THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games on their penultimate homestand of the 2026 season vs. San Francisco (2-1, Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (Friday-Sunday), including a 5-2 win on Thursday vs. the Giants...Will have the day off on Monday before starting a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (September 8-10) and Chicago-NL (September 11-13)...Have hit 163 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1129) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the fourth-most runs (691) in all Major League Baseball, behind Chicago-NL (753), Washington (735) and Milwaukee (705), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs in 2025 (they are looking to be the fourth team in MLB history to finish top three in MLB in runs the season after finishing last in the league in runs, the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

CALL TO THE HALL: Pittsburgh will host its fifth Hall of Fame Game tonight vs. the Angels...Wilbur Cooper, John Candelaria and Jack Wilson were inducted in a ceremony on Thursday at PNC Park's Left Field Lounge...The Pirates' previous HOF Games were on Sept. 3, 2022 vs. Toronto, Aug. 26, 2023 vs. Chicago (NL), Aug. 24, 2024 vs. Cincinnati and Aug. 22, 2025 vs. Colorado.

HALO AGAIN: The Pirates are hosting Los Angeles (AL) for three games this weekend (Friday-Sunday)...Pittsburgh has played nine games vs. the Angels at PNC Park (since 2001), its fewest vs. any American League team in stadium history...The Pirates hosted Los Angeles for three games from June 15-17, 2004, three games from June 3-5, 2016 and three games from May 6-8, 2024.

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe, who is one home run shy of becoming the first Pirate with a 30-homer season since Josh Bell (37) in 2019, has the third-most home runs by a player in his first season with the Bucs in team history, behind only Brian Giles (39) in 1999 and Reggie Sanders (31) in 2003.

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh will play 12 of its final 21 games vs. American League teams...The Pirates will play vs. Los Angeles (Friday-Sunday), at Chicago (September 8-10), vs. Kansas City (September 18-20) and at Detroit (September 25-27)...They have won nine straight interleague series here at home, dating back to a three-game sweep from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Pirates have won three straight series (August 24-26 at San Diego, August 28-30 at St. Louis and Tuesday-Thursday vs. San Francisco) and are looking to win four straight series for the first time since July 9-24, 2024...They have also won three straight series here at PNC Park (also August 14-16 vs. Boston and August 17-19 vs. Detroit) and are looking to win four straight home series for the first time since May 24-June 19, 2024.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2020 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Jones lost a 4-1 decision after allowing three runs over 4.2 innings of work on August 28 at St. Louis...He has gone 0-5 with a 6.75 ERA (26.2ip/20er) in his last six starts (since July 29 vs. Arizona) after posting a 2.20 ERA (28.2ip/7er), 35 strikeouts and a .122 batting average against (12-for-98) over his six starts from June 21-July 24.

LOS ANGELES TIMES: Jones will make his first career start against Los Angeles (AL) tonight...The 25-year-old Jones is a 2020 graduate of La Mirada (CA) High School, located approximately 15 miles northeast of Angel Stadium...He was recognized as the Perfect Game & Rawlings California Two-Player of the Year during his junior campaign.

SKY-HIGH JULY: Jones’ 2.00 ERA (27.0ip/6er) during the month of July was tied with Atlanta’s Chris Sale and San Francisco’s Robbie Ray (he was traded to San Diego on August 3) for the seventh-lowest mark in the National League (minimum 27.0 innings pitched), behind Chicago’s Shota Imanaga (1.53), Chicago’s Matthew Boyd (1.67), Miami’s Eury Pérez (1.69), New York’s Nolan McLean (1.78), Arizona’s Brandon Pfaadt (1.88) and Arizona’s Merrill Kelly (1.95)...His .120 batting average against (11-for-92) during the month of July was first among Major League pitchers (minimum 90 at-bats).

DYNAMIC DUO: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run on two hits and one walk in 6.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2, 10-inning loss on July 24 vs. Chicago (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Bubba Chandler (July 22 [G2] at New York-AL) and him were the first pair of Pirates starters since at least 1893 to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs & one or zero walks in back-to-back games.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Jones became the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with three or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed and at least six strikeouts in three consecutive outings when he accomplished that from July 2-18 (G1).

30 ROCK: Jones retired his final four batters on July 2 at Philadelphia, retired each of his 18 batters on July 8 vs. Atlanta and retired his first eight batters on July 18 (G1) at Cleveland (Steven Kwan snapped the streak with a two-out single in the third inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones became one of only three Pirates pitchers in the last 70 years (since 1957) to retire at least 30 consecutive batters, joining Harvey Haddix (38 straight batters, May 21-26, 1959) & Jim Bibby (32 straight batters, May 19-24, 1981).

YOU’RE PERFECT: Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings.

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain...He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).
