TONIGHT, THERE'S ONLY YOU TONIGHT: The Mets are set to open their 61st season when they take on the Washington Nationals...In the history of Major League Baseball, the Mets (39-21, .650) have the best winning percentage on Opening Day...Research courtesy of *Elias*.

OPENING DAY: After losing their first eight Opening Day contests, the Mets have won 39 of their last 52 Opening Day games (.750)...New York took nine straight openers from 1975-1983 to tie a major league record...The Mets have won 12 of their last 16 openers, including four of the last five.

THE BIG APPLE TV+: Tomorrow's 7:05 p.m. game against the Washington Nationals will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+...Fans can access the game for free by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com...The service is accessible to anyone with internet or wireless access, no cable or satellite subscription is required.

WASHINGTON, D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: The Mets will open the season in Washington D.C. for the first time since 2019...The Mets defeated the Nationals 2-0 on that day...The Mets are 7-2 all-time vs. the Expos/Nationals on Opening Day...New York is 3-1 in lid-lifters vs. the Nationals since they moved to D.C....The Mets are 2-0 when opening in Montreal/Washington.

WAY, AWAY FROM HERE: The Mets are 16-12 when starting the season on the road...Dating back to 2001, New York has won seven of its last 11 games when beginning the year on the road.

MEGILL, MY BELLE: Tylor Megill is set to make his first Opening Day start tonight in Washington...He will have the fewest major league innings pitched (89.2) of any Mets Opening Day starter in franchise history...See the below chart from *Elias* for more recent Opening Day starters with as little major league experience:

STARTING OFF WITH A BANG: The Mets have only had one player to record a leadoff home run on Opening Day...Kaz Matsui began the first game of the 2004 season with a home run off Russ Ortiz on April 6 in Atlanta.

GRAND SLAMS: Collin Cowgill and Todd Hundley are the only two Mets to hit a grand slam on Opening Day...Cowgill went deep on April 1, 2013 off San Diego's Brad Brach...Hundley's slam came on April 26, 1995 at Colorado off Billy Swift.

TWO HOME RUNS: Robin Ventura, Bobby Bonilla, Cleon Jones, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds are the only five players in club history to hit two home runs in an Opening Day tilt...Ventura was the last to accomplish the feat on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

EXTRA, EXTRA ON OPENING DAY: The Mets have played seven extra-inning games on Opening Day...They are 5-2 in those contests...The last extra-inning affair was in 2014, a 9-7 loss to the Nationals...The last Mets Opening Day win in extras was a 6-4, 10-inning victory on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter begins his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,551.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves: Placed RHP Jacob deGrom on the 10-Day IL (stress reaction on his right scapula)...Placed LHP Joey Lucchesi on the 60-Day IL ("Tommy John" surgery)...Placed RHP Jake Reed on the 10-Day IL (left oblique strain)...Optioned LHP David Peterson to Triple-A Syracuse.

NATS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in three of the last four years.

CAN-ÓPENER: According to *Sportradar*, Robinson Canó is a .328 career hitter on Opening Day, collecting hits in 14 of 15 games...His 19 hits in season openers are tied with Yadier Molina for second most among active hitters, trailing only Albert Pujols (20).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets finished the 2021 season going 30-51 (.370) with a 4.39 ERA, 224 walks and 686 strikeouts on the road...The team's 30 wins were tied for 23rd in the majors...Outside of 2020, the team's 30 road wins were the fewest for the franchise since they went 29-52 in 2009...Despite this, the Mets' 686 road strikeouts were a franchise record, edging the 2019 Mets by one punchout.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets went 39-37 against the NL East last season...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodríguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Three Mets are taking part in their first career Opening Day...RHP Sean Reid-Foley, RHP Tylor Megill and RHP Drew Smith are celebrating their first major league Opening Day...Only seven players in franchise history have made their major league debut in a start on Opening Day...Pete Alonso (2019), Brad Emaus (2011), Kazuo Matsui (2004), Rey Ordoñez (1996), Kelvin Chapman (1979), Rod Gaspar (1969) and Al Moran (1963).

A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: The Mets have recorded 10 shutouts on Opening Day...Before last year, the Mets won back-to-back Opening Days via shutout, a 2-0 win at Washington in 2019 and a 1-0 win against the Atlanta Braves in 2020...The Mets have been shut out only once (7-0, April 9, 1963 vs. St. Louis) on Opening Day...Research courtesy of *Elias*.

GOT HIM DOWN PAT: Pete Alonso and J.D. Davis have enjoyed success against Patrick Corbin in their three seasons as division rivals...Alonso owns a .333/.412/.800 slashline against Corbin and his 10 hits, four home runs and seven RBI off him are his most vs. any pitcher...Likewise, Davis' 10 hits, four homers and six RBI vs. the southpaw are his most against any hurler...Davis has slashed .345/.406/.862 against the Nats' Opening Day starter...Davis has two career multi-homer games...His first came on April 6, 2019, with both homers coming against Corbin when the Nationals visited Citi Field.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets begin their 61st season today in Washington...Last year, the Mets ended with a record of 77-85 and in third place in the National League East...The Mets begin their first road trip of the year, a two-city seven game series against Washington (four games) and Philadelphia (three games)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami... Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER: The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on Opening Day...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992...He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

- In 11 Spring Training games, Alonso hit .233/.361/.467 (7-30) with four doubles, one home run, four RBI, seven runs scored and six walks.
- Alonso is a lifetime .358 (62-173) hitter vs. Washington, including a .376/.438/.731 slashline with 16 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in 25 games at Nationals Park...His 19-game on-base streak in D.C. (September 2, 2019-present) is the longest active streak at this ballpark.
- Is 10-30 (.333/.412/.800) with four home runs and seven RBI vs. Patrick Corbin in his career, his most hits, homers and RBI against any pitcher.
- Ranked third in the NL with 37 home runs last season...Tied for seventh in the league with 67 extra-base hits and was 11th with 291 total bases...He tied for 11th in the NL with 94 RBI, was 13th with a .519 SLG and 15th with an .863 OPS.
- Struck out in 31 percent of his April plate appearances in 2021, then cut his K-rate to 18.2 percent for the rest of the season, leading to a career-best 19.9 K%.
- Ranks 14th in Mets history with 106 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).
- Last season, led the NL with 16 home runs off left-handed pitchers...Homered every 10.56 at-bats vs. LHP, first in the NL and fifth in MLB.

- Hit .219/.219/.344 (7-32) with one double, one home run, three RBI and two runs scored in 10 Grapefruit League games.
- Joined the Mets on November 30, signing a two-year contract with a team option for a third season...His home debut will mark his first game at Citi Field.
- Last season, had career-high marks in runs (93), hits (120), triples (four), walks (77), HBP (27), games (141) and at-bats (519)...Tied his career-best in doubles (22).
- Has a .377 OBP over the last three seasons (2019-2021), a mark topped by just 10 players in the majors (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

- Was 9-25 (.360/.407/.440) with two doubles, two RBI, three runs scored and two walks in eight Spring Training games...Appeared in the field at first and second base.
- His .347 (41-118) average against the Nats is his best vs. any opponent (min. 100 AB)...Homered in his first AB as a Met on Opening Day in D.C. in 2019.
- Last appeared in the majors in 2020, when he slashed .316/.352/.544 in 49 games during the shortened season.
- Spent the entire 2021 season on the Restricted List after being suspended for violating MLB's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program.
- Played for Estrellas de Oriente in the Dominican Winter League this offseason...Batted .300 (12-40) in 10 games with his hometown team...Canó also played for the Dominican Republic in the Caribbean Series, hitting .417 (10-24) in seven games played.

- Has more runs scored, hits, doubles, home runs and RBI vs. the Nationals than he does against any other single opponent...His four homers, six RBI and 10 hits against Patrick Corbin are his most off any pitcher.
- Missed more than half of last season as he was plagued by left hand injuries...Underwent surgery to repair a torn ligament in his left hand on October 5...Was limited to just 15 games before the All-Star break before landing on the IL...Reached base safely in all 15 games, hitting .405 (17-42) with a 1.109 OPS.

- Missed six weeks (May-June) with a strained right oblique and missed all of August with a strained left hamstring.

- Played for San Diego from 2015-2019, where he twice topped the 20-steals mark, swiping a career-high 30 bases in 2016 and 24 in 2018.

- Finished 2021 on a high note with nine homers and 25 RBI in September, thanks to a .267/.359/.574 slashline (.933 OPS)...It was his best month of the season in all three slashline categories.
- His 25 RBI in September were the most in a month in his career...Both his nine homers and 25 RBI were tied for sixth in the majors in September.
- Missed 36 games last season with a strained right oblique.

- Ranks second among active players in hit by pitches (133) to Anthony Rizzo (178)...Leads MLB in outfield assists (84) since making his debut in 2012.
- Is the only player in the majors with at least 20 stolen bases in each of the last eight full seasons (2013-19, 2021).

- Batted .364 (4-11) with two doubles, a home run, five RBI and a 1.203 OPS as a pinch hitter.
- Was shelved for two and a half weeks from mid-August through early September last year with back spasms.

- Almost exclusively played second base in 2021 until the end of August, then, 26 of his last 27 starts came in left field.

- Injuries limited Nimmo to 92 games in 2021...When healthy, was one of the best hitters in the majors by OBP, posting a .401 mark for the season, making him one of five players who had at least 350 plate appearances to reach base at that clip or better...Also had one of the top walk rates in the league, ranking seventh in the NL and 11th in MLB with a 7.15 PA/BB ratio.
- Ranks fourth in the majors with a .398 OBP since the start of 2018 (min. 1,000 PA)...Trails Mike Trout (.442), Juan Soto (.432) and Bryce Harper (.399).
- Batted .306 (30-98) with a .429 OBP against lefties in 2021...From 2016-2020, he hit .243 (65-268) with a .358 OBP against left-handers.
