TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 6-game homestand with the last of 3 games against the Arizona Diamondbacks (2-0)...Seattle will also host the New York Mets (3 G, 6/1-6/3) on the homestand...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the AL West Division-leading Mariners defeated the Diamondbacks by a 5-1 score last night on 4 home runs...the Mariners have won a season-high 5 consecutive games since May 25.

- **Don't Look Back, You Can Never Look Back** - The Mariners (30-29) are above the .500 mark for the first time since March 30, when they held a 3-2 record.
- **Let The Sunshine In** - Seattle is 13-9 (.591) in day games this season.
- **I Just May** - The Mariners are 14-13 in May and look to secure a winning month today...Seattle went 3-3 in March and 13-13 in April.

JULIO RODRÍGUEZ: FRONTRUNNER FOR AL PLAYER OF THE MONTH...Mariners center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** enters the final day of May as having one of the best months in the big leagues this month...in 27 May games, Julio is batting .286 (32x112) with 18 runs, 7 doubles, 10 home runs, 18 RBI and 6 walks, getting on base at a .322 clip, slugging .616 with a .938 OPS...Julio **leads the AL during the month** in home runs (10), the most homers he's hit in a calendar month...in the month among AL leaders, Julio also ranks 1st in total bases (69), 1st in extra-base hits (17), 2nd in slugging percentage, T-3rd in hits, T-5th in runs scored and T-9th in RBI.

I GOT 5 ON IT...during the Mariners season-best 5-game winning streak, the offense is batting .314 (70x224) with 34 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple and 14 home runs, slugging .595 with a .938 OPS and 110 total bases across 198 plate appearances.

SWEEP EMOTION...as the Mariners go for their sixth consecutive victory today, they also go for their second straight series sweep, after dropping the A's in a 3-game set in Sacramento from May 25-27...Seattle last swept back-to-back series from Sept. 19-25 last season, when they swept 3 games at Houston and 3 games vs. Colorado, with the Mariners securing a Postseason berth and AL West Division title in the series against the Rockies.

PIGGYBACK...in the 2 instances that **Luis Castillo** and **Bryce Miller** have pitched in the same game, the Mariners pitching staff has posted a 2.00 ERA (4 ER, 18.0 IP) with 24 strikeouts and 5 walks as a team, allowing just 11 hits...in those games, Miller has posted a 1.69 ERA (2 ER, 10.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts and 1 walk...Castillo has posted a 2.84 ERA (2 ER, 6.1 IP) with 10 strikeouts and 4 walks...Castillo is expected to appear out of the bullpen in this afternoon's game.

THE MARVELOUS MOUND MEN OF THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST...the Mariners pitching staff has posted a combined 3.51 ERA (205 ER, 525.1 IP) with an MLB-fewest 152 walks, along with 501 strikeouts...among Major League pitching staffs they rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.30), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.60), 5th in ERA, 5th in WHIP (1.21) and 10th in strikeouts...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 336.2 innings pitched and ranks T-4th in strikeouts (318) and T-3rd in quality starts (26)...the Seattle bullpen ranks 4th in the Majors in ERA (3.15).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, EMERSON HANCOCK!...starting pitcher **Emerson Hancock** celebrates his 27th birthday today...in 11 starts this season, the right-hander is 4-2 with a 2.78 ERA (20 ER, 64.2 IP) with 63 strikeouts and 15 walks, posting a 1.01 WHIP while dialing up 7 quality starts in his 11 outings.

JOLT EMERSON...the second career home run off the bat of **Colt Emerson** was a third inning solo shot last night against D'Backs starter Ryne Nelson...through his first 12 games as a big leaguer, the 20-year-old Emerson is batting .237 (9x38) with 6 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 7 RBI and 4 walks, posting a .326 OBP, slugging .526 with an .852 OPS across 43 plate appearances.

WOO! WHAT A LIST...last night's starter **Bryan Woo** tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in his start, allowing just 2 hits with no walks to go along with 9 strikeouts...in 82 career starts (2023-c), Woo has posted a 0.98 WHIP across 466.1 innings pitched...Woo is **1 of 6 pitchers in the Majors since 1901** to carry a sub-1.00 WHIP and pitch at least 400 career innings, along with Hall of Famer **Addie Joss** (pitched from 1902-10), **Koji Uehara** (2009-17), **Kenley Jansen** (2010-c), **Jacob deGrom** (2014-c) and **Josh Hader** (2017-c)...if you include only starting pitchers, it's only three: Woo, deGrom, and Joss.

J.P.'S BIG FRIDAY...**J.P. Crawford** recorded his first career multi-homer game Friday after hitting his second leadoff home run of the season and a 2-run homer in the 5th inning...he has tallied 16 career leadoff home runs with Seattle, ranking 2nd in franchise history behind only **Ichiro Suzuki** (37 HR)...heading into Sunday, Crawford has hit safely in 6 consecutive games (5/24-c), during which he is batting .333 (9x27) with 6 runs, 3 home runs, 6 RBI and 1 walk.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...right fielder **Luke Raley** homered last night, his team-leading 13th home run of the season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Raley has been one of the best left-handed hitters across the Majors this season?...in 53 games, he's batting .279 (41x147) with 22 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, the 13 homers and 31 RBI, getting on base at a .338 clip, slugging .592 with a .930 OPS over 161 plate appearances...among all MLB players with at least 150 PA this season, Raley's .592 SLG ranks 5th to Ben Rice-NYY, Yordan Alvarez-HOU, Mickey Moniak-COL and Kyle Schwarber-PHI.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 31

- **1980** - The Mariners turned the second triple play in their history. Cleveland's Toby Harrah lined to 1B Bruce Bochte who relayed to SS Jim Anderson to retire Ron Hassey, the runner on second. Anderson's relay to 2B Julio Cruz covering first beat Joe Charboneau back to the bag (3-6-4).
- **1998** - "Major League Baseball Featuring Ken Griffey Jr." is released on Nintendo.
- **1999** - Team sets new ML record as quickest team to hit 100 HR (50 games). Team ties ML record for most HR in any one month—58 in May.
- **2001** - Aaron Sele gets career victory #100 in s 2-1 win vs. Baltimore.
- **2016** - The Mariners tied the club record for most runs in a single game at T-Mobile Park with 16 against the Padres. It was the 18th time in club history that the team has scored 16+ runs in a game.
- **2022**—George Kirby earns first career win in an 10-0 thrashing of the Orioles in Baltimore.
- **2025** - In his Major League debut, Cole Young recorded a single, walk, and a walk-off fielder's choice in the 11th inning to become the **first** player in Mariners history with a walk-off plate appearance in his MLB debut, and the first player age 21-or-younger with a walk-off PA in MLB debut since Miguel Cabrera-FLA (walk-off HR) on June 20, 2003.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 4th appearance (3rd start) of the season and the 78th (77th start) of his career...it marks his 1st career start and appearance against the Diamondbacks.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...

made his first career relief appearance on May 25 vs. Athletics, throwing 5.0 innings to piggyback Luis Castillo's 4.0 innings to start the game...Miller allowed 2 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits and 0 walks while striking out 4 batters...threw 83 pitches and 55 strikes.

WHO STRIKES FIRST...

Miller will be making his first career appearance against the Diamondbacks...they are 1-of-3 teams, not including the Mariners, that he has yet to face...the Mariners are scheduled to play the other 2 teams, the Pirates and Nationals, in June...Miller is 9-4 with a 3.14 career ERA (40 ER, 114.2 IP), a 1.047 WHIP, and a K/BB of 3.00 in inter-league games.

HOME AT LAST...

will be making his 2nd home start of the season in today's game...Miller is 13-9 in home games with a career 3.26 ERA, 9.2 K/9 and a 1.032 WHIP...owns the 7th best WHIP in home games among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...also ranks 6th in opponent batting average (.212), T-6th in ERA (3.26), and 12th in K/BB (3.9)...the Mariners are 24-16 when he starts at T-Mobile...in 28-of-40 career home starts, including his lone home start this season, Miller has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP...17 of those starts are over 6.0 IP.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER...

recorded 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer walks in each of his first 3 appearances this season...is the first time he has recorded 3 such outings in a row since 2024 (6/29/24-7/28/24)...his 4 runs, 2 walks, and 16 base runners allowed through his first 3 outings are all best marks over a 3 game span to start the season since Miller's 2023 debut season (5/2/23-5/7/23) where he had a 0.47 ERA (1 ER, 19.0 IP) with 1 walk and 8 base runners allowed...is 1-of-4 pitchers to have 4-or-fewer runs, 2-or-fewer walks, 16.0+ IP and 14+ strikeouts through the first 3 games of the 2026 season.

BRYCE BESTS ALL...

is dominating lefty batters through his first 3 appearances this season with a 0.81 WHIP, a 4.0 K/BB and a .226 opponent OBP over 31 PA against left handed hitters...historically matches up better against right handed batters...ranks T-7th, matching Luis Castillo, in WHIP (0.98), T-9th in OBP (.261), and 9th in BB% (4.5) against right handed batters among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 100.0 IP)...has a 5.3 K/BB against RHB.

BRINGING THE HEAT...

through his 3 starts of the season, he has increased the average velocity of his four-seamer to 97.0 mph compared to 94.8 mph last season...in his last home start on May 19, fired a 99.3 mph 4-seamer for a strike, marking the fastest pitch thrown of his career, just passing his previous career-high of 99.2 mph thrown in his first start of the season (5/13 vs. HOU)...18 of his 20 fastest pitches thrown in his career have been recorded over his last 3 starts...logged 20+ pitches over 97 mph in his first 2 starts...prior to the start of this season his career-high was 10 pitches above 97 mph on Aug. 6, 2023 vs. LAA.

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...

owns a career 10.38 base runners per 9, ranking 8th in the AL since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 9.00 baserunners per 9 this season is tied for 11th best among AL starting pitchers in 2026 (min. 15.0 IP)...his 18 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 5/19 vs. CWS) since 2023 rank T-7th in MLB, joining rotation-mates Logan Gilbert (T-2nd, 23 G), Bryan Woo (T-2nd, 23 G), and George Kirby (T-9th, 17 G) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span...ranks T-10th in opponent OBP among AL starting pitchers this season (min. 15.0 IP).

CRACKING THE WHIP...

ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400 IP) with a 1.122 WHIP...his 107 walks are tied for the 6th fewest through a pitchers first 77 games with the Mariners (min. 400.0 IP) while his 362 hits allowed are 2nd fewest, trailing Bryan Woo's 46 hits through his first 77 games.

BEWARE THE 4-SEAM...

owns a career .287 opponent OBP and a .226 opponent average on his 4-seam...his OBP on his primary pitch ranks 9th in MLB among pitchers that have thrown 2000+ 4-seam fastballs since 2023...his 456 swing and misses on his 4-seam are 7th most in the AL since 2023, despite missing several games to start this season.

GOING THE DISTANCE...

has pitched 6.0+ innings in 30 career games and 5.0+ innings in 61 of his 77 career outings...the Mariners are 36-24 when he pitches 5.0+ innings and 23-7 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 9-22 when he tosses fewer than 5.0 innings in a start...in his last appearance pitched 5.0+ innings out of the pen, becoming the first Mariners pitcher to log 5.0+ innings of relief and earn the win since Tommy Milone on September 18, 2019 at Pittsburgh.

REHAB RECAP...

made 4 rehab starts between Triple-A Tacoma and High-A Everett from April 18-May 6, accumulating a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) with 9 hits and 7 walks allowed to 14 strikeouts.

ON THE IL...

started the 2026 season on the 15-day Injured List with a left oblique strain, retroactive to March 22...also spent two separate stints on the 15-day IL in 2025 with right elbow inflammation: May 12-30 and June 7-18.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 12th appearance of the year and the 255th of his career (253 GS)...it will also be his 1st appearance against the Diamondbacks this season and the 10th of his career (9 GS).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 25 at the Athletics, threw 4.0 scoreless innings with 2 hits and 2 walks allowed to 6 strikeouts...he threw 68 pitched with 42 strikes in his 10th start of the season before Bryce Miller took over for the final 5.0 innings of work.

WHAT A RELIEF...is making his second relief appearance of the season today...last piggybacked off **Bryce Miller** on May 19 vs. the White Sox, where he factored into the loss, throwing 2.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 1 hit and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts...it marked his first career relief appearance in the regular season...prior to then, he made a relief appearance in the 2025 Postseason, entering the 14th inning of Game 5 of the ALDS vs. Detroit (10/10/25), tossing the final 1.1 innings and retiring all 4 batters faced to earn the win.

"For me, nothing changes. I mean, same guy, same mentality, same teammate. You're coming in here and trying to support everyone you can, and for me that mentality has always given me results. The only thing that has changed (is it's a) different job, coming in at a different position. So just come in, get ready and try to be the best teammate that I can and try to execute my job the best I can."

GOING THE DISTANCE...in their last piggyback start on May 25 at ATH, Castillo (4.0 IP, 0 R) and Bryce Miller (5.0 IP, 2 R) covered all 9 innings in the 9-2 win...it marked the first time since Sept. 21, 1999 that multiple Mariners pitchers tossed at least 4.0 innings and allowed 2-or-fewer runs in a 9-inning game.

PIGGYBACK...in the 2 instances that Castillo and Miller have pitched in the same game, the Mariners pitching staff has posted a 2.00 ERA (4 ER, 18.0 IP) with 24 strikeouts and 5 walks as a team, allowing just 11 hits...
