SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 5-3, last night vs. Padres.

◆ **Corbin Carroll** (1-for-3, HR, RBI, 2 BB) hit his fourth career leadoff homer (all this season), which are tied for the fifth most in the NL (also: Mookie Betts).

◆ **Eugenio Suarez** (2-for-4, RBI) logged his 99th RBI and is 1 shy of becoming just 1 of 5 primary third basemen with 3-or-more 100+-RBI seasons since 2018 (also: Manny Machado/SD, Jose Ramirez/CLE, Nolan Arenado/STL and Rafael Devers/BOS).

60 MILLION @ CHASE FIELD: Tonight, the D-backs are expected to reach 60 million all-time attendance @ Chase Field, with a current all-time total at 59,991,02.

◆ Chase Field's current attendance total of 2,260,069 is the largest in 16 seasons, since 2008 (2,509,924), and fifth largest since 2003.

THE WILD STRETCH: The D-backs are tied in the NL Wild Card hunt with the Braves and Mets [both hold tiebreakers], 4.0 games behind the Padres (first WC)...the D-backs have 2 games to play vs. Padres while the Braves and Mets have 2 games remaining this weekend before a doubleheader against each other on Monday.

88 WINS: The D-backs' 88 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 2 games to go, are their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have reached 90+ wins 6 times (1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

SUAREZ'S BIG FEATS: Tonight marks **Eugenio Suárez's** 154th game at third base, the most by any D-back third baseman in a single season (previous: Matt Williams, 153 G in 1999)...Suárez, at 29 HR and 99 RBI, is looking to join only Jake Lamb/2017 (30 HR/104 RBI/143 G) and Williams/1999 (35 HR/142 RBI/153 G) as the only primary third basemen to record a 30+-HR, 100+-RBI season in franchise history.

◆ **Ketel Marte** (35 HR/93 RBI) and **Suárez** (29 HR/99 RBI) look to become the first D-backs pair to each have a 30+-homer, 100+-RBI season since 2017 (last: Paul Goldschmidt, 36 HR/120 RBI and Jake Lamb, 30 HR/105 RBI)...only other occurrence was in 1999 (Steve Finley, 34 HR/103 RBI; Jay Bell, 38 HR/112 RBI; Matt Williams, 35 HR/142 RBI).

FIRST-INNING FANS: The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 38 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (31), Marlins (28) and Padres (26)...their 31 homers in the first inning are the most in the NL, ahead of the Phillies (30) and Dodgers (29).

◆ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with franchise highs of a .325 AVG, .384 OBP, .566 SLG, .950 OPS, 212 hits and 369 total bases...also lead MLB with 124 runs (third most in franchise history, behind 2018/129 R and 1999/125 R).

PUK CLOSING IN ON ALL-TIME STREAK: Since Aug. 3, **A.J. Puk** is 1 of 2 relievers to go scoreless [min. 20.0 IP]...owns a current career-best 25 straight scoreless games (23.2 IP) with 9 hits and 4 walks allowed and 38 strikeouts.

◆ Puk is 1 appearance shy of tying the franchise record for consecutive scoreless appearances by a reliever (26 by Yoshihisa Hirano from May 6-July 3, 2018, 22.2 IP) and 1.1 innings shy of the franchise record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched by a reliever (25.0 IP by Brandon Lyon from April 9-June 12, 2008, 24 appearances).

FIRST-INNING HISTORY: The D-backs are the first team to boast a first-inning average of .325+ since the 2000 Cardinals (.336) and are just 1 of 9 teams since 1979 to have a first-inning average of .320+:

D-BACKS LOOKING TO MAKE DEFENSE HISTORY: Per Elias Sports Bureau...since 1900, there has not been a MLB team with consecutive seasons of 65 or fewer errors...Arizona has committed 62 errors in 2024 after finishing the 2023 season with a franchise-low 56 errors.

◆ The D-backs' .989 fielding pct. and 62 errors are the best in the Majors, ahead of the Braves (.988, 68 E), Twins (.988, 69 E) and Rangers (.988, 70 E).

START WITH MARTE: **Ketel Marte's** 13 first-inning homers are tied for the most in a season by a D-back with Paul Goldschmidt (13 in 2018), ahead Luis Gonzalez (11 in 2001), Goldschmidt (9 in 2015) and Chris Young (9 in 2007)...his 13 homers are third most in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (18) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (15).

◆ Marte's 33 home runs in the first inning as a D-back are third in franchise history, behind Paul Goldschmidt (52) and Luis Gonzalez (41).

KETEL AND THE BABE: **Ketel Marte's** 22 combined home runs in the first inning and ninth inning (or later) are tied for the most all-time in a season with **Babe Ruth's** 22 in 1927 [Stats Inc.].

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 208 homers are tied for fourth most in a single season in franchise history (also: 2001), behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

◆ The D-backs' 208 homers this season are fifth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (235), Dodgers (230), Orioles (230) and Braves (209).

◆ The only time the D-backs have finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs is 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223).

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: In his ninth MLB season...has spent seasons with the Red Sox (2015-21) and Tigers (2022-23).

- Signed to a 4-year contract by the D-backs as a free agent on Dec. 8, 2023.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his 10th start, sixth home start since being reinstated from the 60-day IL on Aug. 6 (strained left shoulder).

- Third straight start against NL West opponent and fifth on the season (1-2; 5.85 ERA).
- The D-backs are 5-4 in his 8 starts...has worked 5.0+ innings and yielded 2 walks or fewer in 6 of his 9 starts.

LAST START: Took the loss on Sept. 23 vs. Giants (5 ER in 4.2 IP, 7 H, 3 BB, 8 K).

VS. PADRES: Second career start vs. Padres.

- Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in his lone start with Red Sox on Aug. 23, 2019 (5 H, BB, 6 K).

AMONG LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: Since 2018, his 66 wins rank fourth among left-handed starters, behind Max Fried/ATL (72), Clayton Kershaw/LAD (68) and Framber Valdez/HOU (68).

- From 2018-23 while in the AL, his 63 wins were the most among lefty starters, ahead of Marco Gonzales/SEA (60) and Framber Valdez/HOU (53)...his 131 starts in the span were the second most in the AL, behind Gonzales (141).

NO LOVE LOSS FOR LEFTIES: From Aug. 7-28, did not allow a hit to the first 16 left-handed batters faced this season and allowed just 2 walks.

ROAD TOUGH IN '23: In his final 13 road starts last season, went 8-3 with a 2.91 ERA (25 ER in 77.1 IP), opponent .238 AVG (68-for-286)/.638 OPS, 76 strikeouts and 21 walks.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: In 2023, limited hitters to a .200 AVG (17-for-85) off his cutter (19.3% usage) with 18 strikeouts...limited opponents to a .233 AVG (28-for-120) off his changeup (18.9% usage) with 22 strikeouts and a 31.7% whiff.

2023 RECAP: In his second season with Detroit, went 13-9 with a 3.30 ERA (56 ER in 152.2 IP), 143 strikeouts, .227 opponent average and 1.15 WHIP over 26 starts.

- Posted career bests in ERA, opponent average and WHIP, while tossing 150.0+ innings for the third time in his career.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Tigers and led the team in starts, quality starts (14), wins and strikeouts.
- Marked the fourth time in his last 5 seasons to win 13+ games and seventh in his last 8 to notch 20+ starts.
- His 13 wins were the most by a Tiger since Justin Verlander won 16 in 2016.
- Tossed 8.0 shutout innings with 4 hits allowed, no walks and 10 strikeouts in Game 2 of the doubleheader vs. Guardians on April 18...became just the third pitcher in franchise history to throw 8.0+ scoreless frames with no walks and 10+ strikeouts (also: Bill Donovan on June 27, 1908 vs. St. Louis Browns and Max Scherzer on June 17, 2012 vs. Rockies).
- Retired the first 20 batters @ Orioles on April 23 to become the first Tiger to accomplish the feat since Jordan Zimmermann (6.2 IP) @ Blue Jays in 2019.
- Recorded 6 consecutive starts with 5.0+ innings and 1 run or fewer allowed from April 12-May 10, the longest streak of his career... tied Michael Fulmer (May 21-June 17, 2016) and Al Benton (April 19-May 20, 1945) for the second-longest streak in Tigers history... over that stretch, went 4-0 with a 0.43 ERA (2 ER in 41.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 0.43 ERA tied Doug Fister for the second-lowest by a Tigers pitcher over a 6-start span since 1913, trailing only Al Benton (0.33 ERA in 1945).

POSTSEASON PRESENCE: Appeared in the Postseason 3 times with Boston: 2017 Division Series (1 G); 2018 Division Series, League Championship Series and World Series (7 G-1 GS); 2021 ALDS and ALCS (3 GS).

- Was a member of the 2018 World Champion Red Sox and made the start in Game 4 @ Dodgers...posted a no-decision after allowing 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 6 strikeouts in the 9-6 win.

HOW IT STARTED: Signed by Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2010.

- Made his Major League debut on May 28, 2015 for the Red Sox @ Rangers...became the first pitcher in Red Sox history to pitch at least 7.2 innings and allow no runs, yield 3 hits or fewer and strikeout 7+ in a debut.

- ◆ His 71 appearances are tied for seventh most among NL relievers with Joe Mantiply.
- ◆ Owns a career-best 5 saves this season (previous: 4 in 2023).
- ◆ His 8 wins are 1 shy of tying his career-high 9 set in 2023.
- ◆ Is limiting hitters to a .229 AVG (24-for-105) off his slider (38.4%) with 44 strikeouts and a 42.0% whiff.
- ◆ Has allowed just 4 of his 27 inherited runners to score (14.8%).
- ◆ Issued 4 walks in his last 18 games since (68 BF, 16.0 IP).
- ◆ With runners in scoring position, opponents are hitting .190 (16-for-84)/.239 OBP with 5 walks and 27 strikeouts.
- ◆ Scoreless in 7 of his last 9 games (6.2 IP) with 2 walks and 9 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 23 home games from May 26-Sept. 11, went 3-2 with a 0.79 ERA (2 ER in 22.2 IP), opponent .233 AVG (20-for-86)/.624 OPS, 6 walks and 29 strikeouts.
- ◆ Did not allow an earned run in 15 of his 17 games from Aug. 5-Sept. 11, going 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER in 16.2 IP), 1.08 WHIP, opponent .203 AVG (12-for-59)/.595 OPS, 6 walks and 22 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 44 games from May 30-Sept. 11 with men on, had a .169 AVG (12-for-71)/.231 OBP with 3 extra-base hits, 5 walks and 23 strikeouts.
- ◆ In his last 26 road games, went 3-1 with a 3.12 ERA (9 ER in 26.0 IP), 0.92 WHIP, opp. .223 AVG (21-for-94), 3 walks and 26 strikeouts.
