SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs reinstated RHP **Paul Sewald** from the 15-day injured list (left oblique strain) and optioned RHP **Scott McGough** to Triple-A Reno following Sunday's game.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 11-4 vs. Padres on Sunday. ◆ **Jake McCarthy** collected his 11th career 3+-hit performance and first since July 26, 2023 vs. Cardinals.

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** hit his sixth home run of 2024 and hit safely in his seventh straight game.
- ◆ Corbin Carroll collected his first multi-hit game since April 19 @ SF and has hit safely in 5 of his last 6 games.
- ◆ Ryne Nelson made his first start since April 18 (activated from IL with right elbow contusion) and turned in his second win (W; 4 ER in 5.0 IP, 8 H, 1 BB, 3 K).

VS. REDS: Over their last 20 matchups vs. Reds, the D-backs are 11-9 overall...in their last 10 on the road, they are 5-5.

SEEING IT WELL VS. CINCY: Since 2022, **Corbin Carroll**'s 1.597 OPS vs. Reds ranks atop all active hitters (min. 30 PA) while **Ketel Marte**'s 1.257 OPS is third.

- ♦ In his 7 career games vs. Reds, Carroll is hitting .409 (9-for-22) with 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 9 runs, 5 RBI and 7 walks...6 of his 9 hits are for extra bases.
- Carroll homered in back-to-back games on Arizona's last trip to Cincinnati on July 22-23, 2023.
- ♦ Marte, in his last 7 games @ Great American Ball Park, is hitting .480 (12-for-25)/.581 OBP/1.000 SLG with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 7 RBI and 5 walks.

TRIPLES ARE KIND OF OUR THING: Since 2022, the D-backs' 9 triples vs. Reds are the most among the Majors, ahead of the Cubs (6), Phillies (6) and Brewers (4).

- ♦ Last season, the D-backs collected 8 triples vs. Reds while the next closest were 5 teams at 2.
- ◆The D-backs' 3 triples @ Great American Ball Park since 2022 are tied for the most (also: Phillies and Padres)

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 15 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning are third most in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (17) and Phillies (16).

- ♦ The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 9 games this season...only the Phillies have more occurrences (12).
- ♦ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 1 run 3 times, 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times, 4 runs once and 6 times once, tallying 33 runs with a .362 average (54-for-149)/1.048 OPS and 13 doubles and 9 home runs.
- ♦ The D-backs' 33 runs scored in the first inning are the second-most in the Majors, behind the Phillies (37) and ahead of the Padres (32) and Marlins (31).

CLEAN FIELDING: Since April 22, the D-backs have made 2 errors (one being Catcher's Interference), which are tied for fewest in the Majors (also: Orioles).

THE RETURN OF SEWALD: Closer **Paul Sewald** returns to action after beginning the season on the injured list (left oblique strain).

◆Last season, he set career highs in saves (34) and matched his career high in games (65)...in 20 games with the D-backs, went 0-1 with 13 saves, a 3.57 ERA (7 ER in 17.2 IP) and 20 strikeouts.

GAMES WITH 10+ RUNS, 10+ HITS: The D-backs 5 games with 10+ runs and 10+ hits are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Royals).

SINCE APRIL 22: Since April 22, Christian Walker's 1.083 OPS ranks fourth in the NL, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (1.223), Max Muncy/LAD (1.213) and Alec Bohm/PHI (1.112), while Jake McCarthy's .355 AVG ranks fifth, behind Bohm (.436), Jurickson Profar/SD (.404), Ohtani (.373) and Mookie Betts/LAD (.358).

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.4 bWAR is fifth among all players (pitcher or position), behind Mookie Betts/LAD (3.3), Shohei Ohtani/LAD (2.6), Bobby Witt Jr./KC (2.6) and Riley Greene/DET (2.4).

WALKER'S BUZZIN': Christian Walker has reached base safely in 11 of his last 12 games...in the span, he boasts a .325/.408/.675/1.083 slash line with 2 doubles, 4 homers, 11 RBI and 7 walks.

♦ Defensively, Walker currently boasts a 35-game errorless streak, tied for the sixth-longest (also: 2 others).

MARTINEZ'S FIREBALL: On Sunday vs. Padres, Justin Martinez's 90.0 MPH throw to first base in the sixth inning following his 101.0 MPH pitch to Xander Bogaerts marked the fastest fielding throw by a pitcher on a play that began with a 100.0+ mph pitch under Statcast (2015) [previous: 88.0 mph by Jordan Hicks in 2018]. MINOR LEAGUE SPOTLIGHT - WEEKLY AWARD WINNER: Double-A RHP Yilber Diaz earned Texas League Pitcher of the Week (April 28-May 5) after his bid of 7.0 shutout innings with 2 hits allowed, no walks and 11 strikeouts.

♦ Yilber is the fifth D-backs farmhand to earn weekly honors in the last 3 weeks...Arizona has had at least 1 winner for 3 consecutive weeks.

NEXT STARTER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (1-2, 5.63)

- ◆ Took the loss in his last start on May 1 vs. Dodgers (L; 6 ER in 3.0 IP).
- ♦ In 4 career starts vs. Reds, is 2-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) with 25 strikeouts and just 2 homers allowed
- ♦ Won his last start vs. Reds on June 9, 2023 while with the Cardinals (0 ER in 6.0 IP, 3 H, 6 K).

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs.

 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Making his first start since April 26 @ Mariners...exited in the sixth inning with right hamstring tightness.

- Seventh start of the season and fourth on the road.
- Limiting opponents to a .114 average (4-for-35) with 21 strikeouts off his curveball.
- The D-backs have scored a combined 37 runs in his 6 starts this year.
- He has exited 4 of his 6 starts this season with the lead.

NO APRIL SHOWERS: Went 2-2 with a 3.67 ERA (11 ER in 27.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts in 5 starts in April.

- In 16 career April starts, is 7-2 with a 1.96 ERA (21 R-20 ER in 91.2 IP), 0.87 WHIP, .180 opponent average (59-for-328) and 110 strikeouts.
- His 1.96 ERA among D-backs starters (min. 10 starts) in April, is a franchise best, ahead of Brandon Webb (2.66) and Patrick Corbin (2.84).

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-10th, 3).

FRANCHISE RANKINGS: Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (4th, 3.24), WHIP (4th, 1.11), strikeouts (6th, 721), wins (T-9th, 41) and quality starts (10th, 61).

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2022, his 12 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Corbin Burnes/BAL), ahead of Blake Snell/SF (11) Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

LAST START: Took the loss on April 26 @ Mariners (3 ER in 5.0 IP).

VS. REDS: Fourth career start vs. Reds, second on the road.

IP, 6 K)...the D-backs beat the Reds, 5-4.

VS. NL CENTRAL In his last 3 starts vs. the NL Central on the road, is 2-1 with a 2.75 ERA (9 R-6 ER in 19.2 IP)...the D-backs are 3-2 in those contests.

- In his last road start, tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.
- In his last 14 starts, is 8-4 with a 2.12 ERA (24 R-21 ER in 89.0 IP), .173 average (53-for-307), 0.87 WHIP and 89 strikeouts.

BATTERS 7-9: Is holding batters 7-9 in a lineup to a .139 average (5-for-36) with 1 walk, 13 strikeouts and 81.8% out rate.

• On the road, is holding batters 7-9, to a .105 average (2-for-19) with 0 walks, 8 strikeouts and 90.0% out rate.

THIRD TIME THROUGH: In his third time thru the lineup, is limiting batters to a .217 average (5-for-23) with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts.

2023 RECAP: Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
- In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

ALL-MLB FIRST TEAM: Named to the 2023 All-MLB First Team, his first honor, along with Gerrit Cole/Yankees, Shohei Ohtani/Angels, Blake Snell/Padres and Spencer Strider/Braves.

CY YOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

ALL-STAR STARTER: Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 at T-Mobile Park and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001.
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

• Last faced Cincinnati on the road on April 20, 2021 (ND; 3 ER in 5.2 | MILKMAN DELIVERED: Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; lan Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

HOW HE STARTED: Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- · Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
