**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 7-game road trip with the first of 4 games against the Houston Astros...Seattle is coming off a 3-game set at the White Sox (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Dave Valle** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will also be televised on FS1 with **Eric Collins** and **Eric Karros** on the call...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners dropped yesterday's rubber match to the White Sox by a 2-1 final.

- **Never Done With 1-Run** - Seattle leads MLB, playing 16 1-run games and going 6-10 in those contests this season...dating back to 2021, Seattle has played an MLB-leading 283 1-run games, going 156-127 (.551), ranking 2nd in winning percentage to only the Milwaukee Brewers (.568/138-105).
- **Roster Moves** - Today the Mariners recalled RHP **Domingo González** and placed LHP **José A. Ferrer** on the Paternity List...González will make his MLB debut when he first appears in a game.
- **Upcoming TV Schedule** - The Mariners upcoming weekend series against the Padres (May 15-17) will be televised on **Mariners TV** on Friday, **FOX** on Saturday and **Peacock** on Sunday.
- **Not Your Average Joe** - INF/OF **Connor Joe** recorded a multi-hit game off the bench yesterday, the first Mariners player since **Luke Raley** (9/7/25 at ATL) with 2+ hits off the bench.

**ASTRONOMIC SUCCESS**...the Mariners have won 7-consecutive games against the Astros (9/17-c), including back-to-back series sweeps (3 G, 9/17-19, 2025 and 4 G, 4/10-13, 2026)...Seattle's 7-game winning streak against the Astros is their longest against Houston in Mariners history (previous: 6 G, 7/19-8/31/13), tied for their longest active streak against an opponent (also: Cardinals, 7 G, 9/8/24-c)...the Mariners longest winning streak against an individual opponent was 13 games against the Athletics (7/23/21-5/23/22)...Seattle has captured the season series against the Astros in each of the last 3 seasons (2023-c).

**HOT ROD**...**Julio Rodríguez** is batting .309 (42x136) with 19 runs, 8 doubles, 6 home runs, 17 RBI, 3 stolen bases, a .365 OBP and slugging .500 for a .865 OPS over his last 34 games (4/3-c)...over his last 14 games, (4/25-c), J-Rod is batting .333 (20x60) with 11 runs, 5 doubles, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.022 OPS...overall this season, Julio is batting .272 (44x162) with 21 runs, 8 doubles, 6 home runs, 18 RBI and a .769 OPS in 41 games...his .769 OPS is the highest mark of his career through his first 41 games of a season, besting his .719 OPS in 2025.

**BY GEORGE!**...**George Kirby** is set to make his 9th start of the season tonight...Kirby is 4-2 with a 2.94 ERA (17 ER, 52.0 IP), 12 walks and 39 strikeouts...his 5 quality starts this season rank T-4th in the AL this season...since his Mariners debut on May 8, 2022, Kirby ranks 4th in the AL in fWAR (14.7), 7th in ERA (3.54), 1st in SO/BB (6.29) and 3rd in quality starts (68) among pitchers with 500.0 IP during that span.

**DOING WHAT WE DO BEST**...the Mariners pitching staff **leads the Majors** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.48) this season, ranking ahead of the next-closest Dodgers (3.15)...Seattle pitchers have accumulated 345 strikeouts and just 99 walks through the first 41 games of the season...Mariners pitching has also allowed the fewest walks in the league by a sizable margin, with the Dodgers again ranking next-closest with 113 walks allowed...the Mariners have ranked either #1 or #2 in the Majors in strikeout-to-walk ratio in each of the last 3 full seasons: #2 in 2023, #1 in 2024, and #2 in 2025...in total since 2023, Seattle leads MLB with a 3.46 SO/BB clip, ranking ahead of the next-closest Phillies (3.22).

**SET YOUR ALARMS: IT'S MILLER TIME**...**Bryce Miller** is set to be activated off the Injured List on Wednesday and will make his season debut after missing the start of the season with a left oblique strain...he made 4 rehab starts between High-A Everett and Triple-A Tacoma holding a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts...Miller was limited by two separate IL stints in 2025 for right elbow inflammation, but excelled during the Postseason, going 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 ER, 14.1 IP) in 3 starts.

**BIG THUNDER ROARS**...on Friday, **Luke Raley** went 2-for-5 with a grand slam and a 3-run home run, his 3rd career multi-homer game and first since April 30, 2023 at the White Sox with Tampa Bay...he drove in a career-high 7 RBI and became the first Mariners player with a grand slam and 3-run homer in the same game since Nelson Cruz on July 23, 2016 at Toronto...Raley's .864 OPS and 8 home runs on the season lead Mariners hitters.

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS**...following the current 4-game set in Houston, the Mariners return home for a 6-game homestand against the San Diego Padres (3 G, 5/15-17) and Chicago White Sox (3 G, 5/18-20)...promotions and events on the homestand include **Hello Kitty Clear Crossbody Bag Night** (May 15), **Salute to Armed Forces Night** (May 16), the **Vedder Cup finale** (May 17), **Josh Naylor Bobblehead** (May 18 and May 19), as well as **Mariners Value Games** (May 18-20)...for more information, visit [Mariners.com/tickets](http://Mariners.com/tickets).

**MOVING UP THE LEADERBOARD**...with his next home run, **Cal Raleigh** will surpass "Mr. Mariner" Alvin Davis for 7th on the Mariners all-time home runs list...Cal and Alvin are currently tied at 160 home runs, with Nelson Cruz (163 HR with Seattle) next up on the list at 6th place in franchise history.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Josh Naylor** has been scorching hot as of late, hitting safely in 9-consecutive games (5/1-c) and since April 17, he is batting .397 (29x73) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 7 SB, a .444 OBP and slugging .575 for a 1.020 OPS in 81 plate appearances, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that since April 17, he leads MLB in batting average?...he also ranks among the leaders in OBP (4th), OPS (10th), wRC+ (5th, 192), SB (3rd) and multi-hit games (T-3rd, 9).

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 10

- **1984** - The Mariners defeated the New York Yankees, 4-3, in a 17-inning marathon at Yankee Stadium. The Yankees scored an unearned run in the 9th to tie the score at two. Each club scored in the 14th, but Jack Perconte's sacrifice fly scored Darnell Coles with the game's winning run in the 17th.
- **1996** - Jay Buhner went 4-for-4, homered twice and drove in a career-best six runs in an 11-1 win vs. Kansas City.
- **2025** - Randy Arozarena extended his career-high 34-game on-base streak while collecting his 9th multi-hit game of the season against the Yankees tying Robinson Canó (4/30-6/5/2016) for the 3rd-longest streak in franchise history.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 9th start of the season and 2nd against the Astros...is making the 121st start of his career and his 11th career start against Houston.
Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 5 vs. Atlanta, tossing 7.0 innings with 2 runs (2 ER), 5 hits, 1 walk and 5 strikeouts...he threw 88 pitches (59 strikes) in his 8th start of the year...marked his 3rd start this season of 7.0-or-more innings.

THE LAST 5...is 3-0 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) and 23 strikeouts to 1 home run and 7 walks allowed across his last 5 starts since April 13...has not allowed more than 2 runs in each of those last 5 starts, throwing a quality start in 3 of the last 5.

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...has reached the 6th inning in each of his 8 starts this year and has cleared the 7th inning in 3 of those starts...his 52.0 innings this season are 2nd-most in MLB, trailing only Max Fried-NYY (52.2 IP) and are the most through a Mariners pitcher's first 8 starts of the season since Logan Gilbert also had 52.0 IP through his first 8 starts of the 2024 season...he has thrown 7.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 3 starts, tied for the most such games this season in MLB.

OOPS, ALL ACES...Kirby and Bryan Woo are the only two pitchers in MLB this season to have 3 games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs, and 1-or-fewer walks allowed...Kirby, Woo, and Emerson Hancock have each thrown 5 quality starts this season, all tied for 7th-most in MLB...the Mariners are the only team to have 3+ players with 5+ quality starts this season.

AGAINST HOUSTON...across 10 career starts against Houston, he is 5-1 with a 2.17 ERA (14 ER, 58.0 IP) and 54 strikeouts to just 6 walks allowed...has tossed a quality start in 8 of his 10 starts against Houston, including both of his last 2 starts (9/20/25-c).

IN HOUSTON...is 3-1 with a 2.78 ERA (10 ER, 32.1 IP) and 30 strikeouts to just 4 walks allowed across 6 career starts against the Astros on the road...has tossed 6.0+ IP while allowing 1-or-fewer earned runs in each of his last 4 road starts against Houston (5/3/24-c).

MESSING WITH TEXAS...across 23 career starts against both Texas teams (HOU & TEX), he is 15-2 with a combined 1.84 ERA (27 ER, 132.1 IP) and 120 strikeouts to just 16 walks allowed...he has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 22 of those 23 starts vs. Houston and Texas, has not allowed an earned run in 8 of those starts and has gone 6.0+ innings in 18 of those 23 starts vs. Texas teams.

HEATED RIVALRY...is 26-6 with a 2.56 ERA (71 ER, 249.2 IP) and 250 strikeouts to just 35 walks allowed across 42 career starts against AL West teams...his 26 wins vs. AL West teams are most among all MLB pitchers since 2022...among pitchers in franchise history (min. 40 GS vs. AL West teams), he leads in ERA (2.56), strikeouts-per-nine innings (1.26), strikeouts-to-walks ratio (7.14), and winning percentage (.813).

#50...is 1 win away from 50 career wins...will become the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...if he factors into the win in his next start, his 121 games will be tied for the 4th-fewest games to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, alongside: Hisashi Iwakuma and Erik Hanson...behind: Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy Garcia (100 G), and Marco Gonzales (118 G).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...is making his 4th road start of the season...among all MLB pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his his 6.16 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road leads MLB all-time among starters (min. 50 road starts), ahead of Shane Bieber's 5.73 SO/BB...his 1.28 walks-per-nine innings ranks 3rd-best all-time, trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.08) and Deacon Phillippe (1.21).

QUALITY STUFF...has thrown a quality start in 5 of his 8 starts this season (last: 5/5 vs. ATL)...has thrown 67 quality starts across his career, 9th-most in MLB since 2022...has thrown a quality start without any walks in 36 career starts (1x this season, 4/7 at TEX), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Tarik Skubal-DET (26), and teammate Logan Gilbert, Logan Webb-SF and Zack Wheeler-PHI (25 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 16 road games, 2nd-most since 2022, trailing Skubal (18 G).

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 8/12/23 vs. BAL)...is 1 of just 2 pitchers with a complete game so far this season (also: Sandy Alcantara-MIA, 4/1 vs. CHW)...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 8 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, joining teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

SO NICE HE DID IT TWICE...is the only pitcher to have multiple starts of 14+ SO and no walks since 2025, having done so twice last season (6/8/25 at LAA & 9/14 vs. LAA)...teammate Emerson Hancock recently joined him and Max Meyer-MIA (4/21/25 vs. CIN) as the only pitchers in MLB with 14+ SO and 0 BB in a game since 2025.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (105), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.29), walks-per-nine innings (1.37), and walk rate (3.7%).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4), ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (1.9) and Logan Gilbert (1.9)...also leads franchise in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.29), also ahead of Gilbert (4.90)...ranks 5th in franchise history in career ERA (3.54), ahead of Logan Gilbert (3.61) and Luis Castillo (3.65)...ranks 11th in total strikeouts (660 SO), trailing Castillo (670 SO).
