TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners open their brief road trip with the first of 3 games against the San Francisco Giants...Seattle is coming off their first homestand against the Athletics (2-2) and Detroit Tigers (1-2)... the Mariners return home Monday for a 6-game homestand where they will host the Houston Astros (3 G, 4/7-9) and the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/11-13)...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won Wednesday's series finale by a 3-2 final over the Detroit Tigers... Seattle is 6-3 over its last 9 games against the Giants, winning the last 3 season series (2021, 2023-24).

- **Hot Start - Dylan Moore** is batting .375 (3x8) with 2 runs, 1 home run, 1 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base over his first 5 games this season, getting on base at a .545 clip and slugging .750 with a 1.295 OPS.
- **Series Business** - the Mariners are 7-3-3 in series since **Dan Wilson** was named Manager on Aug. 22, 2024.
- **Fun With Names - Luis Castillo** and **Luis F. Castillo** are set to become the third set of players with the same name to appear for the Mariners, joining Ken Griffey (Jr.) and Ken Griffey (Sr.) and Brian Hunter (1996) and Brian Hunter (1999).
- **Déjà Vu** - The Mariners are set to have pitchers named **Luis Castillo** start in back-to-back games, with **Luis (Miguel) Castillo** starting on Wednesday against the Tigers and **Luis (Felipe) Castillo** starting today's game at San Francisco, just the second set of pitchers in MLB history to start consecutive games for the same team, joining Bobby (**Joseph**) Jones and Bobby (**Mitchell**) Jones, who started back-to-back games from July 3-4, 2000 and Aug. 10-11, 2002 with the New York Mets.
- **Take a Walk** - Seattle's offense has drawn 29 walks through 7 games, the most walks in the American League...Seattle ranks T-4th in MLB, trailing the Cubs (43 BB in 9 games), Diamondbacks (34 BB in 7 games) and Dodgers (31 BB in 8 games).
- **Winner, Winner** - The Mariners have put together 4 consecutive winning seasons (2021-c), tied for the most consecutive winning seasons in franchise history (also: 2000-03).
- **Runners** - The Mariners are 6-for-8 (75.0%) in stolen base attempts this season, with **Ryan Bliss** (2 SB), **Julio Rodríguez** (2), **Dylan Moore** (1) and **Cal Raleigh** (1) each swiping at least 1 bag so far...the Mariners set a franchise record with a 83.3% (140-for-168) success rate on stolen bases last season.

ROSTER MOVES...yesterday the Mariners reinstated INF **Jorge Polanco** from the Paternity List and optioned INF **Leo Rivas** and LHP **Jhonathan Díaz** to Triple-A Tacoma...today, the Mariners selected RHP **Luis F. Castillo** from Tacoma and designated for assignment RHP Hagen Danner.

THE J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** is batting .325 (49x151) with 31 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 8 stolen bases, getting on base at a .385 clip and slugging .570 with a .954 OPS in 36 games since Aug. 28, 2024...among AL hitters with 100 PA during that span, his .954 OPS ranks 3rd, trailing Aaron Judge-NYY (1.110 OPS) and Nathaniel Lowe-TEX (.970).

RANDY'S LASER SHOW...over his first 7 games this season, **Randy Arozarena** has 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 2 RBI and 5 walks with a .321 on-base percentage, a .522 slugging percentage and a .843 OPS...each of his 4 hits so far this season have been extra-base hits...he leads Mariners hitters with 9 hard-hit balls (95 MPH+) and 7 balls in play at least 100 MPH.

CAL IS ON THE BOARD...**Cal Raleigh** hit his 1st home run of the season in Monday's game...he is 1 home run shy of tying Mike Zunino (94 HR) for the franchise record among catchers...Cal already has the 7th-most home runs among catchers in their first 5 Major League seasons, after leading all catchers with 93 home runs through his first 4 seasons...Mike Piazza (128 HR) holds the record for most HR through a catchers first five MLB seasons.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF...Mariners starters **Logan Gilbert** (2 GS), **Luis Castillo** (2 GS), **Bryce Miller** (1 GS) and **Bryan Woo** (1 GS) have combined to go 2-3 with a 3.03 ERA (12 ER, 35.2 IP), 9 walks and 36 strikeouts in 6 starts...last season, the Mariners starting rotation led the Majors in ERA (3.38), quality starts (92), IP (942.2), SO/BB (4.81), BB/9 (1.77), WHIP (1.03) and Opp. AVG (.221), ranking 2nd in strikeouts (889) and 4th in fWAR (15.2).

MUÑY, MUÑY, MUÑY...**Andrés Muñoz** has recorded saves in each of his first 3 appearances this season... Muñoz set a career-highs with 22 saves and a 2.12 ERA (14 ER, 59.1 IP) last season, earning his first career All-Star nod...on Opening Day, he joined Edwin Díaz, Josh Hader, Craig Kimbrel, Kenley Jansen, Dellin Betances, Ken Giles and Greg Holland as the only pitchers since 2000 to post a 2.64 ERA, 12.4 SO/9 and a 3.53 SO/BB or better over his first 200 career games.

HOT START FOR JORGE...third baseman **Jorge Polanco** has hit safely in each of his first 4 games to begin the season (3/27-c), batting .400 (6x15) with 1 home run, 4 RBI and a sacrifice bunt...on Thursday night, "Polo" supplied the go-ahead and eventual game-winning 2-run homer in the bottom of the eighth, his first career Opening Day home run in his seventh Opening Day game.

MARINERS EXTEND CAL RALEIGH TO 6-YEAR CONTRACT...the Mariners announced on Wednesday they extended catcher **Cal Raleigh** to a 6-year contract through the 2030 season, with a vesting player option for 2031...the 28-year-old backstop has led MLB catchers in home runs in 3 consecutive seasons and catcher caught stealing in 2 consecutive seasons...Cal led the Mariners in games played (153), plate appearances (628), home runs (34), RBI (100), extra-base hits (50) and total bases (238) last season... Raleigh won a *Rawlings* AL Gold Glove Award in 2024, also named the AL Platinum Glove Award winner and becoming the first Seattle player to go Platinum.

UPCOMING HOMESTAND...following a brief trip to the Bay Area for 3 games against the San Francisco Giants, the Mariners return for a 6-game homestand against Houston and Texas beginning on Monday...the homestand is highlighted by **Cal Raleigh "Platinum Glove" Bobblehead** nights from April 7-9, **Mariners Corduroy Hat** Night on April 11, **Mariners Salute to Armed Forces Night** on April 12 and **Mariners Little League Day** on April 13.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Gabe Speier** has tossed 2.2 scoreless innings over his first 3 appearances this season, recording 4 strikeouts, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that Speier holds a 0.30 ERA (1 ER, 30.0 IP) with 3 walks, 33 strikeouts and a 0.63 WHIP in 31 career appearances in March/April, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since earned runs became official in 1913, Speier's 0.30 ERA in the opening month of the season is the lowest in MLB history (min. 30.0 IP)?...he ranks ahead of Aaron Crow (0.66 ERA), Andrew Bailey (0.84), Keegan Thompson (0.87) and Vean Gregg (0.88), and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**... that Speier's 0.30 ERA in March/April trails only Adam Kolerek's 0.28 ERA in August as the lowest ERA in any calendar month since 1913 (min. 30.0 IP)?

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 30-year-old right-hander is set to make his season debut in today's game...he is also making his 4th major league appearance (1st start) and 1st against the San Francisco Giants.
- Spent the 2023-24 seasons pitching in the Japanese NPB with Chiba Lotte (2023) and Orix (2024).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the Arizona Diamondbacks on Feb. 16, 2012.
- Made MLB debut on 8/6/22 vs. TB (w/Detroit).
- Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on Jan. 24, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT...ND in his organizational debut on 3/30 with the Tacoma Rainiers vs. Round Rock...tossed 5.2 innings allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and 2 walks with 2 strikeouts.

BEEN A WHILE...last appeared in a Major League game 942 days ago, on Sept. 5, 2022 at Los Angeles-AL while with the Detroit Tigers, tossing 1.2 scoreless innings with 3 strikeouts.

SPRING RECAP...in 2024 Spring Training, Castillo totaled 3 appearances in relief with the Mariners, collecting a 5.40 ERA (3 ER, 5.0 IP), allowing 9 hits, with 5 strikeouts and 2 walks.

OVERSEAS...in 2024 with Orix in the NPB, he went 3-5 with a 2.96 ERA (31 ER, 94.1 IP) in 15 games...in 2023 with Chiba Lotte in the NPB, he went 3-3 with a 3.12 ERA (17 ER, 49.0 IP) in 12 games... in 2 seasons combined in the NPB, he went 6-8 overall with a 3.01 ERA (143.1, 48 ER), 108 strikeouts, and 21 walks in 27 games.

HEY, YOUR NAME SOUNDS FAMILIAR...is set to become just the second pair of pitchers with the same first and last name to start at pitcher in consecutive games for the same team in MLB history, joining Bobby (Joseph) Jones and Bobby (Mitchell) Jones who did it twice for the New York Mets: July 3-4, 2000 and Aug. 10-11, 2002...**Luis F. Castillo** and teammate **Luis Castillo** are the 3rd set of players in franchise with the same name, joining Ken Griffey (Jr.) and Ken Griffey (Sr.) and Brian Hunter (1996) and Brian Hunter (1999).

MLB DEBUT...In his MLB debut with Detroit, he threw 1.0 innings of relief against Tampa Bay, allowing 0 runs on 2 hits, and striking out 1 batter in 5 batters faced.

CAREER...After his debut, he would appear in 2 more games in relief work for the Tigers in 2022...Castillo finished the season with 3.2 innings pitched (0.00 ERA), allowing 0 runs on just 2 hits, with 3 strikeouts.

MINORS...signed a Minor League free agent contract with Detroit in 2022 on Feb. 1...he split his time in Double-A Erie (3 games, 1-0, 3.1 IP, 2 H, 3 SO) and Triple-A Toledo holding a 1.74 ERA (8 ER, 41.1 IP) and 39 strikeouts in 40 Triple-A games, all coming in relief.

IT'S BEEN A JOURNEY...signed at 17 years old, Castillo spent part of 9 seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks organization (2012-2021), 1 season with the Detroit Tigers (2022), and 1 season with the Seattle Mariners (2025)...in 11 total seasons in the Minors League, Castillo is 28-26 appearing in 232 G (33 GS), throwing 1 CG, collecting 11 saves in relief, holding a 3.46 ERA (183 ER, 476.1 IP), with 415 K's and 131 BB.
