METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Giants, 5-2, snapping their three-game winning streak...Today, the Mets play their final game of their first homestand of the year, a seven-game stand against the Arizona Diamondbacks (2-1) and the San Francisco Giants (2-1)... Following this series, the Mets head to Arizona (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has not allowed a run over their last four games.... The last time New York relievers allowed a run was in the seventh inning on April 16 vs. Arizona...That is a span of 15.2 innings...The bullpen owns a 3.28 ERA ( 17 earned runs/46.2 innings) with 21 walks and 55 strikeouts...Their 55 punchouts are fourth in National League.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carlos Carrasco needs 11 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher... His 1,368 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Eclipsed 1,300.0 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington, becoming one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to reach the milestone (three active).

STRIKE THAT: New York's pitching staff has struck out 134 through the team's first 13 games...That ranks third in team history behind the 2018 Mets (136) and the 2019 team (135)...The team's 134 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

THE CHARMING MAN: In six games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits and two walks while striking out seven in 6.2 innings of work.... He owns a career record of $4-3$ with a 2.93 ERA ( 27 earned runs/83.0 innings) with 26 walks and 73 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

CHASEN DREAMS: After allowing a run in his first appearance of the season, Chasen Shreve has made four scoreless appearances (5.1 innings)...Overall, he is $1-0$ with a 1.42 ERA (one earned run/6.1 innings) with two walks and eight punchouts in five appearances.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha returned from the IL last night and went 1-4 with an RBI...He has reached base safely in all seven games with the Mets... He is batting .360 (9-25) with two runs, four RBI, four walks, a . 467 OBP and an .827 OPS.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for third in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 14 RBI...He is batting .260 (13-50) with nine runs three doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, two walks, a .500 SLG and an . 816 OPS in 13 games this year...He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run on Sunday vs. Arizona...That breaks his tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 47 home runs at Citi Field... That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

DOUBLE DARE: Eduardo Escobar collected his seventh double of the season last night...That is tied for the major league lead and leads the Senior Circuit...Eight of Escobar's 13 hits have gone for extra bases... He has drawn 11 walks in 12 games this year...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost the season series against the Giants in each of the last two years...New York won the series, in the prior three seasons (2017-2019).

SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR: Francisco Lindor had his on-base streak snapped at 12 games last night... He is batting .277 (13-47) with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, nine walks, a . 404 OBP, a . 553 SLG with a . 957 OPS.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone $7-1$ with a 2.08 ERA ( 16 earned runs/ 69.1 innings) with 17 walks and 79 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, WHIP (0.87), opponent's batting average (.177) and strikeouts...Their 69.1 innings rank third.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York is second in the majors and in the National League with a . 349 OBP...They are third in MLB with 54 walks, tied for fifth with 61 runs, seventh with a .252 batting average and eighth with a .738 OPS...The Mets have blasted 12 home runs this year... That is tied for ninth in the majors and tied for fifth in the National League...Through 13 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 61-35.

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 11 stolen bases through 13 games...That is tied with the Dodgers and the Angels for the major league lead...The Mets did not record their 11th steal until May 17 last season in the team's 36th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte are tied for fifth in the majors with three steals.

EL JEFF-E: In 12 games this year, Jeff McNeil is batting . 293 (12-41) with five runs, a double, a home run, six RBI, five walks, a steal, a . 383 OBP and a . 773 OPS...He has reached base safely in nine of his 11 games with an at-bat... He has collected four multi-hit games this year.

OPS, I DID IT AGAIN: J.D. Davis owns a lifetime OPS of 882 OPS at Citi Field...It is the highest home OPS in franchise history (min. 100 PA)... Jeff McNeil is second with an . 868 OPS and Brandon Nimmo is third with a .846 OPS at the home of the Mets.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has record 65 saves as a member of the Mets....That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets... He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is $9-14$ with 65 saves, a 3.93 ERA ( 66 earned runs/ 151.1 innings) with 62 walks and 246 strikeouts... His 246 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (281) and Josh Hader (280) have struck out more...Additionally, his 246 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13 th with 259.

LAST START: Carrasco tossed 5.0 scoreless innings with three hits, two walks and eight strikeouts in the no decision on April 16 vs. Arizona...Marked his first scoreless outing as a Met and his first overall since September 20, 2020 at Detroit while with Cleveland....His eight strikeouts were his most in a Mets uniform; last did so on September 25,2020 vs. Pittsburgh.
GOT OUT OF THE FIRST: Has thrown 9.2 scoreless innings since surrendering a first-inning home run to Nelson Cruz on April 10 at Washington...April 16 vs. Arizona marked his third scoreless opening frame in 13 starts with the Mets dating to August 4, 2021 at Miami...Is his longest scoreless innings streak since not allowing a run through 13.0 innings from May 9-20, 2019...Last season, Carrasco pitched to a 13.50 ERA (18 earned runs/12.0 innings) in the first inning compared to a 3.89 ERA ( 18 earned runs/41.2 innings) in all subsequent innings... Eight of his 12 home runs allowed came in the first frame, while opponents slashed .404/.444/.877.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO: Faced the Giants once last season on August 26 at Citi Field, allowing two runs on three hits with five strikeouts through 7.0 innings in a no decision...All three of his appearances against San Francisco while with Cleveland came on the road...Is $0-2$ with a 3.00 ERA (nine earned runs/27.0 innings), three walks and 21 strikeouts in four career starts against the Giants.

AGAINST THE NL WEST: Has faced just three of the five opponents in the National League West, most recently in his last start on April 16 vs. Arizona; has never faced Colorado and San Diego...Six of his career appearances against the division have come on the road, compared to three at home...Is 1-4 in those nine career games (eight starts) with a 3.75 ERA ( 20 earned runs/48.0 innings).

HOME VS. ROAD: Carrasco is looking for his first ever win at Citi Field, as he went 0-2 with a 5.39 ERA ( 20 earned runs/30.1 innings) in seven starts at home last season; did not factor in the decision in his first start at home this year...In six starts away from home as a Met, he is 1-3 with a 5.28 ERA (17 earned runs/29.0 innings)...Is $39-42$ with a 4.33 ERA ( 309 earned runs/ 642.1 inning) in 128 career games ( 106 starts) at home, compared to 50-36 with a 3.36 ERA ( 248 earned runs/664.1 innings) across 128 games ( 103 starts) on the road.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs 11 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100 -win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...His 1,368 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Eclipsed 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington, becoming one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to reach the milestone (three active).

GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE: Carrasco made two starts during Spring Training, both against the Houston Astros...He did not earn a decision while posting a 5.40 ERA (five earned runs/8.1 innings) with two walks and eight strikeouts...In his final Spring Training start on April 4 at Houston, Carrasco allowed two runs on four hits and a walk with five strikeouts through 4.1 innings of work.

2021 RECAP: Missed the first three months of the season with a hamstring injury and made his Mets debut on July 30 vs. Cincinnati...Issued one or no walks in his first eight starts with the Mets (six walks total in that span)...Only three pitchers have walked fewer batters in their first eight starts with the Mets (Bartolo Colón, Bob Friend and Dennis Ribant each walked five)...He posted a 3.51 ERA ( 13 earned runs/33.1 innings) in six starts from August 20-September 18, tossing at least 5.0 innings and allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...Underwent right elbow surgery on October 19, performed by Mets Medical Director Dr. David

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON [ $0-\mathrm{D}, \mathrm{0.00]}$

LAST TIME OUT: Made his first start of the season on April 17 vs. Arizona, tossing 4.1 scoreless innings with three hits, two walks and four strikeouts in the no decision...Marked his first scoreless start since June 14, 2021 vs. Chicago-NL.

NO RUNS, NO PROBLEM: Has thrown 8.1 scoreless frames to start the 2022 campaign, 4.0 innings in a relief appearance on April 11 and 4.1 innings in his start on April 17...It is the second-longest scoreless innings streak of his career, behind 10.0 shutout frames from June 14-June 19 (G1), 2021.
