METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Dodgers, 8-0...The Mets are down 2-1 to the Dodgers in the NLCS...New York defeated the Phillies, three-games-to-one in the NLDS...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild Card Series.

CH-CH-CHANGES: Major League Baseball announce the following scoring change...In Game 2 of the NLCS, Francisco Lindor reached base to lead off the top of the sixth inning on what was originally ruled an E5...That has since been changed to a base hit.

CHASING THE PENNANT: The Mets are playing in the NLCS for the ninth time in franchise history and the first time since 2015...The Mets are 27-18 (.600) all-time in the National League Championship Series.

EIGHT IS GREAT: According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to reach the League Championship Series after being 11+ games under .500, joining: 2019 Nationals, 2013 Dodgers, 2005 Astros, 1989 Blue Jays, 1984 Royals, 1974 Pirates and the 1973 Mets.

LA LAND: The Mets are facing the Dodgers for the fourth time in Postseason history...They faced off in the 2015 NLDS (3-2), the 2006 NLDS (3-2) and the 1988 ALDS (3-4)...Overall, the Mets are 10-8 against the Dodgers in the Postseason.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 10-6 all-time in Game 4 of a Postseason series...This includes a 7-6 record at home and a 1-2 record at Citi Field...The Mets defeated the Phillies, 4-1, in Game 4 of the NLDS at Citi Field...The Mets are on a four-game winning streak in Game 4 of the NLCS, beating Chicago in 2015; St. Louis in 2006; St. Louis in 2000; and Atlanta in 1999.

TO THE POST: The Mets are 58-44 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .569 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, 600) and the Yankees (249-179, .582) have a better winning percentage... The Mets own the fifth-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.23 ERA.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 7-7 during the Postseason at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets are 33-20 at home in the Postseason...Their .623 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors.

AINT IT GRAND: Mark Vientos connected for his first career grand slam in Game 2 of the NLCS at Dodgers Stadium...He is the first player since Bryson Stott (2023 WC, G2) to hit a Postseason grand slam for his first career grand slam...Per Elias, he is one of 13 players to accomplish the feat including Jordan Luplow (10/8/2021); Ronald Acuña Jr. (10/7/2018); Paul Goldschmidt (10/4/2011); Shane Victorino (10/2/2008); Kazuo Matsui (10/4/2007); Mark Lewis (10/6/1995); Ron Gant (10/7/1992); José Canseco (10/15/1988); Mike Cuellar (10/3/1970); Chuck Hiller (10/8/1962); and Bobby Richardson (10/8/1960)...Francisco Lindor connected for his second carer Postseason grand slam in Game 4 of the NLDS... He also cleared the bases on October 6, 2017 with Cleveland vs. New York-AL... His two Postseason grand slams are tied with Shane Victorino and Jim Thome for the most in MLB history.

SAVE ME: In Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series, David Peterson became the first pitcher in franchise history to record his first career save in the Postseason...He became the 19th pitcher to have earned their first career save in the playoffs... Courtesy of Elias.

ON THE MARK: Through his first 10 career Postseason games, Mark Vientos is batting .366 (15-41) with three homers, 11 RBI, two doubles, two walks, six runs, a .395 OBP and a 1.029 OPS...His six multi-hit games are tied for the most ever in a single Postseason in Mets' history with John Olerud (1999) and Todd Zeile (2000...The trio has the second-most ever multi-hit games overall behind only Edgardo Alfonzo and Cleon Jones, who each had seven career multi-hit games their time with the Mets...Marty Barrett (1986), Troy Glaus (2002) and Marquis Grissom (1996) hold the single-Postseason record with nine multi-hit games each.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Mark Vientos is the third-youngest player (24 years, 300 days) with 10+ total bases in a playoff game, doing so in Game 2 of the NLDS...He was only older than Carlos Correa (21y, 20d) in Game 4 of the 2015 ALDS and Manny Ramírez (23y, 134d) in Game 2 of the 1995 ALCS... Vientos is now the third Mets player with three extra-base hits in a playoff game, joining Lucas Duda in Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS and Gary Carter in Game 4 of the 1986 World Series

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM: Game 2 of the NLCS marked the third time in Postseason history that a club hit a leadoff home run and a grand slam in the same game...Courtesy of Sarah Lands...New York is the first club to accomplish the feat since the Orioles in Game 1 of the 1996 ALDS...The first club to ever accomplish the feat is the Yankees, who did so in Game 5 of the 1953 World Series, also against the Dodgers.

EVERYBODY HITS: In Game 2 of the NLCS, each player in the Mets starting lineup safely reached base, marking the second time this Postseason that every batter in New York's starting lineup reached base...They also did so in Game 2 of the Wild Card Series against Milwaukee...Overall it is the sixth time in Mets Postseason history that each batter in the starting lineup reached base safely after they also accomplished the feat on October 30, 2015 (G3 WS); October 15 2006 (G4 NLCS); October 11, 2000 (G1 NLCS); and October 17, 1973 (G4 WS).

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 40 Postseason games, batting .289 (39-135) with 16 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 22 walks, a .388 OBP and a .548 SLG.

TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE: Ryne Stanek has appeared in 28 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7 ER/25.2 IP) with eight walks and 25 strikeouts in the playoffs.

CLOSING TIME: In Game 2 of the NLCS, Edwin Díaz became the sixth pitcher (10th occurrence) in Mets Postseason history to record a save of more than three outs...It was the first since Jeurys Familia did so in Game 1 of the 2015 NLCS (1.1IP)...Familia also did it in Game 5 of the 2015 NLDS (2.0 IP) and Game 1 of the 2015 NLDS (1.1 IP)...There have been 13 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each...Díaz has recorded two Postseason saves with the Mets, tied for the fifth-most.

BACK-TO-BACK: The Mets have hit back-to-back home runs twice in the Postseason...On October 21, 2015 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Lucas Duda and Travis d'Arnaudhit back-to-back home runs in the first inning...On October 9, 1988 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds went back-to-back in the fourth inning.

HAPPY TRAILS: According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason... After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins)...The Mets won Game 3 of the NLWCS and Game 1 of the NLDS after trailing entering the eighth inning...According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 4-3 on the road during the 2024 Postseason...All-time, they are 25-24 on the road in the Postseason...New York finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

ON THE RECORD: New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are the first team in MLB history to clinch a postseason spot in a win and win a playoff series BOTH via games in which they faced a deficit in the ninth inning or later...Courtesy of Sarah Langs and Elias.

WILD OUT: The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022....In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

DIVISION BELL: The Mets appeared in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...They defeated the Phillies, three-games-to-one...Overall, it was their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 15-5 all-time in the series...Their .750 winning percentage in the series is the best in the National League...That is tied with the Blue Jays (.750) for the best mark in the majors...This includes a 9-1 record at home in the Division Series.

IN A CLINCH: The Mets are 13-9 in clinching games, including 2-0 this year... New York has clinched a spot in the NLCS for the first time since 2015...The Mets clinched their first Postseason series at Citi Field after defeating the Phillies, 4-1, in Game 4 of the NLDS.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0 scoreless innings in the Mets 4-1 win in Game 4 of the NL Division Series against Philadelphia on Oct. 9...Recorded four hits with one walk and five strikeouts.

POSTSEASON: Has appeared in seven career Postseason games, including six starts... Is 0-1 with a 2.43 ERA (8 ER/29.2 IP) with nine walks and 26 strikeouts...Has appeared in two games this year, starting Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee and Game 4 of the NL Division Series against Philadelphia.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Quintana did not allowed a run in a career-best 25.2 innings from August 31 until the fourth inning of his last start...It marked the longest scoreless streak of his career.

KEEPING IT 100: Earned his 100th career win, throwing 6.2 scoreless innings on September 7 against the Reds...Became the 19th active pitcher to reach the 100-career win plateau...Is the sixth active left-handed pitcher with 100+ wins...Is the first Colombian born pitcher with 100 career wins...With a win tonight, Quintana will extend his streak to a season-high five wins.

HAVE TO ADMIT IT'S GETTING BETTER: After allowing eight runs on May 3 at Tampa Bay, Quintana has made 23 starts and posted a 9-6 record with a 3.33 ERA (48 ER/129.2 IP) with 45 walks and 101 strikeouts...Has given up one or fewer earned runs in each of his last five starts...Has a 0.28 ERA (1 ER/32.0 IP) over his last five starts.

JUNE BLOOM: Quintana made five starts in June and went 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) with 11 walks and 26 strikeouts...The Mets went 4-1 in those starts.

8.0 IS GREAT: Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis in the Mets' 4-2 walk-off victory...Was his longest start as a Met and his longest start since September 17, 2022 vs. Cincinnati with St. Louis (Also 8.0 IP)...Was the longest start by a Met since Justin Verlander threw 8.0 innings on July 19 vs. Chicago-AL.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN: In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

METS DEBUT SEASON: After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

300 CLUB: In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.
