TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 7, 2006: In an 8-5 win at Texas, Joe Torre becomes the fourth Yankees manager to amass 1,000 career wins, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460), Casey Stengel (1,149) and Miller Huggins (1,067).

May 7, 1999: Two Japan-born starting pitchers face each other for the first time in Major League history, as Hideki Irabu (NYY) goes up against Mac Suzuki (SEA). Both pitchers carry a shutout into the fifth inning before the Yankees score three times in the frame en route to a 10-1 victory.

May 7, 1959: The Yankees play an exhibition game against the Los Angeles Dodgers before 93,103 fans at the L.A. Coliseum. The game is played to honor paralyzed Dodgers catcher Roy Campanella.

May 7, 1921: Outfielder Bob Meusel hits the first of three career cycles in a 6-5 win at Washington-AL. His three cycles remain the Yankees' franchise record.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 8, 1987: Mike Pagliarulo hits a two-out, "walk-off" grand slam in the 9th inning against the Minnesota Twins, giving the Yankees an 11-7 victory. Pagliarulo and Gary Ward each homer twice in the game.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees conclude their six-game homestand tonight with the final game of a three-game set vs. San Diego (1-1 thus far)...are 2-3 on the homestand after dropping two-of-three vs. Tampa Bay and splitting their first two games vs. San Diego...after this homestand, will embark on a six-game road trip, featuring three-game series against the A's (Fri.-Sun.) and Mariners (5/12-14).
► Their +60 run differential this season is the second-highest in the AL and tied for the second-highest in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Padres, 12-3, on Tuesday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (6.0IP, 7H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 4K, OHR, 1BK) did not record a decision despite allowing only 2R/ER in a season-high 6.0 innings...**Yankees batters** scored double-digit runs for the sixth time this season...scored 10R in the seventh inning, their most runs in an inning since their 11R in the second inning on 7/28/15 at Texas...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) hit his 12th home run of the season with a solo shot in the fourth inning...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 5RBI, 1SB) hit a game-tying RBI single and his first career grand slam in the seventh inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (0-for-4, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) drew a go-ahead bases-loaded walk in the seventh inning...**1B Ben Rice** (2-for-4, 2 doubles, 2RBI) hit a two-run double in the seventh inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1SB) hit an RBI single in the seventh inning...**DH Jasson Dominguez** (2-for-3, 1R, 1 double, 1BB) reached base three times...**LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.2IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) earned his first win as a Yankee.

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his eighth start of the year tonight vs. San Diego...**is 6-0 with a 1.01 ERA (44.2IP, 5ER) in seven starts this season**...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of those starts...**has not allowed an ER in four of his last five starts (since 4/9), posting a 0.52 ERA (34.1IP, 2ER) in that span**.

- **Among pitchers to debut with a team since 1913 (when ER became an official stat in both leagues), is just the third pitcher to record at least six wins and post an ERA of 1.01-or-lower in his first seven starts with a franchise**, joining Los Angeles-NL's Fernando Valenzuela (7-0 and 0.29 ERA in 1981) and Boston's Boo Ferriss (7-0 and 0.57 ERA in 1945) – confirmed by *Elias*.
- Leads the Majors in wins and pickoffs (four), ranks second in ERA (first in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.265, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' OPS (.519, sixth in AL), eighth in HR/9.OIP (0.40, fifth in AL) and groundball percentage (52.8%, second in AL), and ninth in WHIP (0.94, seventh in AL)...also ranks seventh in the AL in opponents' BA (.187).
- **The Yankees are 7-0 in his seven starts**...is one of just two pitchers in the Majors this season to make at least seven starts and have his team win all of his starts, joining San Francisco's Robbie Ray (team is 7-0).
- **Has won a career-high six straight starts since 4/4, posting a 0.68 ERA (40.OIP, 3ER) over that span**.

FAN-TASTIC: **The Yankees have averaged 41,684 fans per home gate this season, their highest average attendance through their first 19 gates of a season since 2014 (41,687).**

- **Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors**, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (51,364) and San Diego (42,345).
- With Tuesday's paid attendance of 38,090, **the Yankees have surpassed 50 million fans for regular season games at the current Yankee Stadium**.

AUSTIN POWERS: **C Austin Wells hit a game-tying RBI single and his first career grand slam in the seventh inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego...his 5RBI in the seventh inning marked the most by a Yankee in a single inning since Alex Rodriguez recorded 7RBI in the sixth inning on 10/4/09 at Tampa Bay**...is only the fifth Yankee in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to accomplish the feat, joining Rodriguez, Bobby Abreu (6RBI in the first inning on 9/12/06 vs. Tampa Bay), Tino Martinez (5RBI in the second inning on 4/18/05 vs. Tampa Bay) and Don Mattingly (5RBI in the seventh inning on 4/11/87 at Kansas City).

- **His 5RBI marked a career high** (previous: 4RBI – 4 times)...his 5RBI marked the most by a Yankees catcher since Gary Sánchez recorded 6RBI on 9/5/21 vs. Baltimore.
- Is batting .286/.295/.595 (12-for-42) with 5R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 13RBI, 1BB, 1SF and 1SB over his last 11 games (since 4/23).
- **Has 3HR in his last six games with a plate appearance** (since 4/29).
- **14 of his 24 hits this season have gone for extra bases** (6 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR).

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe hit an RBI single in the seventh inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego...is hitting .333/.390/.556 (12-for-36) with 6R, 5 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI, 3BB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB over his last 10 games (since 4/25).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his 12th home run of the season with a solo shot in the fourth inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego...**is tied for the Major League lead in home runs...has hit 4HR in his last seven games (since 4/29) and 5HR in his last nine games (since 4/27-32)**.

- **Owns a 32-game on-base streak (since 4/2)...is tied for the third-longest on-base streak of his career**, trailing only a 45-game streak from 8/29/22-4/12/23 and a 37-game streak from 5/2-6/12/24 (also had a 32-game streak from 5/28-6/30/17)...**is the second-longest active on-base streak in the Majors**, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber's 41-game streak since 9/23/24...is batting .413/.503/.702 (50-for-121) with 26R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 23RBI, 20BB/4IBB, 2HP and 3SB over that span.
- **Has reached base in 35 of his 36 games this year**, batting .412/.503/.772 (56-for-136) with 34R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 12HR, 34RBI, 23BB/5IBB, 2HP and 3SB.
- **Has reached base multiple times in 22 of his last 27 games (since 4/7), 25 of his last 31 games (since 4/3) and 27 of his 36 games this year**...his 27 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.
- Has hit .312/.422/.686 (206-for-660) with 143R, 33 doubles, 2 triples, 70HR, 146RBI and 121BB in 183 career Interleague games...since 2017, leads the Majors in HR (69), SLG (.685) and OPS (1.109), ranks second in OBP (.423), and third in BA (.313), RBI (145) and walks (120) in Interleague play...has hit 52HR in his last 111 Interleague games (since 9/1/21).
- Has hit 4HR in his last six games vs. the Padres (since 5/28/23).
- Over his last 27 games (since 4/7), has hit .444/.534/.727 (44-for-99) with 20R, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR, 17RBI, 18BB/3IBB, 1HP and 1SB.
- Has hit .500/.588/.893 (14-for-28) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 21RBI, 5BB/4IBB and 1HP with RISP this year.

Has reached base multiple times in 22 of his last 27 games (since 4/7), 25 of his last 31 games (since 4/3) and 27 of his 36 games this year...his 27 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- Has hit .312/.422/.686 (206-for-660) with 143R, 33 doubles, 2 triples, 70HR, 146RBI and 121BB in 183 career Interleague games...since 2017, leads the Majors in HR (69), SLG (.685) and OPS (1.109), ranks second in OBP (.423), and third in BA (.313), RBI (145) and walks (120) in Interleague play...has hit 52HR in his last 111 Interleague games (since 9/1/21).
- Has hit 4HR in his last six games vs. the Padres (since 5/28/23).
- Over his last 27 games (since 4/7), has hit .444/.534/.727 (44-for-99) with 20R, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR, 17RBI, 18BB/3IBB, 1HP and 1SB.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.87 ERA (109.2IP, 35ER) over their last 21 starts (since 4/14)**...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.104), opponents' OBP (.282), opponents' OPS (.608) and WHIP (1.24), rank second in opponents' SLG (.326, first in AL) and third in ERA (third in AL).

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 17 of their last 21 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of those starts.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** scored double-digit runs for the sixth time this season on Tuesday vs. San Diego...scored 10R in the seventh inning, their most runs in an inning since their 11R in the second inning on 7/28/15 at Texas.

- **The Yankees' 60HR this year are tied for their most home runs through their first 36 games of a season in franchise history** (also 60HR in 2003).
- Lead the Majors in HR (60), BA (.262), OBP (.346), SLG (.470) and OPS (.815), rank second in runs scored (202, first in AL), runs per game (5.61, first in AL), total bases (571, first in AL), XBH (128, first in AL) and times on base (480, first in AL), and fourth in walks (144, second in AL).

RICE RICE BABY: **C/INF Ben Rice** hit a two-run double in the seventh inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego...17 of his 29 hits this year have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR), including seven of his last eight hits since 4/25 (5 doubles, 2HR).

MERRY GRISHMAS: **OF Trent Grisham** drew a go-ahead bases-loaded walk in the seventh inning...his six game-winning RBI are tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL) and his eight go-ahead RBI are tied for the sixth-most in the Majors (tied for second in AL).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (6-0, 1.01 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his eighth start of the season in tonight's series finale vs. San Diego...the 31-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...earned his sixth win of the season in the Yankees' 3-0 victory on Friday vs. Tampa Bay after allowing only 1H over 7.0 scoreless innings (2BB, 6K, 1HP)...**is 6-0 with a 1.01 ERA (44.2IP, 5ER) in seven starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in five of those starts...the Yankees are 7-0 in his starts this season...**leads the Majors in wins and pickoffs (four), ranks second in ERA (first in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.265, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' OPS (.519, sixth in AL), eighth in HR/9.0IP (0.40, fifth in AL) and groundball percentage (52.8%, second in AL) and ninth in WHIP (0.94, seventh in AL)...went 11-10 with two complete games (one shutout) and a 3.25 ERA (174.1IP, 146H, 71R/63ER, 57BB, 166K, 13HR) over 29 starts with the Atlanta Braves in 2024...over nine Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025), has gone 79-36 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 2.97 ERA (929.0IP, 814H, 342R/307ER, 257BB, 902K, 78HR) in 175 career games (158 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 500.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.70), tied for first in shutouts (four) and pickoffs (22), second in winning percentage (.706), HR/9.0IP (0.65), opponents' SLG (.326), opponents' OPS (.606), third in groundball percentage (54.4%), tied for third in wins (60), fourth in groundball/flyball ratio (2.23) and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 77 wins since 2019 rank second in the Majors, trailing only Gerrit Cole (79)...the two-time All-Star (2022 and '24) and three-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting twice in his career (second in 2022 and fifth in 2020)...has made seven career Opening Day rosters (2019-24 with Atlanta and 2025 with the Yankees)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, INF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his sixth win of the season in the Yankees' 3-0 victory on Friday vs. Tampa Bay after allowing only 1H over 7.0 scoreless innings (2BB, 6K, 1HP)...marked his third scoreless start of the season (also 0R in 7.2IP on 4/20 at Tampa Bay and 0R in 7.0IP on 4/9 at Detroit).

- ✦ **Has won a career-high six straight starts since 4/4, posting a 0.68 ERA (40.0IP, 3ER) over that span.**
- ✦ **Has held opponents to a .118/.189/.118 (4-for-34) slash line with runners in scoring position...**against opponents with RISP, ranks first in the Majors in OBP, SLG and OPS (.307), and tied for second in BA (tied for first in AL).
- ✦ **Has made four starts after a Yankees' loss this season and has gone 4-0 in those four starts without allowing an ER in 27.2IP.**
- ✦ Three of his seven starts this season have been scoreless: 0R in 7.0IP on 4/9 at Detroit, 0R in 7.2IP on 4/20 at Tampa Bay and 0R in 7.0IP on 5/2 vs. Tampa Bay...is one of only two pitchers in the Majors this season to toss three scoreless starts of at least 7.0IP (also San Diego's Nick Pivetta - three)...his 7.2 scoreless innings on 4/20 at Tampa Bay was the longest start by a Yankee this season and the longest scoreless start by a Yankee since Clarke Schmidt tossed 8.0 scoreless innings on 5/16/24 at Minnesota.
- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee and did not record a decision (4.2IP, 7H, 6R/2ER, 2BB, 4K, 0HR, 2HP).
- ✦ Earned his first win as a Yankee on 4/4 at Pittsburgh after allowing only 1R/ER in 5.2 innings in the Yankees' 9-4 win (6H, 1BB, 6K, 1HR).
- ✦ Recorded his sixth career double-digit strikeout game on 4/9 at Detroit (7.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0BB, 11K)...matched his second-most strikeouts in a game, trailing only his 13K on 6/4/24 at Boston...marked the first time in his career that he recorded at least 10K without walking a batter...was the first Yankee to do since Michael King recorded 13K and 0BB on 9/20/23 vs. Toronto.
- ✦ Did not allow a hit to his first 17BF on 4/20 at Tampa Bay (7.2IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 2K, 1HP).
