TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 30, 1984: Don Mattingly goes 4-for-5 in a 9-2 win vs. the Tigers, as he finishes the season with a .343 batting average and wins the American League batting title.

Sept. 30, 1973: The Yankees play their final game in Yankee Stadium before it gets remodeled, losing 8-5 vs. Detroit. Tigers pitcher John Hiller gets Yankees first baseman Mike Hegan to fly out to centerfield for the game's final out.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 1, 1961: Roger Maris hits his 61st home run in the season's final game off Boston's Tracy Stallard at Yankee Stadium, establishing a then-Major League record. It was the only run in a 1-0 Yankees victory.

Oct. 1, 1932: In Game 3 of the World Series at Wrigley Field, Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig each hit two home runs in the Yankees' 7-5 win over the Cubs. Ruth's second homer, which came in the fifth inning, is his fabled "called shot."

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final road trip of the season tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Kansas City (0-1 thus far)...are 2-2 on the road trip after winning two-of-three games at Toronto and losing their series opener at Kansas City.

- Have still won three of their last five games and five of their last eight games (since 9/21)...are 11-7 in their last 18 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a 19-11 (.633) record since 8/28, tied with Baltimore for the second-best record in the Majors over that span, trailing only San Diego (19-10, .655)**...are 21-14 in their last 35 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Royals, 12-5, on Friday at Kauffman Stadium...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (L, 0.0IP, 6H, 8ER, 2BB, OK, 1HR) allowed a career-high tying 8R/ER without recording an out...**C Austin Wells** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 4RBI) recorded a career-high 4RBI, hitting a three-run HR in the fourth inning and driving in a run on an RBI groundout in the sixth inning...**LF Everson Pereira** (0-for-4, 1RBI) drove in a run on an RBI groundout in the fifth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 1R) and **1B Jake Bauers** (2-for-4) each recorded multiple hits...**DH Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1BB) reached base twice...**3B Oswald Peraza** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double) hit a double in the fifth inning...**RHP Randy Vásquez** (3.2IP, 4H, 1ER, 2BB, 6K) allowed 1ER over 3.2 innings of relief...his 6K matched his career high...**RHP Keynan Middleton** (1.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 1BB, 1HR, 1WP) was reinstated from the injured list prior to the game and allowed a two-run HR in the seventh inning...**LHP Nick Ramirez** (1.0IP, 1HP) tossed a scoreless eighth inning.

AUSTIN POWERS: **C Austin Wells** recorded a career-high 4RBI on Friday, hitting a three-run HR in the fourth inning and driving in a run on an RBI groundout in the sixth inning.

- Has recorded at least 1H in nine of his last 12 games (since 9/12-G2)...has reached base safely in 10 of those games.
- Is hitting .296/.321/.778 (8-for-27) with 5R, 1 doubles, 4HR, 9RBI and 1BB in his last seven games (since 9/20).
- **Has 8RBI over his last four games (since 9/25).**
- **Has 4HR in his last seven games (since 9/20)**...eight of his 13H this season have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 4HR).

WINNING WAYS: With an 81-79 record, the Yankees need one win to clinch their 31st consecutive winning season (since 1993)...their current 30-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

- Their current 30-season streak is the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 10-2 in their last 12 games vs. Kansas City (since 8/11/21), 13-3 in their last 16 games vs. the Royals (since 6/23/21) and 18-5 in their last 23 games against Kansas City (since 4/19/19).

- **Have won each of their last 15 completed series vs. the Royals since 5/25/15, going 36-12 in that span... according to STATS, their 15-series winning streak vs. the Royals is tied for their second-longest such streak vs. an opponent in franchise history**, trailing only a 21-series streak vs. the Boston Red Sox from 1930-33... also recorded a 15-series winning streak vs. the Kansas City Athletics from 1955-57.

BATTERS' EYE: **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 4.03 pitches per plate appearance ratio and rank third with a 9.53 PA/BB ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

RARE OCCURRENCE: The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on Sunday for the first time since 2016...the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base twice on Friday... **is batting .381/.544/.905 (16-for-42) with 12R, 4 doubles, 6HR, 17RBI and 15BB over his last 13 games (since 9/14-G2).**

- **Has hit 37HR in 105 games this season...is just the second player in Major League history to hit at least 37HR in a season while playing in 107 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees have two games remaining this season), joining Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland).
- Has reached base multiple times in 55 of his 105 games this year, including 43 of his last 76 games (since 5/12).
- Has reached base in 46-of-97 plate appearances over his last 22 games (since 9/5), posting a .474 OBP in that span (21H, 25BB).
- **Has hit 5HR in his last six games (since 9/22).**
- Has 12RBI in his last seven games (since 9/21).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 37HR are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the ninth-most in the Majors...is also tied for fourth in the AL in game-winning RBI (13) and ranks sixth in walks (87).**
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, his 18HR are tied for first in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors... leads the AL with 52BB and ranks second in the Majors in that span, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (58)... also ranks fourth in the AL and 10th in the Majors in OBP (.408) over that span...additionally, ranks sixth in the AL in OPS (.972) and SLG (.564) over that stretch.
- Has 7BB in his last five games (since 9/24).
- Has hit .391/.480/.891 (25-for-64) with 19R, 5 doubles, 9HR, 20RBI, 10BB, 1HP and 1SB in his last 17 games vs. the Royals (since 7/26/18).
- Has 7HR in his last seven games vs. Kansas City (since 4/29/22)...has 3HR in his last three games at Kauffman Stadium (since 4/29/22).

SCHMIDT'S CREEK: **RHP Clarke Schmidt** will make his 33rd appearance (32nd start) of the season tonight...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 24 starts this season, tied for the sixth-most such starts in the AL and tied for the eighth-most such starts in the Majors.**

- Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of his last 22 starts (since 5/19), 22 of his last 25 starts (since 5/3) and 23 of his last 27 starts (since 4/23).

CENTRAL PERK: Since 2022, the Yankees are 42-21 (.667) vs. the AL Central...are 53-25 in their last 78 games vs. the division (since 6/23/21) and 66-31 in their last 97 games (since 9/12/19-G1).

- Have won or split 25 of their last 31 completed series vs. the AL Central (going 24-6-1 since 9/10/19), 28 of their last 34 completed series (going 25-6-3 since 6/13/19) and 31 of their last 38 completed series (going 28-7-3 since 4/18/19).

GLEYBER DAY: **INF Gleyber Torres** reached base twice on Friday...has reached base multiple times in 10 of his last 16 games (since 9/12-G2).

- Is batting .306/.396/.515 (60-for-196) with 32R, 14 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 27BB, 2HP and 5SB in 52 games since 8/1... has hit safely in 37 of those games and has reached base safely in 43 of those contests...**his .911 OPS since 8/1 is the 10th-highest in the AL (min. 150PA).**
- Since 7/6, is hitting .303/.372/.496 (83-for-274) with 42R, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 30BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 71 games in that span.
- Has recorded a career-high 66BB this season.

RELIABLE RANDY: **RHP Randy Vásquez** allowed just 1ER in 3.2 innings of relief on Friday (4H, 2BB, 6K)...his 6K matched his career high (also 6K in his Major League debut on 5/26 vs. San Diego).

- His 3.2IP on Friday matched his longest relief outing this season (also 3.2IP on 8/11 at Miami)...**has tossed 2.0-or-more innings in five of his six relief appearances this season.**

JUDGE'S RULING: On Friday, MLB announced that **OF Aaron Judge** had the third-most popular jersey in Major League Baseball this season...the rankings are based on tallied sales from MLBShop.com of Nike player jerseys this season...Judge has been in the top-seven of most popular jerseys in each of the last seven seasons since 2017...has also been ranked in the top-four during six of those seasons and the top-three in five of those seasons.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (9-9, 4.65 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his 33rd appearance (32nd start) of the season tonight at Kansas City...the 27-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Monday vs. Arizona and did not record a decision after allowing 2ER over 4.0IP (3H, 3BB, 3K, 0HR, 1WP, 1HP)...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 19 of his last 22 starts (since 5/19), 21 of his last 25 starts (since 5/3) and 22 of his last 27 starts (since 4/23)**...**his 24 starts with 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the sixth-most such starts in the AL and tied for the eighth-most such starts in the Majors this season**...**has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his last 22 starts (since 5/19) and 21 of his last 27 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season**...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last six starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season (4/1-8/20)...made his second career Opening Day roster in 2023 (also 2022)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched on Monday vs. Arizona and did not record a decision after allowing 2ER over 4.0IP (3H, 3BB, 3K, 0HR, 1WP, 1HP)...after surrendering a two-run double to Alek Thomas in the first inning, did not allow a run over his final 3.1IP (2H, 2BB, 3K).

- ✦ **Marked his 24th start with 3R-or-fewer allowed, tied for the sixth-most such starts in the AL and tied for the eighth-most such starts in the Majors this season.**
- ✦ Threw just 4.0IP after tossing at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his previous 21 starts (5/19-9/19) and 21 of his previous 26 starts (4/23-9/19).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Is 5-3 with a 5.27 ERA (68.1IP, 40ER) and 68K in 14 starts on the road this season...has tossed at least 5.0IP and allowed 3R-or-fewer in seven of his last 11 road starts (since 5/19).

- ✦ Earned the win in four consecutive road starts from 6/29-8/8, marking the longest such streak of his career.
- ✦ Has made 33 appearances (17 starts) in his career on the road, going 8-7 with one save and a 4.78 ERA (107.1IP, 119H, 65R/57ER, 42BB, 107K, 11HR).

VS. KANSAS CITY: Will be making his fourth career appearance (second start) vs. Kansas City tonight...in three appearances (one start) vs. the Royals, has gone 2-0 with one save and a 2.79 ERA (9.2IP, 8H, 2BB, 8K, 1HR, 1HP).

- ✦ Made one start vs. Kansas City this season on 7/21 at Yankee Stadium, earning the win after allowing 3ER over 5.2IP (5H, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP).
- ✦ Made his only career appearance at Kauffman Stadium on 5/1/22, earning the win after tossing a scoreless inning of relief (1.0IP, 1H, 1K).

2023: Has made 32 appearances (31 starts) this season, going 9-9 with a 4.65 ERA (155.0IP, 161H, 89R/80ER, 46BB, 146K, 23HR)...**his 24 starts with 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the sixth-most such starts in the AL and tied for the eighth-most such starts in the Majors this season**.

- ✦ **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 19 of his last 22 starts (since 5/19), 21 of his last 25 starts (since 5/3) and 22 of his last 27 starts (since 4/23).**
- ✦ **Has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his last 22 starts (since 5/19) and 21 of his last 27 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season**...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last six starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season (4/1-8/20).
- ✦ Had a 14-start streak of 3R-or-fewer allowed from 5/19-8/8, the fifth-longest such streak in the Majors this season, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell's 23-start streak (5/25-present), Minnesota's Sonny Gray's 17-start streak (4/1-7/2), Cleveland's Tanner Bibee's 16-start streak (6/18-present) and New York-NL's Kodai Senga's 15-start streak (6/28-present).
- ✦ Recorded a 10-start undefeated streak from 6/11-8/8, going 6-0 with a 3.42 ERA (52.2IP, 20ER) in that span.
- ✦ Made his first relief appearance on 7/9 vs. Chicago-NL (0.2IP, 1K)...marked his first relief appearance since 10/4/22-G2 at Texas.
- ✦ Tossed a career-high 6.2IP on 8/26 at Tampa Bay.
- ✦ Did not allow a HR in four straight starts from 5/14-31, marking the longest homerless stretch of his career *as a starter* (previous: three straight starts from 6/16-9/3/22).
- ✦ In his eighth start of the season on 5/9 vs. Oakland, earned his first win of the season after allowing just 2ER over a career-high-tying 6.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR, 1WP)...marked his first career win *as a starter*...reached 100.0 career innings in the first inning.
- ✦ Struck out Ezequiel Duran (swinging) in the fifth inning on 4/28 at Texas for his 100th career strikeout...struck out Spencer Torkelson (swinging) in the fourth inning on 8/31 at Detroit for his 200th career strikeout.
- ✦ Recorded a career-high-tying 8K on 4/23 vs. Toronto, 4/28 at Texas, 7/15 at Colorado and 8/20 vs. Boston.
