RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals return home to begin a seven-game, eight-day homestand tonight against the Colorado Rockies (June 6-9) and division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates (June 11-13) ... The Cardinals recently finished their longest road trip of the season, going 4-5 over a nine-game, 10-day, three-city road trip through Cincinnati (2-1), Philadelphia (1-2), and Houston (1-2).
FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 3rd place in the NL Central, 1.0 game behind Chicago and 6.0 games behind Milwaukee The Cardinals are a half game back in NL Wild Card race, while sporting MLB's 4th-best win pct. (.667, 14-7) since Mother's Day ... St. Louis has played the fewest home games (25) in MLB so far this season.

TAP THE ROCKIES: The Cardinals . 750 home win pct. (45-15) vs. the Rockies is its best against any opponent since Busch III opened in 2006

St. Louis has defeated the Rockies in 19 of its last 22 home games (May 18, 2016-present) and is 36-8 (.818) at Busch Stadium III vs. the Rockies in their last 44 meetings since Sept. 30, 2010 ... The Cardinals have won the season series vs. the Rock Pile in 22 of 30 seasons since Colorado joined MLB as an expansion team in 1993.

WILD, WILD WEST: Since 2019 vs. the National League West, the Cardinals are 47-22 (.681) at Busch Stadium, but just 29-45 on the road.

WHAT A LONG STRANGE "RISP" IT'S BEEN: The Cardinals had success hitting the longball over their recent nine-game road trip, plating 21 of their 34 runs via home run ... However, St. Louis was 9 -for- 55 with runners in scoring position with only four of those hits w/ RISP scoring runs.

WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR: Six Major League shortstops lead their respective teams in Baseball Reference's Wins Above Replacement: Orioles Gunner Henderson (4.2), Royals Bobby Witt Jr. (3.8), Dodgers Mookie Betts (3.6), Rockies Ezequiel Tovar (2.3), Cardinals Masyn Winn (2.2), and Mets Francisco Lindor (1.6).
SAVE CRAVE: The Cardinals share the MLB lead in saves (22) with the Guardians and Yankees and rank 2nd in save percentage ( $78.6 \%$ ) behind only the Reds ( $81.3 \%$ ) ... Ryan Helsley, who leads MLB in saves (22) and ranks 2nd in games finished (25), has converted 20 consecutive save opportunities, MLB's longest active successful save streak and the 7th-longest in franchise history (Alex Reyes holds the record with 24 successful saves in a row from 2016-21)

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: St. Louis is 25-2 (.926) when leading after 7 innings and a perfect 26-0 when leading after eight, one of four MLB teams (Guardians, Dodgers, Twins, \& Mariners) with a 1.000 win percentage when leading after eight innings . The Cardinals are 17-1 this season when the trio of JoJo Romero, Andrew Kittredge, and Ryan Helsley all pitch in the same game, with their only blemish on May 4 vs. the Chicago White Sox.

GOLD-RUSH: Paul Goldschmidt has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games (May 11-present) MLB's 5th-longest active on-base streak and three shy of the Cardinals mark for this season held by Nolan Arenado (25) ... Goldy's career-long is 46 games (April 22-June 10, 2022), while his active 22-gamer is currently the 8th-longest of his career and 3rd-longest as a Cardinal (2019-24).
REDBIRD REHABS: Pitchers Steven Matz (lower back strain) and Giovanny Gallegos (right shoulder impingement) are scheduled to appear for Triple-A Memphis at Omaha (AAA-Royals) tonight ... Matz is set to pitch two innings and throw approximately 45 pitches in his first rehab outing, as Gallegos makes his 3rd appearance with Memphis.
