/23.0 IP) with seven walks and 23 strikeouts in the playoffs.

**WILD OUT:** The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

**POSTSEASON BOUND:** The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

**POSTING UP:** Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year...Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

**ON THE RECORD:** New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season... The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87... The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

**DANCING IN SEPTEMBER:** The Mets went 17-9 in September...Their .654 winning percentage was third in the majors and the second-best in the National League...Their 3.21 ERA in the month was the third-best in the National League. A LEADING MAN: Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs when batting first this season...That tied a record for the most in franchise history...He joined Curtis Granderson (26 HR/140 Games, 2015) as the franchise leader...In 109 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor batted .303/.374/.552 with 82 runs, 31 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 71 RBI, 42 walks, 23 steals with a .926 OPS...The Mets went 64-43 when Lindor bated first this season.

**30-FOR-30:** Lindor recorded his second 30 home run/30 double season as a Met and the fifth of his career...Only six players in Mets history have recorded multiple seasons with 30 home runs and 30 doubles - Lindor (2023-24), Pete Alonso (2024 & 2019), David Wright (2007-08), Carlos Beltrán (2006-07), Carlos Delgado (2006 and 2008) and Howard Johnson (1989 and 1991).

**OMG:** Jose Iglesias recorded a hit in both games of the team's doubleheader on the final game of the season...He ended the year with a 22-game hitting streak...It is the longest hitting streak of his career and it is the longest streak by a Mets player this year...His previous high was an 18-game streak from May 27-June 18, 2013 with the Red Sox...The last time a Mets player had a longer streak was Wilson Ramos, when he recorded a 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2019...Iglesias batted .395 (34-86) over that span with 14 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk, two steals, a .429 OBP and a .477 SLG.

**FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Francisco Lindor finished the season with a 7.6 fWAR...That was the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...Only Shohei Ohtani (9.1 fWAR) had a higher mark...Lindor's 17.4 defensive fWAR was third in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets stole 106 bases out of 128 attempts this year, giving them a 82.8% success rate...It is the second-highest in franchise history...Last year, the team was successful in 88.7% (118-133) of stolen base attempts, the highest in team history...Brandon Nimmo was not caught in 15 stolen base attempts this year...His 15 steals were a career-best...Francisco Lindor stole 29 bases this year...That is two shy from his career-best 31, accomplished last year.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo hit .241/.344/.419 with 44 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI and 39 walks in 74 road games...This compared to a .207/.310/.379 slashline with 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs and 38 walks in 75 games at home in 2024...Overall, Nimmo hit 23 home runs this year, one short of his career-best 24 he accomplished last season... His 90 RBI were a career-best...He recorded 77 walks this year...That's three short of his career-best 80 he recorded in 2018.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** From the All-Star break until the end of the season, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.74 ERA, the sixth-lowest mark in the National League in that span....Overall, the Mets relief staff have struck out 648 batters this season, which was fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 648 strikeouts were second-most in franchise history...The team recorded 571 punchouts in 2023...The 2021 team recorded the franchise record with 658 punchouts from the bullpen.

He joined Darryl Strawberry (1983-1986), David Wright (2005-2007), Michael Conforto (2017), Pete Alonso (2019) and Francisco Alvarez (2023) as the only players in franchise history age 24 or younger to have 25 or more home runs in a season...He joined Wright (2005-2008, 2010), Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991) and Robin Ventura (1999) as the only third baseman in franchise history with 25 or more home runs in a season (min. 50% games at 3B each season).

MANAFA NEWS & NOTES							

LAST TIME OUT: He went five innings against Milwaukee in the Wild Card Round...He recorded four strikeouts, he surrendered two earned runs and six hits...He didn't receive a decision.

POSTSEASON: Has appeared in four postseason games and has started three of them...Is 0-3 with a 10.66 ERA (15 ER/12.2 IP) with three walks and 13 strikeouts.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: : Manaea has completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts during the regular season....That is tied for the sixth-most in the National League... Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30 against Minnesota and 8/5 at St.Louis...Manaea joins Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors this season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea is the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He is the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)... The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts... He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

WRITING A CHECK FOR 10K: The Mets had six games in which the starter has struck out 10 or more batters this year...Four of those performances were by Sean Manaea... Manaea is the just the seventh left-handed pitcher in franchise history with four or more double-digit strikeout games in a season joining Sid Fernandez (1985-1986,, 1988, 1990 1992), Jerry Koosman (1968, 1976), Johan Santana (2008-2009) and Jon Matlack (1974)...His 11 strikeouts on July 30 vs. Minnesota were the most in a game by a Mets left-handed pitcher since Steven Matz's 11-strikeout performance on September 1, 2018 at San Francisco and were the most by a Mets southpaw at Citi Field since April 24, 2012 when Johan Santana struck out 11 Marlins hitters...In his last start, August 27 at Arizona, Manaea became the first Met since Jacob deGrom (9/30/22 at Atlanta) to record 11 strikeouts and not issue a walk.

SPECTACULAR STRETCH: Since the start of July, Manaea is second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)... Since June 14, Manaea has allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which is tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER YEAR: Manaea recorded a career-high in innings pitched (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12), and tied a career-high in starts (32). He also finished with the second-lowest ERA of his career (3.47)...His best came in 2019 when he only appeared in five games.

RIGHTY DOMINATION: Held right handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right handed hitters being at .250. It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games)

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest nohit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut... He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventhmost by any Mets pitcher in their team debut...Credit Elias.

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...In 2024 the southpaw allowed just 26 hits in 135 plate appearances ending with the offering, for a .193 batting average with 61 strikeouts... His 44.9 K% with the pitch is the 20th best in the majors, while his 41.9 whiff% is the 12th-best mark in the majors this season (Min. 25 Plate Appearances)

SINK OR SWIM: Manaea has thrown his sinker 44.7% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal... The southpaw has a run value of 15 with his sinker, which is the fifth-best mark in the majors. He also has 71 strikeouts via the sinker which is the highest mark in the majors.
