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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (65-70) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (67-68)

August 28, 2026 - Busch Stadium - St. Louis, MO - 7:15 CDT - Game #136/Road #70

RHP Jared Jones (2-5, 4.76 ERA) vs. LHP Quinn Mathews (0-2, 6.43 ERA)

THE PIRATES: had the day off on Thursday in St. Louis...Have gone 2-4 in the first six games of this season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, Monday-Wednesday) and St. Louis (Friday-Sunday), including a 3-0 loss on Wednesday at Petco Park...Will have the day off on Monday before starting a six-game homestand vs. San Francisco (September 1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (September 4-6)...Have hit 158 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1172) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the fifth-most runs (657) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Washington (704), Chicago-NL (695), Milwaukee (668) and Los Angeles-NL (661), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs in 2025 (they are looking to become the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs scored the year after finishing last in the league in runs scored and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

CENTRAL PARKS: Pittsburgh is 20-20 vs. the National League Central, including 10-10 on the road...The Pirates won each of their first four road series vs. the division when they won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Cincinnati, won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago, won two of three games from April 24-26 at Milwaukee and won two of three games from May 19-21 at St. Louis...Pittsburgh lost three of four games from July 30-August 2 at Cincinnati and lost three of four games from August 3-6 at Milwaukee...The Pirates will play 12 of their final 27 games vs. the division, including six vs. St. Louis...Pittsburgh has finished with a winning record against the division twice since it formed in 1994, coming in 2013 (45-31) and 2018 (43-33).

GATEWAY TO THE WINS: The Pirates have won or split each of their last two series here at Busch Stadium...They split a four-game series from August 25-28, 2025, while also winning two of three games here earlier this season from May 19-21...Pittsburgh is looking to win or split three straight series in St. Louis for the first time since winning two of three contests from September 4-6, 2015, winning two of three contests from May 6-8, 2016 and winning three of four contests from July 4-7, 2016.

BACK WHERE IT ALL BEGAN: Luke Weaver, who was selected by St. Louis in the first round (27th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and pitched 233.0 innings over 52 appearances (43 starts) with the Cardinals from 2016-18, enters tonight one strikeout shy of 800 for his Major League career...He made his Major League debut on August 13, 2016 at Wrigley Field, where he struck out future teammate Dexter Fowler looking for his first career strikeout...Weaver earned his first Major League win here on August 26, 2016 vs. Oakland...He has pitched 12.1 scoreless innings across six career games (one start) against the Cardinals.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: Brandon Lowe has six extra-base hits vs. St. Louis this year, including solo homers on April 30 at PNC Park (off JoJo Romero) and May 21 at Busch Stadium (off Dustin May)...His six extra-base hits vs. the Cardinals are tied with Chicago (NL)'s Ian Happ for the fourth-most in Major League Baseball, behind Chicago (NL)'s Alex Bregman (10), Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (eight) & Chicago (NL)'s Seiya Suzuki (seven)...His 50 extra-base hits as a second baseman lead all of MLB.

SWITCHING THINGS UP: Bryan Reynolds enters tonight's game at Busch Stadium three hits shy of 1100 for his Major League career...He is one of three switch hitters in Pirates history (since 1887) with at least 1000 hits, along with National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Max Carey (2418) and Johnny Ray (1009)...Reynolds leads all Major League switch hitters in hits since making his Major League debut on April 20, 2019 vs. San Francisco.

FEELING BULLISH: Pittsburgh's bullpen has a 2.98 ERA (99.2ip/33er) in August...That is the fourth-lowest mark among all Major League bullpens during the month, trailing Milwaukee (1.52), Boston (2.31) and San Diego (2.69)...The bullpen's 99.2 innings in August are tied with San Francisco for the third-most in all of MLB, behind Chicago-AL (127.0) and Toronto (109.1).

START ME UP: Bubba Chandler gave up one earned run in 5.2 innings on Wednesday at San Diego...Pirates starters are looking to allow one/zero earned runs in five straight games (since August 23 at Los Angeles-NL) for the first time since last season from August 31-September 5...The starting rotation's 3.24 ERA (72.1ip/26er) since August 11 at Miami is seventh in MLB.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 28, 2012: Pedro Álvarez finished a triple shy of the cycle, going 4-for-5 with a double, two home runs, four RBI and three runs scored in Pittsburgh's 9-0 win over St. Louis at PNC Park. Álvarez, who reached 25 home runs and 20 doubles for the season during that night's victory, posted his fifth career multi-homer game after connecting for home runs off Jake Westbrook and Brandon Dickson.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2020 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing two runs on three hits and a career-high five walks over 4.0 innings in the 4-3 loss on August 22 at Los Angeles (NL).

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run over 5.0 innings in his only career start against St. Louis, which came in Pittsburgh’s 5-4, 10-inning win on July 3, 2024 at PNC Park (Oneil Cruz delivered a game-ending single).

SKY-HIGH JULY: Jones’ 2.00 ERA (27.0ip/6er) during the month of July was tied with Atlanta’s Chris Sale and San Francisco’s Robbie Ray (he was traded to San Diego on August 3) for the seventh-lowest mark in the National League (minimum 27.0 innings pitched), behind Chicago’s Shota Imanaga (1.53), Chicago’s Matthew Boyd (1.67), Miami’s Eury Pérez (1.69), New York’s Nolan McLean (1.78), Arizona’s Brandon Pfaadt (1.88) and Arizona’s Merrill Kelly (1.95)...His .120 batting average against (11-for-92) during the month of July was first among Major League pitchers (minimum 90 at-bats).

DYNAMIC DUO: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run on two hits and one walk in 6.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2, 10-inning loss on July 24 vs. Chicago (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Bubba Chandler (July 22 [G2] at New York-AL) and him were the first pair of Pirates starters since at least 1893 to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs & one or zero walks in back-to-back games.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Jones became the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with three or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed and at least six strikeouts in three consecutive outings when he accomplished that from July 2-18 (G1).

30 ROCK: Jones retired his final four batters on July 2 at Philadelphia, retired each of his 18 batters on July 8 vs. Atlanta and retired his first eight batters on July 18 (G1) at Cleveland (Steven Kwan snapped the streak with a two-out single in the third inning)... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones became one of only three Pirates pitchers in the last 70 years (since 1957) to retire at least 30 consecutive batters, joining Harvey Haddix (38 straight batters, May 21-26, 1959) & Jim Bibby (32 straight batters, May 19-24, 1981).

YOU’RE PERFECT: Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings.

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

ON THE MEND: Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakeland), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

2024 IN REVIEW: Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).
