METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 5-1, yesterday...The loss snapped a seven-game winning streak, the team's longest of the season...Today, the Mets finish a six-game trip (5-0) to Miami (3-0) and Washington D.C. (1-1)...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (4-1), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 49-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 23-6-3 in 32 series this year... Following this series, the Mets return home for an 11-game homestand, their longest of the year, against the Braves (five games), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 28-9 (.757) following a loss this year...The .757 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

RUBBERBAND MAN: The Mets are 12-3 in rubber games this season...According to Elias, that's the best winning percentage (.800) in such games this season...When playing the third game of a three-game series on the road (after splitting the first two games) the Mets are 8-2, which is tied for the second-best such winning percentage in the majors this season...The Angels are 3-0...The Mets eight wins are the most in the majors.

NEVER GONNA GIVEN YOU UP: Yesterday, the Mets acquired RHP Mychal Givens from the Chicago Cubs in exchange for minor leaguer RHP Saúl González...Givens, 32, has gone 6-2 with two saves and a 2.66 ERA (15 ER/40.2 IP) in 40 games for the Cubs this season...His six wins lead all NL relievers and he is tied for 12th in the league with 51 strikeouts out of the bullpen...He has not allowed an earned run in his last 16 outings (17.1 IP) since June 16...He has held right-handed hitters to a .196 average in his career, a mark that ranks fourth among qualifying pitchers since 2015 behind only Max Scherzer (.176), Aroldis Chapman (.185) and Raisel Iglesias (.188)...Since his debut season in 2015, he ranks in the top 10 among all relievers in wins (31, tied for third), innings (437.0, seventh) and strikeouts (517, 10th).

RUF STUFF: The Mets acquired INF/OF Darin Ruf from San Francisco in exchange for infielder J.D. Davis, LHP Thomas Szapucki and minor leaguers RHP Carson Seymour and LHP Nick Zwack...Ruf, 36, slashed .216/.328/.373 with 11 home runs and 38 RBI in 90 games for the Giants this season, including a .252/.364/.523 line against left-handed pitchers...He has drawn 40 walks and his 12.7 percent walk rate ranks fifth in the National League...In his career, Ruf has posted a .929 OPS against southpaws, good for the 15th-best mark among all active players (min. 500 plate appearances vs. LHP).

MAY 1?: RHP Trevor May is expected to rejoin the Mets today...May has been on the injured list since May 3 with right triceps inflammation...He has made four rehab appearances between Triple-A Syracuse and Double-A Binghamton and posted a 4.50 ERA (two earned runs/4.0 innings) with one walk and four strikeouts...He has posted a 31-24 record with a 4.40 ERA in 291 career appearances.

PICK SIX: Today's starter Chris Bassitt has thrown six innings in each of his last seven starts...That matches his career-best, set from July 11 - August 21, 2015...In seven starts since June 14, Bassitt is 3-3 with a 2.89 ERA (15 earned runs/46.2 innings) with nine walks and 43 strikeouts.

REPEAT RELIEVER: Yesterday, MLB announced that Edwin Díaz has been voted the National League Reliever of the Month for the second consecutive month...Díaz earned his seventh career Reliever of the Month Award and his second in a row...He is the first Major League reliever to win consecutive Reliever of the Month Awards since Josh Hader in May-June 2019...He made 11 scoreless appearances and converted each of his seven save opportunities, striking out 25 and issuing just one walk in 11.1 innings...Since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.43 ERA (one earned runs/21.0 innings) with 10 hits, two walks and 46 strikeouts...He has converted all 12 saves in that period.

30 FOR 39: 30 of Díaz last 39 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He has not allowed a run in his last 15 outings dating back to June 22, covering 14.1 innings...That places him 1.2 innings shy of his career-high scoreless streak of 16.0 innings...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 84 strikeouts That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.5% of batters faced (84/160), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 42 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 18.14 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 23 saves, a 1.51 ERA (seven earned runs/41.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 37-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

DAY MAN: New York is 26-15 in day games this season...The team's .634 winning percentage in the sunlight is the fourth-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.99 ERA with 104 walks and 397 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 2.99 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 397 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

REVOLUTION NO. 9: Francisco Lindor is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .429 (15-35) with eight runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, five walks with a .500 OBP and an .800 SLG in that span...It's the second time this season he has recorded a hitting streak of at least nine games...He has safely hit in 20 of his last 21 games, batting .337 (29-86) in that span with 14 runs, five doubles, a triple, six home runs, 17 RBI, nine walks with a .400 OBP, a .628 SLG and a 1.028 OPS in that span.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor has recorded 74 RBI in 102 games this season (72 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...Jose Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...Lindor has recorded 104 hits this season, matching his total from 2021.

DOUBLE O-70: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the NL with 86 RBI, while, Francisco Lindor is sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL with 74 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with 70 or more RBI this season.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have clinched the season series against the Nats and have won it in four of the last five years.

POLAR EXPRESS: Alonso recently surpassed 1,000 career road plate appearances... Among the over 2,500 players in major league history with at least 1,000 PA on the road, Alonso's .940 OPS away from home ranks 16th, just behind Ty Cobb (.941), Stan Musial (.944) and Mickey Mantle (.958)...Only Mike Trout (.979) and Juan Soto (.970) have better marks among active hitters...Alonso's .582 career road slugging percentage leads active players and is the seventh-best all-time behind six of the top hitters in major league history: Babe Ruth (.681), Lou Gehrig (.644), Ted Williams (.615), Joe DiMaggio (.610), Barry Bonds (.597) and Mark McGwire (.586)...This season, Alonso is tied for third in the majors with 16 road home runs and is ninth with a .553 SLG in away games.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Over his last 51 games since June 1, Lindor is batting .262/.327/.475 with 25 runs, eight doubles, a triple, 11 home runs, 32 RBI, 17 walks with an .803 OPS...He ranks second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (24)...He ranks 13th in the majors and ninth in the National League with a 4.2 fWAR.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 20 of their next 23 games vs. their division...The Mets are 4-1 during the stretch...Overall, the Mets are 32-13 against the East this year...Their .711 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...Since May 27, the team has gone 19-6 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 2.98 ERA against the East, while hitting .258/.336/.415...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 225-141 this season.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets have won 23 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 33-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...Their 23 wins scoring four or more runs is tied for the second-longest in history and is tied for the longest single-season streak...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more...New York is 55-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 55 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .917 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 65 games this season, second-most in the National League and fourth-most in the majors...Their .631 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 65-38 record through the team's first 103 games...Only the 1986 (69-34) team posted a better record through the first 103 games of the season.

JUST ME AND THE OPEN ROAD: The Mets have won eight of their last 10 road games and has gone 13-5 on the road since June 24...New York is 34-21 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .618 road winning percentage is tied for the second-best in the majors...New York is batting .259/.327/.412 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks fourth in the majors and second in the NL.

FOR STARTERS: Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.00 ERA (31 earned runs/139.1 innings) in the team's last 23 games with 147 strikeouts and 37 walks...That is over a full run better than the next-best club, the Dodgers (3.18)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.57 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.57 ERA from their starters.

RETURN OF THE MAC: Jeff McNeil is batting .429 (9-21) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, with a .455 OBP and a .667 SLG over his last five games...He has recorded three multi-hit games in that span...He has collected 133 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 33rd on the team's all-time list...He is batting .327/.384/.463 on the road this year...His .327 average on the road ranks eighth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets lead the major leagues with 134 infield hits this year...That is eight more than the second-place team, the Cleveland Guardians...Brandon Nimmo and Jeff McNeil are tied for sixth in the National League with 17 infield hits...Mark Canha has recorded 16 infield hits and Starling Marte has collected 15.

MARTE PARTY: After batting .224/.290/.318 in 20 games in April...Marte is batting .325/.367/.521 with 46 runs, 17 doubles, four triples, nine home runs, 32 RBI with 14 walks...Over his last 21 games, he is batting .365 (31-85) with 10 runs, three doubles, four homers, 11 RBI, five walks with a .413 OBP and a .565 SLG...Marte leads the club and is tied for seventh in the NL with a .300 average.

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Pete Alonso has hit .344 (44-128) with 22 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 11 home runs, 27 RBI, 15 walks with a .418 OBP and a .688 SLG in 34 career games at the ballpark...His .344 batting average ranks second all-time at the ballpark (min. 100 AB), while his .688 SLG is the best...Mark Canha has hit .500 (12-24) with six runs, a home run, five RBI and three walks in six career games at Nationals Park...Jeff McNeil has hit .316 (37-117) with 15 runs, three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 20 RBI, 12 walks with a .382 OBP and a .479 SLG in 32 games at Nationals Park.

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: The Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh on July 22...In eight games with New York, the lefty has hit .286 (6-21) with two runs, two doubles, seven walks with an .864 OPS...He has reached base safely in seven of those contests and in all three of his starts.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Started against Miami for the fourth time in his last six starts... Bassitt went 6.0 innings and allowed four runs on six hits...He walked a season-high four batters and struck out only two, the fewest punchouts he has had in a start this season...The game was tied, 4-4 when Bassitt exited.

ROAD TO WASHINGTON: Among pitchers with at least nine starts on the road, Bassitt's five wins are tied for seventh in the NL...He owns a 4.83 road ERA (27 earned runs/50.1 innings) striking out 49 batters and walking 18...In his career, Bassitt is 23-13 with a 4.41 ERA on the road (162 earned runs/330.1 innings) with 297 strikeouts and 126 walks.

LONG TIME NO SEE, LITERALLY: Bassitt will make his second career start against the Nationals today...He faced them for the first time in his Mets debut on April 9 allowing three hits in 6.0 innings while striking out eight batters and walking one...Bassitt has eight starts against the NL East, going 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (18 earned runs/56.1 innings), 52 strikeouts and 14 walks.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: In his last seven starts dating back to June 14, Bassitt is 3-3 with a 2.89 ERA (15 earned runs/46.2 innings)...In that span, he has struck out 43 batters and walked only nine...Bassitt's 0.943 WHIP in those seven starts is the seventh-lowest WHIP as a starter across that span in his career...His sub-3.00 ERA is the second-lowest ERA in a seven game span this season (min. 40.0 IP), the lowest ERA he has had across seven starts came from April 9-May 14, 2022 (2.34).

UNDER PRESSURE: The Mets are 11-8 this season when Bassitt takes the mound... Of his 19 starts this season, 11 games have been decided by three or fewer runs including his last start where the Mets beat the Marlins, 6-4, breaking a 4-4 tie on a go-ahead two-run homer by Brandon Nimmo...Five of those 11 games were decided by one run.

UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY: Today Bassitt will make his 20th start of the season, a feat he has only reached twice before in his career, 2019 (25 GS) and 2021 (27 GS)...Through his first 19 starts, Bassitt has pitched 115.0 innings and has recorded 117 strikeouts...With 43.1 more innings logged and 43 punchouts Bassitt will surpass career-highs in both categories set in 2021 with 157.1 innings pitched and 159 strikeouts.

HOUND ON THE MOUND: Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 15 of his 19 starts this year, including each of his last seven starts...That is tied for the longest streak of his career accomplished from July 11-August 21, 2015...Bassitt has thrown for 7.0 innings or more in four starts this season...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 13 of his 19 starts...Those 13 games with six or more strikeouts ranks fifth-most in the NL and tied for eighth-most in the majors.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: Across his eight seasons in the majors, the most quality starts Bassitt has had in a season is 16 in 2021...Currently, Bassitt has 12 quality starts on the season.

QUICK CHANGE: Bassitt's fastball has produced 41 strikeouts this season, which is his most with any pitch...His strikeout percentage on his fastball is 44.1 percent (41 Ks in 93 plate appearances)...Bassitt owns a .158 BAA and .211 SLG (7th in NL) on his curveball which is his lowest SLG of his career on any pitch (min. 200 pitches).

NEW YORK GROOVE: His 1.130 WHIP is the seventh-lowest in franchise history among starters through their first 19 games as a Met...Bassitt's 117 strikeouts allowed are the eighth-most in franchise history among starters through their first 19 games as a Met.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (11-4, 3.79 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 100th career win in his July 30 start against the Marlins at loanDepot Park...Went 7.2 scoreless innings giving up only four hits... Carrasco struck out seven batters and walked two.

MORE POWER: Carrasco pitched more than 7.0 innings for the fourth time this season...After striking out seven in his last start, Carrasco now has nine games this season where he has struck out six or more batters in a game...Dating back to July 14, Carrasco has not allowed a run in 18.2 consecutive innings...His longest scoreless streak came from 6/7-6/18/2011 when he went 21.1 innings without allowing a run.

- Homered on August 1 at Washington to pass Michael Conforto for seventh in Mets history with 133 HR...Up next on the Mets all-time list: Carlos Beltran (149).
- Is a career .336/.425/.696 hitter against the Nationals...His 20 homers are tied for his most against any team, while his 37 extra-base hits and 46 RBI are his most against any opponent.
- Tied for fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 27 homers...Leads the NL and is second in the majors with 86 RBI...Tied for 17th in the NL with 58 runs scored.
- Ranks ninth in MLB and third in the NL with a .542 SLG...Is ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .896 OPS...Is 17th in the NL in OBP (.354).
- Has five homers and 17 RBI in his last 19 games since he ended a career-high 10-game RBI drought and an 11-game home run dry spell on July 9 vs. Miami.
- Has 16 game-winning RBI and 24 go-ahead RBI this season, most in MLB.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is tied for third in games with multiple RBI (21) this season.
