THE PIRATES:...beat the Rays $4-3$ on Saturday to even their weekend series...Have gone 14-12, including 9-6 at home, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone 28-3 (.903 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have the fourth-best record (20-17) among all National League teams since 5/11 behind the Phillies (23-14), Cardinals (23-14) and Dodgers (22-17)...Are hitting. 287 (39-for-136) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks seventh in all of MLB behind the Mets (.314), Diamondbacks (.310), Nationals (.293), Astros (.291), Yankees (.290) and Red Sox (.289)...Have gone 9-4 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have the second-best ERA (3.29) among starting rotations this month behind the Mariners (2.77)...Have surrendered 16 home runs this month, which is tied for the fewest among all teams in MLB along with the Reds and Tigers...Have not lost back-toback home games since 5/22-23 against the Giants.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 338 (26-for-77) with seven doubles, a triple, four home runs and 12 RBI during his current career-high 19-game hitting streak...It's the longest active hitting streak in MLB coming into today as well as the thirdlongest hitting streak this season in MLB (Ketel Marte and Anthony Volpe each hit safely in 21 straight games earlier this year)... Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate in a single
 season since 2019 when Kevin Newman also safely in 19 straight games...The last Pirate with a single-season hitting streak of more than 19 games was Jason Kendall in 2004 (20 games).

SHORT HOPS: Oneil Cruz' 445 -foot home run on Saturday marked the fourth time he has reached the Allegheny River in his career (it was the first time to do it on the fly)...Cruz now has 28 career home runs as a shortstop, which ranks 10th at that position in team history (Pirates Hall of Famer Dick Groat ranks ninth with 30).

SEEING RED: The Pirates will depart for a six-game, seven-day road trip

PLAYING THE FIELD: The Pirates bring a season-high 55.0 inning errorless streak into today... Pittsburgh's longest errorless streak in 2023 was 76.1 innings...Pittsburgh has gone $9-4$ this month when not being charged with an error...Pittsburgh's .989 fielding percentage this month ranks fifth in all of MLB behind the Rangers (.994), Guardians (.994), Astros (.991) and Diamondbacks (.990).

WHAT'S AT STAKE: The Pirates have won four straight series at PNC Park heading into the deciding game of this series against the Rays...The last time the Pirates had a longer series streak at PNC Park was between August and September of 2015 when the team won five straight.

AIN'T IT NIFTY: Andrew McCutchen legged out the 50th triple of his career in yesterday's win against the Rays...McCutchen ranks fourth among all active players in extra base hits (777)...The only three active players with more extra base hits are Freddie Freeman (857), Joey Votto (837) and Paul Goldschmidt (794).

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Paul Skenes gets the start today in the finale of this six-game homestand...Since making his big league debut on May 11, he is tied for the ninth-most strikeouts (53) in all of MLB.... His 53 punchouts since May 11 are the most among all rookies in MLB (Luis Gil of the Yankees is second with 52).

HOT ROWD: Rowdy Tellez has reached base safely in each of his last seven games, going 9-for-25 (.360) with three doubles and three RBI...He comes into today with a .386 average (17-for-44) with five doubles, a home run, $10 \mathrm{RBI}, .438$ OBP, .568 slugging percentage and 1.006 OPS in 14

Willie Stargell took Mets starter Gary Gentry deep with a three-run shot in the first inning while finishing the game with four RBI. Luke Waker picked up the win for the Pirates after hodiding the Mets to two runs in 7.0 innings while Mudcat Grant worked the final 2.0 innings to record his sixth save of the season.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he made seven starts, posting an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) with 45 strikeouts against just eight walks before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

PROSPECT SZN: Skenes entered the 2024 season rated as the No. Pirates 1 prospect by Baseball America, as well as the top pitching prospect in baseball and the No. 3 overall prospect in the sport by MLB.com...Entering the 2023 draft, he was rated by MLB.com as the No. 1 prospect in the 2023 class, as well as having the "Best Fastball", "Best Breaking Ball", third "Best Control" and fifth "Best Changeup" in the 2023 college class.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win on June 17 vs. Cincinnati after allowing just one run on six hits with seven strikeouts against one walk over 6.0 innings of work.

AGAINST THE RAYS: Skenes will be making his first career start against the Rays today.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his eighth career start and appearance today.... He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his seven career outings, including two or fewer five times and one or fewer four times (two scoreless outings).

Skenes is the second pitcher in Pirates history to win at least four of his first seven career starts with 50 or more strikeouts, joining Jose DeLeon (1983).
His 53 strikeouts through six outings are the second-most by a Pirates pitcher to start their career, trailing only DeLeon's 62 in 1983.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in strikeouts (1st, 53), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 12.13), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3rd, 7.57), , ERA (5th, 2.29), WHIP (8th, 0.99) and opponents batting average (15th, .221).

GETTING IT DONE': Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in six of his seven career games, making him one of seven players since 1900 to reach those totals to start their career...His teammate Jared Jones also did so in his first six games of this season, but prior to that this hadn't been done since Masahiro Tanaka did so for the Yankees in 2014...The last NL player prior to this year to accomplish that feat was Stephen Strasburg in 2010.

BRINGING THE HEAT: Skenes has thrown 65 pitches of $100.0+\mathrm{mph}$ this season, the most of any Major League starter in 2024...To date, Skenes has thrown two of the top10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season and eight of the top 20...Prior to Angels flamethrower Ben Joyce making his first career start on June 16 and throwing nine pitches of $101.0+\mathrm{mph}$, Skenes had previously thrown seven of the top-10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season.

Skenes has thrown nine pitches of $101.0+\mathrm{mph}$, including the hardest thrown pitch by a Pirates starter since data started being tracked in 2008 (101.9 on May 11 vs. Chicago-NL)...His nine pitches at that velocity are tied with LAA Ben Joyce for the most in the Majors by a starter this season (Jared Jones has three, Tarik Skubal has one).
His 65 pitches of 100.0 -plus mph are already the most ever by a Pirates starter since 2008, topping Gerrit Cole's 33 he had during his five years with the Bucs.

MEMORABLE DAY AT WRIGLEY: On May 17, in his second career Major League start, Skenes threw 6.0 no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts against the Cubs, including fanning the first seven hitters of the game...He was the first Pirates pitcher to ever strike out seven-plus consecutive hitters to start a game and the third Major League rookie of all-time to do so, joining Jacob deGrom on Sept. 15, 2014 ( 8 K in his 21 st career game) and Jim Deshaies on Sept. 23, 1986 ( 8 K in his 28th career game).

He was the fourth rookie pitcher all-time to record an outing of 6.0+ IP, 0 hits allowed and 10+ strikeouts and the first since Chris Heston's no-hitter on June 9,2015 vs. Mets...Houston's Don Wilson (1967) and Texas' Jim Bibby (1973) also did so in no-hit efforts as well.
