METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action and defeated the Mariners, 2-1, last night...The Mets continue a 10-day, nine-game homestand (3-4) against the Angels (1-2), Rangers (1-2) and Mariners (1-0)...New York is off on Labor Day before the start of a five-game road trip against Washington (two games) and Minnesota (three games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 - September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS CLINIC: In honor of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, earlier today Carlos Carrasco hosted a youth baseball clinic at Citi Field for pediatric cancer patients and their siblings...The clinic is part of his Cookie's Kids program, where Carlos invites patients from Cohen Children's Medical Center to Citi Field or visits patients in the hospital to share his inspiring story of overcoming cancer...Mets infielder Luis Guillorme joined Carlos to lead light baseball drills and fun games for the participants to enjoy...The children met Mr. Met and had their names announced on the field by the Mets PA announcer...The families enjoyed lunch and received tickets to an upcoming game.

IRON MAN: Ronny Mauricio made his MLB debut last night and smashed a 117.3 mph double to right field in his first at-bat...It was the hardest-hit ball by a Met this season and the fourth-hardest hit ball by a Met in the Statcast Era (Since 2015)...It is the hardest-hit first career hit by any player to debut since the Statcast Era began...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...It was the 11th hardest-hit ball in the majors this season...Only Matt Olson, Shohei Ohtani, Giancarlo Stanton, Jake Burger, Wilson Contreras and Ryan Jeffers have had harder batted balls this season...He is the first Met since Steven Matz (June 28, 2015) to have a multi-hit game in his MLB debut.

DINGERS! The Mets have socked 174 home runs this season...That is tied for the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs.

CONNECT FOUR: Brandon Nimmo recorded his 20th home run of the season last night...The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who featured a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

20, 20, 25 HOURS TO GO: Francisco Lindor has recorded 29 doubles, 24 home runs, and 25 steals this season...He is one home runs away from becoming the fifth player in franchise history to recorded 25 doubles, 25 homers and 25 steals in a single season...He would join Darryl Strawberry (1984, 1986, 1987, 1988), Howard Johnson (1989, 1991), David Wright (2007) and Carlos Beltrán (2008).

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.2 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.0 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.9) and Mookie Betts (18.1) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.0 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

WHEN I'M 64: Over his last 64 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .294 (70-238) with 48 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 29 walks, 19 steals with a .380 OBP, a .513 SLG and a .893 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high-tying 25 bases in 132 games this season (Also: 2018).

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 37 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .270 (24-89) with 12 runs, five doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI, 10 walks, a .359 OBP and a .629 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit a career-best 20 home runs this season...He joined Curtis Granderson (2015), Tommie Agee (1969, 1970) and Michael Conforto (2017) as the only Mets to have 20 or more HR in the leadoff spot...Nimmo is the first Mets outfielder with 20 or more homers since 2019...He is batting .282 (48-170) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .347 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year...His .282 average is the 12th-best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

SWEET 16: Daniel Vogelbach has recorded six home runs over his last 17 games...He is batting .292 (14-48) in that span with eight runs, 14 RBI, nine walks with a .414 OBP and a .667 SLG...He has posted an .832 OPS in 33 games following the All-Star break.

MARINERS-METS NOTES: The Mets will play the Mariners in back-to-back seasons for the first time in team history.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts...He moved into third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)...He is now three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie...Last night marked the first time a Mets rookie pitcher recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Syndergaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11 - 17, 2014...Courtesy of Elias.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: Kodai Senga Recorded a career-high-tying 12 strikeouts for the third time this season last night...He joined Dwight Gooden (six) as the only Mets rookie with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts...He also joined Hideo Nomo (five), Kerry Wood (five) and Spencer Strider (three) as the only rookies with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995).

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is fifth in the majors and is third in the NL with 96 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1965, Casey Stengel's #37 was officially retired in a small, private ceremony at Shea Stadium...Stengel was named the Mets first manager on September 29, 1961 and despite the team's early on-field struggles, the city proudly embraced their "lovable losers" due to Stengel's witty charm and dynamic personality...Stengel led the Mets to a 40-120 record in 1962 and then had an 11-game improvement, going 51-111 the following year...The Mets were 31-65 when Stengel fractured his hip on July 24, 1965 ending his managerial career...Stengel continued to serve in the Mets front office as a scout, public speaker and Vice President...He was still a member of the Mets front office when he passed away due to cancer on September 29, 1975 at age 85...Stengel was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1966 and later was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1981.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Dominic Hamel struck out a career-high-tying 11 batters over six scoreless innings of work as Binghamton defeated Harrisburg, 6-5, last night...The righty allowed just three hits and two walks as he improved to 8-6 on the season...The 24-year-old right-hander now leads the Eastern League with 147 strikeouts this year...The Ponies first got on the board in the second inning on a solo home run from Agustin Ruiz, his team-leading 18th of the season...The team added five runs in the seventh thanks to a solo homer from Matt O'Neill, a sacrifice fly from Kevin Parada, a two-run single from JT Schwartz, and an RBI double from Jeremiah Jackson.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 7.0 innings in the Mets' 3-2 victory over the Angels at Citi Field...Allowed just one run on three hits while issuing three walks and striking out a season-high-tying eight batters.

SEA LEGS: Tonight, Peterson will make his first career appearance against the Mariners...Peterson owns a career 4-3 record against American League opponents, posting a 3.65 ERA (23 ER/56.2 IP) over 15 appearances (nine starts).

SEVENTH HEAVEN: In his last start, Peterson pitched a season-high 7.0 innings...Was the fourth time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only gone deeper in a start once in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2023...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.78 ERA (14 ER/45.1 IP) in 14 games, eight of which aew starts.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: This season, Peterson has pitched to a 2.61 ERA (12 ER/41.1 IP) in 11 home outings (seven starts)...Over 11 road outings (nine starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 7.74 ERA (37 ER/43.0 IP).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .237 (64-270) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (7-7, 5.29)

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Megill made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse after being optioned on June 22...The right-hander went 0-3 with an 8.67 ERA (26 ER/27.0 IP) over those six starts...Megill recorded two quality starts with Syracuse, July 9 at Worcester and July 29 at Lehigh Valley.

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.
